Ladies and Gentlemen,

It gives me great pleasure to submit for your consideration and adoption, the 44th Annual Report of Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch Incorporated, covering our activities for the 1992-1993 season.

The 43rd Annual General Meeting saw several members of the Executive not seek re-election, they being Stephen Strange, who was Honorary Secretary for eight years and Clive Owens, who was Honorary Treasurer for the past ten years. Mr Rex Sargeant was elected to Life Membership of Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch.

Awards

The total number of awards this season were slightly down on last season with 91 fewer awards being gained this season. The number of Bronze medallions fell from 485 to 455 this season, Life Saving Certificates also fell from 263 to 180 this season. Training Officers Certificates rose from 42 to 56 and IRB Drivers Certificates rose from 30 to 57.

Thanks to all Board Officers who did Examinations during the year and also a special thanks to Linda Mulhall who took on the position of Instructional and Examination Supervisor from Christmas.

Membership

The total membership of the Branch has risen from 6,200 to 6,385 this season, with a great improvement in the number of active members throughout the Branch.

Rescues

The number of rescues performed this season has risen from 793 to 855 with the majority of these being done by Board rescue 530 and IRB 464.

Carnivals

During the season, seven open carnivals were conducted by clubs at Cronulla, North Cronulla, Elouera, Wanda, South Maroubra, Coogee and North Bondi. Maroubra hosted the Branch Championships, while Bondi hosted the IRB Championships. The Branch Patrol Championships and the Interdistrict Championships were held at Wanda.

In addition to these carnivals, the Branch also conducted a number of special events, the George's River Sailing Club Botany Bay Bash Surfboat Marathon, The Yarra Bay Sailing Club Stillwater Championships and the Rossfield Carnival.

Burning Palms conducted the 'River Run' Surfboat Marathon on the Georges River and Cronulla the Mazda Surfboat Marathon.

A programme as comprehensive as this, together with appointments at State and Australian Championship Carnivals, demanded a major commitment on the part of our Carnival Officials and, I would now place on record the Branch's sincere thanks. Our carnivals were well attended by competitors from within the Branch and, to those competitors who visited from other Branches, I would thank you for your support and keen competition.

Rembrance

With such a vast organisation as ours, there are many people who contribute to the activities of the Board. The front line being the 93 Active Examination Members and the 71 Competition Officials who take time out each week-end to participate in the examination of club members and the conducting of carnivals within the Branch.

As usual the season started off with the Club Captains Conference held in July at the Prince Henry Hospital Function Centre. The meeting largely reflected on the goals set in the previous year of increasing IRB Awards, raising the standard of Patrol Captains and the continuing implementation of Patrol uniforms within clubs.

Several Patrol Captain's Seminars were held throughout the Districts with Patrol Captains lectured on patrol obligations, uniforms and public liability.

The first role, and the very essence of our organisation, is Life Saving and I would like to record the efforts of our Life Saving Officers under the leadership of Peter Sullivan, Life Saving Supervisor. Peter has been instrumental in maintaining a high standard of Life Saving within the clubs.

To Peter my sincere thanks for taking on the many projects under the Life Saving portfolio, many at short notice and requiring some detail.

The District Supervisors, Frank Osborne, Jim Sherratt, Colin Fitzgerald, Paul Cooper and their assistants are the officers nost directly responsible for the day to day activities of the Board on a District basis. Conducting patrol inspections, preliminary examinations and ensuring that Surf Life Saving standards are maintained, enhanced and strengthened in heir respective areas.

Looking after the interests of our Emergency Services systems our Emergency Service Co-ordinator, Brad Taylor. Apart rom operating the Branch 24-hour call-out system, Brad has contributed heavily to his role as Deputy of Life Saving and has always ensured healthy discussion at Board Management Meetings.

With the assistance of the Branch Duty Officers, Brad has ensured that Surf Life Saving has become the number one authority in surf rescue with statutory authorities.

The Branch Radio Room, controlled by Karen Strickland and Peter Fuller, was manned throughout the season as we have come to expect and has kept the umbrella of communications ntact. Stage three of the Radio Room has been completed to enable a broader range of communications through the Branch with clubs operating on two channels, one for emergencies and the other for patrol activities.

The Inflatable Rescue Boat section, has been maintained by Bernie Kelly once again during the season. Several Twilight IRB Carnivals were held along with a start of season training and examination day which proved very successful.

The ORB portfolio under the skippering of ORB Supervisor, John Cox, has had a busy year with the introduction of Sydney's second Offshore Rescue Boat in the Randwick District. John has spent a large amount of time in training and examination of the crew of the ORB3 who have had to start from scratch in the transmission from JRB to ORB.

John has also completed a large amount of research and field trips with ORB2 who are currently in the process of purchasing a new craft and extending their shed facilities.

Linda Mulhall took control as Examination Supervisor part way through the start of the season that commenced with Examination and Instruction Seminar 92 at the Narrabeen Sport and Recreation Camp. The Seminar ran over two days and was attended by approximately fifty participants. The Board was also responsible for the overseeing of proficency tests and for the examination of 1,095 awards.

Looking after the interest of our Competition Officials, Kim Wilson was responsible for the running of our seven open surf carnivals, five boat and ski marathons, three board riding events and several championship events. All up, a total of aproximately 1,500 competitors passing through the Branch Office computer.

Luckily, Kim does not face the daunting task of running Sydney's carnivals alone, he is backed up by people such as the Branch Gear Steward, Arthur White and Board Gear Steward, Bill Gray who fronted up each week-end to personally take care of the carnival gear.

A number of members served as Honorary Officers of the Association including John Fraser, Deputy President of Surf Life Saving New South Wales Inc., Greg Allum, Superintendent of Competition Surf Life Saving New South Wales Inc. and the many Board Officers who were appointed to Committees and Championship Carnivals and supported the Association by travelling at their own expense.


FINANCIAL REPORT

Income 1992-1993




Expenditure

North Bondi SLSC has completed its 86th season with distinction.

Management

The Club Mangement thanks our major sponsors, officials and sub-committees. The best Club Official was Bob Peterson, Chief Instructor; Gunther Kitzler was the best Active Member and the most outstanding junior was Kris Yates. The Junior Club hosted the Sydney Branch Championships which were formally opened by the Governor of NSW and Karlie Cunningham was presented with the Junior Life Saver of the Year.

Our total expenditure exceeded our total income by \$3,861. With an annual turnover in excess of \$300,000 this is not considered a problem if it doesn't become a trend.

Life Saving

Our patrol of the year was Patrol 7, captained by John Koppi. We also had a total of 65 patrolling members that achieved 100% patrol efficiency. Congratulations to those who instruct, organise, captain and perform our life saving patrols.

Competition

The Senior Club won the North Bondi Carnival, the Waverley Shield for the 10th year in succession, the Bas and Stan McDonald Trophy and a number of medals at the Sydney Branch, NSW and Australian Masters Championships.
