SEASON 1974-75

Gentlemen,

I am pleased, on behalf of the Branch Superintendent and Officers of the Board to present this 26th Annual Report covering the activities of the Board Members during the past season.

This season, as in customary, has been an active one for Members of the Board. Major activity was in the sphere of resuscitation where work was concentrated in instructing Members of the Board together with club members for the Advanced Resuscitation Certificate. This is reflected in the large increase in the number of awards. This increase in the number of awards has also been influenced by the increase in Resuscitation Certificates and the inclusion of Power Boat Bronze Medallions.

On the carnival side of the work the usual restricted number of open carnivals were held together with the traditional inter - and intra - club and district competitions for which the Board provided officials.

During the season training and examinations for the Advanced Resuscitation Certificate have been carried out at Wanda, Cronulla and finally at the Community Centre, Caringbah.

The season started well with John Dewey being re-elected Honorary Superintendent whilst former Examination Supervisor John May became his Deputy.

These two men have worked extremely hard during the season and have spent many hours in conjunction with our Hon. Medical Officers in analysing and improving the Advanced Resuscitation Certificate examination technique.

Long Service Member Perc Ainsworth was elected as Examination Supervisor and has carried out the work in this exacting position with zeal.

After a number of years as Southern Side Supervisor he became Hon. Superintendent of Sydney Branch for five seasons from 1954 to 1959.

The sincere sympathy of the Board is extended to his wife Belle.

EXAMINATIONS AND AWARDS

Requests submitted from Branch Clubs resulted in 56 examination days being held and due to several examinations being held on different beaches on the one day there were 80 examination locations. At these examinations 142 squads were presented. This is exclusive of Advanced Resuscitation Certificate examinations. In that area 175 awards were made before Christmas 1974 as a result of examinations at Wanda. During the same period 15 Advanced Resuscitation Certificates were gained at Cronulla whilst the remaining 52 were gained at the Community Centre, Caringbah.

In addition our Board Members examined candidates for the Advanced Resuscitation Certificate from other Branches which results in a grand total of 252 Advanced Resuscitation Certificates.

With the influx of Resuscitation Certificates, due mainly to North Cronulla's "Pool Safety" course and Advanced Resuscitation Certificates the grand total of awards is somewhat inflated.

What should be noted, however, is the drop in the basic life saving award, the Bronze Meddallion, from 281 to 240. This does not auger well for beach patrols. One saving grace is the increase in the number of Qualifying Certificates.

The award of Power Boat Bronze Medallion was introduced last season and it is pleasing to note that 26 medallions of this new award were gained.

The appointment of Examiners was capably handled by the new Examination Supervisor Perc Ainsowrth.

As a result of the general diligence of the District Supervisors the failure rate was kept low and they should be congratulated on their efforts.

CARNIVALS

Again the Branch Superintendent, John Dewey, was in charge of the appointment of Carnival Officials. As in the previous season his efforts were again hampered by the lack of Board Members applying for carnival positions.

In accordance with the Branch's continuing policy six carnivals including the Branch Championships at Elouera and the Inter-Cities championships at Bondi were conducted in the Branch together with the Inter-District Carnival run by Cronulla and Elouera.

One special Carnival was approved by the Branch this being the Channel 10 Colour T.V. Carnival held at Bondi.

Board members again assisted at Manly-Warringah Branch Carnivals.

Sydney Branch Board, in addition, provided members to assist in the running of the Metropolitan Championships at Newport, the State Championships at Redhead/Swansea Belmont and the Australian Championships at Dee Why.

As Surf carnivals are a vital link in the fitness chain of Club members the thanks of the Board is extended to the Clubs in the Branch which undertook the difficult task of organising carnivals. Furthermore, the Board appreciates the post carnival hospitality which the Clubs extend to its members.

Whilst on the subject of carnivals the many restricted competitions held in districts and in addition intra-club events must be mentioned. These events require the services of Board Members which are given freely.

The Annual Gear Inspection and D.C. Lucas Trophy Competition were conducted by the Gear Inspection Committee on the 19th and 20th October 1974.

The competition was won by Burning Palms with 100% (20 Items Examined), whilst Garie was second with 99.719% (35 Items Examined) and South Maroubra was third with 99.643% (24 Items Examined).

The Board extends its congratulations to Burning Palms for its second win in three seasons on each occasion with 100%.

The hospitality extended by the various Clubs to the Gear Inspection Committee is greatly appreciated.

Health Commission the classes are held at the Caringbah Community Clinic, classes are also held at Coogee and North Bondi Club-houses. The Advanced Resuscitation Committee under the guidance of Dr. Ian Mackie are to be congratulated for their time and efforts over the year. Board members Frank Osborne I.C. Dave Medlin, Solly Stephens, Trevor Elliott, Keith Messenger, Mick De Luca and Peter Quartley are the guiding panel of this committee and with their medical Associates Drs. Carnivals were again conducted at a very high standard, by the few Board Officials who turn up week after week. Unfortunately the running of Carnivals is always left to the few, I was always under the impression, that Carnivals were a Board Members duty!

Examinations were held practically every weekend, and on many week nights for the Resuscitation Certificate groups, the appointments of Examiners and the compilation of awards was expertly handled by Percy Ainsworth our Examination Supervisor.

Introducing our newer members was the province on Deputy Superintendent John May, he has handled this and the regular inspection of Clubs in a first class manner.
