PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Following is the 1995/96 Annual Report and Financial Statement which has been prepared by our Administration Director, John De Cean. Considerable time has been spent preparing this record of activities of our Clubs and Branch. John, congratulations for producing another accurate and interesting report.

Our Lifesaving activities were exceptional, Clubs and Groups performed 1,793 rescues, well done and congratulations to all. Awards were slightly down with Bronze Medallions static and Life Saving Certificates up. Total awards were 993, down 98 on the previous year.

Competition continues to be strong, with Elouera taking out the overall pointscore in the Branch Championships, which were held at Bondi. The Elouera Club won the State Championships and then were crowned the World Club Champions at the World Lifesaving Titles in Durban, South Africa. Sydney featured prominently with five of the top ten positions held by Sydney Clubs. After many difficult meetings, Sydney Branch provided the venue for the State Championships. Our commiserations go to Wanda who were unsuccessful in finalising arrangements to an acceptable level with State Centre allowing South Maroubra to accept the challenge which they did and conducted a most successful championships. Carnival dates continue to be a problem which will need to be addressed by Clubs, Branch and State to resolve the issue.

On administration, we reduced staff to an acceptable level to compensate for the shortfall in Sponsorship. Our funding has been tight due to the loss of WD & HO Wills although we have worked hard and long to seek another major sponsor. We currently have negotiations with three large organisations and trust that shortly we can have a positive result.

On behalf of the Branch, we sincerely thank Members of the Board of Control, for their continued effort, time and advice at Examinations, Training sessions, Carnivals and Displays. Again well done and congratulations on another successful season.

To our sponsors, thank you for your contribution whether large or small; they all assist in funding our organisation. This is becoming extremely difficult as we continue to have increased costs. To the Federal, State and Local Governments, we express our appreciation for your strong financial support towards Surf Life Saving.

To the Branch Clubs and Members, my personal thanks for your continued support. I am proud to represent you knowing that Sydney is one of the leading Branches in New South Wales through your efforts.

To my fellow Executive Officers, thank you for the tremendous sacrifice; you each give up many hours of your own time to the Branch. I trust this year it has been beneficial to you personally. To retiring Directors Peter Agnew, John Restuccia and Colin Fitzgerald thank you for your contribution over the years. I am disappointed that you are not seeking reelection and wish you all every success in your new endeavours. To Ken English, Deputy President, and John De Cean, Administration Director, your continued support is appreciated. My thanks also to our past Treasurer, David Bergin and his replacement, Brent Jackson, who has now been transferred to Victoria. I also thank Yvette Roser, our Office Manager, for her dedicated services.

I have enjoyed my first year as your President. To put it together with my personal and work commitments has been exciting and challenging and I look forward to an even prosperous season ahead.



- Gear Inspection



This year patrol notices were unfortunately up by about 40% on last year, which means clubs either signed on late or left early. Most were signing on late which must be an issue for all club captains.

This is a first for Sydney Branch as we now have the State and Australian Life Saver of the year. Congratulations Suzanne Young. Also a first, the "Heroes of the Surf" was also taken out by the ORB3 crew of, Richard Lissadden, Andrew Lissadden, Marcus O'Donoghue & Ursula Say, after doing a rescue off Yellow Rock, which resulted in the saving of the crew of a stranded boat, which was heading towards the rocks. "Well done Crew".

To the six finalists in the Sydney Branch Life Saver of the year competition, well done and good luck on the Branch Presentation night.

This season was the worst ever in the Branch's history with respect to spinal's, with eleven. Four (4) were taken by helicopter with one being in a critical condition. The only good thing out of all this, is all feedback from the Ambulance and Helicopter Services reported that patrol personnel handled the spinals proficiently, which is a credit to our training on spinal injuries.

Once again Christmas Day was a big day for the Bondi Beach Clubs, as around 150 people were rescued including a mass rescue of 60 people. It's good to see Local Government will finally be looking at Bondi on Christmas day, as it's a major concern to all.

Life guards at the National Park was a major project which I tackled. To the members of Garie I'm confident you will soon see a life guard there. A recent meeting with Premier Bob Carr was a major step forward in bring this matter to finality. A meeting with Royal National Park and Wildlife authorities will finally give some Government body power to make a decision, so safety can be maintained down there at Garie.

To all the members of the Branch Radio Room, thanks for your ongoing support this year. As it was a very busy and trying season, your professionalism helped our Life Savers on the beach maintain safety. "Good work Team"

To the two ORB Groups thanks as well. Your presence on our beaches is greatly appreciated. Your quick response to rescues is second to none, that's why the NSW Police Force are continuing to call out our rescue service.

Director of Examination & Instruction Report

So its time to write up another year as a member of the Sydney Branch Board of Control and to reflect as to what did actually happen in the last twelve months in the area of Examination & Instruction.

Following the clamour of trying to pull dates and venues together during the winter the season opened to the mellow tunes of the "Start of the Season E & I Conference", which saw fifty three examiners and chief Instructors attend a one day meet at the Prince Henry Hospital conference rooms to discuss the direction of the season.

The day was mainly used to launch the SLS NSW Education Panel's guidelines for the conduct of Bronze Medallion and various other projects. All present agreed to move towards the new format, leaving behind the prelim/final exam system and moving towards a knowledge, skills and scenario format; thus embarking on one of the largest changes, to the way we examine and instruct within the Branch, in recent times.

Following the E & I Conference on the Saturday, the Sunday was taken up by the first Examiner Course. Conducted by Dr. Dianna Kendall and David Armstrong the course moved from the normal content of the BM to the actual skills an examiner requires to examine.

The examiner's course will now form the base for examiner's education and will also be the initial port of call for new examiners.

At the end of season post mortem of our Examination methods, a number of successes and failures could be reported on:-

- * Examiners and Instructors generally agreed that this season is superior to previous seasons.
- * The teaching of rescue scenarios should become part of an instructors training methods throughout a squad's duration and that preliminary checks of candidates should be completed by a senior instructor prior to presentation of a squad or examination.

* As a Board of Examiners, we must have a better understanding as to the assessment criteria for the patrol rescue scenario and continue to investigate improved human resource methods for examining the Part A and B formats.

Train the Trainer courses were held on eight occasions throughout the Branch during the season with candidates becoming accredited prior to gaining their Training Officers Certificate. This course will become invaluable with the introduction of a Bronze Lesson Plan book with forty, one hour lesson plans under the current format of the TTT.

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The Board Education Panel had a large influence in the area of Examination and Instruction at the start of the season, comprising of Suzanne Young, Dianne Lovell, Craig Farrugia, Paul Tardent and Peter Murphy. The panel was responsible for the formulation of plans and procedures for the season and put in a large work load during the normal quite time of winter. My thanks to all.

Dianne Lovell has put in a large contribution to the TTT program and has been invaluable during the year, with trips with me to other Branches, to conducting all the programs in the Cronulla-Sutherland area.

I attended three State Education Panel weekend meetings during the season and found the workings of the panel to be of pure inspiration with a number of projects being conceived, developed and implemented. I believe these projects will have a stream of positive effects to Examination & Instruction in the coming seasons. Sincere congratulations must clearly go to Dianne Kendall the NSW Education Adviser and NSW NDO David Armstrong for their full and utmost commitment to this area of Surf Life Saving.

The District Supervisors and Assistants wore a large burden of the new exam system during the year and to their credit did a fantastic job, may I take this opportunity to thank them on your behalf, well done!

Thanks, Andrew Chubb the E & I Director of Sydney Northern Beaches who like Dianna has given me the time in both meetings and over the phone that has helped Sydney Branch immensely on a large number of occasions during the year.

To the Branch Executive, the Board Officers and to Natalie and Yvette, thank you once again for your advice, assistance and support.

The Board would not be able to function without the Active Examiners that are committed to Surf Life Saving in Sydney and who give up their weekends, to have feet in the sand, examining Bronze Medallion Squads or in the training rooms examining ARC Awards, in our IRB's and ORB's and at the coal face for Proficiencies. My thank you, seems hardly enough.

So what did happen during the year?

- * The conduct of over 126 separate Examinations with a total of 993 candidates.
- * 2600 members being examined in 63 separate proficiency tests.

- * One day E & I workshop seminar.
- A two night resuscitation workshop conducted by Keith Grima
- * The introduction of a new SLS Training Manual.
- * Eight Train the Trainer courses ran with the attendance of 71 TO's and Instructors accredited.
- * Four Examiner Accreditation Courses ran.
- * Three Examination and Instructionmeetings held.
- * Introduction of SLS NSW BM guidelines.
- * Proficiency exemption scheme.

Director of Competition Report

In reporting to you on the 1995/96 season, I can say that there was continued commitment by the Branch, clubs and officials alike, to provide a quality of competition befitting Sydney Branch. Eight (8) senior carnivals (including the Branch Championships) were conducted during the season, as well as a Twilight IRB Series, other special events and Junior Carnivals.

In an endeavour to meet SLSA guidelines on Member Retention, this season has been one of trial and innovation! Several new initiatives were undertaken with contrasting measures of success!

The concept of conducting a Life Saving Events only carnival, comprising Surf Rescue Challenge, Patrol Competition, First Aid and Champion Lifesaver was well accepted and attended by clubs. A definite winner! The original concept of holding several carnivals in a season on non conflicting dates to regular competition is definitely the way to proceed next year. A review of event timetabling needs to be undertaken, as there is a particularly high instance of competitors participating in several events during the day.

Two (2) fully integrated Senior/Junior carnivals were conducted this season, with a much broader range of event options being made available to U/12 and U/14 competitors. (Originally we trialed "Team Events" only last season). There is a significant opportunity to further develop the potential of these carnivals with both competitors and officials alike. The greatest disappointment during my two (2) year tenure in this role has been my inability to successfully integrate Senior and Junior competition officials to become one united body. This issue is one the Branch must make a priority in 1996/7!

A broad base of age categories and a comprehensive number of event options were offered for the first time to Masters Competitors. Events were trialed at two (2) carnivals and the Branch Championships with only moderate success. There is a definite need for Masters events, but, once again, a full review of how the Branch manages this requirement going forward needs to be undertaken. One option may be to include a limited number of events in fewer age categories at every open carnival, so that competitors have competition consistency.

Each of the three (3) initiatives undertaken this season will play an integral part in building a broader and stronger competition base as well as contributing significantly to the goal of membership retention. The season again highlighted the depth and quality of persons officiating in Sydney Branch. During the course of the season, many officials were given the opportunity to expand their skill base by gaining exposure to other roles, which will ensure the standards are maintained for the future.

Michelle Phillips and the IRB contingent again conducted the Twilight series very efficiently and successful. Many thanks to all concerned.

I would like to personally thank Graham Rees and his board riding fraternity for their efforts in ensuring that the Board Riding section continued to be a viable part of competition in the Branch. The Branch must take "ownership" of this area of competition to ensure its successful future. Boogie Boarding is a must for future seasons.

Congratulations to South Maroubra on conducting a most efficient and enjoyable NSW State Championship.

Congratulations to Wanda and Cronulla Sutherland District on winning the Branch Pointscore and Inter District Competitions respectively. The closeness of the Pointscore for both is reinforcement of the competitive strength of this Branch!

I.R.B. Supervisors Report

Yet another season has passed and another goal for Sydney Branch IRB has been achieved. We are now being taken seriously in top level IRB competition with the Bondi team placing equal third at the National IRB championships and two Sydney female teams placing in the top four in the inaugural women's display event at the same titles. Due to ever increasing work commitments, the amount of time and effort I could put into Branch IRB activities had to be curtailed and pointed in their direction. It was suggested and trialed that IRB exams be set dates in the calendar like Bronze Exams - it did not seem to work - however exams did continue.

Competition grew in the twilight series, with additional female events introduced to bring them in line with State Events. We also had two firsts, with the Clovelly club running an IRB carnival and the first IRB carnival being stopped due to large seas. It was also voted by the other metropolitan areas to continue with the metropolitan IRB carnival which Sydney hosted last year. This voting happened in April this year, so it was with great disappointment that earlier in the season the Branch

decided to elect venues and ownership of the future of this carnival. The inception of this carnival was based on the country IRB championships, which is run by the Branches involved, officials supplied by them and the venue moved amongst them.

Ducks continue to play a vital role in lifesaving in this branch, and the IRB personnel are still some of the hardest workers in the clubs, I hope that the increased competition has continued to encourage new members to this section and provided an area of release and enjoyment to them.

By increasing the level of competitiveness of the teams, the length in which some would go to win, and the unwillingness to assist to help things run, increased dramatically over my years as supervisor.

I am very proud of Sydney Branch IRB sections in the improvement (in the vast majority) of the gear presented for gear inspection. Emergency Services Co-Ordinator Report

During the past season the emergency services section of the Branch was called to attend eighty five (85) incidents. Sixty one (61) of these cases were reported by surf clubs through Sydney Surf. I am happy to report that none of these incidents resulted in loss of life.

The remaining 24 cases came through our 24 hour call out system. These cases involved searches on both land and in water and included various medical emergencies. The calls originated from:

Police	29.2 %
Lifesaver 1	20.8 %
Water Police	16.7 %
Ambulance	16.6 %
Public	8.3 %
Careflight	4.2 %
Lifequards	4.2 %

As can be seen from the figures below the days of the lifesaver just rescuing and resuscitating swimmers have gone. Today's lifesaver is now being asked to recognise and treat a more complex and diverse range of situations.

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While the number of spinal cases appears to be high, I feel this is due mainly to our heightened awareness and training in recognition and treatment of spinal injuries. Many patients in the past would not have been diagnosed as a spinal injury and just treated for their more obvious symptoms.

Once again I would like to thank all the duty officers and the two offshore groups for their dedication and willingness to be on call 24 hours a day seven days a week.

As the duties of the Radio Supervisor and the Emergency Services Co-Ordinator overlapped in a number of areas, it was decided to combine the two positions.

Throughout the season the existing radio equipment did not meet our expectations and consequently a new console and radios are being prepared in readiness for next season.

The introduction of the new channel proved to be extremely successful. It allowed Sydney Branch to have its own working channel without having to compete for air space with other Branches.

The Branch radio room had problems with numbers for the first part of this season. Fortunately we were able to recruit eight new members as the season progressed and this relieved the burden of excess hours for all concerned.

There were eight members who gained their 100% this season. To gain this you must complete 20 hours before the first of January and 20 hours after or a total of 50 hours all up. Congratulations to the following people on their achievement. Brad McDonogh, Gaelyn Watson, Sue Morris, Cheryl Hormann, Brian Harris, Peter Agnew, John De Cean and Peter Cleary.

May I conclude by thanking my Deputy Chairman, Barney Johansen, Vice Chairman, Peter Garlick and Reg Francis for your support and advise during the season and to all Club Officers, Delegates and Chairman, thank you for your contribution towards this wonderful Branch of ours and lets all strive to continue to make this the number one Branch in New South Wales.

Our awards were down on previous years however it is hoped that with a new intake of members and recently awarded trainers, that this situation should soon be rectified.

Rescue numbers were also down, reflecting the low attendance of the surfing public last year due to poor weather conditions at the commencement of the season. However, several rescues were carried out in very dangerous, dumping surf conditions and a few potentially tragic outcomes were averted thanks to the vigilance and training of our patrolling members.

First Aid cases were varied and some serious, although this only normal for a beach in an isolated, bush area.

Competitively, Garie competed in it's own carnival, held after a lapse of many years and also fared well in the District Carnival. Members area gain participating in the club's internal competitions with much more enthusiasm thanks to a more concerted effort from our new Race Secretary and Team Manager.

In the Juniors, the Garie Guppies membership more than doubled and although plagued with wet windy days, still participated keenly and held an 'away' event at a neighbouring beach where the waves were more their size. This event generated a lot of interest from parents of local youngsters who we hope will join up for the coming season.

All first aid cases were generally attended to by Bronte members with assistance from the Waverley Municipal beach inspectors to whom the club is grateful. The Club worked well with these beach inspectors and the close liaison between these professional and Club Officials and members contributed to this.

The past season saw a large increase in the number of lifesaving awards gained and the club must extend its thanks not only to its own Chief Instructor but to those members who took squads through and the Branch Officials who provided examinations. Of particular importance to a small club like Bronte is the junior member program introduced to ensure an increased flow of Junior Activity members into the senior club ranks. Bondi Surf Life Saving Club

Bondi Surf Club celebrated its 90th Birthday on the 6th February 1996 - this historic event was viewed by thousands on television and spoken about on radio. Our 90th Anniversary Ball was held at the AJC Randwick with some 350 in attendance - a great evening was had by all.

The season was again a busy one at Bondi with 645 rescues which included 37 first aid cases, 5 of which were serious ranging from cardiac arrest to spinal injury. We can proudly report 'no lives lost during patrol hours'. A large proportion of these rescues were performed on Christmas Day with an estimated 20 000 people on the beach. No fewer than 50 of our lifesavers gave up their Christmas Day to patrol the beach. Our lifesavers, together with the Council Lifeguards, performed a mass rescue with 64 people being pulled from the surf in the space of 5 minutes. For the remainder of the day until 8:30 pm patrol members had to form a human barricade to prevent swimmers going further than waist deep in the dangerous conditions. Congratulations must go to the 'Bondi Lifesavers'.

The season saw an increase in the number of lifesaving awards gained and we must extend thanks to our Chief Instructor, Bob Bailey, President, Peter Murphy and Peter Thorne for their time and effort, put into training these members.

Bondi hosted the Sydney Branch Championships in almost perfect conditions. Congratulations to our medal winners, 4 Gold, 3 Silver and 5 Bronze. A big thank you to all the helpers who guaranteed a successful carnival.

Competitively our Club had a successful season bring home 1 Gold (U16 Ladies R & R - Bondi's first ever ladies medal) and 2 Bronze plus 4 Gold and 1 Silver and 1 Bronze for our Masters at the State Titles. At the Australian Masters Cyril Baldock gained a Bronze Medal.
