



## **HONORARY SECRETARY**



Fellow members, on behalf of the Branch Superintendent Peter Agnew and Officers I have much pleasure in presenting this Forty Sixth Annual Report. My job is a simple one of recording and collating the facts as presented and writing letters and reports. The real work is carried out by the Board Officers and the active Board Members.

I took over the position of Honorary Secretary in September and since that time have had the opportunity to witness what happens behind the scenes and the hard work put in by your Officials, which in the main has led to a very satisfying season. Due to a number of resignations Peter Agnew, John Restuccia and Brad Taylor have doubled up on positions. They must be congratulated on their commitment to the Board, as in these trying times it is difficult enough to do one job successfully let alone two.

The season started off with Seminar 94 at Narrabeen Sports Academy. It was titled LIFESAVING OF THE FUTURE. The weekend was multifaceted with Club Presidents, Secretaries, Chief Instructors and as well as Board Members, taking part, with attendance nearing the hundred mark. Dr Diana Kendall spoke on the following topics: "Train the Trainer, Examine the Examinee and, most importantly the new Bronze Medallion Examination". In addition Dennis Haussner, Scott Derwin, Ernie Davis and Gus Stanton spoke, as well as members John De Cean, Bill Singleton, Yvette Roser, Peter Agnew, John Restuccia and Keith Grima.

It was felt that it was time to review the Boards Structure and a number of changes are planned, which include, doing away with the Superintendents position and creating three Directorships; Lifesaving, Education and Competition. Such positions will all be on the Branches' Executive. I believe the changes are necessary and will result in a smoother running structure and should in the long run, result in improved efficiencies for all concerned.

As with all seasons, we have seen members resign, which is unfortunate, with others joining and we wish you a long and enjoyable association with the Board. The drought which has effected so much of Australia touched us with Jenny Anderson transferring to Country membership due to her having to return to her familys' property.

On the Lifesaving side patrol uniforms are seemingly becoming more acceptable to active Patrol members, with T-Shirts now being worn by most and shorts becoming more common. This of course makes us more visible to the public and can only improve our high profile on the Beach. Hopefully all clubs will incorporate the shorts next season.

Once again the question of Professional Life Savers doing patrols was raised. They can only sign on if they wear a patrol cap and are under the direction of the Patrol Captain. This in effect means, they like the rest of club members can only do patrols when they are not working.

Clubs continued to request to sign off early from patrols. Such requests can not be given a positive response, as we are committed legally to our patrol hours, however requests to go onto surveillance via the appropriate officers is given when the conditions allow for a reduced presence on the beach.

Clubs are reminded that gear which is not inspected or passed during the Annual Gear Inspection must be presented for inspection prior to it being used. Again there are legal ramifications if this is not adhered to.

Changes to the Bronze Examination, has seen a move back to basics with candidates demonstrating how they will react to patrol situations. Both candidates and examiners seem to have reacted favourably to the format.

Peter Agnew's introduction of a Board Plan was well received and gave direction through out the season, and is being looked at for the coming season. It was and is a great management tool.

The radio room has been a vital link to clubs patrols for coordinating emergency situations and is the eyes and ears of the Board. Unfortunately, not all clubs appreciate its importance and there have been difficulties in manning it. Our thanks to those clubs who have helped. The room is continuing to be upgraded and the facilities for operators has improved considerably through the purchase of a microwave oven and providing lunches and videos ( for use in the quiet periods)

Solly Stephens provided the definitive advice on how to do a pickup whilst using a rescue board, which was widely circulated.

Colin Fitzgerald has worked hard with the concept on integrating carnival activities with the JAC and combined carnivals which will become more common in the future. Colin is also looking at introducing boogie board competitions, which I am sure will be at least as successful as the boardriding.

Solly Stephens was honoured with Life membership of National Council and Harry Brown was likewise with Life membership of State Centre.

We wrote to State Centre with respect to our concerns as to the format of the AMP challenge with regards to swimmers being in the water at the same time as IRBs. They did not share our concern.

Peter Agnew, introduced INSIDE SURF magazine and we had two excellent issues. Hopefully next season this great piece of communication will become a more regular feature in our publications arsenal. Peter Agnew also formulated and introduced the Education Committee, which is now meeting on a regular basis.

We held two full Board meetings, and at the second one Darren Peters (General Manager Coaching and Education - National Council) gave a very interesting and enlightening talk on educational standards and reassessing our existing standards. At the same meeting the proposed changes to our structure were endorsed in principle.

We also held an examination and instruction meeting at which Terry Boardman (NSW State Superintendent) spoke on a full range of topics, including examinations, new manual, beach closures and first aid accreditation to name a few.

One of the problems with anything to do with the Association is attending meetings. So as not to unnecessarily impinge on officers limited time it was resolved our management meeting not be compulsory except for the Executive, so long as was were kept up to date. This I believe worked well.

I have enjoyed the season as the new kid on the block and hope that you all look forward to the coming season with enthusiasm, as without your support it won't work. To the clubs, the Board is made up of your members, to do your bidding so please support us and encourage your members to join and this in turn will enhance the beaches activities and reflect upon yourselves.

To Peter, John, Brad and Colin thanks for your patience and assistance I appreciated it.



#### **EMERGENCY SERVICIES CO-ORDINATOR**

Once again I would like to start off this report by thanking the Duty Officers for their outstanding efforts this Season. Apart from the load placed on these people in their role as Duty Officers all of them carried out patrol duties in either Offshore Rescue Boats, Sydney Surf radio room or beach patrols. Many of them did all or a combination of these as well as holding down club and Branch positions. This shows great dedication to Surf Life Saving in Sydney Branch.

During the Season the Duty Officers received training in trauma counselling. This training is not intended to replace professional counsellors and is only to be used to conduct initial debriefings and to help clubs recognise people in need of professional counselling after a major incident. The benefits of this training have proven to be very useful on a number of occasions this season.


This season was much quieter than last season, in fact the total rescues were down by 55%. I feel this is due largely to calmer seas this year. The other big factor, as far as the call outs go, is there were nowhere near the amount of fisherman washed off rocks. Fisherman being washed off rocks was a major problem last year and an advertising campaign to halt this trend was started, obviously this has worked.

#### RADIO SUPERVISOR

Sydney Surf has had many ups and downs this season, but thanks to a hand full of devoted people the room managed to stay open all season. The radio room handled 33 incidents that were called through from Clubs. This figure is way down on last season, 60% in fact, but this seemed to be the trend right across the board. I might add John De Cean tried his hardest to get this figure up, it seemed every time he was on patrol, there was a rescue.

The equipment on a whole performed well, but towards the end of the season one radio started to play up. There is an application in next years budget to upgrade some of the equipment in the room, so this will not be a problem in the coming year.

The big problem faced by the Branch radio room is the lack of operators. There have been a number of requests made throughout the season for clubs to provide more members. Unfortunately this has met with an extremely poor response. I urge all clubs to try to find operators before the next season starts, so they can be trained and put on patrol as soon as possible.

Listed below are the operators and their hours for the season. The highlighted names are those who obtained their 100%. This is worked out on patrolling 20 hours before 31.12.94 and 20 hours after 31.12.94. Both Brad McDonogh and Michael Shea did more than 40 hours but, unfortunately only did half the season.



## **EXAMINATION & INSTRUCTOR SUPERVISOR**

The Examination and Instruction portfolio has contained a large amount of change during the year as we continually strive to learn and try to improve the area of our exams and instruction within the Branch.

This Season started off with Seminar 94 that involved Club Executives, Delegate Officers and Board Examiners spending a weekend at Narrabeen Sports Academy to look at a variety of topics. One of the major topics that was presented was by Dr Dianne Kendel the NSW Examination Adviser who presented a new format for the Examination of the Surf Life Saving Certificate and Bronze Medallions.

The Format had been trialed in other areas of NSW, and was in response to Clubs concern that new Patrol members lacked knowledge in basic Patrol duties and coordinated rescue skills.

The participants at Seminar 94 adopted enthusiastically two examination changes, being the introduction of a written paper and a patrol based scenario. Following several detailed Examiner and Chief Instructor meetings to detail the major workings of the new exam format, it was put into operation on January 1st 1995.

Proficiency tests once again formed part of a busy start to the Season with two to three Examiners being appointed to each venue. The amount examined in the proficiency tests still is of concern to the Board and with another addition this Season being examined it seems that most of these annual tests now concentrate on quantity of items examined rather than quality. I believe that the true objectives of proficiency testing needs to be clearly defined and a totally new approach taken to meeting these objectives than the current method used.

Several "Train the Trainer" courses were held within the Branch for all new Training Officers and Instructors. The main aim of "Train the Trainer" is to teach Instructors how to better teach and understand the principles of teaching. A total of 43 candidates attended. The largest number in NSW.

A new Examiners evening was held during the year to brief Potential Examiners on their roles and responsibilities. A number of new Examiners joined the Board this year and we take the opportunity to welcome you to the ranks.

I would like to thank the club Training Officers for their efforts and their hospitality.



# CARNIVAL AND COMPETITION SUPERVISOR



Season 1994/95 has been a major learning curve for me, in terms of adjusting to and establishing exactly what is required from the Carnival and Competition Supervisor.

At the commencement of the year, a very clear set of objectives were determined by Management as the major issues to be addressed and achieved in the area of Competition, Carnivals and Official. These objectives all formed part of the Sydney Branch Board - Operation Plan.

In reporting to you I can say that whilst we moved forward considerably in our endeavours to improve overall performance, we did not fully realise the objectives set, a situation that must be rectified in 1995/96. There are still many areas requiring improved focus in the Carnival Competition area, but I now believe we once again have a credible base, and a solid foundation from which to springboard into next season.

Sydney Branch conducted eight Senior Carnivals through the season, a Twilight IRB series, plus special events and Junior Carnivals. To ensure the Branch continues to provide the best Officials' support available, a succession plan for Officials is in the process of being introduced. The talent within our ranks needs to be fully utilised, with experienced Senior Officials assisting with the development and training of up and coming members.

The depth of talent available in the Branch is highlighted in the Senior Carnival appointments, where the skills of a broad number of Officials were called upon to fill senior roles.

Congratulations to all those Officials who qualified at the various accreditation levels during the season.

Michelle Phillips and her "crew" again conducted the Twilight IRB series very efficiently and successfully. My thanks to all concerned! The Branch still has not solved the problem of recruiting, training and retaining Duty Crews for normal carnivals. The topic has been thoroughly discussed and a plan is to be instigated to fix this shortfall in our operation in 1995/96.

Thank you to all clubs and officials for your efforts and support in 1994/95 in ensuring Carnivals and Competition offered in Sydney Branch remain the best on offer!


