Season 1954-55.

To be presented at the Annual Meeting of the Branch, to be held at Federation House, 166 Phillip Street, on Thursday, 6th October, 1955, at 7 p.m.

Gentlemen,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Sixth Annual Report of this Branch which, you will note, shows yet another year of progress and achievement made possible only by the unstinted efforts of all members.

Again, it is our proud boast that no lives have been lost whilst affiliated Clubs have patrolled the beaches.

Branch Council Meetings were held on the first Tuesday of each

month, and on the whole were well attended.

At the May meeting it was decided to enforce the Branch Constitution regarding the attendance of Delegates, and eight Delegates' positions were declared vacant. The majority of these positions have since been filled.

Executive meetings were held regularly every week, and all Officers are to be congratulated on their attendance.

Matters that are of particular interest are as follows:-

RESCUES.—This Association's primary purpose of existence has once again been upheld as the following summary of rescues for the year will show.

The over-all drop in figures compared with last year would indicate that the surfing public is becoming more alert to the safety precautions, i.e. bathing between flags etc., and that Club patrols are more vigilant in their measures to protect the bathing public when conditions are hazardous.

BOARD OF EXAMINERS.—The Board of Examiners once again was a tower of strength to the Branch, and under the leadership of Mr. Bill Foerster, our Branch Superintendent, it was responsible for the usual large number of Examinations, Carnivals, etc., being successfully conducted. The Gear Inspection Committee did valuable work, and their efforts were instrumental in bringing Club gear to a high standard early in the season.

It was decided at the June meeting that a gear inspection trophy be presented next season. Mr. Lucas has very generously donated such a trophy. It is hoped with this incentive that all Clubs will make the necessary efforts to ensure rescue worthy gear early in the season.

ATTENDANCE OF DELEGATES.—Concern is felt at the attendance of Club Delegates at Council Meeting. Clubs should insist on their delegates' attendance, and thus ensure that matters which may affect their Clubs do not pass unnoticed.

Please find enclosed a list of the attendance of all Officers, elected Vice-Presidents, and Delegates for the past season.

HON. REGISTRAR.—At the May Council Meeting the resignation of Mr. Gordon Davies from the position of Branch Hon. Registrar was accepted with regret.

Nominations were called for the position, and Mr. Simmons the then Assist. Registrar, was elected at the June Council Meeting. In the short time elapsed before this report went to print, Mr. Simmons had shown that we have discovered another capable and valued officer.

HON. AUDITORS.—Unfortunately early this season, we were faced with the resignation of the Hon. Auditors Messrs. R. A. Irish and Michelmore. To these gentlemen was extended the gratitude of the Branch for a task well carried out over a number of years. Special mention is due to Mr. Peter Crosthwaite of the firm for his personal contribution towards the conduct of the Annual auditing of our accounts.

Through the efforts of Mr. Soutar, we were fortunate in obtaining the services of Messrs. L. J. Richardson, Payne and Co. The Branch is grateful to this Company for its ready acceptance of the position, and for the excellent auditing of our books this season.

NYLON LINES.—A postal vote on this matter was conducted by National Council, resulting in favour of the use of nylon lines being permitted for competition in the 1955-56 season.

An estimated cost of such lines is in the proximity of £33 each.

GEAR HAND BOOK.—Compiling work is under way on the new gear hand book, which will embrace all gear used by our Association. Mr. Besomo and all who contributed to the excellent preparation of the

book are to be congratulated. Latest reports indicate the Gear Book will be available early next season.

Competition for this Shield will be run in conjunction with the Acme Cup and will be open to all Clubs between and including Dee Why and North Palm Beach.

Dick's Shoes Beach Football Competition. A Beach Football Competition has been organised and the final match will be played at the Health Week Carnival at Bondi, on Saturday, 15th October.

The excellent trophy donated by Mr. Dick McPhillips has been accepted for a five year period. The Club holding the trophy the longest or with the greatest aggregate of points at the conclusion of this period will be the ultimate winner.

SYDNEY SURF CLUB

The response from members of the Branch to form a Members' Club was disappointing. 153 members subscribed, which is below the minimum number required by law of 200. The resulting lack of finance made it difficult to negotiate to obtain suitable premises.

The average attendance at meetings was only 30 resulting in a proposal to wind up the affairs of the Club, but this was postponed pending a decision of the New South Wales State Centre to acquire a city property, in which event, the Sydney Surf Club would become a tenant of portion of the space available.

In the meantime, members were notified that those who wished to draw their subscriptions could do so and this was availed of by

some members.

A final decision re the future activities of the Club should be k \mbox{own} in the early part of the coming season.

NATIONAL COUNCIL AND STATE CENTRE.—This Branch has continued to take a most active interest in the matters of State Centre and National Council.

To Messrs. Arthur Castleman and Ken Watson, State and National Council Secretaries respectively, I extend my appreciation for cooperation extended during the past season.

The past season has imposed a strenuous burden upon the officers of Sydney Branch, and it is pleasing to record that everybody has responded enthusiastically and loyally to the demands.


To our Honorary Secretary, Mr. Gus Staunton, I say "Thank You
