

Ladies and Gentleman

The presentation of this Report brings to a close yet another successful season of the Sydney Branch Board of Control and it is with much pleasure that I present to you its 44th Annual Report for the 1992/93 season.

As the ensuing pages of this Report will describe, your Board Officers have been extremely active in the field of Life Saving, Examination, Instruction, Carnivals and Competitions in fulfilling its obligations to the Sydney Branch and its Clubs.

With such a vast organisation such as ours, there are many people who contribute to the activities of the Board. The front line being the 93 Active Examination Members and the 71 Competition Officials who take time out each week-end to participate in the examination of club members and the conducting of carnivals within the Branch.

As is usual the season started off with the Club Captains Conference held in July at the Prince Henry Hospital Function Centre. The meeting largely reflected on the goals set in the previous year of increasing IRB Awards, raising the standard of Patrol Captains and the continuing implementation of patrol uniforms within clubs.

Several Patrol Captains Seminars were held throughout the Districts with Patrol Captains lectured on patrol obligations, uniforms and public liability

The first role, and the very essence of our organisation, is Life Saving and I would like to record the efforts of our Life Saving Officers under the leadership of Peter Sullivan, Life Saving Supervisor. Peter has been instrumental in maintaining a high standard of Life Saving within the clubs.

To Peter my sincere thanks for taking on the many projects under the Life Saving portfolio, many at short notice and requiring some detail.

The District Supervisors, Frank Osborne, Jim Sherratt, Colin Fitzerald, Paul Cooper and their Assistants are the officers most directly responsible for the day to day activities of the Board on a District basis. Conducting patrol inspections, preliminary examinations and ensuring that Surf Life Saving standards are maintained, enhanced and strengthened in their respective areas.

Looking after the interest of our Emergency Services systems is our Emergency Services Co-Ordinator, Brad Taylor. Apart from operating the Branch 24 hour call-out system, Brad has contributed heavily to his role as Deputy of Life Saving and has always ensured healthy discussion at the Board Management Meetings.

With the assistance of the Branch Duty Officers, Brad has ensured that Surf Life Saving has become the number one authority in surf rescue with statutory authorities.

The Branch Radio Room, under the control of Karen Strickland and Peter Fuller, was manned throughout the season as we have come to expect and has kept the umbrella of communications in tact. Stage three of the Radio Room has been completed to enable a broader range of communication through the Branch with clubs now operating on two channels, one for emergencies and the other for patrol activities.

The Inflatable Rescue Boat section, has been maintained by Bernie Kelly once again during the season. Several Twilight IRB Carnivals were held along with a start of season training and examination day which proved very successful.

The ORB portfolio under the skippering of ORB Supervisor, John Cox, has had a busy year with the introduction of Sydney's second Offshore Rescue Boat in the Randwick District. John has spent a large amount of time in training and examination of the crew of the ORB3 who have had to start from scratch in the transmission from JRB to ORB.

John has also completed a large amount of research and field trips with ORB2 who are currently in the process of purchasing a new craft and extending their shed facilities.

Linda Milhall took control as Examination Supervisor part way through the start of the season that commenced with the Examination and Instruction Seminar 92 at the Narrabeen Sport and Recreation Camp. The Seminar run over two days was attended by approximately fifty participants The Board was also responsible for the overseeing of proficiency tests and for the examination of 1095 awards.

Looking after the interests of our Competition Officials Kim Wilson was responsible for the running of our 7 Open Surf Carnivals, 5 Boat and Ski Marathons, 3 Board Riding Events and several championship events. All up, a total of approximately 1500 competitors passing through the Branch Office computer.

Luckily Kim does not face the daunting task of running Sydney's carnivals alone, he is backed up by such people as the Branch Gear Steward, Arthur White and Board Gear Steward, Bill Gray who fronted up each week-end to personally take care of the carnival gear.

A number of Members served as Honorary Officers of the Association including: John Fraser, Deputy President of Surf Life Saving NSW, Greg Allem NSW Superintendent of Competition and the many Board Officers who were appointed to Committees and Championships Carnivals and supported the Association by travelling at their own expense.

I also wish to make mention of Mr. M. Wallace, Director, Prince Henry Hospital for his continuing support in the use of the Hospital Function Centre for our Board AGM and Captains Conference.

A New Members Introduction evening was held at the Branch during the season by New Members Co-Ordinator, Linda Mulhall, and I would like to take this opportunity to welcome all new members to the Board.

To Roslyn our Branch Office Mangeress may I once again thank you for your efforts in assisting the Board with its many duties

The Board's continued momentum rests on all our shoulders and in knowing this I thank all the Board Officers and members for their continued support and enthusiasm, commitment and dedication to an organisation that has no equal.

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



EMERGENCY SERVICES CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

I would like to start this report by thanking George Shales, my Deputy, and the other Duty Officers - Peter Sullivan, Ron Camilleri, John Restuccia, Peter Agnew, John Cox, David Cross, Mathew Scott and Peter Fuller. All of whom have put in many hours to make the Sydney Branch Call-Out System the success that it is. The time put in by these people usually goes unrecognised. Apart from being Duty Officers and on-call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, many of them hold Branch positions, are involved in Offshore Boats and the Branch Radio Room as well as involvement in their own clubs.



In last year's Report I said I would be endeavouring to have the call-out system accredited. Unfortunately, after a number of meetings with the State Rescue Board, Police and Ambulance, we are no closer to beoming an accredited rescue body. This is largely due to the fact that the State Rescue Act states that Surf Life Saving is exempt from accreditation. However some good has come from these meetings. There is now better recognition of the call-out system among the statutory authorities. These meetings are continuing and hopefully I will have better news next season.

The Wollongong Aerial Patrol proved to be a useful newcomer over our beaches. Apart from their regular patrols they were called in to assist with a few searches for boats and missing swimmers.

The Helicoptr Rescue Service has had to make a few changes following the unfortunate crash of 'Lifesaver One' earlier this year. They now hire two aircraft to provide the service we have become accustomed to. 'Lifesaver One' is now a twin engine Squirrel, a much smaller helicopter than the Dauphin and is used for all rescue work. Lifesaver Two is another Dauphin, larger than the old one, this is used for hospital transfers etc. Whilst not a permanent situation, the two hired aircraft will be operating in this manner until a final decision is made on a replacement helicopter.

The remaining three groups which made up the emergency services in the Branch are the two offshore groups and the Branch radio group. All of these are covered elsewhere in this Report however I would like to mention that they are all progressing well although they could do with more members.

From 1.5.92 to 18.4.93 Sydney Branch's Emergency Services handled 72 incidents. A brief Summary of these is as follows:

The IRB Gear Inspection Team comprising of Peter Burst and Bob Cane once again carried out the task of inspecting our Branch IRBs admirably and generally found a high standard of equipment. The IRB Captains have also asked for a mid-season check to be carried out next season.

A night exercise was also conducted by Brad Taylor, Emergency Services Co-ordinator, for IRBs and ORBs in Botany Bay which was quite successful and a lot was learnt from the participating crews in attendance.

The District IRB co-ordinators once again took a lot of the work load of examinations within the districts and I thank Peter Burst, Trevor Perrin, and Arthur White for the effort they put into the IRB section.

Several IRB Twilight Carnivals were held during the season concluding with the Branch IRB Championships at Bondi. The home team of Bondi won the pointscore followed by North Cronulla and North Bondi. Thanks must go to the officials who spent the morning in the rain and congratulations to all the teams who competed in a most enjoyable carnival.

Finally, thanks to the Board Executive and to Ros in the office who took up a lot of the workload. To Ken Hudson, Bill Singleton, the carnival IRB co-ordinators comprising of Craig Smith, Bob Cane and Peter Burst, thank you for your continued support

The Sydney Surf Radio Room was able to be manned for the full season providing a communication base for the Sydney Branch Clubs, Offshore Boats, Lifesaver Helicopters and Aerial Patrol.

Aerial Patrol was introduced to our Branch this year with regular patrols of our beaches. Their role is to act as a spotter plane for sighting sharks, boats in distress etc.



This season saw the introduction of our new console which allowed us to have two operators man the desk. Also with the new panel has come many bugs which are still to be ironed out.

I would like to thank the clubs for making the changeover to channel 2 as an operating channel and channel 1 as a rescue channel successful. CB channel 25 proved also to be worthwhile giving the clubs a chit chat channel eg laying of buoys.

The number of radio operators was a little healthier this season with the recruitment of a number of new members.

My thanks must go to Peter Fuller my Assistant Radio Supervisor. Peter has always made himself available when needed, he has also carried out all the maintenance on the aerials located on top of the Prince Henry Hospital nurses quarters (a scarry height). Thanks also to Peter Agnew and Brad Taylor for holding the ladder for Mr Fuller.



ORB SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

During the season the Randwick group had a change of leadership with George Shales taking the position of Captain. The Executive of the group has had a big workload between training and forward planning for the next few seasons.



Offshore Two was kept busy over the winter period with an average of a job per month with three call-outs and three jobs given to them while they were carrying out training.

The beginning of the season saw a steady flow of rescues where the Offshore Rescue Boats were called to assist:

The hard work of the Cronulla-Sutherland group to have their facilities upgraded at Gunnamatta Bay has paid off with a grant from the Federal Government and funds from the Sutherland Shire Council.

The work which has been approved is to have the sewerage connected, crew amenities and modifications to house a new boat with hardtop. Doug Sorensen and Graham Bruce also applied for funding to assist with the purchase of a new boat which was passed in the package.



ROYAL NATIONAL PARK DISTRICT SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

This is a very hard report to make as there has been no District Supervisor or Assistant until I took over at the beginning of February. All clubs have had infringements and although there has been a dedicated hard grind by a nucleus of members in all clubs endeavouring to gain new members and increase finance in order to run the clubs more efficiently, one club, Garie, is becoming dispirited. The new motor for the IRB was stolen and the old one is unreliable.



I was appalled that the club still has no captain. The Chief Instructor works hard but bronze medallion trainees continue to dissipate due to the fact that parents begin to baulk at the \$7.50 Park entrance fee (no fee sticker can be issued until the candidate receives a BM).

In previous years when District Supervisor I have on many occasions requested assistance for this Club from the Board to help in the recruitment and training. I even requested for the clubs from Cronulla-Sutherland District to pass on the names and addresses of club members who found that membership of a highly competitive club not to their liking, and give them the chance to try and sell the different lifestyle of a more patrolling, surfing, snorkelling, fishing type of existence.

The Club has battled on, decreasing the number of patrols and making them all day patrols because of the depleting numbers. In order to have the beach patrolled it has been necessary to restrict carnival entries to zero. They were not even able to organise the District Carnival as the other clubs were entered into too many carnivals to allow time for it. The first time it hasn't been held in my 35 years in the district!

Although the patrols of all three clubs ranged from non-existent (1 occasion) to good over the season. The general standard was down on last year mainly due to the decrease of experienced patrol members. The main problems we will have to face next year will be patrol strength, member responsibility and patrol experience. Garie NEED experienced life savers in the 20-30 year old bracket.

Radio communication within the District and with Sydney Surf was patchy with clubs sometimes establishing contact through another club.

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

As a late starter in the role of District Supervisor I did not have the luxury of settling into the job, it was full on from the first week. Squads started to appear in large numbers and the perennial problem of examiners was upon me. The problem was resolved by asking the Chief Instructors to supply examiners with every squad they presented, - it worked! I quickly became aware of a hard working dedicated group of people without whom my task would have been impossible.

I was pleased with the quality of most squads this season and like everything else improvements can be made in how we train our new life savers. It is always difficult to pinpoint specific problems in this area but in the case of closing dates for awards to compete in carnivals it's easy. These closing dates are the single biggest factor of poor squads. The squads are pushed through and presented to examiners well before they are ready, this is totally unfair for the young life savers. I know the reason for these dates being set however the effect on squads does not justify the policy.

All the clubs in the district maintained viable patrols throughout the season and the equipment was well maintained. I received good co-operation from all patrol captains, IRB drivers and patrol members. The co-operation between the clubs was good with the result of "NO LIVES LOST" in the district. To all the people who patrolled the beach this season I am pleased to say "WELL DONE".

I believe however that improvements can be made to improve the efficiency of the patrols. This would involve the training of patrol captains in management skills of people. This would give the captains better knowledge of their patrol members personal abilities, their strengths and failings. Patrols would then become more interesting for their members. Some patrols stand out as good patrols, the one consistent factor is the leadership of the patrol captain.

The inter-club carnival held at North Cronulla was exceptional, large seas ensured long swims in testing conditions. The local rivalry was at its best. This produced a high standard of competition and good sportsmanship. North Cronulla had a fine win on the day - congratulations.

Cronulla SLSC continued where they left off last season with great victories during the season leading up to State and National Titles. These results along with fine individual achievements from the other clubs once again marks the No.2 Sydney District in the field of competition.



RANDWICK AND WAVERLEY DISTRICT A.R.C. EXAMINATION TEAM REPORT

Advanced Resuscitation in the Randwick and Waverley District is very healthy and stable. The combination of uniform examination standards and regular instructor seminars have resulted in another season of high award numbers and good standards.

The examination team has consisted of the same dedicated members for the past three years. Plans to increase the examination team to six during the season were unsuccessful, however, it is intended to select at least one more examiner for training from amongst the active ARC instructors.

The examination team conducted 30 separate examinations during the season, with a total of 104 ARC and 5 ARCI awards being gained.

During the season the team conducted a very successful ARC instructors seminar and a spinal awareness night at which the spinal collar was introducted.

The ARC examination team will soon be authorising ARC instructors in the fitting of spinal collars, this will be done at two planned instructors seminars during the winter recess. Instructors will then be assisting the examination team with ARC updates, including spinal collars.

Of priority for the Board during the winter period, will be the educating of Board members and club instructors in the recovery and movement of spinal patients. This task is of much greater complexity than the fitting of cervical collars and will involve all bronze medallion candidates, instructors and examiners.

The ARC examination team is currently looking at the teaching and examination of spinal collars, as well as preparing for the annual assessment and recertification by Dr Ian Mackie. The team consisting of Tim Murray, Roger Habib, Paul Cooper, Peter Agnew and myself have performed exceptionally well during the season. The members of the team are all involved in other demanding activities and yet they continue to devote time to the exacting and constant task of ARC examinations. My personal thanks to them all.

The team would like to thank Dr Ian Mackie and his research assistant Troy Eadie for their professional advice and assistance during the season.


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CARNIVAL COMPETITION SUPERVISOR'S REPORT work was - resolved donate dead
