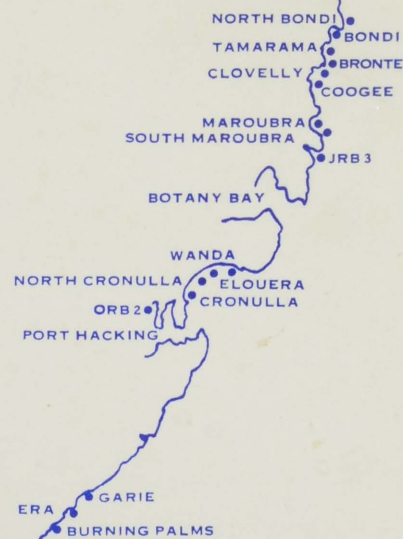

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It gives me great pleasure to submit for your consideration and adoption, the 42nd Annual Report of Sydney Branch, Surf Life Saving Association of Australia Inc., covering our activities for the 1990-1991 season.

Season 1990-91 has been extremely busy for Sydney Branch, however our responsibilities as Lifesavers, to the community on the southern side of Sydney Harbour, has not diminished.

Sydney Branch patrols the coastline from Burning Palms in the south, to North Bondi. Nearly 2,500 Active Lifesavers, voluntarily maintained patrols every Saturday, Sunday and public holiday from September 22 to April 21, the longest patrol season of any Branch in Australia. Every one of these Lifesavers has completed and passed a proficiency test to demonstrate their fitness and abilities in the surf as well as cardio-pulmonary resuscitation before being

allowed into a rostered patrol.

Examinations conducted during the season, resulted in a grand total of 1,115 Lifesaving Awards being gained by members of our fifteen Clubs. This figure is slightly greater than that of the previous season's figure of 1,062. Bronze Medallion Awards gained numbered 464, an increase of some 7.7% on last year's 431 awards. It is pleasing to note that this is the third year in which Bronze Medallion awards have increased. Surf Life Saving Certificates, primarily gained by members under 15 years of age, were 230 awards, a decline of 11.7% on the previous season's figure of 257 awards.

Advanced Resuscitation Certificate awards this year were 155, an increase of 4% (1990 — 149 awards). First Aid Certificates also increased from 16 to 39 this season. Inshore Rescue Boat Drivers' Certificates were 42

compared to last season's figure of 44.

Careful analysis of the Award figures gained by members of our Clubs during the past few years; especially those for Bronze Medallions, the basic award gained by our Lifesavers to undertake beach patrols; indicates the smaller Clubs have continued to gain more of these awards. These gains are at the expense of the larger Clubs, who all have, apart from North Bondi, registered decreases in Bronze Awards.

North Bondi gained 65 Bronze Awards (1990 — 37) and, of the smaller Clubs, largest of the increase in awards were recorded by Clovelly gaining 28 awards (1990 — 15) and Tamarama, 44 (1990 -21).

South Maroubra, the beach closest to and most affected by the Malabar sewerage outfall, has been able to gain 47 Bronze Medallions compared to the previous season's 5 awards. This excellent result has been achieved largely through the commissioning of the deep sea sewerage outfalls in early August 1990 and the Club actively promoting their pollution-free beach through events such as their "Clearwater Classic" marathon.

It is to be hoped that this same effect on membership and awards will also improve for those Clubs in the Waverley District when the Bondi deepwater outfall is commissioned this July.

The increase in Bronze Medallions gained by the smaller Clubs, if it continues again into next season, would indicate a healthy outlook for their future. It is also an indication to the larger Clubs, especially those such as Coogee, (1990 — 41) and Wanda (1990 — 40) that some turn-around must be affected.

Both the awards of Surf Life Saving Certificates and Bronze Medallions, are those which are obtained by new Active Lifesavers. When compared with the Membership Tables, (which include these new awardees in the total active membership figures), a generally good indication can be gained of the strength of our Clubs.

Total membership figures for our Senior Clubs this season was 6,176, a small increase of some 8%, over last season's figure of 5,719. This is a good change to the previous three season's trend of decreases in overall memberships recorded.

Total membership comparison would indicate a turnover this season of some 10.65% in total membership, which, by contrast to the previous season's turnover of some 25.84% is a great improvement.

The question of membership retention is now a greater problem than ever before, through changes in society and the changing attitudes of today's young people. The annual demand to train new members, with the net results of little, or no gain in patrol strengths over the previous year, is a great waste of manpower and resources.

The value of our Clubs' rescue equipment was \$758,902, whilst the value of Club's premises was some \$10,800,925.

There was a decrease in the overall rescues performed by our Clubs' Patrols this season. No doubt, this can be attributed to the reasonably good weather conditions encountered during this summer, when compared to the atrocious weather and seas of the previous season.

Surf Rescues undertaken by members of our Clubs this year totalled 1,230, a decrease of some 20.89% on last year's figure of 1,487. IRB Rescues, 342 (1990 — 476), still

accounted for nearly a third of all rescues performed (27.80%). Whilst compared to other methods of performing rescues, those that were performed using the traditional Reel, Line and Belt, continued to remain low, accounting for less than 1% of all rescues.

Our present training techniques, which instill more emphasis on our member's skills using rescue boards and rescue tubes, continue to be vindicated. Rescue Boards accounted for 35.61% and Rescue Tubes 11.06%, of the total rescues.

Clubs in the Branch held seven open carnivals during the season, whilst the Maroubra Club hosted the Branch Championships. Winner of the Open Carnival pointscore was the Wanda Club and the winner of the handicapped pointscore was Coogee Club. As well as open carnivals, a number of special events were also conducted within the Branch, including the Era Botany Bay Bash, Burning Palms' River Run, Pier One, all Surfboat marathons and the Yarra Bay Sailing Club Sydney Branch Stillwater Championships for all types of craft. The popular winter board riding competition was also held in the Branch and is continuing this winter. Two rounds of IRB Competition were held at Garie and the IRB Championships at Maroubra.

Our Board of Lifesaving Control has again worked extremely hard this season under the leadership of Superintendent, Trevor Elliott and Lifesaving Supervisor, Geroge Shales. At the recent Annual Meeting of the Board, Trevor retired and Peter Agnew, who held the position of Emergency Services Co-Ordinator, was elected the Branch Superintendent. Trevor, having served eleven years, has been the longest serving Superintendent of our Branch.

The Board is responsible for overseeing the Lifesaving activities of our Clubs. Included in this year's activities was conducting the annual proficiency tests for nearly 2,500 Active Lifesavers, examinations on 35 separate occasions for Bronze Medallions alone, other award examinations and the regular hours of instruction for Club members and officiating at carnivals. A massive task indeed for the 189 Active Members of the Board and, a task that is greatly appreciated by all members of the Branch.

One major undertaking of the Board this season, concerned the organisation and conducting of open carnivals held within the Branch. Concern had been expressed by the Clubs and Competitors that carnivals in general needed a review. Two reasonably well attended open forums to discuss all aspects of competition were held prior to the start of the season. From these two meetings emerged a new concept in running carnivals with a completely new timetable and schedule of events.

No longer would carnivals commence at 9.00 a.m. in the morning and continue until 5.00 p.m. with the upshot of competitors having to wait many hours for events; and, indeed, our Officials also having to devote such long hours each Saturday to run them. Instead, they started at 12.00 noon and most finished by 4.30 p.m. and just as important, every event on the championships programme of events was conducted.

The results were achieved by conducting events in blocks in the various competition arenas at set times each carnival. It did mean, however, that competitors would not be able to compete in all areas as previously. But, at least competitors knew exactly what time their events would start each week and with no need to wait around.

These changes proved very popular with both competitors and officials; and with some fine-tuning of the timetable, will continue next season. One proof of our success was that, possibly the biggest Metropolitan Championships, this year held in the Manly Warringah Branch at Long Reef, was run to our timetable.

In the sphere of mobile services, both the Cronulla-Sutherland District Offshore Rescue Boat and the Randwick District Jet Rescue Boat both performed creditably. Both groups have a close working relationship, which helped to create a bond between the two groups.

The support offered by the Randwick Municipal Council to the proposed replacement of JRB3 with an ORB Craft is very encouraging. It is hoped the new craft will be available for duty at the beginning of the next season.

This year, the JRB/ORB Supervisor, Ron Camilleri, was sent to Victoria to study ORB operations. It is pleasing to note from his report that our service is comparable to those operating in Victoria - the recognised leaders in Australia of this type of craft.

Sydney Surf, the Branch's radio room continued to service our Club's emergency radio network. Plans are underway with the State Radio Panel for a major update of the equipment in the room, enabling greater flexibility with the use of radio channels. Members of our Clubs are to be thanked for their voluntary assistance with manning the room, often in addition to their normal beach patrols. Outside of patrols hours, calls for assistance are received through the Branch's 24 hour emergency call-out service. Through the four Duty Officers, the Emergency Services Co-Ordinator is able to respond the necessary rescue group to assist. During the past year the system has been used on a number of occasions to respond to Police calls for the assistance of both JRB3 and ORB2.

Both the Branch Office and the Radio Room continue to operate from the small cottage generously provided by Prince Henry Hospital. Our sincere thanks are extended to the Administrator of the hospital for the kind provision of this service. Additionally, we have been fortunate to be able to use the Hospital's functions room to conduct a number of meetings and conferences, including the recently held Club Captain's Conference.

The Branch office operates four days a week, with Margaret Pearce employed as Office Assistant. A replacement computer was purchased during the season and efficiencies are continuing to be implemented.

Prior to carnivals commencing, a computer programme to process carnival entries was written specially for the Branch by Paul Bondin. Paul, having no background in Surf

Lifesaving, did a remarkable job in interpreting our needs. The Branch will be able, this coming season to shorten the entry closing period from ten days to four.

The programme necessitated Clubs using a new entry form, similar to the one used for State and Australian Championship entries. Comments received by Club Members charged with the task of preparing the entries, wholeheartedly endorsed the form.

Gear Inspection

The annual conference for Club Gear Stewards was held at Cronulla in August 1990. Inspection of our Clubs' rescue equipment was carried out in September. The winner of the Aquatic Club Don Lucas Gear Inspection Trophy was South Maroubra, with Burning Palms, Garie, Era and Clovelly being highly commended. Appreciation is extended to Cronulla, Bronte, Clovelly and Burning Palms for hosting the Inspection Panel.

Harry Brown IRB Trophy

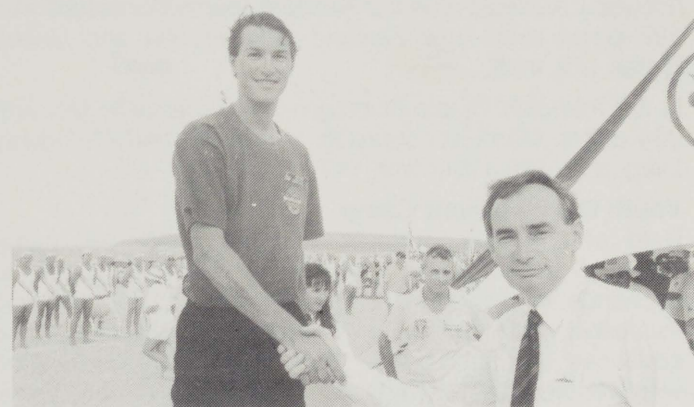

Rescue '90 Lubeck, West Germany

The World Life Saving Bi-Annual Congress was held in Lubeck, West Germany in August 1990. Amongst the delegates in the Australian Team were Bob Bransdon (Clovelly) and John Cox (Cronulla). In his report after his return, Bob indicated the congress was a little disappointing, with many of the nominated speakers having been replaced. The problems with interpreters from German to English also left much to be desired.

In conjunction with the Congress, the World Life Saving Championships were held and it is good to report the Australian contingent were dominant. Australia won the national teams championship with 211 points followed by the United States Lifesaving Association, 191 points and Royal Life Saving Society Australia, third with 171 points.

The Kevin Weldon Interclub Trophy was won by Cronulla with 240 points, second, Surfers Paradise, 142 points and third, LA County Lifeguards (USA) with 116 points.

Asia Pacific Life Saving Championships

Held in Penang, Malaysia in January this year, members of the team from the Branch were Richard Ford (Cronulla), Daniel McLellan (Cronulla) and team coach, Ian Goode (Cronulla). The Australian Team won the Championships by two points from Australian Royal Lifesaving and the Malaysian Team.

Surf '90 Pan Pacific Lifesaving Championships

Held in Japan in August 1990 members from the Branch selected in the Australian Team were Ian Goode (Team Manager) and Richard Ford (Cronulla), Samantha O'Brien (South Maroubra) Robert Chapman and Shane Whittaker (North Cronulla), Brent Pritchard and Grant Wilkinson (Elouera). Australia won the National Teams Pointscore with 192 points with New Zealand 188, second and United States 179, third.

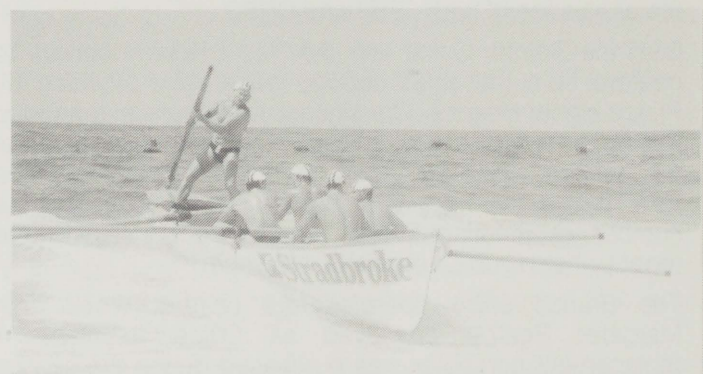


Branch IRB Championships

REMEMBRANCE

Walter Andrew Thomas Crain, M.B.E., Branch Life Member aged 87 passed away on July 3, 1991, after a long illness.

Born at Adelong, near Tumut, on November 25, 1903, he spent his early childhood in the district before coming to Sydney to attend Fort Street Boys High School. Walter then studied law at the University of Sydney and graduated with honours. He joined Freshwater SLSC in 1926 and, after obtaining the Bronze Medallion during the 1929-30 season, continued on to become Club Secretary 1934-39, Auditor 1946-85 and Honorary Solicitor 1946-91. Walter was elevated to Life Membership of Freshwater SLSC in 1939.

From 1942-46 Walter served his country first with the army then as a legal officer in the RAAF, in the Pacific theatre. It was during this period that he encountered medical problems that effected him for the remainder of his life.

Walter Crain was Honorary Legal Officer of Sydney Branch since inception in 1949 and for more than a quarter of a century gave valuable assistance in this area as well as acting as an advisor to both National Council and NSW State Centre.

Life Membership honours were conferred on him at all levels of Surf Lifesaving, Sydney Branch 1960, NSW State Centre 1963, and ultimately the highest honour of the Association in 1967.

Walter was created a Member of the Order of the British Empire in the 1981 New Year's Honours.

A service of thanksgiving was held on July 8, 1991 in the Parish Church of St. Giles, Greenwich, the church in which Walter worshipped and contributed much over many years as a Church Warden, Secretary of the Parish Council and Honorary Solicitor.

The Reverend John Henderson, in his oration conveyed a worthy tribute "Walter's attitude to life can be summed up

in one word — service. In his quiet, gently way, he saw the generous gift of his time and skill to be simply the way one should live. We will not forget his gentleness, the warmth of his friendship, his wisdom and his quiet courage. We give thanks for those memories for they are personal and precious and through them Walter will continue to live on."

Deep condolence of the Officers and Members of Sydney Branch, SLSA is extended to Mrs. Mavis Crain and her family on this sad occasion.

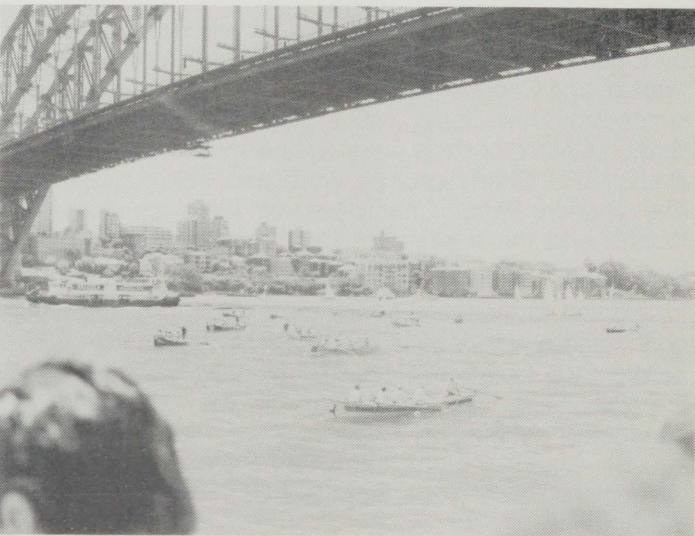

The Australian Surf Life Saving Championships were held at Scarborough Beach, in Perth on March 21, 22, 23 1991. The weather was extremely good, apart from the last day, which saw wind and rain squalls for most of the morning, only clearing in the early afternoon.

Results of the Interstate Teams Competition, saw the NSW Team come second with 97 points, with Queensland, first (114) and Western Australia filling third place also with 97 points.

Australia won the test gaining 47 points to New Zealand's 27 points.

BRANCH SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The Board now comprises 102 Active Examination members, qualified examiners who have participated in the examination of Club members this season. There have been 87 Officials active in the wide range of Competition conducted within the Branch.

The first role of our organisation is life saving and the traditional strong emphasis required has been maintained by the Life Saving members of the Board. The policy on Patrol Obligations and Hours of Duty was mutually formulated at the Captains' Meeting conducted at the end of June and gave ample time for Clubs to organise for the Season. The Branch's Information Directory which contains this policy and voluminous information was put together during the winter months by the Board Executive. This involved extensive reviewing of the content and rewriting and expanding where necessary. This unique publication

was available to all Club members and is vital to the planning and co-ordination of activities with specific information on emergencies, examinations, carnivals and calendars.

The Life Saving Panel met seven times during the Season under the Chairmanship of George Shales and while attendance at meetings led to some criticism the members were active in the field where the effort was required.

The District Supervisors, John Restuccia and three new faces, Peter Sullivan, Steve Barrett and Kim Wilson, with their Assistants, carried the workload in the Districts with hands on involvement with the Clubs. The Life Saving Panel was also responsible for the introduction of the Patrol Inspection Report which improved communications on patrol standards.

The commitment from Peter Agnew as Emergency Services Co-ordinator resulted in improved co-ordination of these sections of the Board. The contributions of Peter, George Shales and a dedicated group of operators maintained important communications in the Branch Radio Room.

The power craft of the Branch were well served by Ron Camilleri who was very active in overseeing standards and providing guidance to the JRB3 Group in their efforts for the timely replacement of their ageing jet boat. The future funding of the Group has not been finalised at this time although all avenues are being pursued in an attempt to replace the craft for the coming season.

Wayne Loney commenced the season enthusiastically as IRB Supervisor but was unable to continue mid season. The position was then filled by our stalwart, Bill Singleton, who oversaw the Clubs' IRB operations and IRB competitions. While IRB's carried out vital patrol duties some Clubs did not maintain the hours expected by these patrol craft. This problem will have to be addressed and a policy implemented to improve the number of qualified drivers available for patrol.

Our Gear Inspection Panel under the direction of Convenor, Ken English, checked all Club equipment prior to the start of the season. Congratulations to South Maroubra who were the recipients of the Gear Inspection Trophy.

The Chief Instructors' Meeting was held prior to the start of the season to format and schedule examinations. The position of Examination and Instruction Supervisor was not filled until September when Ursula Say was elected and was immediately faced with the start of season workload. Proficiency testing was conducted for all active Surf Club Members as well as the examination of some 1,100 candidates for Association Awards. With the support of the Examiners, all these obligations were carried out admirably. Unfortunately the role of the Supervisor is complicated by the number of one off exam requested by Clubs, often with very short notice.

Bob Bransdon filled the position of New Members Co-ordinator and conducted a successful indoctrination day at the Branch Office to welcome all the new members on the Board.

Junior Activities of the Clubs have been integrated within the Branch and a good liaison exists with Ian Goode the Superintendent. There is further opportunity for the amalgamation of the Junior Panel of Judges into our competition ranks.

Our Carnival Officials are now active for the twelve months of the year, with distinct categories of competition. As well as Surf Carnivals, Stillwater Rowing, IRB Competition, Board Riding and Endurance events were also conducted.

In an effort to re-organise carnivals two open meetings were held during the winter months which produced a new carnival programme. The meetings gave the Board insight into the needs of competitors and Clubs which were then integrated into our carnival structure. This process is continuing and will result in further fine tuning for the coming season. Ken Metcalf and his Officials have had a successful season and deserve the thanks of competitors.

The details of Officials Accreditation requirements are now spelt out and every official should aim to achieve the appropriate certification for next year's carnivals.

Denis Dick, as Board Gear Steward, ensured that Carnival Stationery and other Board Gear was maintained and made available whenever required.

There were difficulties experienced when a replacement gear trailer was not organised in time for the season, however, through the efforts of Arthur White and Bill Singleton who acted as Branch Gear Stewards for the majority of the season, the gear was maintained and transported to our carnivals. A new gear trailer has been purchased and is presently being fitted with suitable racks.

A well attended and most successful evening was hosted by the Branch and Board on the eve of the State Titles in recognition of the more than 50 years of dedicated service of Life Member, Ron Howells. Ron and his wife Gloria have now retired from the workforce and are living at Hawks Nest.

It is pleasing to be able to present this brief summary of the work and activities of the Board. Margaret Pearce at the Branch Office has been a most able administrative support for all Officers and activities during the year and her willing assistance has been most appreciated.

The Board, as the active arm of the Branch and with a membership larger than most Clubs, has been most successful in completing the tasks required.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank and congratulate the Officers and Members of this Board for their many and varied contributions to the success of the season.

In this my last season as Superintendent, I thank you all for your support and wish the same enjoyment and satisfaction that I have experienced over a number of years to the incoming Officers of the Board.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Members of

We have audited the accompanying accounts, including the balance sheet of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia, Sydney Branch Incorporated at 31 May 1991, the related statement of income and expenditure for the year then ended and accompanying notes. Our audit was made in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards, and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances, except as explained in the following paragraph.

It is not practical for the association to establish control over voluntary donations and contributions prior to their initial entry in the accounting records, nor is it practical to circularise possible contributors to confirm that all such monies have been received and recorded. The examination relating to voluntary contributions was therefore limited to the amounts recorded in the accounts.

In our opinion, except for the effect of any adjustments that might have resulted had the receipts from voluntary donations and contributions referred to above been subjected to satisfactory audit tests, the accounts referred to above are properly drawn up so as to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the association at 31 May, 1991 and of the result of the association for the year ended on that date.

TREASURER'S REPORT

"If the tight monetary controls were maintained in 1989-90 then the Branch's financial position should be returning to the pre 1986-87 year. To finally achieve this the tight rein must continue in 1990-91."

It is with pleasure that I report an operating surplus of \$53,200, after providing \$6,103 for depreciation. This is a 23% increase on the 1989-90 result.

Income

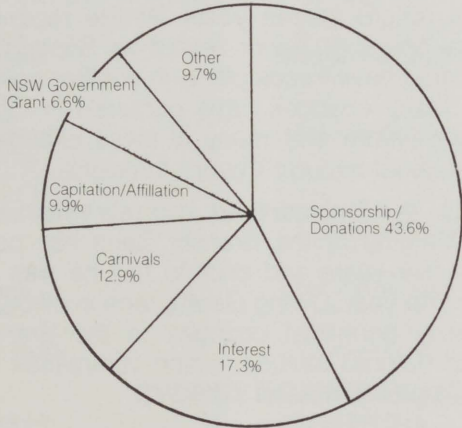
Income fell from \$170,703 in 1989-90 to \$167,915 in 1990-91 or 1.6%. With affiliation and capitation fees linked to the CPI, the main increases in income were from the NSW Government Grant, up 32.7%, interest received up 14.5% and carnival income up 4.7%. To offset these increases, awards income fell 33.6%, sponsorship and donations fell 6.5% and insurance fell 11.8%.

I suppose the most satisfying portion of the income was the increase in the NSW Government Grant. Our thanks to the Department of Sport Recreation and Racing.

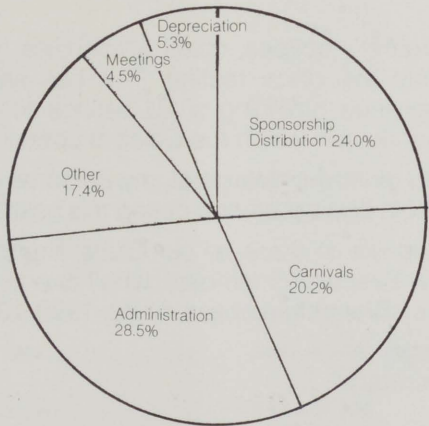
Income 1990-1991



Expenditure

Just as income fell, expenditure decreased from \$127,577 in 1989-90 to \$114,715 in 1990-91 or 10%. Administration costs fell 6%, competition fell 19.1%. Despite the drop in expenses, we still managed a 4.1% increase in distribution of sponsorship money to the Clubs. The balance of Branch charges fell 21.7%.
