Mr. President,

Gentlemen,

Hereafter will be found for your perusal and, I trust, for your adoption at the Annual General Meeting, the 17th Annual Report and Balance Sheet of the Sydney Branch, marking the conclusion of our 59th year of operation.

The concluding 1965-66 season has been a truly outstanding one and I am sure that all Officers and members will share with pride the knowledge of a task well completed. Figures contained in this report will indicate that new records have been set in the allocation of awards of this Association; rescues are at the lowest figure of recent years and our membership shows a steady increase, which is both heartening and encouraging in the knowledge that in this day and age with its many outside attractions and interests, members are retaining an active association with lifesaving and the youth of to-day, more and more, is meeting the challenge and discipline of surf club life.

Sydney Clubs and their members have been outstanding in competition, as will be evidenced by the record of titles, both State and Australian, which have been carried in victory back to this Branch and also, the Sydney Branch have been well represented in touring teams.

All Officers have discharged their duties to a very high standard and a most striking feature is undoubtedly the harmony which exists within the Branch between the Council, the Clubs, the Board of Examiners, and the Officers generally, and it is in this atmosphere of harmony that the steady growth and development of the vast resources of the Sydney Branch can be accelerated.

It is difficult in an introduction such as this to single out various items for particular comment and, accordingly, I will retain the style

which has been found most acceptable in previous seasons and will therefore set out in the following pages items of importance which occurred within, or affected the well-being of the Branch during the season.

I trust, therefore, Mr. President and gentlemen, that you will find the details submitted in this report to be factual and easy to follow in style.

BRANCH COUNCIL.

The Branch Council, comprising the elected Delegates of the Clubs, the Club Presidents, who occupy the position of Association Vice-President, together with the Association Officers, have met regularly since the previous Annual General Meeting, with the Council Meeting being held on the first Tuesday of each month.

We again extend our appreciation to His Honour Judge Harvey Prior and the Management and staff of the Aquatic Club for their consideration and courtesies in allowing the Council to meet under the most congenial atmosphere of the Conference Room.

A great number of our Officers and Delegates avail themselves of the excellent facilities of the Aquatic Club and dinner before the Branch Council Meeting has become the accepted commencement of the evening.

Full Minutes of the proceedings at the Council are circulated to all Officers, Delegates and Club Secretaries before the following Council meeting; agendas are circulated on the evening and it behoves all Delegates to retain their agendas to assist them in making their reports to their respective Clubs.

Attendances have, on the whole, been of a very high standard and the record of attendances of elected Officers, Club Presidents and Delegates, are set out for perusal.

We again repeat the request that Clubs should particularly peruse the attendances of their Delegates and should not elect to the position of Association Delegates members who are unable or unwilling to fully represent their Clubs in the Association sphere.

A tremendous volume of work is absorbed by the Branch Council, yet meetings are normally concluded well before the meeting dead-line of 10 p.m.

BRANCH EXECUTIVE.

Meetings of the Executive since the previous Annual General Meeting have been infrequent and, indeed, two or three only have been convened.

Since the closing of the Association Office in Hunter Street and possibly coupled with the lighter burden of adminstration caused by the splitting of the former Sydney Branch, the need has not been found to hold executive meetings regularly and this body now meets only on the specific instructions of the Council.

However, we are indebted to those Officers and Delegates who have made their time available when called upon and because of the small number of meetings involved, we will not record the attendance records from Executive Meetings.

BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

We have continued to be most fortunate in the Officers administering the Board of Examiners and the full complement of Officers and members is

set out in the opening pages of this report.

Branch Superintendent Jim Switzer, and Deputy Superintendent Albert Moseley, are constant members of the Branch Council and together with the Secretary of the Board of Examiners, John Vaughan, who is also Assistant Secretary of the Branch, ensure that the Board of Examiners and the Branch Council do not drift apart in opinions or in objectives.

It was unfortunately an acknowledged fact that in the past, harmony between the Board of Examiners and the Branch Council was not of the highest standard, but over recent years, this situation has steadily improved until we find the very amiable and efficient method of operation between the Branch and the Board as it exists to-day.

An enormous number of examinations and carnivals are each season coordinated by the Board of Examiners members and they never falter in this task.

Gear Stewards' and Chief Instructors' Conferences were held at the commencement of the season and undoubtedly assisted in their special spheres.

Again we extend to each and every member of the Board of Examiners our sincere appreciation for their assistance and co-operation.

Members of Clubs, wishing to join the Board of Examiners, should direct their enquiries to the Board Secretary, John Vaughan, and ascertain the correct procedure for such an application.

AWARDS.

A snap check has been made on past records available to the Sydney Branch and it would appear that the season's total of 616 awards will set an all-time high.

The gaining of such a large number of awards will speak volumes for the enthusiasm and activity of the Club Chief Instructors and also the members of our own Board of Examiners in coping with this ever-increasing demand of examinations.

RESCUES.

As we are pleased to report that awards are at an all-time high, we are similarly pleased to advise that rescues are the lowest they have been for many seasons and we trust that this low figure reflects the diligent attention to their duties of our rostered patrols.

The season was not a particularly moderate one and, indeed, rough seas assailed the coastline on many occasions and were a constant threat to the average surfer, but nevertheless, our patrols undoubtedly carried out their duties to the highest standard and we are most grateful to them.

MEMBERSHIP.

It has been the familiar cry of this Annual report that Clubs should be ever diligent and on the alert re declining membership figures.

With the gradual increase of membership and the steadily improving position, this cry may be heard less frequently and more faintly, but nevertheless, Clubs should ensure that they do not neglect this most important avenue of future lifeblood.

Many Clubs are known to actively seek membership and, indeed, the fostering of the "Nipper" Clubs has done a great deal to alleviate this present situation.

We have seen, as reported previously, a gradual increase in membership over recent years, but this increase has been most noticeable in the category recorded as "others" and is not necessarily in the most important fields of active, reserve active and cadet. Indeed, the increase in active membership is a very nominal one, as is the increase in cadets. Reserve active membership shows a drop of 260.

Special mention will be made elsewhere in this report of the formation of "Nipper" Clubs and a Juvenile Association and we do trust that by our efforts in this regard, we will be rewarded with a steady influx of members for many years to come.

SYDNEY BRANCH CHAMPIONSHIPS, BONDI BEACH, FEBRUARY 5, 1966.

The Branch Championships were this season conducted on the Bondi Beach in most inclement weather conditions and, indeed, certain events had to be postponed and finalised at a later date.

Difficulty appeared to be encountered by the Bondi Club in the seating and entertaining of official guests and this, of course, would no doubt be affected in part by the high seas, gusty wind and rain which prevailed throughout most of the day.

We are indebted to our Branch Superintendent, Jim Switzer, and his team of Carnival officials who gave so unselfishly of their efforts to ensure a successful conclusion of the carnival and we extend our congratulations to the Cronulla Club, who won the outright pointscore on the day.

Minor placegetters in the Club pointscore were - Bondi, 2nd; North Cronulla, 3rd; and North Bondi, 4th. Unfortunately, a trophy was not made available for this purpose this season by the Daily Mirror Newspaper, but nevertheless, a bannerette was presented by the Sydney Branch in recognition of the effort expended.

FINANCE.

We are appreciative of the Treasurer, Mr. K. Lonsdale, and the Assistant Treasurer, Mr. J. Needham, both very energetic Officers of the Branch and also office-bearers in the Wanda S.L.S.C., for their efforts in the sphere of finance.

It was not anticipated in the budget at the commencement of the season that the loss of the previous year would again be repeated and latest figures in the preparation of the Balance Sheet as this report is prepared for print, indicate that we will have a slender margin of income over expenditure.

The Finance Committee, comprising the Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Secretary, together with John Vaughan, Ron Buist and Don Lucas, met on two occasions during the latter part of the season and brought down a number of recommendations to the Council as intentions to improve the financial standing of the Branch.

Every thinking Officer and Delegate must agree that this tightrope walking in the financial sphere is not healthy, to allow the development of the Branch and most certainly curtails any expenditure not rigidly budgeted for. In the coming season, we have already allocated a figure to assist in the formation of the Juvenile Association here in Sydney Branch and this figure alone would account for the majority of our profit margin for the year.

Among a number of suggestions brought down by the Finance Committee

were the holding of a Bowls Day and the Assistant Secretary,
John Vaughan, has already made overtures in this regard; also, the
conducting of a "Holden Dinner". It is anticipated that the majority
will understand the meaning of the term "Holden Dinner", but briefly,
it will comprise a Dinner held at some suitable venue with tickets
being sold at \$20.00 per double. The evening will be a multi-course
dinner with top artists of T.V. and radio entertaining the guests
non-stop throughout the evening and at the conclusion, a ballot is
conducted and a Holden Sedan is presented to one of the guests present.

Indications received from parties who have conducted these dinners would lead us to expect a profit margin somewhat in the proximity of \$1,400.

It has been resolved that a meeting of all Club Presidents and other interested parties, together with the Branch Executive will be held very early in the coming season, in an attempt to have a committee formed and have such a dinner organised.

The Treasurer's report follows, and the financial statement and audited Balance Sheet are set out elsewhere in this report for your attention.

Treasurer's Report.

I have pleasure in presenting for your approval the Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account for the year ended June 30, 1966. This year the Income and Expenditure Statement shows an excess of Income over Expenditure of \$154, a marked improvement on the loss of \$171 in the previous financial period. This is attributable not only to an increase in revenue, but also a decrease in expenses. A note-worthy effort in this day and age.

It is disappointing however, to note that even though we have curtailed our expenditure, the increase in revenue was not greater. In the field of donations, we had a further decrease of \$159 this year,

In the coming financial period, we will be committed for heavy expenditure, for the South African tour and the pledged support of the Juvenile Association. I hope that the Clubs will support the Branch in its money-raising campaigns, which the Finance Committee recommended to the Branch in the latter months of last year.

In conclusion, I would take this opportunity to thank John Needham, the Assistant Treasurer, who capably deputised for me at Council Meetings owing to my tech. obligations. To my other fellow Branch Officers, I thank them for their continued support, especially Gus Staunton, our Secretary.

Finally, to the Presidents and member of the Clubs within our Branch, I wish them success for the coming season and trust that they will continue to support the Branch to the fullest of their ability.

The Branch has been fully represented at all meetings of the State Centre and the attitude has greatly improved from the time when Sydney Branch was considered the giant Colossus and almost open hostility reigned continually.

The emergence of a new group of Officers in the State Centre must, of course, have some bearing upon this improvement and the Sydney Branch has been able to act on numerous occasions fully in support of and with the full support of the country branches.

Unfortunately, it must be a recognised fact that the Sydney and Manly-Warringah Branches do, on occasions, nullify their votes in State Centre by voting for and against various items, thus leaving the real decision to the other representatives.

However, this is, of course, the simple danger of the dismembering of the original Branch and probably little can be done and, more to the point, little should be done to again organise a unified front to the country and other near-city branches.

It is with regret that we note the continued absence of the State President, Mr. Tom Meagher, from his duties and it would appear that the speedy return to his usual vigorous self which all had anticipated, will not become a reality for some time.

For the greater part of the season, Mr. Meagher's duties were very capably carried out by the Deputy President, Mr. Con Asmussen, and we must sincerely extend our congratulations to this gentleman, not only for the manner in which he has carried out his assumed task, but has represented the N.S.W. State Centre most capably as a member of the National Council.

To the State Secretary, Mr. Norman Steele, our congratulations go for the diligent attention to his duties.

Mr. Hector McDonald, Superintendent of the Manly-Warringah Branch, and indeed a former Superintendent of the Sydney Branch, was success-

ful at the last Annual General Meeting of State Centre in seeking the position of Deputy Superintendent and to this gentleman and also to Mr. Lionel McDonald, the State Superintendent, we extend our congratulations for the manner in which they have attended to the various matters falling within their sphere.

Finally, to all other Officers including the Treasurer Mr. Ernie Lawler, a former Officer of the Sydney Branch, and his assistant Mr. John Rosewell, and all other members of the State Council, we extend our appreciation and congratulations for a task well done.

As mentioned previously, the N.S.W. State Centre is represented on the National Council by the Deputy President, Mr. Con Asmussen, and the Sydney Branch was again successful last season in nominating the Branch Secretary, Mr. Gus Staunton, for the co-delegate's position on the Council. These gentlemen have attended all meetings of the National Council, where applicable, and it must be agreed, have continued the task of harmonising the relationship between the National and State spheres.

The activity in the National sphere at the present time is intense and this has undoubtedly thrown a great burden on the National Council Officers and particularly the Secretary-Treasurer, Mr. Ken Watson.

The mid-yearly meeting of the National Council held in Coolangatta at the conclusion of the Australian Championships witnessed the approval being given to the N.S.W. invitation for South Africa to visit Australia next season and particularly the N.S.W. and Manly-Warringah area. Also, because commitments were well advanced in both regards, the National Council approved the visit of a team from the U.S.A. to our shores in the coming season and, finally, over the Christmas period an Australian representative team will tour New Zealand.

This influx and exodus of touring teams in 1967 must surely mark the coming season as a glamour one reminiscent of the multi-visits of teams at the time of the Olympic Games.

To the Chairman of the National Council, His Honour Judge Adrian Curlewis; to the Superintendent, Mr. Bob Brydon; to the Assistant Secretary, Mr. Kevin Weldon; to the other Officers and Delegates who have supported the N.S.W. State Centre during the season, we say "thank you".

We understand that the National Superintendent will not again be seeking nomination in this regard and we must go on record of extending our congratulations to Mr. Brydon for a task well done over a number of years and wish his successor every success and pledge him every assistance in his mammoth task.

INSURANCE.

The insurance affairs of the Branch have again been very ably conducted by the Insurance Officer of previous seasons, Mr. Barry Regan. We extend to Mr. Regan our congratulations for a task well done and must under this general heading caution all Clubs to conduct their affairs of insurance with the most proper regard for procedure and also for the time table of events.

Unfortunately, the Association Office and, we are sure, Mr. Regan, is constantly assailed during the season by members who are seeking clarification of their present standing of a non-existent insurance claim, such claim being non-existent because the appropriate Club Officer has failed to lodge same, or the claim has been lodged well outside the time limit.

It would be, unfortunately, in some cases a proven fact that Club Secretaries have not conveyed the information concerning the insurance scheme to their respective Club members; particularly members have not been advised that the entire responsibility of the financial obligations arising from accidents, etc., must be met by the claimant and will not be met directly by the Government Insurance Office. The G.I.O. will reimburse amounts to the claimant but, as stated, the direct responsibility for the settling of these claims will lay with the Club member and not with the Office. Consequently, the practice of Club members instructing Ambulance Brigades, hospitals, doctors, etc., to forward their accounts to the Insurance Company, should cease.

We are led to believe that the Rothmans Company will be expanding its already large donation for insurance purposes to cover all Club members.

Following is a report upon matters of insurance prepared by the Insurance Officer.

"During the past season, Sydney Branch members made a total of 39 claims for injuries received during the course of duty. This compares with a figure of 27 for the previous season. It is interesting to note that of these 39 claims, only 9 persons received head or facial injuries and these occurred as follows - beach football 2, surfboard and ski 5, surfboat 2. The remaining 30 were made up as follows - 14 leg, 1 back, 5 shoulder and 10 cases of arm and hand injuries.

Since reporting in the previous annual report, the aluminium surf boat situation has developed to the point of where the National Council at its mid-yearly meeting, held in Queensland, approved aluminium surf boats for competition and are currently seeking standard specifications.

The two previously manufactured surf boats are still giving excellent service, one being in the possession of the Cronulla S.L.S.C. and the other boat, which had toured America with the Australian team last season, eventually was allocated to the N.S.W. State Centre and, in turn, to one of the northern branches. We are led to believe that a sponsor ordered a further boat to be manufactured by the De Havilland Company and this boat has been delivered to the Portsea Club in Victoria.

It would appear that all future aluminium boats will be made by the De Havilland Company, the previous manufacturers Highgate Engineering, being a company which simply develops products to the betterment of the aluminium industry.

The Boat Inspector of the Sydney Branch, Mr. George Challis, who is also a member of the National Boat Advisory Committee, has kept the Branch and its Clubs au fait with the situation in this particular sphere and we take the opportunity of extending to Mr. Challis our congratulations for the manner in which he has carried out his duties in this and many other matters.

Ross Safety Belt.

During the concluding part of the season, considerable concern was expressed re the suitability of the four-pronged type Ross Safety belt pin, which had been approved by the Association and, indeed, now made mandatory for manufacturers. The Branch called upon the State Centre to act with a degree of urgency in rectifying this situation but from the report of the State Board of Examiners' meeting, it would appear that Sydney Branch was almost alone in its fears concerning this particular item of equipment. Other Branches reported satisfactory service from the belt and it will therefore lay to Sydney Branch to satisfy itself that every precaution and safety is taken within our own boundaries.

The acquiring of the metal fittings for Ross Safety Belts and the material from which they are manufactured, also the continuity of supply, has unfortunately been a point of contention for many years. The N.S.W. State Centre now has a most wonderful opportunity to establish their own set of dies and tools for these most essential items of equipment and also for the metal fittings for surf reels, which have also come under criticism from time to time. This opportunity has been presented to the State Centre in the guise of a special grant for the development and experimenting with gear.

The National Council received during the season, and has since allocated to the States, funds from an anonymous donor who has indicated that this money should be used in gear experimenting and development.

It will be agreed, I am sure, that the State Centre could do a great deal worse than consider the acquiring of its own tools and dies and hold in stock a nominal number of sets of metal fittings which can be called upon by the various manufacturers of surf reels and Ross Safety Belts and thus do away with the chaotic state of affairs which existed at the commencement of last season when the new specification Ross Belts were not available for many months.

Gear Improvement Committee.

The Gear Improvement Committee has met on a number of occasions during the season and has considered various items, ranging from proposed "crash" helmets for surf boat crews to new specifications for fins on surf skis, etc. The shark attack kit which had previously been submitted to and endorsed by the Sydney Branch, and indeed, virtually endorsed by the N.S.W. State Centre and National Council, has remained a virtual unknown factor on the beaches, since the cost involved, approximately \$45.00, has apparently deterred most Clubs from the acquiring of this excellent item of equipment.

LONG SERVICE AWARD.

It is with pleasure that we report that the situation of the Long
Service Award has improved enormously since our previous annual report
and we now witness a flow of Long Service Award badges from the
National Council through the N.S.W. State Centre to the various

applicants.

It must be mentioned, however, that this flow is, at times, erratic and there are, on many occasions, delays which we find, in our limited knowledge of the distribution and acquiring problems, difficult to understand, but nevertheless, the badges are now becoming available in increasing numbers and Clubs should not anticipate any undue delay in this regard.

REGISTRAR.

To the Branch Registrar, Mr. Harry Brown, we extend our congratulations for a duty well done. Harry has occupied this position now over a number of seasons and has undoubtedly brought a degree of solidarity to its activities which are very heartening and which are efficient, to say the least. This gentleman has continued as President of the North Cronulla S.L.S.C. and these duties, coupled with the duties of Registrar in the Sydney Branch, must indeed take their toll of his uncommitted time.

We do trust that in future seasons we will be as well served in this particular sphere as we have been during the past season.

SOUTH AFRICANS' VISIT.

As mentioned under the National Council and N.S.W. State Centre heading, the National Council did extend an invitation to the South African Surf Lifesaving Association to send a touring team to Australia in the coming season as the specific guests of the N.S.W. State Centre and the Manly-Warringah Branch.

This visit follows on the recent visit to South Africa of a team from the Manly-Warringah Branch itself and it is anticipated that the South Africans will visit a number of other States during their tour.

Undoubtedly, the acquiring of the finance and the multi organisational problems of acting as hosts to the South African team has presented the Manly-Warringah Branch with many problems and we must extend our congratulations to these gentlemen for their fortitude and their persistence in this regard. The Sydney Branch has indicated to the appropriate authorities that we would be pleased to have the South Africans as our guests over a week-end in the coming season and it is understood that this invitation has now been accepted.

SYMPATHIES.

The President, Mr. A.R. Loton, Deputy President Mr. D.C. Lucas, Branch Officers and member Clubs, express their sincere condolences to all those members of the Association and our Clubs who have suffered bereavement throughout the concluding season.

B.P. GEAR TRAILERS.

As this report is prepared for print, advice has been received that the B.P. Company will be continuing its donation in a slightly curtailed form to this Association for some seasons to come.

A number of gear trailers, suitable for towing behind vehicles, have been made available to the N.S.W. State Centre and the Sydney Branch will not be successful in acquiring one for the coming season, but we will receive a trailer, presumably for competition, in the 1967-68 season.

It is understood that the present allocation of trailers, which will number 18, will cover the N.S.W. Branches at the rate of six per year for the next three years.

Again, our sincere appreciation to the British Petroleum Company for their continuing support of this association which already marked them as the largest donor this Association has known.

OFFICE ADMINISTRATION.

As in previous seasons, the Branch Office has been conducted at the business establishment of the Honorary Secretary, at 335 Illawarra Rd, Marrickville. Undoubtedly, there are some drawbacks to not having a central office in the City, but these deficiencies must surely be more than offset by the large financial saving to the Branch of not having to meet commitments involving office rent, telephone, office staff, etc., all of which would be applicable to a City office. Clubs are again reminded that stocks of handbooks and other printed matter are available from the Association Office, nominally between the hours of 9-5 on week-days and also on Saturday mornings until 11.30 a.m.

I am sure I express on behalf of all Officers our very sincere appreciation and thanks to Mrs. Joan Vaughan, wife of the Branch Assistant Secretary, for her untiring efforts on our behalf.

Mrs. Vaughan is heavily committed in other activities, but nevertheless is responsible for the preparation of all duplicated matter and the vast majority of correspondence from the Sydney Branch and Board of Examiners. Her capacity for work has us all speechless and the presentation of this Annual Report itself is ample testimony of the high standard of work which we have come to expect from this young lady.


