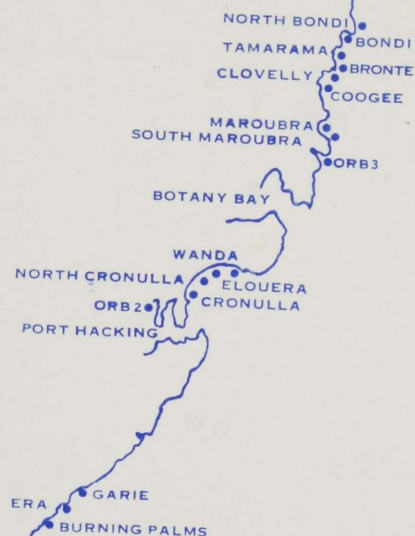

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As President of Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch Inc., it gives me great pleasure to submit for your perusal the 45th Annual Report.

Since the inception of Surf Lifesaving, dedicated members have made this movement their lifetime work.

However major problems are now facing both clubs and Branch, in endeavouring to recruit suitable applicants to fill key administration positions.

We must ask ourselves why? If this Branch is to continue to progress we must seriously address this growing problem. Membership of clubs has remained static over a number of years and this is not a healthy growth for our movement.

This is a matter we must address and it will be a major topic in the forthcoming Seminar, which will be conducted this season at the Narrabeen Lakes Sports Academy. Another down note was the failure of key Branch officers to 'deliver the goods' and as such left the Executive with serious financial concerns.

Myself as President must take responsibility for allowing this situation to develop, however we are Officers who have shouldered this added burden.

On a positive note the Branch has purchased a property for investment. We hope the investment augers well for the future finances of our Branch.

The attendance of Clubs to Branch Council Meetings has fallen off considerably, with some Clubs unrepresented for a number of meetings, even when these meetings were conducted in their own district. At times some of the business must seem boring, but after all I must remind these Clubs that they are the Branch, not the Branch Executive, and the saying 'that union is strength' is now more evident today when Surf Life Saving is facing much criticism from outside bodies as to whether we can justify our existence to these people, remains to be seen.

The Branch Board of Control Officers and members continue the tradition and carried out with dedication the duties of Instruction and Examination under the guidance of our Superintendent Peter Agnew and his Officers. Most Clubs have maintained Patrol standards, although the Board had to deal with several breaches during the season.

A number of carnivals were conducted and once again there seemed to be a shortage of officials. North Cronulla and North Bondi Carnivals were linked to the Nutri Grain Series and were huge Carnivals, really to much for one day. The Branch called on neighbouring Branches for assistance and to those other Branch Members who assisted us on these days many thanks. The Branch Championships were conducted by Bondi Surf Club, as

were the Branch IRB Championships and I must thank that Club for conducting these events.

At the State and Australian Championships a number of Officials from the Branch were appointed to assist at these events.

The most successful Club at the State and Australian Championships was the Cronulla Club who won the overall pointscore. A very great achievement and, for the second year in a row.

To the Australian and State Governments who support our movement and the Local Government areas of Waverley, Randwick and Sutherland our appreciation for their continued support.

To our major sponsor, W.D. & H.O. Wills, I thank you on behalf of the Branch for your most generous support over many years.

To Yamaha Motors sponsors of the IRB Twilight Series, to Maroubra Seals Club for the use of their premises for meetings and the continued support to Surf Life Saving as a whole and to all who sponsored equipment and prizes for competition in our Branch, many thanks to you from Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch and our members.

It is very difficult to mention all who have contributed to the Branch during the year, but to those who were on committees and individuals such as Branch Team Manager and Coach and members of Branch Teams thanks for your contribution to the Sydney Branch.

At the latter part of the season our office Secretary, Roslyn Malin resigned. I must thank her for her dedication and help to all officers and Clubs. I hope she will remember her association with kindness and not regret.

The report would not be complete without reference to the magnificent effort our Branch Secretary John De Cean did during this year. His dedication to take on the Treasurer's portfolio at the busiest part of the season was a tremendous achievement. To you John on behalf of your fellow Executive Officers our heartfelt thanks.

To my good friend and Deputy President Bill Gray, who was always on call for any help I asked for my appreciation and Peter Agnew our Superintendent who has put in a marvellous effort on behalf of Surf Life Saving and his work in updating the Branch Office thanks for your contribution to our Branch.

Finally the Branch is indebted to those many members who fulfil their Patrol duties and kept our beaches safe for the surfing public, may the efforts continue this coming season.

Among the top MLC 200 Scholarship holders, two athletes came from Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch;

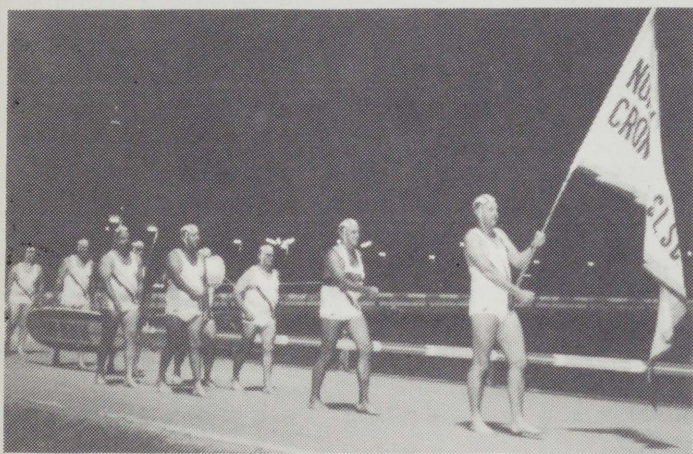

Superintendent's Report

While annual reports present an opportunity to stop and take a look back on the past twelve months and create a document which will become a part of Surf Life Saving history; it is always a time when I ponder if the Board of Control has made significant achievements during the season. As your Superintendent, I always like to think that the Board's achievements are extras to the simple day to day running of Surf Life Saving in Sydney or what could usually be referred to as 'survival mode', to actual moving forward and making new ground.

It is not until you put pen to paper and start writing and reading the individual efforts of officers and members of the Board do you realise and fully appreciate the enormous magnitude of achievements and new ground made by a large number of young men and women within this Branch each day, simply by just fulfilling their individual duties.

While it would be complacent to admit this is the case in every scenario, or simply rest on our laurels without constantly reviewing our position and performance, it is pleasing to report and detail these achievements and record the efforts of the Board Officers and members for you, and while the individual officers reports give a more detailed view, below is a summary of the 1993-94 season.



Foremost, the Board's lifesaving arm under the leadership of the Life Saving Supervisor, Peter Sullivan, has once again set a platform to be followed by our lifesavers on Sydney beaches by providing lifesaving standards, guidance and supervision.

As Peter is moving to greener pastures and taking on a role in RNP District prior to retiring from work and travelling around Australia, I would like to place on record my sincere appreciation for his efforts in this position and for giving and receiving advice so freely when sought.

The District Supervisors, Barry Dundas, Colin Fitzgerald, Jim Sherratt and their Assistants have once again maintained the front line, being on the beach most weekends conducting examinations, patrol inspections and the day to day running of the Districts and have truly displayed their commitment to Surf Life Saving. The Emergency Services portfolio continues to move with the times under the guidance of the Emergency Services Co-Ordinator, Brad Taylor, and has an impressive and effective call-out system that has been continually updated by Brad to ensure the efficient use of surf life saving resources. This proved essential during the State's bushfires disaster in January this year and had a number of statutory authorities highly commending our out of hours operations. A vote of thanks was received by Brad from the Branch Council for his efforts in co-ordinating SLS services at the fire control centre in shifts of up to 24 hours.

Radio communications was once again the responsibility of the Radio Supervisor, Karen Strickland, who spent numerous

hours looking after the running of the Branch Radio Room 'Sydney Surf' and the radio network along Sydney's beaches. Whilst the actual numbers of operators at Sydney Surf got off to a shaky start it is pleasing to report there was a small influx of new operators to assist in this vital service that we have come to expect.

The Inflatable Rescue Boat section received a boost of enthusiasm from the word go following Michelle Phillips' stepping into the role of IRB Supervisor. This enthusiasm never let up once during the season with Michelle hosting numerous activities including IRB training weekends, the Yamaha Twilight Series, activities on Sydney Harbour, regular meetings of IRB captains and examiners and the issuing of a regular newsletter. One can only be inspired by Michelle's commitment to this area.

John Cox continued at the helm as ORB Supervisor during the season and although starting off the first half of the season trying to work around some controversial areas that seemed to be fuelled by problems rather than solutions the second half of the season was more productive with ORB3 having their training status lifted in its second year of operation and ORB2 settling into a new craft and shed.

The large job of looking after the examination and instruction portfolio rested upon the E & I Supervisor, Linda Mulhall, with the season starting off with the introduction of the cervical spinal collar and the trialling of an examiners accreditation course. Linda also had the daunting task of looking after the large number of proficiency tests and examinations, a task that would be insurmountable if not for the examiners, proficiency co-ordinators and the large contingency of Board members who take time out each week-end to assist in these tasks.

Kim Wilson held the position of Carnival and Competition Supervisor and was responsible for the overseeing of the seven Branch carnivals including three major Nutri-Grain carnivals which saw a large burden put on our competition officials who gave up their time unselfishly on most weekends.

Hopefully teething problems with our Branch carnivals will be ironed out during the off season following several open forums.

I would take the opportunity to thank the Branch Gear Steward, Bill Singleton, and the Board Gear Steward, Bill Gray, for their continued support and assistance with our carnival equipment and the effort put into these tedious tasks.

A number of Branch members served as Honorary Officers of the Association including Greg Allum, National Competitions Director and John Fraser, President - Surf Life Saving NSW.

I would extend our appreciation to Peter MacMahon, National Lifesaving Director, Terry Boardman, State Lifesaving & Examination Supervisor, Bob Little, State Competition Superintendent; all of whom assisted the Board and its officers on numerous occasions.

A number of members were appointed to committees and championship carnivals during the season and supported the Association by providing assistance and on most occasions travelling at their own expense.

A number of new members joined the Board during the season under the watchful eye of New Members Co-ordinator, Hazel Fitzgerald-Carolan, and I would like to take the opportunity to welcome them to the Board.

This year the Board Management Committee met on nine occasions during the season. Two full Board Meetings were held during the season at Maroubra SLSC who we thank for the use of their club house facilities. Two examination and two competition meetings were also held.

The Board Executive Officers also attended the Branch Council Meeting each month and I was fortunate enough to represent the Board on the Branch Executive held on most months during the year. On membership it is pleasing to note last year's recipient of the Board of Control's 'Most Valuable Member' Award was Colin Fitzgerald for his contribution to life saving, examinations, instruction and competition during the 1992-93 season.

In closing this review of the 1993-94 season may I take the opportunity to extend thanks and appreciation to my fellow Branch Executive Officers - Bill Singleton, Bill Gray and John De Cean for their continued support and guidance throughout the season. To Roslyn, our Branch Office Secretary, thank you once again for your efforts in assisting the Board and its Officers during the season.

To the examiners, officials and members who make up the Sydney Branch Board of Control may I thank you once again for your continued support, enthusiasm, commitment and dedication and I look forward to the challenges and opportunities that the 1994-95 season holds within it.

IRB Supervisor's Report

The 1993-94 season will, I hope, be seen as the resurgence of IRB's in the Sydney Branch.

A lot of encouraging and positive things have happened. An increase in awards, increased participation and input from the clubs within the Branch in all IRB activities.

The year started for the IRB sections with the annual Gear Inspection. Detailed gear inspection sheets were forwarded to all clubs in the Branch and then the inspection panel, headed by the IRB supervisor, followed them precisely, without fear nor favour.

If a problem was found that could not be fixed on the spot then it was to be re-inspected. It was a hard way to start (and unpopular!), but a very necessary one to ensure that the credibility of the reformed IRB panel was established.

Highlights during the year included the inaugural 'Yamaha Sydney Twilight Series'. It gave Sydney clubs much needed competition; stirred the friendly rivalry between the clubs and forged new friendships and camaraderie between clubs in the Branch. It also served the purpose of letting other Branches know that Sydney was becoming serious about IRB competition. It was not however, without teething problems and patience being tested! But no rules were allowed to be bent.

Several IRB training week-ends were conducted with many participants and a lot of cross fertilisation of training techniques and ideas shared. It was however disappointing that week-ends were organised and made available, but only two of our four Districts took advantage of and lent assistance to train candidates.

IRB proficiencies were done on the largest scale ever in our Branch, and new and much needed up-dated examination papers were created and implemented. A Branch IRB newsletter was founded to increase the information flow within the Branch, but it did leave me wondering whether anybody was going to provide dirt about what's going on in the 'Duck' sheds!

Australia Day saw Sydney IRB's, with the accompaniment (and protection!) of Offshore Rescue Boat 2, fly the flags of our Branch and all our Districts on Sydney Harbour in the Flags Afloat parade and judged runner up in the major category of group entry. The participants — Garie, Era, Burning Palms, North Cronulla, Elouera, Wanda and Bondi did Life Saving, and particularly Sydney Branch proud.

To address a fall off in interest by our younger crew people a 'Sydney Branch Advanced Crew Achievement Certificate' was introduced to encourage young people to remain interested and involved in the area of IRB's until they become old enough to gain their IRB Driver's Award. It was encouraging to see the enthusiasm shown in this additional training and their sense of achievement in gaining this Branch certificate.

As stated previously, this season has begun the resurgence of IRB's in the Sydney Branch with IRB's being responsible for approximately 80% of all rescues performed by our Association. Unfortunately, this resurgence is being

hampered by lack of support, and copious demands being placed on the IRB sections within our Branch. It became very apparent to me throughout the season how very strong some Branches in NSW are in the area of IRB competition, and other IRB activities, and that driver numbers and patrol obligations were easy for them to fulfil and, accompanying this, the immense enjoyment and support they found in this area. Whereas in a lot of Sydney clubs it is expected that IRB people turn up every week for patrol, extra activities, such as displays, training exercises and competition are considered frivolous and a waste of money. I believe this attitude is slowly changing, but it is important for all clubs to realise that if IRB activities *are not enjoyable* and there is nothing but 'Patrol' to do, then participation and involvement begins to wane.

A sincere thank you to Arthur White, the District IRB Supervisor for the Bate Bay Beaches, who is always willing to lend a hand. Also, to Brad Taylor and Anthony Graham for their assistance with National Park clubs. To Steve Barrett for his assistance in helping with my vision of a Twilight Series and to Peter Burst for his unfailing dedication to Sydney IRB's — doing the Waverley IRB Supervisor's job, maintaining and towing the Branch IRB, and participating in all IRB activities. Your efforts were very much appreciated and you are an example to us all.

Last, but not least, the officials and new officials who helped out in the inaugural Twilight Series and the Branch Championships, thanks to each and everyone of you. Without your help, IRB's in Sydney would continue to flounder.

On a positive note, the action plan for next season has been done. It includes more sponsorship of IRB activities in the Branch. A large open IRB carnival, more educational training activities and a lot of encouraging plans to keep the Sydney Branch IRB sections growing and improving.
