27th ANNUAL REPORT Season 1975-76

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Gentlemen,

I now present the 27th Annual Report, which covers the activities of the Board members during the 1975-76 season. This report is submitted on behalf of the Branch Superintendent and his Officers for consideration by the Board members at the Annual General Meeting.

This season has again been a busy one for the members of the Board, as will be seen from the number of examinations conducted where there was a considerable increase from last season. This, of course, has resulted in a sizeable increase in the number of awards. Included for the first time among the awards are Inshore Rescue Boat Bronze Medallions.

In respect to carnivals, the usual number of open carnivals, including the Metropolitan Championships, was held, together with a number of inter and intraclub and district competitions, officials for which were provided by the Board.

John Dewey was once again at the helm as Honorary Superintendent, with John May as his Deputy. Unfortunately, John May found it necessary to resign from office in February, and his place was taken by Long Service Member, Keith Messenger.

These men have worked well during the season, though at times lacking the full support of the members.

Perc Ainsworth was elected again as Examination Supervisor and was kept busy by the increased examination activity.

Membership.

Life Membership. First in the membership category comes the Board's congratulations to Kevin Andrews (Tamarama SLSC) on his election as a Life Member of Sydney Branch. Kevin has been a keen and busy member of the Board for many years and deserves the honour conferred. We know he will continue the good work in the seasons to come.

Our congratulations, also, go to Albert (Ike) Moseley, on being elected a Life Member of the Surf Life Saving Assn of Australia. His election is a just reward for the tremendous amount of work he has done for Surf Life Saving.

Examinations and Awards.

Requests submitted from Branch Clubs resulted in 95 examination days being held and, due to a number of examinations being held on different beaches on the one day, there were 105 examination locations. At these examinations, 197 squads were presented. This is exclusive of Advanced Resuscitation Certificate examinations.

All Advanced Resuscitation Certificate examinations, with the exception of 19 awards granted in New Zealand as a result of a visit by Dr.Ian Mackie, were carried out at the Community Centre, Caringbah.

It should be noted that under the terms of granting the Advanced Resuscitation Certificate, re-examination must be carried out every two years, unless the holder is a current member of a Board of Examiners. Accordingly, with this award now two years old, increasing numbers of holders will be coming forward for refresher courses and re-examination. This is a problem which still has to be solved in relation to administration efficiency.

The large number of Resuscitation Certificates is again mainly due to the various "Pool Safety" courses held during the season.

It is pleasing to see that the number of awards has risen by over 30% and even more pleasing to note a 43% increase in Bronze Medallions and an 18% gain in Qualifying Certificates, despite a 23% decrease in Instructors Certificates.

The lack of Instructors and Trainee Instructors was noted early in the season by the Board and a recommendation was made to the Branch in this regard.

It should be noted that the Inshore Rescue Boat Bronze Medallion appears in the statistics for the first time.

The appointment of Examiners was efficiently handled by Examination Supervisor, Perc Ainsworth, but it is necessary to report that examiners were not so efficient in their attendance at examinations.

With the increase in the number of squads presented, more work was thrown onto the District Supervisors and their Assistants. They rose to the occasion and, as a result of their diligence, examination failures were minimal.

Carnivals.

As is the usual practice, John Dewey, the Branch Superintendent, was in charge of the appointment of Carnival Officials. Lack of Board members applying for carnival duty was again evident and it was necessary for non-volunteering members to be appointed to positions at several carnivals.

The Branch continued with its policy of six open carnivals and these included the Branch Championships at South Maroubra and the Metropolitan Championships at Wanda, plus the Inter-Districts Carnival at Cronulla.

Sydney Branch Board also supplied members to assist in the running of the State Championships at Kempsey-Crescent Head/ South West Rocks and the Australian Championships at Clifton Beach, Tasmania.

The Sydney Branch was also the venue for the first National Inshore Rescue Boat Carnival and the Board supplied the Referee and officials for this carnival.

Several Board members were also regular attenders at Manly-Warringah carnivals.

A number of members also travelled to Avoca Beach to help with the Intercities Championships.

The Board supplied members for the many restricted competitions held in Districts and for intraclub events, when requested. These restricted competitions are now becoming major events and in the future, when Board members are required, it will be necessary for a full programme of events to be submitted, so that these mini-carnivals can be fully staffed.

In completing this section, mention must be made of the Clubs running carnivals. Without these, the competition so necessary for the efficiency of Club members would not be available. The Board extends its thanks to these Clubs and expresses its appreciation for the after-carnival hospitality so often provided.

There was one matter considered by the Meritorious Awards Committee and it has been postponed, awaiting further information. Another application for an award has been received, which has yet to be discussed.

The Resuscitation Committee had one formal meeting together with a number of informal ones relating to the Advanced Resuscitation Certificate.

The Life Membership Review Committee elected in the 1974-75 season continued with its activities with the result that a number of members could be nominated for that honour.

The majority of meetings was held at the Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club and the Board's thanks are extended to Maroubra for making their facilities available.

Apart from the regular monthly meetings, the Board organised the following functions,

- Gear Stewards' and Gear Inspectors' Conference at Cronulla Carnival Organisers' Conference at Coogee Two R. & R. Seminars at Wanda
- Board Seminar weekend at Caldercott, Royal National Park Board Emergency Services Field Day at Coogee

It is disappointing to report that the Seminar and Field Day were poorly attended by Board members, thus detracting somewhat from the effectiveness of these functions.

As a result of the Branch's decision to have the annual gear inspection before the start of the season, the inspection and D.C.Lucas Trophy competition were conducted by the Gear Inspection Committee on September 27 and 28, 1975.

The competition resulted in an amazing quadruple dead-heat, with four Clubs scoring 100%. These were Bondi (37 items examined), Coogee (27 items examined), Garie (24 items examined) and North Cronulla (44 items examined).

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The Board congratulates these Clubs for their fine efforts.

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The hospitality extended by the various Clubs to the Gear Inspection Committee is greatly appreciated.

The District Supervisors have again been efficient in their activities and have attended to the many duties associated with their position. Jack Young, No.4 District Supervisor, has also suffered ill health during the season, but has been able to attend to his duties satisfactorily.

The Board expresses its appreciation to the members of the Power Surf Boat Panel and the crews which manned the Branch and District Power Surf Boats at carnivals. Without their help, carnivals would be more difficult to stage.

On the Board's behalf, I would like to thank Branch Officers and the secretarial staff at Illawarra Road, Marrickville, early in the season, and at "Surf House", currently, for their assistance and support.

Finally, to the Officers and members of the Board who have helped with Board activities, I offer my thanks and appreciation for their efforts.
