# 19th ANNUAL REPORT

To be presented to the 19th Annual General Meeting of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia, Sydney Branch, at the Aquatic Club, 2 Riley Street, Sydney, on Tuesday, September 3, 1968.

Mr. President. Gentlemen:

It is once again my pleasure to present for your consideration and, I trust, adoption, the Annual Report of the Sydney Branch.

The report will be the 19th since the formation of the Branch, but will mark at least 62 years of operation by some of our member Clubs.

In some respects, the season has been a repetition of others, but in other ways, it has brought its own individual challenges and difficulties.

We have witnessed the continued efficient functioning of the Branch Council; on the other hand, the Executive, which for so many years was the pivot of Branch administration, has almost ceased to exist as an identity. The conducting of the Doorknock Appeal called for a high degree of co-operation between the Clubs and, in turn, between their members. Whilst the Appeal was outstandingly successful, it is also generally agreed that the effort of most Clubs was far short of a maximum one.

We have maintained harmonious relationships with the N.S.W. State Centre and through that Centre, with the National Council and our kindred Branches.

The Branch displayed its supremacy in competition by winning the N.S.W. Interbranch contest and again taking off the 2SM Trophy for Branch competition at the Metropolitan Championships.

All the foregoing matters, and others, are set out in the Report in more detail.

With the removal from Office of the Council of the City of Sydney, the Branch has found itself in the strange position of being without a Patron. Contrary to popular opiniom, the Constitution does not provide

that the Patron must be the Lord Mayor of the City of Sydney, but this is a practice which has become time-honoured.

A special committee has been set up to make recommendations and approaches in this matter and we trust they will be successful in appointing a Patron who will be actively interested in Surf Life Saving.

The Branch appears to have fallen into a "wasteland" of genuine interest by civil dignitaries and it is very many years since we have had a Patron, or a large number of our Vice-Patrons, attend an Annual General Meeting. Whilst on this matter, we must extend our sincere appreciation to the Premier, Mr. Askin, M.L.A., for his thoughtfulness in requesting Mr. Einfeld, M.L.A., to represent him at the last Annual Meeting.

Above all, the Branch has continued to carry out its prime task of controlling Surf Life Saving on our beaches, which attract millions of swimmers each summer and, in this respect of safeguarding the beaches, the Clubs and their members have rendered outstanding service.

I trust you will find the remainder of the report accurate and in a style easy to read.

#### BRANCH COUNCIL.

The Branch Council has continued to meet on the first Tuesday of each and every month at the very congenial surroundings of the Aquatic Club.

We are indeed grateful to His Honour Judge Harvey Prior and the Committee of the Aquatic Club for the facilities made available to us and also to the Manager, Mr. Wagstaffe, and his Staff for their courteous attention at all times.

When it is considered that the Branch Executive has virtually ceased to function as an administrative body, it is surprising to find that the Council meetings are not being swamped by a great number of routine matters. On the whole, the Council meetings normally conclude in the proximity of 9 pomo, and the facilities available at the Club have undoubtedly contributed towards the building of a social atmosphere surrounding Branch Council meetings.

The affairs of the Council have been promulgated to Clubs, Officers and Delegates by means of Minutes being circulated and also the monthly Branch circular. Wherever possible, the monthly circular is supplemented by special bulletins but, on the whole, the circular and Minutes remain the prime contact between the Branch and its Clubs.

Attendance records of Officers and Delegates, which are set out in this report, speak for themselves and we must congratulate those members of the Council who have been so regular in their attendance and by their

presence, have allowed the Council to function in its correct manner.

Unfortunately, owing to an accident in January, I found it necessary to be absent from four Council meetings and I must extend my own personal appreciation to the Branch Treasurer, Mr. John Vaughan, and the Assistant Secretary, Mr. Trevor Elliott, who assumed the Secretarial duties at the meetings in my absence. Fortunately, the injuries sustained did not prohibit my attending to Association affairs of a clerical nature.

#### BOAR D OF EXAMINERS.

Continuity of Office Bearers undoubtedly leads to a situation of solidarity and this is the case with our Board of Examiners. The Superintendent, Jim Switzer, has concluded another year in this most important office and has been very capably assisted by Albert (Ike) Moseley as Deputy Superintendent and John Vaughan as Secretary of the Board.

Sydney Branch Board members played active and important roles in the conducting of the N.S.W. Championships and also the staging of the Austral ian Championships, which this season were held at North Cronulla. In addition to these carnivals, there was the full complement of Sydney restricted and open carnivals, together with the Metropolitan Championships, the N.S.W. Interbranch Championships and the various local Club competitions. Awards for the season indicate further that the Board members were diligent in their duties and the total of 531 awards for the season is most creditable and is an increase of 90 on the previous season.

Towards the close of the season, the Board were instrumental in the preparation of material to be submitted through the N.S.W. State Centre to the National Council for the forthcoming Instructional Conference. The findings of this Conference will not be implemented during the active part of next season, but could well be available for instruction to Clubs during the winter months and in this respect also, we must look to our Board of Examiners to spearhead the introduction of new methods and procedures.

We are informed that the Superintendent and Secretary of the Board will not be seeking re-election to these positions in the coming season and we do trust that the Board and the Branch will be fortunate enough in securing members of the ability of these two outstanding retiring Officers.

A list of the members of the Board of Examiners is set out in the early pages of this report and to each and every one of these gentlemen, we extend our sincere appreciation of their continued co-operation and assistance.

#### AWARDS.

Figures available for awards gained during the concluding season show a happy rise over the 1966-68 season and we trust that this upward trend will continue. For your information and comparison, figures are set out over recent seasons and we have a constant rise and fall in this respect which gives evidence to some type of a saturation point in our present structure and Club facilities.

#### RESCUES.

The lifeblood of our movement is the Club member who is actively engaged in patrolling the beach and to each and every one of these members, we extend our very sincere appreciation for their devotion to duty. Championships are conducted to maintain a high standard amongst our members, but all too often the glamour of our movement goes to the competitive stars and we tend to ignore the member on the beach who is actively engaged in the purpose for which we have been organised.

The rescue figures set out below, whilst being more than last season, are still considerably short of those seasons ranging from 1963 to 1965 and we feel that this continuing low rescue figure gives evidence of the vigilance of the patrols in their crowd control and also we trust it gives evidence that the members of the surfing public are becoming more aware of the safety factors concerning surfing and we look to a gradual decline of figures in this respect.

#### MEMBERSHIP.

This report in the past has, on many occasions, sounded a warning concerning the various declines with respect to membership and it is a pleasure on this occasion to advise that the membership has reached an all-time high figure.

The most important category when considering membership is, of course, the active member who is the backbone of the patrols. It is pleasing to note that this number is still remaining somewhat static; a slight improvement of 30 members on last year is inconsequential when compared to previous years and, indeed, this figure shows a certain amount of slight fluctuation each year.

The Reserve Active figure shows an increase of some 200 and this, of course, is preferable to an increase being associated with the categories of "Associate" or "Other".

The Cadets show a slight decline which is surprising, considering the much publicised anticipated advantages that the "Nipper" movement would have on our Clubs. To be sure, the decline is only 35, but when we had been anticipating an increase, it becomes all the more noticeable.

#### CARNIVALS.

Misguided members of the public sometimes criticise the apparent preoccupation of the Association with staging carnivals and similar contests, but it should be apparent to the person who is prepared to
rationalise the matter, that a well-skilled crew or individual who is
in first-class condition for his competitions against other Clubs, would
be the best person or crew to assist or to stage a rescue should it be
required. The lightness of surf craft has been debated on many
occasions, but undoubtedly a craft which can be more easily managed to
the water's edge and launched, has the advantage over the more cumbersome
craft which would require many more people to successfully launch and
even more skill would be required of the crew to successfully affect a
rescue.

Concern has been expressed at the apparent reluctance of some Clubs within the Sydney Branch to stage carnivals and it is acknowledged that this is an onerous task and the financial return is highly problematical. Nevertheless, the Branch does need an active programme of carnivals within its area to promote the competition that the members require and also to ensure the Branch has adequate carnivals over which to conduct the various trophies which are donated from time to time.

No fewer than six restricted carnivals were staged in the Branch during the season and undoubtedly in many respects, the competition displayed at these localised contests is equal to anything seen at the more widely publicised carnivals.

During the winter months, a beach events convention and a water events convention were conducted, the findings from which have been discussed by the Branch and will undoubtedly lead to a brightening of our carnivals in coming seasons.

The Branch, during the winter months, formed a committee to look into the matter of a standardised system for the closing of entries for carnivals. Their report is currently being discussed.

Scottish Amicable Surf Reel.

The previous annual report recorded our appreciation to the Scottish Amicable Life Assurance Society for their very generous and tangible donation of three stainless steel surf reels. One of these reels was allocated for competition between the two Branches at the Metropolitan Championships and the remaining reels were allocated - one to Sydney Branch and one to Manly-Warringah Branch for internal competition.

The Sydney Branch reel was allocated for a pointscore competition based upon the results of cadet events at all Branch carnivals. The contest was particularly popular with the Clubs and to the winners, Wanda S.L.S.C., we extend our sincere congratulations.

Conditions for the contest for the reel won by the Sydney Branch at the Metropolitan Championships are currently being considered by the Competitions Conditions Committee.

Whilst on the matter of carnivals, mention must be made of the Branch's efforts to acquire a full set of carnival equipment and undoubtedly, this equipment will render a Club's task much easier in staging a carnival. During the visit to Australia by the U.S.A. Team, a carnival was held at the North Cronulla Beach, comprising representative teams of the various Districts, also the Sydney Branch Team and the American contingent. 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CARNIVALS, 1968-69:

Considerable debate and concern surrounded the allocation of the Australian Championships to Tasmania and, more precisely, to the proposal of that State Centre to conduct the series of carnivals over two week-ends.

The Sydney Branch and the N.S.W. State Centre originally opposed the

proposal, but it was carried at the National Council, largely by the support of the smaller States and most Clubs then made their arrangements accordingly.

During May, the Victorian State Centre gave notice of motion that the Carnivals should be conducted over one week-end only and this rescission motion was carried. It was hoped that the Tasmanian State Centre would have selected the second of the original two proposed dates and also named the venue to be Burnie, since most Clubs had bookings and travelling arrangements already finalised in this regard. However, the Tasmanian State Centre saw fit to lodge another motion requesting entirely different dates of March 7. 8 and 9 and this matter being put to a postal vote, was carried by a strong majority of the other States, with N.S.W. opposing.

The scene for the Championships is still somewhat clouded, in so far as many Clubs who had originally anticipated strong contingents were then faced with the prospect of cancelling both accommodation and travel arrangements and endeavouring to finalise same for an alternate week-end; also, the many Club members who had arranged their annual holidays to coincide with the originally proposed dates, then found the situation changed.

We can, of course, only extend our best wishes to the Tasmanian State Centre and trust that they will be able to overcome the enormous difficulties which are now confronting them and wish them every success with the Carnivals, which will now be conducted at Clifton Beach, near Hobart.

The N.S.W. State Championships in 1968-69 will be conducted at Corrimal Beach on February 1 and 2.

The Metropolitan Championships are, of course, conducted on a rotation basis and the Carnival in 1969 will be held at Collaroy Beach, on Saturday. January 18.

The 1969 Interbranch Championships are to be conducted in the Central Coast Branch on Sunday, February 16.

Details of venues for the Sydney Branch Championships and also the Interdistrict carnival will be finalised at the Annual General Meeting.

DOOR KNOCK APPEAL, NOVEMBER 4 and 5, 1967.

Undoubtedly, one of the most controversial schemes adopted over recent years was the Door Knock Appeal conducted early in November. Many Clubs and individuals were critical of the proposal, but even the sternest critics must agree that the financial return was rewarding.

Some Clubs organised their resources to the fullest and they would be the best judges of whether the funds received reached their expectations, but in all cases, Clubs who took part in the Door Knock received monies that would not otherwise have been forthcoming.

A high degree of co-operation was received from various Councils throughout the Sydney Metropolitan Area and to these Councils we extend our thanks.

It would be true to say that the return to the Clubs was directly in proportion to the effort expended and those Clubs who mustered only a small number of members were still rewarded with a handsome income; indeed, the smallest return by any Club was \$461.00. As opposed to this, the North Cronulla Club's net income of \$1,991.00 was an outstanding feat.

The Branch had retained the services of Mr. John Pope, a professional organiser of such appeals and Mr. Pope discharged his duties quite diligently. Overall expenses for the Appeal were kept to a minimum and a number of voucher books, etc., which were printed and not used, could be utilised in future Appeals.

The Branch, itself, benefited to the extent of \$1,100.00 and to all those Clubs and individual members who took part in the appeal, we extend our very sincere appreciation of their efforts and we trust that the financial return of over \$11,000.00 within the Branch, will tempt their consideration of conducting a similar appeal in the future.

We must also, at this stage, record our appreciation to the Branch Treasurer, John Vaughan, for his careful attending to the various matters arising from the Appeal and in particular, to Peter Stapleton, for a most thorough audit.

CHARITY BOWLS DAY, JULY 28, 1968:

We were again indebted to the Canterbury-Bankstown League Social Bowling Club and the Lakemba Bowling Club for their continued support in staging the second of what we now trust will be an annual Charity Bowls Day.

A greater degree of co-operation was forthcoming from the Clubs than on the previous occasion and it is with pleasure we note the funds raised were in excess of \$400.00. To Mr. Jack Johnson, the Hon. Organiser, and indeed all the organising committee, we extend a very sincere thank you.

#### ASSOCIATION GEAR.

In our constant striving for greater efficiency from our gear, we have witnessed a number of innovations and new items of equipment being introduced over the concluding season. A safety release belt, based upon the release belt in use in South Africa, has now been approved for use immediately in N.S.W. by the State Centre and it is anticipated that this belt will very quickly replace the now superceded Ross Safety Belt. The principle of the new belt, which will be known as the "Type SA" belt, is a considerable improvement over the Ross Belt and will undoubtedly be welcomed by the Clubs.

Polythene surf lines have been giving unsatisfactory service and constant reference to this item of equipment has been made in various reports to and from the N.S.W. State Centre. The matter reached a crisis towards the close of the season and the N.S.W. State Centre then forbid the use of any polythene surf lines by the Clubs.

Of a less radical nature, but nevertheless quite important, has been the rapid increase of the popularity of the tubular steel surf reel over the previous timber reel. Two models of the metal reels are now available in addition to the timber reels, so the Clubs are afforded an excellent opportunity in this regard to seek out a piece of equipment which best serves their purposes.

Of a domestic nature, the Branch has now forbidden the use of metal buoy markers, etc., in surf boat racing and it is anticipated that a new polythene boat buoy will be available for use in competition in the coming season.

Previous mention has been made of the Gear Trailer supplied to the Sydney Branch by the B.P. Company and largely equipped by very generous donations from various business houses.

Mention must also be made at this stage of the Branch Gear Steward and Deputy Superintendent, Albert Moseley, and we are indeed appreciative of this gentleman for his accommodation of the Gear Trailer at his home.

#### FINANCE.

The Branch at present is in a very sound financial position. During the year, we were able to transfer \$3,000 into investments and we also purchased new equipment for the office and equipment to assist in the conducting of carnivals.

Our income exceeded the expenditure by \$1,215 and this was due mainly to the Door Knock Appeal conducted in November. Not included is the \$419 raised in July at the Bowls Day and this will further strengthen our position. In general, all sources of income increased, but to some degree this was offset by higher expenditure.

Thanks are due to the Officers and delegates for their help in financial matters and particularly those who assisted in the Door Knock and Bowls Day. Thanks also to the Auditor, Peter Stapleton, for auditing the books and assistance during the season.

Many personnel changes have been made in the State Centre over recent years and it is pleasing to note the influx of new delegates and Officers who, in combination with the more experienced Officers, have given the N.S.W. State Centre a strong background of administrative ability.

We have conducted our affairs with the State Centre most harmoniously and we must also congratulate the State Superintendent, Mr. Lionel McDonald and the Hon. Registrar, Mr. Jack O'Reilly, for the manner in which they have carried out their duties.

The Publicity Officer, Mr. John Beasley, has been diligent in his duties and was instrumental in the conducting of a press conference early in the season.

The National Council season has been a very full one and it is anticipated that 1968-69 will make even greater demands with the conducting of the Instructional Conference and virtually all handbooks being under full-scale revision.

To the National Superintendent, Mr. Jack Dearlove, we also extend our congratulations for his task well done. Similarly, we extend our appreciation to the other Officers and Delegates of the National Council for their diligent attention to their duties.

The N.S.W. State Centre is represented on the National Council by Messrs.

C.K. Asmussen and G.B. Staunton.

The National Council was instrumental in bringing the Rothmans Insurance Scheme to full fruition and to the Rothmans Company, we extend our appreciation of their very tangible support and their financial assistance.

It has been resolved that a meeting of the International Council will be held next season during the period of May to July and all States and Branches are currently being asked to lodge submissions in this respect. Finally, but by no means least, the National Council has recently announced that a further donation of \$6,000.00 has been received from an anonymous donor. This anonymous donor has been a consistent supporter of the Association over recent seasons and with this further donation, the total funds received have now reached the staggering figure of \$37,000.00. To this unknown donor, we can only extend our very sincere appreciation on behalf of each and every member of our Surf Clubs.

#### JUVENILE ASSOCIATION.

The Sydney Branch Juvenile Association has continued to flourish as a somewhat autonomous body and there have been periods throughout the season when the Branch has lost contact with the Nippers' activities. However, a recent change of office in the Juvenile Association may, we trust, result in an improvement in liaison.

Concern has been expressed both in the Sydney Branch and in the Sydney Juvenile Association at some of the trends which are taking shape in the State Juvenile section. Proposals are being considered by that State body for the issuing of their own Meritorious Awards, Resuscitation Certificates, etc., and it is generally agreed within Sydney Branch that these developments were not originally intended in the formation of a Juvenile Association.

It was originally envisaged to be a "feeder" movement whereby Nippers would be introduced to the basics of surf life saving and as they turned of age, they would be channeled into the various surf clubs. In many respects, of course, this basic intention is still being observed, but there are growing tendencies that the movement is developing into an operation slightly different and concern has been expressed that the members are not being channeled into surf clubs quite as soon as they could and that the issuing of such awards is not called for.

To all those gentlemen who devote so much of their time to the Nipper

movement, we extend our very sincere appreciation and trust that their efforts will continue to be crowned with success.

## B.P. - WARATAH SURF BOAT MARATHON RACE, OCTOBER 8, 1967.

At the very outset of the season, an invitation was received from the Sydney Committee, who conduct the Sydney Waratah Festival, for this Association to organise a Marathon Boat Race on the Sydney Harbour. It was further proposed that the boat race should coincide with the start of the B.P. Ocean Classic for powerboats, which entails a marathon powerboat race to Newcastle and return.

The invitation was accepted and a highly successful Marathon Surf Boat Race was staged between Watsons Bay to a finishing point off the Opera House. The Referee on the day, Mr. Albert Moseley, is to be complimented for his efficient handling of the event and it is very pleasing to note that a similar invitation has again been received to stage a Marathon Boat Race in 1968. Correspondence is currently to hand from the B.P. Company indicating that they will again support the event to the extent of a fully equipped surf reel and the Branch has resolved that the 1968 event will be conducted on Sunday, October 13.

We extend our appreciation to the B.P. Company and to those other donors who supported the event in 1967 and to the winners of the 1967 race, the Bulli S.L.S.C., our congratulations for a most creditable performance.
