Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is with great pleasure I submit to you for your consideration and adoption, the 41st Annual Report of Sydney Branch, Surf Life Saving Association of Australia Inc., covering our activities for the 1989-1990 season.

Sydney Branch patrols the coastline from Burning Palms, in the south to North Bondi. Over 2,300 Active Lifesavers, voluntarily maintained patrols every weekend and public holiday from September 23, 1989 to April 22nd, 1990 - the longest patrol season of any Branch in Australia

Every one of these Lifesavers has completed and passed an annual proficiency test, prior to November 30, before being allowed to continue rostered patrols. In these tests, our Lifesavers have to demonstrate their fitness and abilities with resuscitation and rescue techniques, using rescue boards and rescue tubes, and prove their knowledge of emergency services and radio procedures.

Examinations conducted during the season, resulted in a grand total of 1,062 Lifesaving Awards being gained by members of our fifteen Clubs. This figure is just below that of the previous season's figure of 1,111. Bronze Medallion Awards gained numbered 431, an increase of some 10.2% on last year's 391 awards. This figure, however is still well below the 516 Bronze Medallions recorded in season 1987-1988. Surf Life Saving Certificates, primarily gained by members under 15 years of age, were 257 awards, the same number as last season.

Advanced Resuscitation Certificates again fell from 161 to 149, but First Aid Certificates rose from 5 to 16 this season. Inshore Rescue Boat Drivers' Certificates were 44 compared to last season's figure of 45.

Careful analysis of the Award figures gained by members of our Clubs, especially those for Bronze Medallions, the basic award gained by our Lifesavers to undertake beach patrols,

Jeff Lumb Troy Graham Brian Purdon indicates that the smaller Clubs have gained more of these awards, perhaps at the expense of the larger Clubs, who have just only recorded slight increases.

Of the smaller Clubs, Burning Palms gained 25 Bronze Medallions, a dramatic increase of some 525% over last season's figure of 4. Similarly, worthwhile increases were recorded by Clovelly with 15 Bronze Medallions (1989 - 9, up 66.6%) and Garie, 26 (1989 - 13, up 100%).

The increase in Bronze Medallions gained, if it continues next season, would indicate a healthy outlook for our Clubs' futures. Both Surf Life Saving Certificates and Bronze Medallion Awards are those obtained by new Active Lifesavers. When compared with the Membership Tables, (which include these new awardees in the total active membership figures), a generally good indication can be gained of the strength of our Clubs.

One aspect, that has had a particularly crucial bearing on the total number of active awards gained this season, is the controversial question of pollution at our beaches. The media campaign over the summer months, has especially highlighted the problem to the public, to such an extent that beach usage has declined by an average of 23% from last season. This decline even takes into consideration the atrocious weather conditions of the previous 1988-89 summer season.

South Maroubra, the beach closest to and most affected by the Malabar sewerage outfall, was invariably highlighted in pollution reports throughout the season. As a result, the Club has only managed to gain 5 Bronze Medallions and 7 Surf Life Saving Certificates compared to 20 and 10 awards respectively, gained the previous season. This poor result has only been achieved by the inordinately hard work undertaken by the Club's management committee to recruit new members, in spite of the adverse publicity circulated in the popular media.

The problem of beach pollution, which has plagued our City's beaches, not only just recently, but for many years past, has been addressed by various governments of both political persuasions and, up till now, with no real worthwhile tangible results. However, as a particular benefit of the pressure brought to bear from concerned citizen groups and the media campaigns over the past few years, I believe there has been somewhat of an improvement in the quality of our beaches. Albeit, weather conditions and the mechanical breakdowns of the sewerage system at both Malabar and Bondi, on some occasions still highlights the problem even more than before.

However, it is to be hoped, that with the commissioning of the deep sea outfalls, later this year and the resulting dispersal of the sewerage far out to sea, this will at least relieve the present problems facing our beaches, for some considerable time into the future.

Total membership figures for our Senior Clubs this season was 5,719, a small decrease of 7.27%, from 6135 last season. This is the third year in succession that a decrease in overall membership has been recorded. Value of Clubs' rescue equipment fell some \$9,365 from the previous value of \$615,804 to \$606,439 this year, whilst the value of Club's premises rose some \$1.12m (12.7%) to \$9,948,306.

Surf Rescues undertaken by members of our Clubs this year totalled 1,335, a small increase (11.25%) on last year's figure of 1,200, however, first aid cases treated dramatically declined by 180% from 3,470 last year to 1,239 this season.

IRB Rescues, 462 (1989 - 376), still accounted for over a third of all rescues performed (34.61%). Compared to other methods of performing rescues, those undertaken with the traditional Reel, Line and Belt, remain low, accounting for less than 1% of all rescues. Our training techniques now place more emphasis on skills using rescue boards and rescue tubes. Rescue Boards accounted for 30.86% and Rescue Tubes 12.43%, of the total rescues.

Clubs in the Branch held nine open, a craft and a teams carnival during the season, whilst the Maroubra Club hosted the Branch Championships. As well as open carnivals, a number of special events were also conducted by the Branch, including the George's River Sailing Club Botany Bay Bash, Pier One (both surfboat marathons) and Yarra Bay Sailing Club Sydney Branch Stillwater Championships (craft). Both the Cronulla and Burning Palms Clubs held specialist boat marathons.

A very successful winter board riding competition was continued after last year's successful inauguration and is continuing this winter with open championships being held in late August. Two rounds of IRB Competition were held, one at Bondi and the Branch IRB Championships at South Maroubra.

The Branch's Under 18's Intercities Championship team won their carnival held at Thirroul, beating Newcastle Branch who had been the dominant winners of the event during the past seven years. Our Interbranch Ladies Team won this special competition held at Elouera against six other Branches and a visiting Auckland, New Zealand, regional team.

The Branch Office continued to operate smoothly from premises kindly provided by the Prince Henry Hospital at Little Bay. As well as office accommodation and meeting rooms, our small cottage incorporates the Branch Radio Room, 'Sydney Surf'.

In February, the Branch Office assistant, Pamela Harris left and took up a position with the Helicopter Rescue Service. Pamela was replaced by Margaret Pearce. Margaret has a good background in Surf, being the current Secretary of Burning Palms Club. Her previous good experience, as a senior secretary at management level in business, has enabled efficiencies to be introduced into the office routine and we have now been able to reduce the number of days worked to four. The office is now open between 10.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. on Tuesday to Friday.

A new photocopier has been installed with the kind help of Mita Copiers and, together with more use of the computer and facsimile machine, has led to these efficiencies. A computer programme is currently being written to speed processing of carnival entries, which will enable the office to concentrate more on other tasks during the busy summer season.

The Board of Lifesaving Control have worked extremely hard this season under the leadership of Trevor Elliott and Life Saving Supervisor Bruce Breadner, who was in charge of overseeing the lifesaving functions of our Clubs. Bruce did a very good job, establishing the position during the last two years. At the recent Board elections, Bruce retired and took on the position of Board Secretary. George Shales, the previous Waverley District Supervisor was elected Lifesaving Supervisor.

The other three senior positions retained after the restructure two years ago, Examination Supervisor, Carnival Supervisor and Emergency Services Co-Ordinator, were extremely well handled by Bob Bransdon, Ken Metcalf and Peter Agnew, respectively.

Jet Rescue Boat 3, from the Randwick District, suffered from some engine troubles during the season. However, effective patrols were maintained in the Randwick and Waverley Districts with the aid of ORB2 and Clubs' IRB patrols. The Randwick District are currently looking at the feasibility of replacing the craft.

ORB2 from the Cronulla Sutherland District continued to patrol their District's beaches. In addition, the craft has the capability of extending their patrols into the National Park area, south to Burning Palms, if the need arises.

ORB2 has recently been certified by the Maritime Services Board as a 24 hour emergency call-out craft. An application, in accordance with the policy on rescue operations, has been made and now endorsed by State Centre. This will now enable the craft to play an integral part in the Branch's 24 hour emergency services network.

This season, Peter Agnew, the Branch's Emergency Services Co-Ordinator, revised and updated the 24 hour call-out system in the Branch. This was done to complement the large and extensive emergency services network the Branch controls.

The system operates with all calls for emergency assistance, outside of patrol hours, being answered through a central emergency telephone number. The appointed duty officer is relayed details of the call by pager and is then able to contact the caller and arrange the appropriate emergency assistance.

Sydney Surf, the Branch Radio Room, continued to provide our Club's with an emergency radio network. Manning of the room is undertaken by members of Clubs, who, in some instances, did so in addition to their other rostered beach patrols. The following table indicates the contribution by Clubs' members to the operation of Sydney Surf:—



The repeater network, installed by State Centre, has maintained its worth for our Clubs, especially those in the Royal National Park. For these Clubs, in addition to the repeater, a radio has been installed at the Wollongong Ambulance Base and provides them with emergency contact, out of patrol hours, to call for help from other emergency services like the Westpac Rescue Helicopter.

During the season, a patrol incentive award for Clubs was again conducted. The winners sharing the donated Mayne Nickless IRB, Motor and Telecom Rescue Board.

To be eligible for the award, Clubs had to complete the season with no patrol defaults, provide 30 hours duty at Sydney Surf, compete in the Branch Patrol Championships and gain a minimum of two IRB Driver's Awards. At the conclusion of the season, Wanda Club won the IRB hull, South Maroubra the Motor and Fuel tank and Maroubra, the Telecom Rescue Board.

Being in the position of knowing, at the beginning of the season, this IRB's was being provided as sponsorship, enabled the Branch to continue this incentive scheme. I would thank both Mayne Nickless and Telecom for their continuing sponsorship.

In memory of Don Lucas, the Aquatic Club of Potts Point make available the Aquatic Club Don Lucas Memorial Gear Inspection Trophy. Held in conjunction with gear inspection at the start of the season, Cronulla Club were this season's winners, with North Bondi, Era and Burning Clubs being highly commended by the Gear Inspection Panel.

The Zodiac IRB Trophy is based on the number of IRB awards gained during the season, by Clubs as a percentage of their Active membership. This year, the Trophy was won by South Maroubra, gaining 8.93%, followed by Garie 6.85% and Era 6.58%.

The Harry Brown IRB Trophy recognises the outstanding Sydney Branch Club with performance of their IRB. Taken into consideration, when making the award, is the annual gear inspection, awards gained during the season and with the Club's participation in the Branch IRB Championships. This season, the Award has been made to South Maroubra.

The Peter Doolan Shield, although not an incentive trophy, is for a special competition conducted amongst our board riding members. Other Branches represented at the competition came from Lower North Coast, Manly Warringah and Illawarra Branches. A special tag-team event is held to select the winner. The event, held this year at Wanda, resulted in Sydney Branch's 'A' team winning the trophy from the Manly Warringah team, whilst the Branch's 'B' team came third.

Prior to the commencement of the season, the Board held successful conferences for Club Captains, Chief Instructors and Gear Stewards. All three were well attended and the benefits gained by the Branch from those Clubs attending, made them very worthwhile.

The Club Captains' conference, to plan for season 1990-91 has already been conducted. It resulted in last season's far reaching policy regarding patrol obligations; a method of dealing with patrol defaults and a rationalisation of patrol hours and manpower, again being adopted, with only minor changes to patrol strengths, at the end of the surfing season. The plan has already gained State Centre endorsement.

### **MERITORIOUS AWARD CERTIFICATES**

Although there is an element of risk every time a Surf Lifesaver is involved in a rescue, there are occasions when exceptional bravery is demonstrated.

For their roles in a dramatic rescue at Manyana Beach, on the New South Wales South Coast, in December, 1987, both Justin Perriman and Richard Fernley of the Elouera Club, have been awarded the Association's prestigious Meritorious Award Certificate. The awards were presented at the 1990 Australian Championships held at North Wollongong.

### LIFE MEMBERSHIP OF SYDNEY BRANCH

At the 40th Annual General Meeting, William Gray of the Elouera Club was elected to Life Membership of Sydney Branch. Bill, gained his Bronze Medallion in 1942 with the Coalcliff Club in the Illawarra Branch.

Since his move to Sydney and the Elouera Club, Bill has given over twenty years of dedicated service to Sydney Branch and is a worthy recipient of this great honour. Congratulations.

### **ASSOCIATION REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS**

During the season, a number of teams have been selected to represent New South Wales and Australia in various Lifesaving events. The Branch has been fortunate to have had members from our Clubs selected in those teams.

## NSW Womens State Team against Auckland District Team

This event was the first ever contest between a NSW Womens State Team and any other team from overseas, on an Australian Beach. The 'Test Match' was sponsored by the Sydney Market Authority and held at Queenscliff on December 30, 1990.

### **NSW State Team**

The NSW State Team, selected to contest the Inter-State Championships at North Wollongong on April 1, 1990 included Darren Schott, the Team Captain from the Maroubra Club and Ken English, the Team Manager from the Cronulla Club.

A new format of competition was introduced, on a trial basis this year, with emphasis being placed more on team events. Queensland won the competition with 152 points, New South Wales, second with 130 points and Western Australia third, with 90 points.

### Surf '90 Pan Pacific Life Saving Championships

These inaugural Championships were held in Japan between August 3rd to 5th this year. The championships were held on a somewhat restricted basis this year, but are hoped to be the forerunner of further championships of this nature on a biannual basis, with the venue being held in various parts around the Pacific region.

### **Rescue '90 Lubeck, West Germany**

The World Life Saving Bi-Annual Congress is this year being hosted by the West German Lifesaving Movement, the DRLG. In conjunction with the ten day congress being held over August 10th to 18th, the World Inter-Club Lifesaving Championships will also be conducted.

Sydney Branch Clubs sending teams to participate in the Championships are Coogee, Cronulla, Maroubra and South Maroubra. Members of our Clubs, who have been selected in the Australian National Team, to contest the Championships, are Richard Ford, Team Captain (Cronulla) and Samantha O'Brien (South Maroubra) Team Manager is Ian Goode (Cronulla).

Selected to be part of the official Australian Delegation to the Congress were Bob Bransdon (Clovelly) and John Cox (Cronulla).

### SIR ADRIAN CURLEWIS SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Each year the Association selects six outstanding young Surf Lifesavers, (one from each State), to participate in the Sir Adrian Curlewis Life Saving Travel Scholarship. These six young Lifesavers are given the opportunity to experience Lifesaving activities in another State. Alyson Weber of the Coogee Club was selected at the NSW awardee.

Alyson also had the opportunity to attend the Australian International Youth Life Saving Training Camp.

### Youth Development Camp 1990

Held January 20th to 26th, the camp provided an excellent opportunity for participants to exchange knowledge and experience whilst receiving invaluable training in Lifesaving management skills.

The camp was for Lifesavers under the age of twenty five years and those members from Sydney Branch Clubs who attended were Alyson Weber (Coogee), Ken Brown (Garie), Peter Agnew (North Bondi), Lynette O'Neill and Chris Mamo from South Maroubra. From the Wanda Club the attendees were Sean McKindy, Scott Allen, Liz Allen, Sue Henville, Mardi Daddo, Kurt Douglas, Stuart Dutton, Ross Payne, Matt Pearson and Geoff Snellgrove.

Congratulations to all concerned. I hope the experience and training gained at this camp will enable you in the near future, to be the Lifesaving Managers of our Clubs.

### **Stockland Mall Sydney Branch Championships**

These were conducted on behalf of the Branch by the Maroubra Club on March 3, 1990. They were kindly sponsored by Stockland Mall of Maroubra Junction. The winner of the Open Pointscore on the day was Cronulla, 126 points, North Cronulla 125, second and Wanda 80, third.

### **Branch Patrol Championships**

This season, Clubs were allowed to enter up to two teams in the Championships, which were conducted at Wanda on February 25. It was again disappointing not to have had all fifteen Clubs competing in this special event, which is designed for our patrol members to demonstrate general Lifesaving skills. South Maroubra won the Championships with 3065 points, with Tamarama (2519) and Wanda 'B' (1974) taking second and third place respectively. Maroubra and the Wanda 'A' team were the only other teams from the Branch competing.

The Championship is structured in a way that the ability of a patrol, to deal with a rescue situation, is taken into account in the judging. No distinct advantage is gained by having a large number of members in the patrol, nor is there any advantage in the fact a patrol may contain a large number of specialist competitors. Smaller Clubs are not disadvantaged, but they are able to compete on an equal basis with the larger Clubs of the Branch.

# Mayne Nickless IRB and Telecom Rescue Board Competition

At the commencement of the season, Mayne Nickless announced that a fully equipped IRB would be available to the Branch. The Branch decided to use the craft as a prize for a 'patrol competition', which was conducted over the whole season. To be eligible to win, Clubs had to contribute 30 hours of duty to the Branch Radio Room, not incur any patrol defaults, gain a minimum of two IRB Drivers Awards and enter a team in the Branch Patrol Championships.

It was also agreed, that the donated Telecom Rescue Board, would be used as a prize in this competition. Of the fifteen Clubs in the Branch, only Wanda, South Maroubra and Maroubra went into the final draw for the prizes.

Two rounds of IRB competition were held this year to qualify teams, for entry into the State IRB Championships. One of these rounds was the Branch IRB Championships, which were again jointly sponsored by Buttercup Bakeries and Vogels Breads and Kenwood Appliances. ### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The strength of Lifesaving in our Branch is the Clubs and it has again been pleasing to see continued consultation with the Clubs and the heeding of advice from the active, hands on, personnel. This advice has been applied in conjunction with the experience and responsibilities of the Board Officers to arrive at acceptable, mutually agreed policies for the operation of Lifesaving in our Branch.

This policy has seen Lifesaving responsibility accepted by the Clubs, allowing our Lifesaving Board to be able to work through the District Supervisors as a partner rather than a 'big brother'.

Keys to this have been the successful 'patrol agreement' which has been modified by our experience and now represents the Lifesaving expectations of the Board to the Branch Clubs and the publication of the Branch Information Directory each year. This landmark document which includes the Patrol Agreement, is well recognised for its efficient dissemination of information and rules and is available as a reference to all Lifesavers within the Branch.

There is a new confidence in the Emergency Services Groups of the Branch which I feel is indicative of the support given to Peter Agnew in the setting up of our successful 24 hour communication system. This allows the ORB, JRB, IRB's and Club personnel contact with statutory services and the knowledge that there are rescue communications in place via telephone and radio to allow us to reach our potential in major rescue support.

Bob Bransdon has reported that the examination tasks have again been diligently carried out by the Board, according to the availability of our membership. Again, it is apparent that more members will always be required to fulfil this obligation.

Competition within the Branch has been extremely well supported with a full programme of events culminating in the successful holding of the Metropolitan Pointscore Carnival combined with an Open Carnival with clubs in attendance. This summer programme, combined with the winter IRB displays and various board riding competitions, now sees our

### Officials involved in year-round activities.

The ongoing programme of review of carnivals brought to light changes in attitudes to our competition with clear messages that competitors are looking for more structured timetables and a known time commitment. ### Secretary's Report

It gives me great pleasure to present to you the 24th Annual Report of the Sydney Branch Surf Life Saving Association Board of Junior Activities.

The 23rd Annual General Meeting saw the Executive return for a further season, which was a good sign that the Branch is heading in the correct direction.

### Sponsorship

The Branch was extremely fortunate to be sponsored by Streets Ice Cream, who have now been sponsoring the Sydney Branch Juniors for the last five seasons. I wish to extend our sincere thanks to Dick Newman, Marketing, and Olga Barrington, Marketing Manager, for the continued support of Streets Ice Cream and hope that the Sponsorship will continue for many years to come.

#### **Selection Trials**

There were two selection trials held to select the competitors for the Inter-Branch Team to compete at Warrilla Barrack Point in December. The first was held on Saturday, 28th October, 1989 at South Maroubra Beach and the second was held on Saturday, 11th November, 1989 at Wanda Beach. 
### Income

Income fell 9.94% from \$189,569 to \$170,723 despite interest rising from \$12,810 to \$25,341. This was due mainly to the loss of sponsorship and insurance. The State Government's decision to include Surf Life Saving in Work Cover has been of great assistance to the Clubs.

Whilst we thank the Government for their contribution in the form of the Government Grant, it must be stated it was exactly the same as the previous year. Since 1986/1987 this grant has risen from \$7,929 to \$8,362 or 5.46%.

### Income 1989-1990





### Expenditure

Just as income fell so did expenditure. It fell 19.7% from \$158,987 to \$127,522. Last year I stated that if the tight monetary controls were maintained in 1989/1990 then the Branch's financial position should be returning to the pre 1986/1987 year. To finally achieve this the tight rein must continue in 1990/1991. It is no good going on a spending spree otherwise all the good work will be brought undone.

### **ROYAL NATIONAL PARK DISTRICT REPORT**

The 1989/1990 season has been rewarding to the three Clubs in the Royal National Park. I also again report that no lives were lost whilst our beaches were patrolled.

Patrols were carried out on the three beaches with the Introduction of a new Saturday surveillance patrol system, whereby Burning Palms and Era completed their rostered patrols at Garie, was most successful. Large Sunday crowds were reported on all three beaches but still Saturday numbers are well down, possibly through people working overtime and the increased shopping hours. The rise in Sunday crowds could be attributed to the pollution problem on Sydney beaches. Nevertheless the increase in rescues within the three Clubs was handled professionally. The District met regularly during the season and our thanks go to Bob Davison as Chairman and Bill Singleton who was our Branch Representative.

Our life saving activities were again under the supervision of District Supervisor, Steve Strange and our Assistant District Supervisor, Peter Sullivan. Through their efforts a number of exams were conducted and awards for the season have increased dramatically through the three Clubs. The District Clubs continue to participate in all Sydney carnivals as well as State and Australian Championships. The District team, which was once again represented at the Interdistrict Championships and our appreciation is extended to our Team Manager, Peter Moran for his and the team's efforts on the day.

Two Clubs attended the Rossfield Carnival, both of these were rewarded financially on the day and it was most disappointing that the Burning Palms Club, who was a major winner last year, failed to attend.

The only area of concern, is the lack of IRB awards. This is placing a burden on drivers in two of the three Clubs, but with the appointment of a District IRB Examiner we hope this can be rectified over the coming season.

The District competition was held at Garie with results being Era winning the Pymble Shield and the Bobby Liddle Trophy with Garie winning the First Aid Trophy. The point score was Garie 89, Era 82 and Burning Palms 24. In competition Era and Burning Palms have competed regularly, the highlight has definitely been with Burning Palms March Past Team gaining a bonus medal at the Branch Championships and their First Aid Team also winning the Open and Junior Championships.

### **RANDWICK DISTRICT REPORT**

Another successful season has passed for the Randwick District, encompassing Clovelly, Googee, Maroubra and South Maroubra Clubs. All four, can again, proudly boast that no lives were lost whilst patrols were on duty.

All Clubs in the District were able to maintain their patrol strengths throughout the season, which was once again beset with inclement weather and pollution problems.

The pollution problems, which are well documented in the media, had a large efffect on the number of awards gained, particularly at South Maroubra. The ability to recruit new members is most difficult, under the adversity of widespread publicity, relating to the state of Sydney's beaches. Clovelly and Coogee, which were not as badly affected, were able to record increases in Bronze Medallions, with Coogee rating in the top three Clubs in the Branch, with awards gained.

The standard of the members sitting for awards has maintained a high level which is a credit to Instructional Members of the Clubs and also to District Supervisor, John Restuccia and the examiners who assisted in preliminary examinations.

The beach patrols of the four Clubs in the District once again has the assistance of the JRB 3 as a back-up rescue service. The existing Jet Boat has begun to show its age over the last couple of seasons and, a number of mechanical problems overtook it during the period. The diligence of the JRB crew ensured that the craft spent as little time as possible out of the water.

A suitable replacement craft is currently being investigated by the District to replace the current craft, which has exceeded all expectations during its most successful life.

Without the assistance of the Randwick Municipal Council, this service would not exist and the District is looking forward to continued support when the new craft is selected. The Buttercup Bakeries - Vogels Bread Company, and our good friend Bud Mestern, have also ensured the viability of the JRB trhough annual support, particularly in the ever changing field of radio communications. Hopefully this valuable assistance will continue.

Randwick Council has also continued to support the Clubs with their annual maintenance and administration grants to each Club. The monthly meetings between the Club Presidents and the Council Engineers Department representative again proved beneficial to the Clubs. The relationship between the Council and The Clubs throughout the District is second to none.

On the competition side the South Maroubra Club showed their patrol skills and expertise by taking out the coveted Mayors Cup and John Ford Trophy, with their win in the Branch Patrol Championships. These trophies are awarded annually to the champion Patrol team in the District. To be champion Patrol team in the Branch is a great achievement by South Maroubra led by patrol captain Linda Perrin. The annual Molloy Shield District Carnival was conducted this year at Coogee with Maroubra narrow winners over the host Club. From the Molloy Shield event, the District Representative team is selected and this year's team put up a great effort against the strong Cronulla-Sutherland District in the Interdistrict Championships. Coach Chris Gately and manager Grant Rutherford did a sterling job with this team. Long time supporters of the District, the Maroubra Seals Club, once again generously donated the team outfits for the District team. The Interdistrict Championships were hosted by the Maroubra club.

Apart from the Molloy Shield, Coogee hosted the annual Mayne Nickless Open Carnival, which unfortunately saw the majority of events cancelled due to atrocious weather. Coogee also hosted the State Patrol Championships and AMP Challenge. South Maroubra were hosts of the Metropolitan Open Carnival which was very well supported in good weather. South Maroubra also hosted the Branch IRB Championships. Maroubra conducted the Sydney Branch Championships in fine style.

The District was very well represented in the various Branch representative teams during the season and congratulations are offered to those selected.

Three competitors from the District were successful in winning gold at the Australian Championships at North Wollongong as follows: Samantha O'Brien (South Maroubra) — 1st Ladies Malibu Board; Tony Seddon (Coogee) — 1st Under 18 Board Riding; John Walker (Coogee) — 1st Over 24 Surf Race. Samantha also finished third in the Women's Surf Race.

The Randwick District is also very well represented on the Board of Control in both Examination and Competition with a number of officials holding Board and/or Branch Office.

Thanks are extended to the Branch and Board officials for their assistance throughout the season and special thanks to Margaret Pearce at the Branch Office. Best wishes to all Clubs and Districts for a successful 1990/1991 season and good luck to those who will be attending the World Championships in Germany.

### WAVERLEY DISTRICT REPORT

As always this report must open by recording the support provided by Waverley Council and its officers. The past season has seen the Council direct an amount of \$50,000 towards the Clubs of the District. This has been in the areas of direct funding for Life Saving Equipment. Funding for administration, maintenance of the four clubhouses and through the donation of prizes for the Waverley Shield, won this season for the ninth successive year by the North Bondi Club.

The Council, also provides one fully operational IRB to one Club per year, on a rotating basis. The knowledge that a new IRB is to be supplied on a four year cycle is a great relief on the funds and fundraising of the four Clubs. This year Bondi is most appreciative of this assistance.

Similarly, Tamarama is delighted to be the recipient of the Surf Boat donated by W.D. & H.O. Wills. Though this was not a full sponsorship, and the payment of the balance did place a strain on Club finances, the Club now owns an asset it can be proud of for many years to come. The Tamarama Club would like to thank the Branch for their understanding and assistance during this period.

All Clubs of the District would like to express their thanks to the Rossfield Group for their ongoing support of Life Saving in Sydney Branch. North Bondi were successful this season in winning their first Rossfield Trophy, to the envy of all other Clubs in the Branch.

In the competitive arena all Clubs had successes of which they should be proud. Bronte continues to excel in beach events, Tamarama the Patrol Competition, North Bondi in craft, but by far the most outstanding result was Bondi's total domination of 5-Man Rescue and Resuscitation at the Australian Titles, taking first place in all three divisions.

All four Clubs hosted carnivals this past season, with Bronte hosting the Waverley Shield, Tamarama, a Teams Pointscore Carnival, North Bondi, an Open Carnival and Bondi, the Toohey's Inter-Branch Championships. Unfortunately, only the latter of these events was sponsored, a problem that erodes the expected income of the host Clubs for the Season.

However, the largest problem that must be faced over the next few years is the changed perception of pollution of the inner city beaches. In the case of the three beaches of the Waverley District, the adage of "Any publicity is good publicity" fails to apply, and having the attitude of "it's no worse now than it ever was" solves little. The sad realisation is that the long established perception of life on the beach and in the surf is rapidly disappearing, and parents are denying permission for their children to join our Clubs. This has a direct impact upon our active membership, our ability to attract income and most certainly effects the methods we chose to patrol our beaches.

Finally the four Clubs wish to thank all those Members of the Branch and Board of Control who helped the Clubs of the Waverley District in any small way. In particular, the Clubs wish to thank George Shales, Waverley District Supervisor, for his commitment to Life Saving in the District. George has been able to steer the Clubs in their Life Saving activities, so that the Patrols and Training Squads in the Waverley District are now the best in Australia.

It is to be hoped, when the deepwater ocean sewerage outfalls at both Malabar and Bondi come into service, our beaches will benefit and there is a return to the cleanliness and popularity they have previously enjoyed.

At the end of this season, a long serving member of the Branch, has indicated he will not be seeking reelection. William Marshall has served the Branch in many positions over the past thirty years, including eighteen as an elected Vice-President, two as Deputy President and five as President of the Branch. In addition, his wise counsel has been invaluable on many Branch Committees, including those of Constitution and Life Membership.

Bill has also been an active points recorder for the Branch over many years. He has been responsible for compiling the season's carnival pointscores. Bill is the current Deputy President of State Centre. It is reassuring to know that with his knowledge of the Association, its procedures and policies, Bill can be relied upon when needed in the future.

To our fifteen Clubs, I would like to acknowledge your Lifesaving efforts during the season and your co-operation with activities of the Branch. To all Clubs who were asked to host Branch Meetings and, to those who have lent their support to Branch functions and events, thank you.

To our sponsors and donors, without your support and contributions our Lifesaving endeavours would have suffered. I thank you sincerely. Without doubt, I can say these thanks are shared by the whole community, who benefit from the voluntary efforts of our Llfesavers.

I would like to record the Branch's special thanks to the paid office staff. First Pamela Harris and, since February this year, to Margaret Pearce. Your service to the Branch is very much appreciated. I know all our Clubs would agree with these sentiments. Thank you very much.

To my Assistant Secretary, Frank Bailey, I would like to record my thanks. You have been of great help to me during the season. Your new presidency is a loss to the Branch but a considerable gain to Wanda. Congratulations and good luck in your new role.

Finally, I would like to thank our President, Geoff Forshaw. Your leadership, enthusiasm and dedication have ensured another successful season for the Branch. To my fellow Executive Officers, Deputy President, Bill Gray, Treasurer, Clive Owens and Superintendent, Trevor Elliott, I sincerely thank you for your efforts and support.

To our Clubs, my sincere good wishes, good luck and success, in all your undertakings, during the forthcoming 1990-1991 season.
