

Gentlemen,

I have the pleasure of submitting for consideration and adoption, the 28th Annual Report of the Sydney Branch, Surf Life Saving Association of Australia.

Without a doubt, the Season has been a most active one for all Branch Clubs and their members.

The Branch Office, now securely located at Surf Life Saving Association headquarters, SURF HOUSE, has benefitted. Having the distinct advantage of being located within the same precincts as NSW State Centre and National Council, many "fringe benefits" seem to

rub off for the benefit of the Branch administration. My personal thanks are sent to 3 ladies who have been grand supports for Sydney Branch once again, in the administrative sphere. I refer, of course, to Joan, Carol and Barbara whose efforts have been really appreciated by us all. Thanks girls!

We suffered a body blow with the enforced resignation of Mobile Services Director, Gus Staunton during the season. His expertise and drive has long been a strong support in this area of Branch activity. We have valued his services and say a sincere thank you to Gus for a job well done.

The "flagship" of the Mobile Services of Sydney Branch, The Wales Surf Rescue Helicopter continued a year long vigil of Sydney and Manly-Warringah beaches. As well, missions inland and to unpatrolled areas gave relief and comfort to many persons in distress. To our sponsors, the BANK of NEW SOUTH WALES who provide the sum of over \$78,000 for the Service, we record our thanks and appreciation on behalf of all surf life savers.

Our working relations with National Executive Director, Gus Staunton and NSW State Centre continue to be most harmonious.

On the beachfront, in the heat of competition, Sydney Branch Clubs and individual members, have once again distinguished themselves in all Championship Carnivals. The Branch colours of blue and gold have been well to the fore all season. Our Branch Team continued their dominance by winning the recently revived Inter Branch Championship point score competition held this year in the Manly-Warringah Branch by the Collaroy Club.

BOARD OF EXAMINERS

Last Season, the Board membership was 100, divided into 17 Life members, 17 Long Service members, 55 Active members, 10 Probationary members and 1 Country member.

John Dewey continued at the helm as Hon. Superintendent whilst the Season commenced with Keith Messenger as Hon. Deputy Superintendent. Keith moved away from Sydney and then John May took the position. Percy Ainsworth was our Examination Supervisor, though working under difficult conditions due to a bout of ill-health.

The re-structure of the Board has been one of the main aims during the year and the special sub-committee has spent many hours in conference with Branch Officers. It is hoped that next Season, the "new look Board of Control" will be in operation.

The Board has been somewhat handicapped due to the lack of members officiating at Carnivals. However, with the increase in the number of Active members and the re-structure, it is to be hoped the situation will be greatly improved in the future.

It is disappointing to note that only 55 holders of the Advanced Resuscitation Certificate from a total of 250 have presented themselves for re-examination after the lapse of the statutory two year period. This, of course, means that the remainder cannot use the oxy-viva for resuscitation purposes. Some 390 ARC holders will have to be re-examined next Season.

On the other hand it is pleasing to see the large number of candidates who sat for the Advanced Resuscitation Certificate Examination last season. Our hard working group of Examiners and Instructors have been kept busy during that time.

It is stressed however, that with the constant up-dating of techniques and improvement in methods, constant revision and practice are required to remain proficient in resuscitation at the advanced level.

In conclusion, on behalf of the Board of Examiners members and Officers, many thanks are extended to the Branch Officers for their assistance and support over the Season.

As I shall not be seeking nomination for the position of Hon. Secretary of the Board of Examiners next Season, I too add my thanks and appreciation to the Branch Officers for assistance and co-operation during the five years of my tenure of office.

The team assembled at 9.00 a.m. on the morning of the Championships to have a team briefing and warm up, the championship proper commenced at approximately 10.00 a.m. Throughout the day, team members competed with tremendous success against very strong opposition and by the end of the day were too strong all round and went on to a convincing win.

The team were a very determined lot, their conduct, appearance and dedication to training as well as the experience and expertise of Coach, Ted Larsen left nothing at all to be desired.

WALES HELICOPTER RESCUE SERVICE

Increased sponsorship from the Bank of New South Wales allowed the Wales Helicopter Rescue Service to operate over the full 1976-77 season.

This has allowed the helicopter to become the first SLSA rescue unit to remain on patrol over the full year, summer and winter.

Over the first nine months of the 1976-77 season, October to June, the crew of the Wales helicopter undertook 174 responses to calls, including 23 after the end of the surfing season.

The 174 separate responses resulted in:

27 people being rescued (21 from the sea, 5 from cliffs),

56 patients receiving medical or first aid (44 flown to hospital),

101 search and other missions.

Typical missions included:

Wattamolla, 31.12.76: Three men were trapped on rocks at the base of a cliff in the Royal National Park after their boat was wrecked. The helicopter crew treated the men then lifted them to safety.

Cronulla, 11.4.77: a 12-year-old boy was swept out to sea in a heavy surf. Three club members supported the boy until the helicopter arrived to lift him to the beach.

Boat Harbour, 19.12.76: A man suffered spinal injuries when dumped by a wave at isolated Boat Harbour, Kurnell. The helicopter crew treated the man, then flew in two ambulance officers to assist as he was loaded into the helicopter to be flown to Prince Henry hospital.

Bald Hill, 31.1.77: A youth fell over a cliff at Bald Hill, Stanwell Park, suffering serious injuries. The helicopter crew and duty doctor administered emergency treatment at the cliff base then flew him to hospital. The prompt treatment and quick transport allowed him to resume work only four and a half months later.

Granville, 18.1.77: The helicopter flew the Police emergency officer to the site of the Granville rail disaster and later was used to fly seriously injured patients to hospital.

As well, the helicopter flew a number of missions to help Water Police locate boats in difficulty, and on 10 mid-week days the helicopter and crew responded via the 24-hour alert system to assist in emergency situations.

In its operation, the Wales helicopter achieved close liaison with various civil emergency authorities including Police, hospitals, State Emergency Service, Coastal Patrol and council beach inspectors in Surf Life Saving's provision of the helicopter as a wide ranging community facility.

In addition to the principle support from the Bank of New South Wales, financial support also was provided by the Sport & Recreation Service of NSW and from Radio Station 2SM, who also helped by contributing to offset the cost of the "Sydney Command" radio base and jet boat duties.

The helicopter crew, drawn from surf clubs in the Sydney Branch and Manly-Warringah Branch, undertook additional training in advanced first aid through special courses organised through the Australian Red Cross Society. In addition to their patrol duty over summer, training and other SLSA duties, the crew members gave their time to allow the Service to be extended over the entire winter.

With the increased scope of duty, the Branch was able to employ a fulltime pilot, Alan Edwards, who had previously flown the helicopters on most weekends since the Service started in 1973.

Through the efforts of the Rotary Club of St Ives and the International Rotary Foundation, two members of the crew — Lex McNab and Paul Neilsen, were able to travel to New Zealand in January to link with the Auckland SLSA rescue helicopter. This allowed the Service to actively observe developments in operational techniques, and in exchange two Auckland crew members spent 10 days on duty with the Sydney crew.

The Bank of New South Wales is expected to again fund the Sydney Branch helicopter operations for the 1977-78 season.

During the approaching Season, all Branch Clubs will now be in contact with our Base Radio Room and this is very satisfying.

POWER CRAFT PANEL

This year has been an extremely fruitful one for the Power Craft Panel. Under the guidance of our new Chairman, Alan Morris, we have reached new heights of efficiency and co-operation with other Branches of the Life Saving Movement.

Our season started off with a bang, with the successful staging of a Power Craft Field Weekend at Wanda. Representatives from as far as Ballina in the north to Moruya in the south; also life savers from West Germany, New Zealand and South Australia were in attendance. Specialist lecturers gave talks on their own fields of life saving. Thanks to all those who made the weekend a success.

The Sydney branches patrol boats again protected the coastline to the extent that no lives were lost.

J.R.B. 1. (Sydney Branch Duty Boat)

Due to carnival duties the craft rarely patrolled on Saturday afternoons, but under the control of Albert Mosely, it performed its duties to the utmost until its unfortunate burning in January 1977.

J.R.B. 2. (Cronulla-North Cronulla-Elouera-Wanda)

Under the captaincy of Bob Green, J.R.B. 2. performed 38 rescues and towed 7 disabled craft to safety. The craft has been plagued with mechanical failure throughout the season and has missed some patrol days because of this. However, you can be assured that all problems will be rectified during the winter maintenance programme. The crew of J.R.B. 2. stands at about 25 with slight inflections and recessions throughout the season.

J.R.B. 3. (South Maroubra-Maroubra-Coogee-Clovelly)

It is pleasing to see that the 1976/77 season saw an increase in crew members to boost their strength to 21. With Andy Tuite in the Captain's chair, J.R.B. 3. operated more efficiently this season, mainly due to the use of their new ramp at Malabar. The craft performed 13 rescues, towed 3 disabled craft and was involved in 3 searches for missing bodies during the season. Also a new addition to the J.R.B. 3, equipment was a new short wheel base land rover to act as a prime mover for the craft. After the winter maintenance programme, full crew training will commence with the view of giving a better service in 1977/78.

J.R.B. 4. (Bronte-Tamarama-Bondi-North Bondi)

After the unfortunate burning of J.R.B. 1. off Bondi in January '77, the crew have still showed their keenness and interest, mainly due to the loyalty of Paul Hoolahan and his senior crew members. The new J.R.B. 4. has arrived from Queensland and will be operational for 1977/78 season. Before the craft burnt, this group performed 32 rescues in its area. With a crew strength of 20 and winter training under way an exciting season looks assured. The 1976/77 season has been a "season of innovation". Since the unfortunate incident at Bondi on New Years

Since the unfortunate incident at Bondi on New Years Day, Jim Poulos and Sid Stone of North Bondi have worked undyingly towards the development of an Inshore Rescue Boat powered by a small jet unit. Senior members of this panel viewed this craft in action and were amazed to see it operate in one inch of water and handle 6-8 foot waves with ease. With further work, it's easy to see that one day this will be a regular piece of life saving equipment — a job well done.

The 1977/78 season promises to be a very exciting season for this panel, commencing with a major public display at the M.I.c. Centre in September, and several field days organised with the I.R.B. Section and the Helicopter Rescue Service of the S.L.S.A.

We would like to thank all donors to our craft, the Branch and all the Clubs in the Branch, who have assisted us in our service during the season.
