

Instruction and Examination Report

The Examination and Instruction portfolio has contained a large amount of change during the year as we continually strive to learn and try to improve the area of our exams and instruction within the Branch.

The season started off with Seminar 94 that involved Club Executives, Delegate Officers and Board Examiners spending a weekend at Narrabeen Sports Academy to look at a variety of topics. One of the major topics that was presented was by Dr Dianne Kendel the NSW Examination Adviser who presented a new format for the Examination of the Surf Life Saving Certificate and Bronze Medallions.

The format had been trialed in other areas of NSW, and was in response to Clubs concern that new patrol members lacked knowledge in basic patrol duties and coordinated rescue skills.

The participants at Seminar 94 adopted enthusiastically two examination changes, being the introduction of a written paper and a patrol based scenario. Following several detailed Examiner and Chief Instructor meetings to detail the major workings of the new exam format, it was put into operation on January 1st 1995.

Proficiency tests once again formed part of a busy start to the season with two to three examiners being appointed to each venue. The amount examined in the proficiency tests still is of concern to the Board and with another addition this season being examined it seems that most of these annual tests now concentrate on quantity of items examined rather than quality. I believe that the true objectives of proficiency testing needs to be clearly defined and a totally new approach taken to meeting these objectives than the current method used.

Several "Train the Trainer" courses were held within the Branch for all new training officers and instructors. The main aim of "Train the Trainer" is to teach instructors how to better teach and understand the principles of teaching. A total of 43 candidates attended. The largest number in NSW.

A New Examiners Evening was held during the year to brief potential examiners on their roles and responsibilities. A number of new examiners joined the Board this year and we take the opportunity to welcome you to the ranks.

Carnival and Competition Supervisor's Report

Season 1994/95 has been a major learning curve for me, in terms of adjusting to and establishing exactly what is required from the Carnival and Competition Supervisor.

At the commencement of the year, a very clear set of objectives were determined by Management as the major issues to be addressed and achieved in the area of Competition, Carnivals and Official. These objectives all formed part of the Sydney Branch Board — Operation Plan.

In reporting to you I can say that whilst we moved forward considerably in our endeavours to improve overall performance, we did not fully realise the objectives set, a situation that must be rectified in 1995/96. There are still many areas requiring improved focus in the Carnival Competition area, but I now believe we once again have a credible base, and a solid foundation from which to springboard into next season.

Sydney Branch conducted six Senior Carnivals through the season, a Twilight IRB series, plus special events and Junior Carnivals. To ensure the Branch continues to provide the best officials' support available, a succession plan for officials is in the process of being introduced. The talent within our ranks needs to be fully utilised, with experienced senior officials assisting with the development and training of up and coming members.

The depth of talent available in the Branch is highlighted in the Senior Carnival appointments, where the skills of a broad number of officials were called upon to fill senior roles.

Singly the most important issue to address in 1995/96 is the total integration of the Senior and Junior Competition Boards, with increased emphasis placed on the appointment of officials and timing of all carnivals. The benefits of dovetailing a competition requirements and having our strong and united Board are endless! This year's experiment of combining Junior and Senior events at the Wanda Carnivals has been extremely well received, with positive feedback coming from clubs, parents and officials alike.

Thirty new officials primarily from the Juniors, participated in the three Level 1 Accreditation Courses conducted during the season. Thanks to Peter Agnew, John Restuccia and Peter Davis who assisted me in conducting these courses.

Congratulations to all those officials who qualified at the various accreditation levels during the season.

Michelle Phillips and her "crew" again conducted the Twilight IRB series very efficiently and successfully. My thanks to all concerned! The Branch still has not solved the problem of recruiting, training and retaining Duty Crews for normal carnivals. The topic has been thoroughly discussed and a plan is to be investigated to fix this shortfall in our operation in 1995/96.

Thank you to all clubs and officials for your efforts and support in 1994/95 in ensuring Carnivals and Competition offered in Sydney Branch remain the best on offer!

The equipment on a whole performed well, but towards the end of the season one radio started to play up. There is an application in next years budget to upgrade some of the equipment in the room, so this will not be a problem in the coming year.

The big problem faced by the Branch radio room is the lack of operators. There have been a number of requests made throughout the season for clubs to provide more members. Unfortunately this has met with an extremely poor response. I urge all clubs to try to find operators before the next season starts, so they can be trained and put on patrol as soon as possible.

Superintendents Report

The 1994/95 season saw several ideas tried for the first time. The end result being a disappointing fourth place at the Inter-Branch Championships.

Carnivals came thick and fast through the month of November, with Coogee hosting the Randwick Shield, which was well organised by Warick Wheeler and his team. (What a great bunch for the next Branch Titles ... just thinking aloud ...).

This was followed by the Waverley Shield run by North Bondi who always seem lucky enough to have a surf that suits the Juniors, which ensures a quick well run carnival.

We then moved on the Bate Bat 4-Way Carnival, this year hosted by Paul Lyon and his team at Cronulla, again another well run carnival that finished on time, just before a tremendous thunderstorm that could have created havoc. Paul showed his organisational skills by co-ordinating the Cronulla Open Junior Carnival just two weeks later.

The final carnival before the State Titles was the Branch Championships organised by Ian Lindfield and his Carnival Team at Wanda, this event was a little slow at the start but we made up time as the day progressed and managed to come off the beach earlier than in previous years.

A major reason for this improvement was due to the efforts put in by our very capable team of officials headed by Deputy Carnival and Water Referee, Reg Francis and Beach Referee Norm "Buzz" Piddington who kept things moving for the whole day.

Whilst on officials I would ask that all Clubs take a hard look at the number of available officials and then try to involve new blood as we can very quickly find ourselves unable to run carnivals because of a shortage of qualified people.

In conclusion, I would like to thank John De Cean for his help and guidance, Robyn Knox for the quick and efficient distribution of information to Clubs and last but not least Reg Francis who was partner, not a deputy in the role of Superintendent.

Bronte Surf Life Saving Club

The season 1994/95 was relatively successful overall but especially in terms of the reason for all Surf Life Saving, that is the protection of the surf bathing public from the vagaries of the surf. Once again Bronte SLSC is proud to report that no lives were lost whilst patrols were on duty. This result has been proudly boasted by Bronte SLSC members for over thirty years and is a direct result of the dedication that the Club's active members have displayed as well as those Club Officials responsible for overseeing this function.

In the 1994/95 Season, over 550 rescues and preventative actions were undertaken and a mammoth estimated 900 first aid cases attended. The large number of first aid cases were the direct result of the unusual blue bottle infestations that appeared at Bronte during the year, apart from stingers, there were only minor cuts and bruises to attend to, all first aid cases were generally attended to by Bronte Members with assistance from the Waverley Municipal Beach Inspectors to whom the Club is grateful. The Club worked well with these Beach Inspectors and the close liaison between these professionals and Club Officials and Members contributes to this.

The past season saw an increase in the number of Life Saving Awards gained and the Club must extend its thanks not only to its own Chief Instructor (who unfortunately was posted overseas with his employer), but to the Instructors at Bronte who took squads through and the Branch Officials who examined these squads to ensure they met the rigid standards now enforced. A pleasing aspect for the Club and possibly the Branch was the number of new instructors and their potential to take on Branch Examiners positions at a Branch level. However, with the low numbers of active members available to Bronte SLSC to man the patrols, it is "often and overkill" to ask these people to back up and perform extra duties. However, some of the new instructors have indicated that they would be willing to assist, if only in a small way.
