20 th ANNUAL REPORT

To be presented to the 20th Annual General Meeting of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia, Sydney Branch, at the Aquatic Club, 2 Riley Street, Sydney, on Tuesday, September 9, 1969.

Mr. President, Gentlemen:

The submission of this, the 20th Annual Report for your consideration, and I trust, adoption will mark at least 63 years of operation of a number of our affiliated Clubs. Years that have been full and active ones in the formation period, and as this Report will indicate the years are still as busy now we have come into somewhat calmer waters.

It must be of considerable pride for the foundation members and all the elder Statesmen of this Association, to witness the great advances in the Life Saving Movement they nurtured and set in motion so many years ago. This Movement now has expanded to embrace the coastline of this great Continent and our methods have been adopted widely overseas.

The Surf Life Saving Association of Australia is now World famous, and the acknowledged leader in our own field. Our methods are accepted in other Countries, our touring teams continue to cover themselves with distinction, and in this whole structure, we pride ourselves upon the part played by the Sydney Branch.

We feel the Season has been a successful one, all sections have functioned well and carried out their duties to a satisfactory standard.

In this atmosphere of self praise and general well being, we would be remiss if we did not recognise our own shortcomings.

Harmony between the Branch and the Clubs has continued to be high, but the Season was unfortunately marred on a number of occasions by an apparent lack of action on the part of our Clubs to requests from the Branch. A routine matter such as the submission of Capitation lists caused considerable upset and loss of discussion time at the Branch Council Meetings. Of far worse effect was the fact that no fewer than six Clubs were disqualified from the Garie Carnival because of non receipt of their Capitations.

Difficulty was also experienced with the finalisation of Carnival dates, both open and restricted. The Branch here has a dilemma since we are anxious to foster such carnivals and the result was that applications were still being considered well into the Season.

On a much more happy note, the Patron Sub-Committee brought their affairs to a most satisfactory conclusion at the March 1969 Council meeting when Mr. W.W. Pettingell C.B.E., B.Sc. was elected as Patron of the Sydney Branch. We extend to this gentleman our very sincere appreciation for his acceptance of the position and his undoubted interest in the affairs of this Association.

Mr. Pettingell is a very busy man in the Civic affairs and business life of the City of Sydney and we do trust that his association with us will be a long and happy one.

It has been my opinion that a report such as this should be a factual record of achievements, and if necessary failures, and the most satisfactory manner to record these items is under a multitude of sub-headings. I trust the Members will find the style easy to follow and above all, accurate.

BRANCH COUNCIL.

The hub of the Branch activity is the Council Meeting held on the first Tuesday of each month. Previous reports have stressed the harmony that exists at these Council Meetings and, it is pleasing to again place on record that such harmony is still very much in evidence.

The congenial surroundings of the Aquatic Club, where the meetings are held, no doubt contributes to the enjoyment of the evening since many Delegates and Officers are members of the Club and, avail themselves of the dining room and other facilities, before and after the meeting.

The overall standard of the Delegates who attend the Council is very high, and, short but direct debates are "the order of the day" in most cases.

As Branch Secretary I have observed that in a majority of cases, the efficiency and co-operation forthcoming from Clubs in Branch affairs, is directly in relation to their interest and representation at the Council. Of the fifteen Club Presidents who are also Branch Vice-Presidents, no fewer than eight are regular attenders of a high standard.

Duplicated agendas and other material, is made available at the meeting, with the intent that Delegates will retain these items to assist their report at their own Committee meeting.

The regular inclusion of a Delegate's report at Club meetings is commended, since often matters requiring urgent attention may have to be acted upon before the receipt of the Branch circular and minutes.

A most careful examination of the attendance record of Delegates is recommended to the Clubs and, the standard in some cases is nothing short of appalling. On the other hand there are the Delegates who record attendance above reproach and it is upon these gentlemen that the functioning of the Council largely rests.

Our Congratulations are extended to Messrs. L. Hardy (Cronulla), H. Bretherton (Garie) and J. Cadet (Wanda) who have a 100% attendance record.

Mr. Moseley played a vital part in the preparation of the New South Wales material for the recent Instructional Conference. Further, Mr. Moseley attended the Conference in Tasmania as an advisor to the N.S.W. Delegate.

A number of "Field Days" are being sponsored by the Board at the commencement of the Season, and these are intended to ensure that all Clubs and Board members become conversant with the new Handbook.

The 1968 Annual Gear Stewards' Conference was well attended at the Nth Bondi Club House on the 18th September, 1968. The Annual Chief Instructors' Conference was held at Tamarama on 27th October, 1968.

The gear inspection of all equipment belonging to Branch Clubs, and also to Local Government agencies, was conducted by the Board Committee on the weekend of the 19th/20th October. Congratulations are extended to the various Clubs who had their equipment to such a high standard. Results of the competition for the "D.C. Lucas Trophy" are set out elsewhere.

Albert Moseley and Bill Swingler together with other members of the Board, were responsible for the demonstration of the Resuscitation and display at the recent Boat Show, (25th July/2nd August). Our thanks are extended to these gentlemen for their representation of the Association on this occasion.

Mention must be made at this juncture of the work carried out to a most satisfactory standard by the Deputy Superintendent Mr. "Nick" Dixon. Mr. Dixon has recently advised that he will not be seeking re-election to this position since his commitments in the N.S.W. State Centre and the Cronulla S.L.S.C. will obviously command the majority of his time.

AWARDS.

The comparison of Award figures over recent years shows a great deal of fluctuation, but the concluding Season seems to strike a low note. The total figure of 388 Awards is only slightly above the 1961-62 season of 375.

We are led to believe that this low number of Awards is similar in other Branches.

The drop in Awards is all the more confusing since membership figures remain somewhat steady.

Whilst these figures are less than previous seasons on a comparison basis, they still represent an enormous amount of work being carried out by the various Chief Instructors and their assistants in the Clubs. To these gentlemen we extend our appreciation and congratulations upon their efforts.

RESCUES

The very basis of our existence is the saving of lives from the surf or, the prevention of circumstances in which a bather may be placed in potential danger.

In this, we record our efficiency with no fewer than 1,141 rescues being carried out. Comparison of figures over a number of years shows a steady decline in rescues and whilst no figures are available for attendances at beaches, we feel these must be on the increase.

Hitherto we have claimed the decline in rescues as testimony to the preventive measures taken by our beach patrols.

Whilst on the matter of rescues, we must record our appreciation and indeed admiration for the various beach Inspectors employed by the Councils who are responsible for safeguarding the beaches between those times when they are patrolled by the members of a Club.

Many of these beach Inspectors carry out most difficult rescues under hazardous conditions unaided, and, we record our appreciation of their efforts in ensuring that the Sydney beaches remain the playground of millions.

MEMBERSHIP

Whilst the overall membership figure at 5,028 is the highest for many years if not an all time high, the main increases are in the category of "Other" and "Associate".

The two vital figures are in the "Active" and "Cadet" division, and whilst the Active members remain amazingly steady, the Cadet category does not show the rapid or even steady growth that the formation of the Nipper Association would have led us to expect.

This report is not being critical of the work being done by the Juvenile Association, far from it. However, it would have been anticipated that even hundreds of new Cadets would have been introduced into the ranks of the Senior Clubs each year, and this is obviously not the case.

A number of perplexing questions are posed that cannot be answered without careful examination and research.

N.S.W. STATE CENTRE.

One of the most singular important events on the State scene this season, was from a Sydney Branch point of view, the successful nomination of Mr. Nick Dixon as State Secretary. Nick also holds the position of Deputy Branch Superintendent, and President of the Cronulla S.L.S.C. He has carried out his duties to a high standard and has been instrumental in the administration of the N.S.W. State Centre being placed on a high level.

Mrs. Joan Vaughan, needs no introduction to the members of this Branch and has taken up an appointment as office Secretary to the State Centre. Her competent handling of affairs in the office is sincerely appreciated by all concerned.

We take this opportunity of extending congratulations to the State Officers, especially Mr. Con Asmussen as President, Mr. A. Whelpton as Treasurer, and Mr. H. McDonald as Superintendent for the manner in which they have carried out their duties. Special thanks to Registrar, Jack O'Reilly for his competent handling of our awards.

The financial outlook, Statewise, is not a happy one and during the season an application was made to the State Government for an increased grant. The result of this application is not yet known, but the situation has become critical. The original budget provided for a cut of \$1,000.00 in the allocation to Branches, but this was avoided only by depleting one of the Touring fund accounts for this season.

Sydney Branch will receive \$1,000.00 under the present allocation as also will Manly-Warringah, Central Coast, and Newcastle. Illawarra Branch received \$1,170.00. Details of the allocation of the State Grant are as follows:

Administration \$7,000.00 State Team \$1,000.00 Interbranch Carnival \$2,000.00

Branches \$8,000.00 Instruction \$3,000.00

During the season the State Council adopted a "Learn to Surf" Campaign for the coming summer months. Whilst the details have not yet been finalised, undoubtedly Sydney Branch will be involved.

A scheme for an improved Insurance coverage for our members was originally put forward by the Coogee Club, and eventually adopted by the State Centre. This scheme which is presently being considered by the State Government provides for a Worker's Compensation basis similar to that enjoyed by Bush Fire Fighters. Mr. G. Cahill of the Coogee Club has been the chief architect of the proposals and we are indebted to him for the detail and knowledge contained in his submissions.

A Surf Boat order form originally conceived in the Sydney Branch and prepared by our Legal Advisor, Mr. W.A.T. Crain, was adopted by the State Centre for use by all Clubs.

Sydney Delegates to the State Centre have been Messrs. G.B. Staunton, and J.K. Vaughan. Both of these gentlemen have now held these positions for many years.

NATIONAL COUNCIL.

The 1968-69 Season will long be remembered by the States and Delegates as one of the most active and controversial in the history of the National Council.

At the 1968 Annual General Meeting, the Sydney Secretary, Mr. G.B. Staunton carrying the endorsement of N.S.W. and the support of two other States opposed the present Secretary-Treasurer, Mr. K. Watson. The resulting deadlock of "3 States All" resulted in the position being retained by Mr. Watson. There were several disconcerting factors involved not the least of which was a strong suggestion that Mr. Watson was about to announce his retirement. However, no announcement was forthcoming until July, and Mr. Watson's resignation took effect as at the 31st July.

A Sydney Branch nominee, Mr. Harry Brown had been successfully elected as Assistant Secretary at the Annual Meeting, and at the present time is carrying on the duties of Secretary-Treasurer. Mr. Brown, who is Registrar of the Sydney Branch and President of the Nth Cronulla S.L.S.C. has carried out his National Duties in a manner which reflects great credit upon himself and the Sydney Branch.

We must record in the pages of this report our appreciation and admiration of the manner in which Mr. Watson has carried out his duties as Secretary since the inception of the National Council.

Together with the President, Judge Sir Adrian Curlewis he has been responsible for the high standing of the National Council in the community.

The most important instructional event of the Season was the Instructional Conference held in Tasmania immediately prior to the Australian Championships.

The National Superintendent, Mr. Jack Dearlove is to be congratulated for the manner in which the affairs of the Conference were conducted and brought to a satisfactory conclusion. The amount of work performed by Mr. Dearlove over the Season would be staggering in its bulk and diversity.

Special mention should be made of Mr. Doig who acted as Conference Secretary and was largely responsible for the recording of the Conference findings.

By no means least in this National activity was the preparation of a new Constitution. The magnitude of this task was only surpassed by the ability of the special sub-committee comprising Walter Crain, Ron Tallon and Con Asmussen. In his capacity as Legal Advisor, Mr. Crain carried the brunt of the work and we can only record a humble "Thank you" for a task well done.

One of the more prominent items to come out of the altered constitution, is the separation of the Position of National Secretary and Treasurer.

Following the conclusion of the National Council meeting held on the 1st and 2nd of August, Australia acted as host to a meeting of the International Council. The outcome of this Conference is highly doubtful, no doubt in part due to the long lapse in International meetings. It is pleasing to witness the enthusiasm for the International Council's renewed role, from such members as U.S.A., South Africa, New Zealand, and others. Present indications are that the Council will meet again in the comparatively near future.

CHARITY BOWLS DAY, 31ST AUGUST, 1969.

As this report is prepared, plans are well afoot for the charity bowls day to be conducted at the Lakemba Bowling Club on Sunday 31st August.

The previous annual report carried details of the 1968 Bowls Day, and we are indeed grateful to the Canterbury-Bankstown League Club-Social Bowling Club for their support of this Association.

Thanks must also be extended to the Lakemba Bowling Club for their hospitality on previous occasions.

COMPETITIONS 1969-70.

The Mobil Surf Reel won by the Branch team at the N.S.W. Interbranch Championships has been allocated to a Patrol Efficiency Competition to be conducted in the coming season.

Details of the contest have been resolved and promulgated to the Clubs. Points will be allocated based on the attendance of Patrol members, their knowledge of various Life Saving procedures, etc. The Board of Examiners will furnish the necessary inspection panels.

SOUTH SYDNEY - EASTERN SUBURBS LIFE SAVERS' EQUIPMENT FUND.

One of the most heartening gestures of support over many years has been the establishment and efficient functioning of the Equipment Fund.

Drawing its support from licensed Clubs and public minded citizens in the South Sydney and Eastern Suburbs area, it is responsible for the allocation of a vast amount of equipment to the Surf Clubs in the district.

To the Chairman Mr. Ray O'Keeffe, the Officers and supporters of the Fund we record our very sincere appreciation.

It is to be regretted that a similar scheme formed in the Sutherland Shire some years ago, did not flourish and appears to have become ineffective.

Whilst on the matter of spontanious public support, we must record appreciation to the Lions Club of Botany/Mascot, Maroubra and Randwick for their efforts to finance a Jet Rescue Boat for Maroubra and South Maroubra Clubs.

LIFE MEMBERS.

The highest honour the Branch can be stow on one of its members is the granting of the coverted office of Life Membership. Should the activities of such a member have been on a State wide basis a similar honour can be bestowed by the N.S.W. State Centre. The final sequence of this order can be "Life Member of the Association" which is bestowed by the National Council.

The large number of Sydney Branch members who have been granted this award by State Centre and National Council reflects great credit upon themselves and the Branch.

Branch Life Member and Treasurer, former Board Secretary, Secretary of Burning Palms, John Vaughan was made a Life Member of the N.S.W. State Centre at the 1968 Annual Meeting.

John, and former Sydney Branch Superintendent Hector McDonald, were presented with their Life Membership Badges at the State Championships held at Corrimal.

Unfortunately, time takes its toll of all ranks and it is with deep regret that we record the passing of Life Member Harry Small. Over recent years, Harry has lived in the north of the State and has not been active in Association affairs, but in years gone by he had given sterling service and will be long remembered by his contemporaries of that time.

We record our very sincere congratulations to Life Member, Vince Williams who was awarded the M.B.E. by Her Majesty the Queen in the June List of Honours. Vince was honoured for his activity on behalf of crippled children and other charitable pursuits.

TOUR OF NEW ZEALAND BY COUNTRY BRANCHES.

In part, as a recognition of the financial and other support that has been forthcoming from the Country Branches over many years, for State and Australian Teams; it was decided to conduct a visit to New Zealand by a team from the Country Branches during December 1969.

This support from the Country areas for State and Overseas teams, should be all the more significant in view of the fact that they rarely have members included in such tours.

The loc per head levy for the South African Tour alone was a financial burden which they knew would have little return locally.

Following deliberations at State Centre, it was resolved to finance the trip by the conducting of an Art Union. An allocation of Art Union books based upon the membership figures, was made to each Club in the State. The response both in Sydney and elsewhere has been well below expectations with in some cases, some Clubs returning almost all books unsold. On the other hand some Clubs sold their allocation and have applied for additional stocks but these are in a minority.

It is hoped that the Art Union will be a success since tremendous principle and prestige is involved not only for the Country Branches but also for all Branches in the State who have been asked to assist, and also for the State of N.S.W. as a whole since we have sanctioned the tour and have negotiated with New Zealand upon the various details.

The Sydney Branch donated \$150.00 towards the outfitting of the team, and this gesture has been acknowledged and appreciated by the Branches involved.

We extend our congratulations to the Tour Manager, Max Sabien, and the Instructor Bill Singleton upon their election, and also our appreciation to the Art Union promotor Mr. Hector McDonald for his efforts in this matter which will benefit Life Saving throughout the Country area.

ADMINISTRATION.

The administration and secretarial affairs of the Branch, whilst being coordinated by myself as Hon. Secretary, are a somewhat disjointed system.

Possibly for far too long, we have been dependent upon the kindness of many people who have a wide range of typing, duplicating, and other matters attended to.

When Manly-Warringah left the overall Sydney Branch in 1961, the burden of the office in Hunter Street was too much, and a scheme was proposed by the finance committee of the day, that we withdraw from the three way arrangement with National Council and State Centre. The proposal was that the Branch make a monitory contribution to the Secretary, to have all the administration conducted from his own office. The saving to the Branch is now well in excess of \$2,000.00 per annum.

The amount passed for payment each month as the "Secretary's allowance" is in reality this contribution towards administration.

As previous reports have recorded, we have for years been indebted to Mrs. Joan Vaughan for the majority of typing and duplicating for both the Branch and the Board of Examiners. Since her appointment as office secretary for the N.S.W. State Centre, we have endeavoured to reduce this burden, and the majority of correspondence, minutes and circulars have been attended to by my wife Ellen.

Joan has kindly continued to prepare minutes and circulars for the Board, and to complete the picture the normal every day affairs of the Branch have been attended to by my own office secretaries.

To all of these people we can only record our very sincere appreciation and assure them of our continued gratitude.

PUBLICITY OFFICER'S REPORT.

Sydney Branch received encouraging support from the Press, Radio and Television stations throughout the season.

While much publicity was concerned with Surf Carnivals, the "Sporting Side" of Life Saving, attention was also drawn to Surf safety - for every help the Branch extends thanks and appreciation.

Many of the Branch Clubs made use of the avenues open to promote both their own activities, and the "image" of Life Saving to the public.

The continued strength of the movement must come through public support and awareness of the work involved in keeping our beaches safe for all.

However, during the season there were instances of public questioning of the Association's efficiency in performing rescues. Whilst Club members were aware that the claims were more sensational than factual, little attempt was made by the Association to answer the questions raised.

More emphasis needs to be placed on publicity by the National and State Councils, to help Clubs in their promotion of the movement.

As Publicity Officer, I would like to extend appreciation to the Mirror, Telegraph, Sun and Herald newspapers. To Radio Stations 2SM, 2UE, 2UV, 2KY, and 2GB. To Television Stations 9, 10, and 7, and the sporting Department of the A.B.C. and A.A.P.

My personal thanks in particular to Bill Jenkings (Mirror), Tom Higgins (Telegraph), Jim McAuley (Sun), Alan Wood (Herald), Garvin Rutherford (2SM), Ron Casey (Channel 9), Jim Shepherd (Channel 10), Rex Mossop (Channel 7), and to Tiger Black.

PATROL HOURS.

A number of Clubs do request and are granted exemptions from these times, but each application is referred to the appropriate District Supervisor for his recommendation.

Clubs are reminded that they should apply early in the Season if they intend to request exemptions. Where Clubs do not patrol the standard hours, certain conditions apply, not the least of which is the requirement that a public notice be erected on the beach to advise the patrolled hours, and also that patrol members remain on the beach till 6 p.m. if bathers are still in the water.

FINANCE.

The Income and Expenditure report shown in this report show a comparison of this and last year's financial activities. Although the Balance Sheet shows a loss of \$111 it will be seen that for the first time in many years we showed a loss on the Branch Championships due to the increase in the allocation for Trophies. The Branch also subsidised the South African Tour and Branch Officials to the Australian Championships in Tasmania.

The Branch's fund raising activities were limited and our thanks to those who assisted with donations, etc., in this regard. Particular thanks to the Canterbury-Bankstown Leagues Club Social Bowling Club and the Lakemba Bowling Club for their combined day on our behalf.

The Branch's thanks as well as my own go to our Auditor Peter Stapleton for his assistance and the audit of the Branch accounts. He reported in part as follows:

"After providing for all known liabilities and expenses including Depreciation \$312, Expenditure exceeded Income by \$111. This is lower by \$1,326 than the Excess of Income over Expenditure of \$1,215 earned for the year ended 30 June 1968. The main difference between 1968/69 income and 1967/68 being the Door Knock Appeal proceeds. In my opinion the Branch Finances remain in a very sound position.

The Lakemba Bowling Club continues to render an outstanding contribution to Branch Funds. It is anticipated that the function this year will result in an even greater donation from this organization and kindred bodies associated with the Charity Bowls Day.

I take this opportunity of expressing my appreciation of the courtesy and co-operation extended to me throughout the year by the Branch President, Hon Secretary and Hon Treasurer."


