ANNUAL REPORT

Mr. President,

Gentlemen.

It is my pleasant duty to again submit for your perusal and adoption this, the 16th Annual Report of the Sydney Branch.

The Sydney Branch, because of its geographical position, its huge membership of qualified lifesavers and the high standard of its Clubs, will always be a vital link in the expanding chain of lifesaving.

As members of this Branch, we should be conscious of our heritage and should examine all matters of our application to lifesaving and service to the public with the most critical eye.

I contend, Mr. President and gentlemen, that Sydney Branch has been diligent in applying itself to its task and that our Clubs have been vigilant in safeguarding our surfing public.

Room for improvement will always be present since perfection is always the elusive aim of mankind in all his strivings.

The form adopted in previous seasons for submitting the report has again been followed and I trust this journal will be factual in matter and easy to follow in style.

Branch Council.

The governing body of surfing in our Branch is the Council and any Club or any Officer who does not seize the opportunity presented by the free interchange and right to vote, disfranchise themselves or himself from lifesaving.

Our appreciation is extended to the Aquatic Club for the congenial meeting facilities available to us on the first Tuesday of each month.

The greatest single factor which impresses with the Council is the harmony which exists at all levels.

The meetings normally commence at 7 p.m. and are, in most cases, concluded well before 9.30 p.m.; indeed, not on one occasion in the last season did the meeting go in excess of 10.30 p.m.

Full minutes of each meeting are circulated to all Clubs, Delegates and Officers and it behoves each Delegate, Club President and Secretary to ensure that matters of importance are brought to the notice of their Club.

Attendances have been, on the whole, good, but some Clubs continue to elect to the position of Delegate, members who cannot or will not carry out their duties correctly and this situation should be adjusted.

AWARDS.

The awards gained by the Sydney Branch Clubs are detailed in the list at the end of this report, but a comparison of the total for the Branch is made with previous years in the following table -

Over the years, the increase in awards has been slight, but it is pleasing to note the increase in Qualifying Certificates, despite the lowering of the Bronze age to 15 years.

Undoubtedly, the "Nipper" Clubs which have been formed have had some influence this season and it is hoped that there will be a bigger influx in future seasons.

RESCUES.

As with the Awards, the rescues carried out by the individual Clubs are in the Branch summary and the totals for the Branch are compared,, in the table below, with previous seasons -

There was a marked increase in the number of rescues "with line" and this is a reflection on the weather last summer. Rescues by other means were roughly as usual.

However, the number of rescues carried out in the Branch does not reflect the amount of work carried out by our Clubs and it is a credit to the vigilance of the patrols that more rescues are not recorded. After all, every rescue is a potential tragedy and the Clubs are basically in the business of preventing rescues, rather then carrying out rescues. The instruction and demonstrations given by the Clubs in educating the surfing public are well worth the effort if the number of rescues is reduced.

MEMBERSHIP.

The active membership of the Branch has been static for some seasons, but it appears that the Clubs in the Branch can carry out their duties successfully with this number of members on patrol. However, all Clubs could use additional members and all efforts must be maintained to ensure recruitment of new members in order that our strength does not fall.

With the formation of "Nipper" Clubs in the Branch, there is a potential that must be tapped for future patrol members and these Clubs deserve all the assistance and encouragement that the Surf Clubs can give. Not only can they assist the Clubs, but the encouragement of the young people into a worthwhile and healthy sport is a grand object in itself.

A word should also be spoken at this time of the excellent work and support given to the active side of the Clubs by the Associate and other members of the Clubs. Their assistance in fund raising and helping at club functions and carnivals is appreciated by all and is a great credit to them.

The Income and Expenditure Statement shows a loss of £85.11. 9 for the year, a little disappointing after making a small profit for the year ended June 30, 1964, of £24.13. 0, the first for many years.
