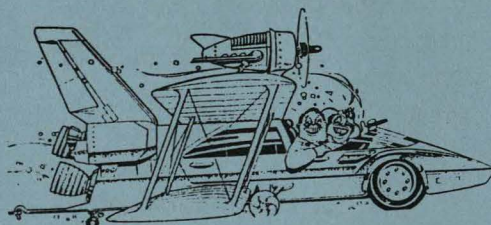

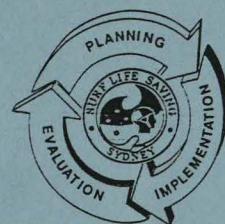

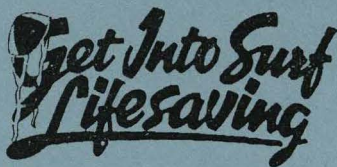

Its on again, this time bigger than ever, seminar 94 Lifesaving of the Future brings together all of the normal start of season seminars into one weekend.

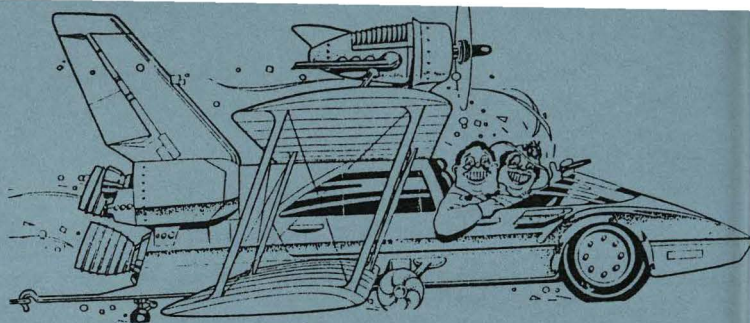
The seminar will involve Examiners, Chief Instructors, Club Captains and for the first time Club Secretaries and Presidents that will see a program of major talks to small individual workshops.

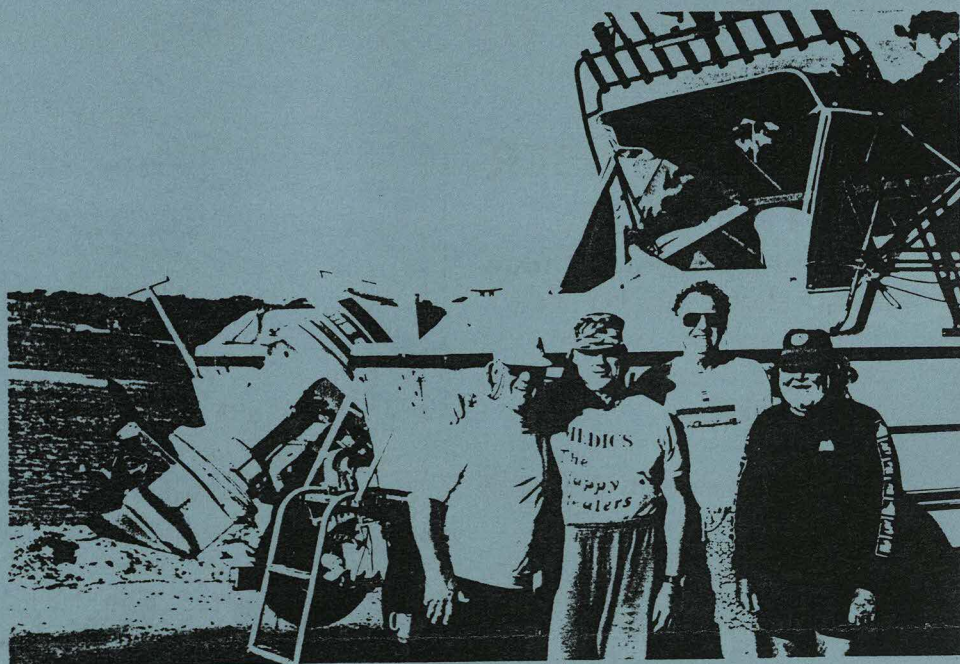

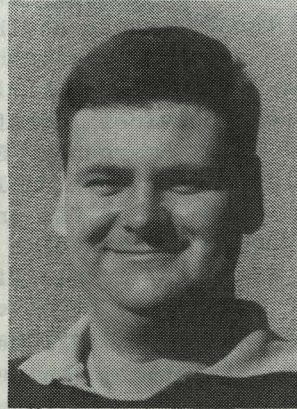

SEASON 1993/94



Fellow Members

As is always the case, it is with much pleasure that I present to you the 45th Annual Report of the Sydney Branch Board of Control for the 1993/94 season.

I encourage you to read the ensuing pages that detail the challenges, criticisms and encouragements of the respective officers in the field of Life Saving, Examination, Instruction, Carnivals and Competition in fulfilling their obligations to the Sydney Branch and its clubs.

While annual reports present an opportunity to stop and take a look back on the past twelve months and create a document which will become part of Surf Life Saving history; it is always a time when I ponder if the Board has actually made significant achievements during the season. As your Superintendent, I always like to think that the Board's achievements are extras to the simple day to day running of Surf Life Saving in Sydney or what could usually be referred to as "survival mode", to actual moving forward and making new ground.

It is not until you put pen to paper and start writing and reading the individual efforts of officers and members of the Board do you realise and fully appreciate the enormous magnitude of achievements and new ground made by a large number of young men and women within this Branch each day, simply by just fulfilling their individual duties.

While it would be complacent to admit this is the case in every scenario, or simply rest on our laurels without constantly reviewing our position and performance, it is pleasing to report and detail these achievements and record the efforts of the Board Officers and members for you, and while the individual officers reports give a more detailed view, below is a summary of the 1993/94 season.

Foremost, the Boards lifesaving arm under the leadership of the Life Saving Supervisor, Peter Sullivan, has once again set a platform to be followed by our lifesavers on Sydney beaches by providing lifesaving standards, guidance and supervision.

As Peter is moving to greener pastures and taking on a role in RNP District prior to retiring from work and travelling around Australia, I would like to place on record my sincere appreciation for his efforts in this position and for giving and receiving advice so freely when sought.

The District Supervisors, Barry Dundas, Colin Fitzgerald, Jim Sherratt, and their Assistants have once again maintained the front line, being on the beach most week-ends conducting examinations, patrol inspections and the day to day running of the Districts and have truly displayed their commitment to Surf Life Saving.

The Emergency Services portfolio continues to move with the times under the guidance of the Emergency Services Co-Ordinator, Brad Taylor, and has an impressive and effective call-out system that has been continually up-dated by Brad to ensure the efficient use of surf life saving resources. This proved essential during the State's bushfires disaster in January this year and had a number of statutory authorities highly commending our out of hours operations. A vote of thanks was received by Brad from the Branch Council for his efforts in co-ordinating SLS services at the fire control centre in shifts of up to 24 hours.

Radio communications was once again the responsibility of the Radio Supervisor, Karen Strickland, who spent numerous hours looking after the running of the Branch Radio Room "Sydney Surf" and the radio network along Sydney's beaches. Whilst the actual numbers of operators at Sydney Surf got off to a shaky start it is pleasing to report there was a small influx of new operators to assist in this vital service that we have come to expect.

The Inflatable Rescue Boat section received a boost of enthusiasm from the word go following Michelle Phillips stepping into the role of IRB Supervisor. This enthusiasm never let up once during the season with Michelle hosting numerous activities including IRB training week-ends, the Yamaha Twilight Series, activities on Sydney Harbour, regular meetings of IRB captains and examiners and the issuing of regular newsletter. One can only be inspired by Michelle's commitment to this area.

John Cox continued at the helm as ORB Supervisor during the season and although starting off the first half of the season trying to work around some controversial areas that seemed to be fuelled by problems rather than solutions the second half of the season was more productive with ORB3 having their training status lifted in its second year of operation and ORB2 settling into a new craft and shed.

The large job of looking after the examination and instruction portfolio rested upon the E&I Supervisor, Linda Mulhall, with the season starting off with the introduction of the cervical spinal collar and the trailing of an examiners accreditation course, Linda also had the daunting task of looking after the large number of proficiency tests and examinations, a task that would be insurmountable if not for the examiners, proficiency co-ordinators and the large contingency of Board members who take time out each week-end to assist in these tasks.

Kim Wilson held the position of Carnival and Competition Supervisor and was responsible for the overseeing of the 7 Branch carnivals including 3 major Nutri-Grain carnivals which saw a large burden put on our competition officials who gave up their time unselfishly on most week-ends.

Hopefully teething problems with our Branch carnivals will be ironed out during the off season following several open forums.

I would take the opportunity to thank the Branch Gear Steward, Bill Singleton, and the Board Gear Steward, Bill Gray, for their continued support and assistance with our carnival equipment and the effort put into these tedious tasks.

A number of Branch members served as Honorary Officers of the Association including Greg Allem, National Competitions Director and John Fraser, President - Surf Life Saving NSW.

I would extend our appreciation to Peter MacMahon, National Lifesaving Director, Terry Boardman, State Lifesaving & Examination Supervisor, Bob Little, State Competition Superintendent; all of whom assisted the Board and its officers on numerous occasions.

A number of members were appointed to committees and championship carnivals during the season and supported the Association by providing assistance and on most occasions travelling at their own expense.

A number of new members joined the Board during the season under the watchful eye of New Members Co-Ordinator, Hazel Fitzgerald-Carolan, and I would like to take the opportunity to welcome you on behalf to the Board:

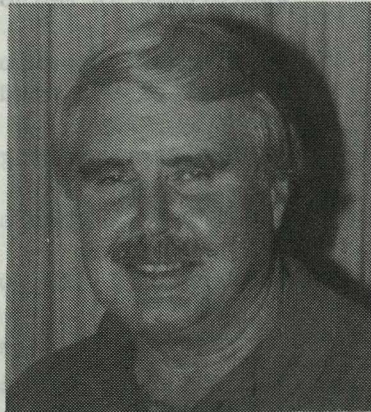

LIFE SAVING SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

Well another season has finished, and the 15 clubs in the Branch have carried out the life saving duties successfully once again with some notable incidents such as the work done by North Bondi and Bondi Clubs on Christmas Day, the clubs from Cronulla/Sutherland and Royal National Park Districts who helped with the evacuation of people from Royal National Park from the bush fires. Well done to all.



Once again my thanks to the District Supervisors, of whom we have only three, and the two Assistant District Supervisors, who completed the tasks required such as bronze medallion and surf life saving certificate preliminaries, help run life saving competitions and carry out inspection of patrols.

There was only one major infringement given for the season, however, there were numerous patrol defaults given, mainly for signing on and off at the incorrect times. On the matter of patrol uniforms there was a great improvement compared to last season but there's still room for improvement.

This season the Board of Control did not hold the Patrol Captains Conferences as it was decided by the Club Captains that the Clubs would do it. After talking to the patrols I would advise that the Branch goes back to running the conferences so as all the latest information is passed onto the Patrol Captains.

Congratulations to the clubs and members who did well in the 93/94 season with regards to the life saving side of the competition.

Firstly, Paul Cotter of the Elouera Club, who won both the Branch Life Saver of the Year and Branch Champion Life Saver, Paul won some great prizes for both titles, one being a return ticket for two to Fiji, donated by Air Pacific, and he also made the finals of the Life Saver of the Year at State level.

The Branch Patrol Championships was won by Tamarama Club lead by Paul Cooper. It seems it was a good season for the Pauls. Tamarama Club received rescue boards and a rescue tube. Well done to all members who competed in the above competitions.

Unfortunately the Gear Inspection Panel did not see fit to select a winner for the Gear Inspection Competition, so let's make sure that there are many winners next season.

Once again ORB2 and ORB3 and Emergency Services Groups have carried out their duties to the highest standard of life saving. The ORB2 group started the season with a new boat which is a credit to them.

The Radio Room, Sydney Surf, had a few problems in the middle of the season, but thanks to Karen, Radio Supervisor, these were overcome but I'm sure Karen could do with more radio operators next season.

I must mention that the reel, line and belt are now part of surf life saving history as it is no longer classed as life saving equipment.

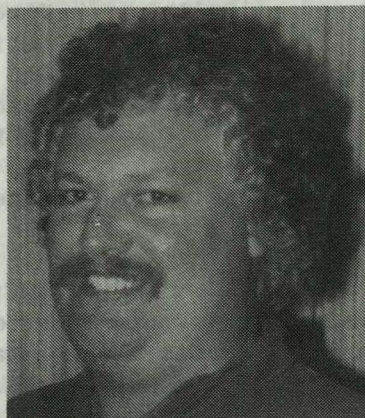

EMERGENCY SERVICES CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

I would like to start this report by recognising the outstanding efforts put in by our Duty Officers. The Duty Officers are on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week. While this time is not spent sitting on the beach watching the bathing public, they can be, and often are, called on at any time to drop what they are doing to go stand on the coastline and co-ordinate a rescue. This may not seem like much but it places a tremendous toll on their social lives. For this I say thank you on behalf of the Branch.



This year saw many improvements in our Emergency Services Group. Some of these being the new portable radios for each Duty Officer, mobile phones for the two co-ordinators and all duty officers being placed on the one paging system. Apart from these capital gains, the season saw a closer working relationship with the Lifesaver Helicopter, the Police and the other kindred rescue groups. Sydney Branch Surf Life Saving is also represented on a sub-committee of the State Rescue & Emergency Services Board, that being the Sydney Maritime Rescue Sub-Committee.

LIFESAVING

The respect our emergency services have gained over the past few years was made evident in the recent State of Emergency because of the bush fires. People have asked me what Surf Life Saving is doing fighting bush fires. The facts are, we did not fight any fires. When the authorities declared a State of Emergency, our Offshore Boats were called in to evacuate Deer Park, Warumbul and Maianbar. Sydney Branch's involvement over the next four days varied from transporting evacuees, Police and Ambulance personnel to providing first aid both on and around the water to the fires at Como.

During the off season the Duty Officers will be doing training in trauma counselling. This will help them recognise people in need of counselling after a major incident. The Duty Officers will not be putting themselves forward as professional counsellors, their job will be to do initial debriefings and advise the clubs of members who may need further help.

As can be seen in the following statistics the Sydney Branch Emergency Services are now starting to be used to their full potential, I hope this trend keeps improving.

IRB SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

The 1993-94 season will, I hope, be seen as the resurgence of IRBs in the Sydney Branch.

A lot of encouraging and positive things have happened. An increase in awards, increased participation and input from the clubs within the Branch IN ALL IRB ACTIVITIES.

The year started for the IRB sections with the annual Gear Inspection. Detailed gear inspection sheets were forwarded to all clubs in the Branch and then the inspection panel, headed by the IRB Supervisor, followed them precisely, without fear nor favour.



If a problem was found that could not be fixed on the spot then it was to be re-inspected. It was a hard way to start (and unpopular!), but a very necessary one to ensure that the credibility of the reformed IRB panel was established.

Highlights during the year included the inaugural "Yamaha Sydney Twilight Series". It gave Sydney clubs much needed competition; stirred the friendly rivalry between the clubs and forged new friendships and camaraderie between clubs in the Branch. It also served the purpose of letting other Branches know that Sydney was becoming serious about IRB competition. It was not however, without teething problems and patience being tested!! But no rules were allowed to be bent.

Several IRB training week-ends were conducted with many participants and a lot of cross fertilisation of training techniques and ideas shared. It was however disappointing that week-ends were organised and made available, but only two of our four Districts took advantage of and lent assistance to train candidates.

IRB proficiencies were done on the largest scale ever in our Branch, and new and much needed up-dated examination papers were created and implemented. A Branch IRB newsletter was founded to increase the information flow within the Branch, but it did leave me wondering whether anybody was going to provide dirt about what's going on in the "Duck" sheds!

Australia Day saw Sydney IRBs, with the accompaniment (and protection!) of Offshore Rescue Boat 2, fly the flags of our Branch and all our Districts on Sydney Harbour in the Flags Afloat parade and judged runner up in the major category of group entry. The participants - Garie, Era, Burning Palms, North Cronulla, Elouera, Wanda and Bondi did Life Saving, and particularly Sydney Branch, proud.

To address a fall off in interest by our younger crew people a "Sydney Branch Advanced Crew Achievement Certificate" was introduced to encourage young people to remain interested and involved in the area of IRB's until they become old enough to gain their IRB Drivers Award. It was encouraging to see the enthusiasm shown in this additional training and their sense of achievement in gaining this Branch certificate.

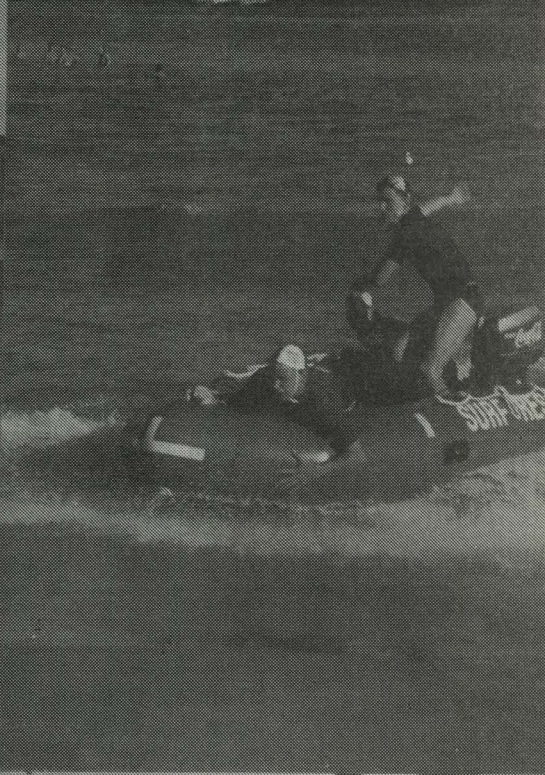
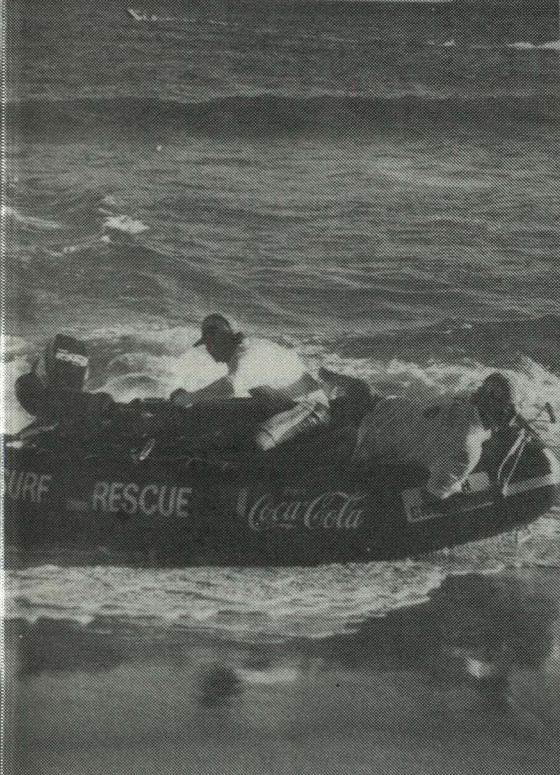
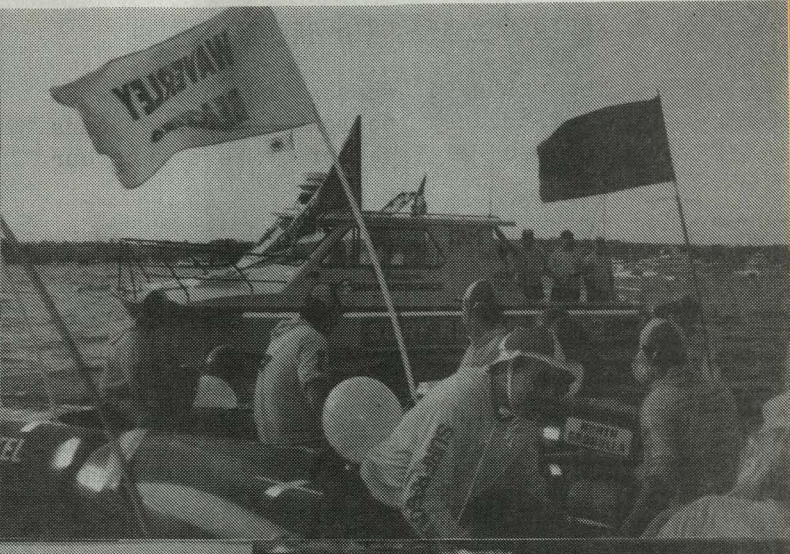
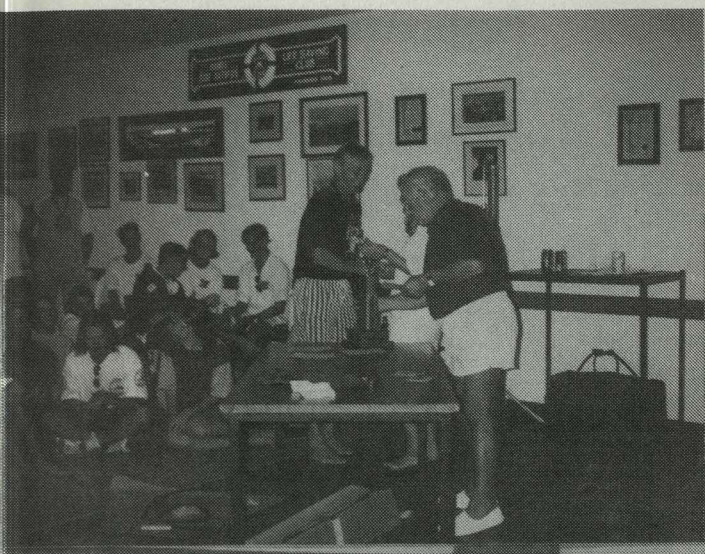
As stated previously, this season has begun the resurgence of IRBs in the Sydney Branch with IRBs being responsible for approximately 80% of all rescues performed by our Association. Unfortunately, this resurgence is being hampered by lack of support, and copious demands being placed on the IRB sections within our Branch. It became very apparent to me throughout the season how very strong some Branches in NSW are in the area of IRB competition, and other IRB activities, and that driver numbers and patrol obligations were easy for them to fulfil and, accompanying this, the immense enjoyment and support they found in this area. Whereas in a lot of Sydney clubs it is expected that IRB people turn up every week for patrol, extra activities, such as displays, training exercises and competition are considered frivolous and a waste of money. I believe this attitude is slowly changing, but it is important for all clubs to realise that if IRB activities ARE NOT ENJOYABLE and there is nothing but "PATROL" to do, then participation and involvement begins to wane.

A sincere thank you to Arthur White, the District IRB Supervisor for the Bate Bay Beaches, who is always willing to lend a hand. Also, to Brad Taylor and Anthony Graham for their assistance with National Park clubs. To Steve Barrett for his assistance in helping with my vision of a Twilight Series and to Peter Burst for his unfailing dedication to Sydney IRBs - doing the Waverley IRB Supervisor's job, maintaining and towing the Branch IRB, and participating in all IRB activities. Your efforts were very much appreciated and you are an example to us all.

Last, but not least, the officials and new officials who helped out in the inaugural Twilight Series and the Branch Championships, thanks to each and everyone of you. Without your help, IRBs in Sydney would continue to flounder.

On a positive note, the action plan for next season has been done. It includes more sponsorship of IRB activities in the Branch. A large open IRB carnival, more educational training activities and a lot of encouraging plans to keep the Sydney Branch IRB sections growing and improving.

Congratulations are extended to JASON HODSDON for receiving the "Radio Operator of the Year" award. A job well done.



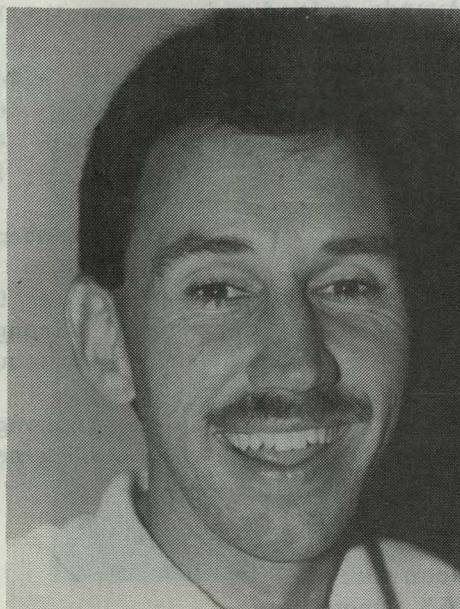

ORB SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

The Offshore Rescue Boats have been flagships of our Emergency Services with the professional manner in which they have operated they have successfully promoted the Branch's 24 hour call-out system.

During the winter months the Offshore 2 group had modifications to their boatshed to extend the roof and provide kitchen and bathroom facilities. Then early in October 1993, the group took delivery of a new eight metre "Shark Cat". The group decided to have members bring the boat down the coast from Queensland by water which proved to be an excellent opportunity for training.



Offshore 3 had a busy season with training which paid off with a good number of awards going through which now puts the group in the position that they are fully operational with qualified crew.

During the season Offshore 3 obtained a mobile telephone and more pagers giving both the boats additional means of communications, to supplement their surf and marine radios.

In November 1993 we held a field day with both boats on display at the Sydney Water Police complex. The Ambulance, Fire Brigade and Coast Guard inspected the boats and went for a ride in them, before joining our crews for a barbecue lunch. I believe that this field day gave these organisations a good understanding of the boats and the call-out system.

During January 1994 we had the bushfires in the Royal National Park. Both Offshore 2 & 3 were involved with the evacuation of the National Parks and for use by the Ambulance Service for access to areas where roads were cut by fire.

Then in mid January 1994, Offshore 2 were called out to assist in the search for an aircraft which went missing off the coast in the Cronulla area.

A number of times during the season Offshore 3 were called to assist with rescues in the Manly-Warringah area.

Both groups have had a busy season and performed well, called to perform rescues in what was at times very hazardous conditions.

Finally, I would like to congratulate both groups for their efforts and wish them the best for the coming season.

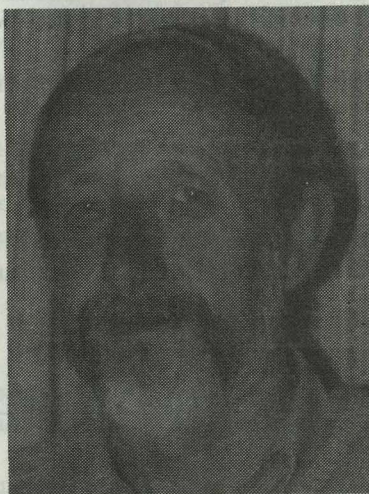

TAKING COMMUNICATIONS TO THE RESCUE SCENE

CRONULLA SUTHERLAND DISTRICT
SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

A difficult time with mixed results is the only way to describe the 1993-94 season. Once again I am indebted to a small group of people who volunteered their time to trial squads this season. The examiners of the District are still a little acknowledged group of people whose work is vital for new members to become part of the SLS movement. I find it disturbing that club management cannot come to terms with the fact that they have no plans or strategies to encourage their members to become examiners.



For two years I have put this problem before the clubs but have yet to see any constructive debate or satisfactory conclusion.

I am pleased to report that in most instances patrols were adequate with personnel and equipment. As with the previous year I received good co-operation from the captains and patrol members. To all of these people "thank you very much." All the clubs worked well together and helped each other when required, however, at times communication on the state of IRB availability could have been better.

In my last report I wrote a chapter on the need to train and improve the knowledge of patrol captains and patrol members. This problem still remains. The classic example this season was the failure of the clubs to introduce the knowledge of spinal lifts to their patrols. On the second last week-end of the season I asked five patrols to demonstrate a spinal lift, only one was able to perform the task.

The quality of the squads presented at the trials was very mixed. Yes, there were some good squads but compared with the previous season I would say not as good. A lot of time was taken up by examiners correcting what should have been basic skills. Many squads had short training times and should not have been presented for trial.

I believe that the failure to train patrols and differing quality of squads is the same problem, which is one of priority. I am concerned that the priorities of the clubs are no longer dominated by Life Saving; this has now been eclipsed by major competition and sponsorship money.

It is no longer good enough to have only a "Chief Instructor" responsible for the training of a surf club. These people are overworked receiving little help from both management and members. To rectify this situation the same amount of resources and people must be made available for "Life Saving" as is available for competition. As with competition, a group of qualified people

is needed to ensure all squad instructors, patrol captains and patrol members receive adequate training and assistance. These people would need to have a recognized position within the club and be responsible to the Chief Instructor. I would like to emphasise the need to assist and train TOCs as I consider a lack of experience in instructing squads is the main reason for the problems with squads this season.

In conclusion although this report has been critical of aspects relating to squads and patrols, I must acknowledge all the fine people within our clubs who have worked so hard this season. The patrol vice captains, chief instructors, instructors, IRB drivers and patrol members. Let's get back to basics of Surf Life Saving and give them the support they need.

RANDWICK DISTRICT SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

1993/94 the season of status quo! Clubs in the Randwick District have basically "marked time" this season with marginal improvement being shown compared to the previous season.

In bronze radio training we refer to the 3P's as being POSITION, PROBLEM, PEOPLE as part of our operation.

I would like to spend a few moments reviewing the District Supervisor's 3P's - PROFICIENCIES, PATROLS, PRELIMS.

PROFICIENCIES:

Clubs need to address the minimal attention given to proficiencies each season. Timing of proficiencies has deliberately been put back to allow for the low water temperatures in October, but clubs still have not seized the opportunity during early patrols to ensure members are brought back to the required standard. Ask yourself this question. If a member of my family required assistance would I be happy with this person handling the rescue situation? Personally, I believe the current proficiency testing requirement and method of examination needs to be reviewed by the clubs and Branch.

PATROLS:

For the best part clubs achieved an acceptable level of performance during the season. Maintaining a consistent quality across all patrols appears to be a difficulty most clubs encounter.

The best performing patrols are those where the Patrol Captain demonstrates true leadership qualities, shows initiative, endeavours to build a team and keeps interest levels and a team spirit within the patrol.

Apart from the clubs responsibility in allocating the correct balance of skills and personnel to each patrol, a way of improving PATROL EFFECTIVENESS and improving PROFICIENCIES may be to test the Patrols' Proficiency rather than solely the individual i.e. have compulsory individual requirements such as Run-Swim-Run, Signals and Resuscitation but instead of testing everyone on all of the other practical components, allocate real life situations for the patrol to handle. That way each Patrol Captain could be responsible for ensuring skills levels are developed and maintained.

Many of you probably have your own ideas on how improvements to these areas can be made. I would suggest that the pre-season conference may be appropriate forums to air your views.

PRELIMS:

Each Club elected a new Chief Instructor this year which inevitably leads to a change in training stands, sometimes for the better - sometimes not.

Clubs must take responsibility and be accountable for the induction of these new people to their roles.

More experienced personnel can be invaluable in ensuring standards are maintained. It is essential that members training squads, do just that! They need to understand the difference between Training and Teaching to prepare squads to the appropriate level.

I believe the overall standard of candidates submitted for Preliminary Exemption to have been of a satisfactory level but slightly down in quality on last year. The overall number of awards obtained in the District were also down.

My personal thanks to my Deputy, Yvette Roser, for her valued assistance during the year.

To the many examiners in the District who unselfishly gave up time to assist with both Preliminary Examinations and Proficiency tests - Thank You!

To each Club Captain for their personal contribution to their clubs overall on beach performance.

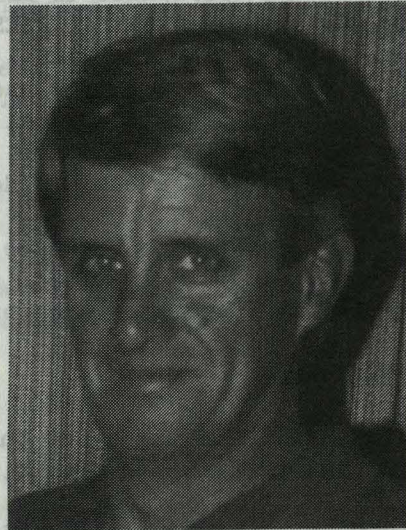

EXAMINATION AND INSTRUCTION SUPERVISOR

I thank you.



I was very pleased to see new examiners join the Board. They were very quickly shown the ropes by our long standing Board members, taking their time to explain the finer points of examinations. Towards the end of the season our new examiners' confidence grew and they were keen to do more exams, unsupervised, which certainly helped to take the pressure off some of our examiners who have been stretched to the limit over the last two seasons.

At this point I would like to pay tribute to Bob Peterson who passed away this season. 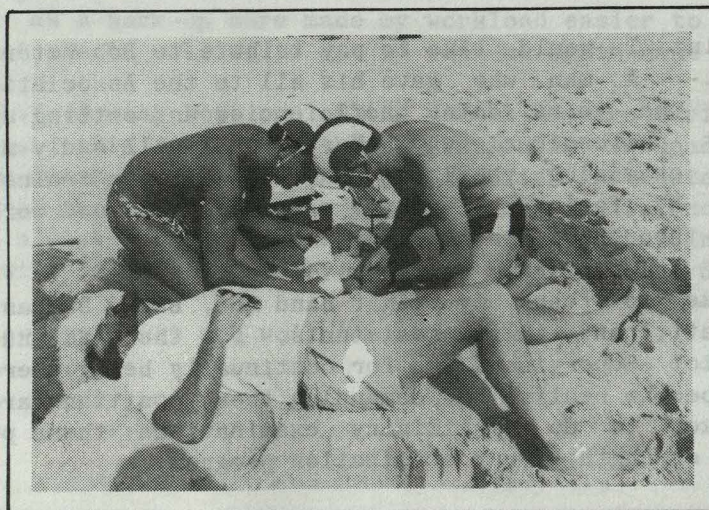

RANDWICK AND WAVERLEY DISTRICT A.R.C. EXAMINATION TEAM REPORT

Awards this season were slightly down on last year's high numbers, however, the total of 66 ARC and 5 ARCI awards achieved during the season is quite healthy.

This season saw the inclusion of the spinal collar into the ARC. Whilst the spinal collar and its application is an easy skill to learn, there is still some way to go in placing the correct emphasis on the practical treatment of spinal patients (including the application of the collar). Too much emphasis is being placed on a drilled five person lift of spinal patients and too little emphasis is being placed on the practical management of patients, given the wide variety of variables.

Continued development of training and examination techniques over the next season should be given some priority by examiners.

Standards this season have been, once again, high. I would like to thank ARC Instructors for their valuable efforts and the hospitality shown to examiners.

Sadly this season will be remembered for the passing of Bob Peterson. Bob was personally responsible for the training of hundreds of ARC candidates over the last few years. He was enthusiastic, meticulous, practical and modest. Bob was an extraordinary person and will be missed by each member of the ARC examination team.

The examination team consists of Peter Agnew, Paul Cooper, Roger Habib, Tim Murray, Hans Visch and myself. Thanks to each member of the examination team for their valuable contribution and continued dedication to lifesaving.

The team would like to thank Dr Ian Mackie A.M. for his support of the team. Close contact with Dr Mackie provides us with a security and back-up which we all appreciate.

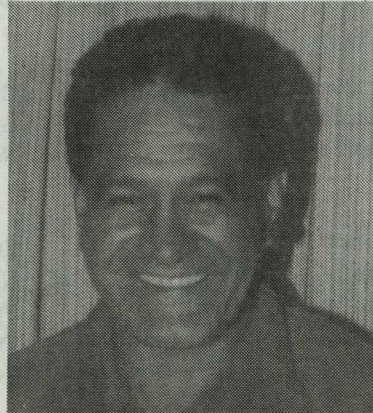

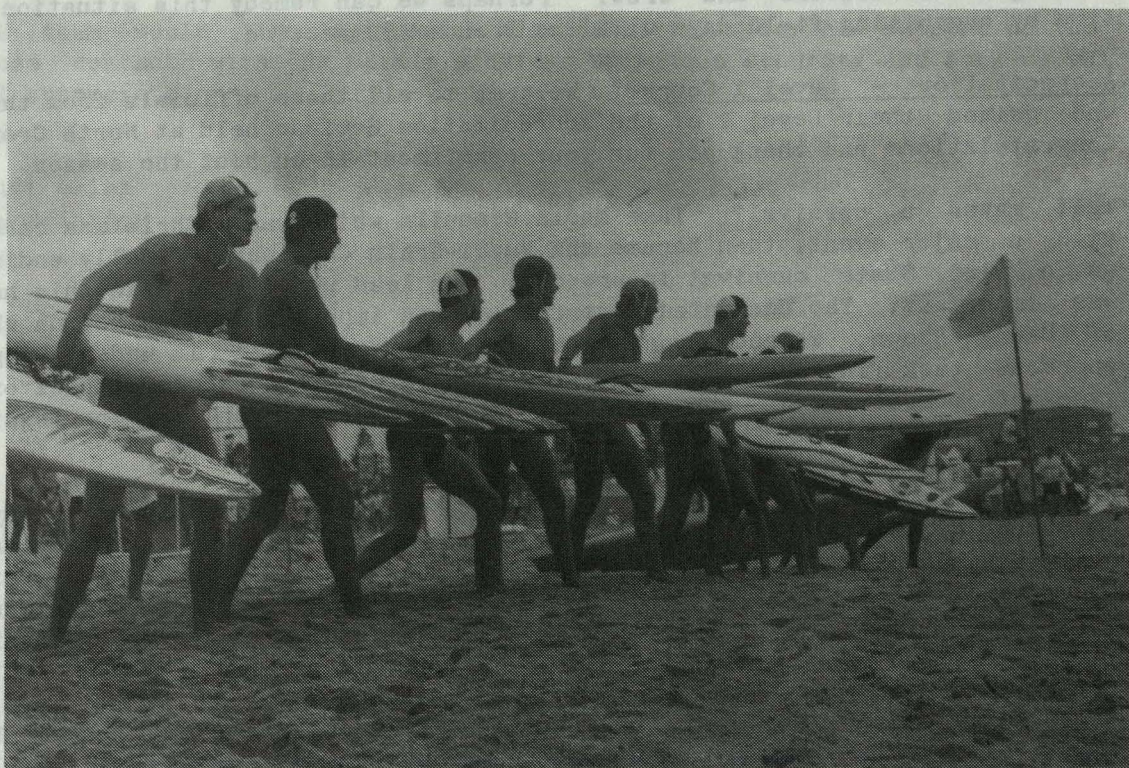
Finally, I would like to thank all Sydney Branch clubs and their members, your role has given this Branch a reputation of high standard of excellence in competition.
