Chief Executive Officer

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I submit to you for your consideration and adoption, the 53rd Annual Report covering the activities of Surf Life Saving Sydney for the 2001-2002 season.

It has been a season of stark contrast.

On one hand our Clubs have carried out their duties in a magnificent manner ensuring that no lives were lost whilst patrols were on duty. This is a huge responsibility for our Volunteer, proficient and well-trained surf lifesavers who make up the 15 (fifteen) affiliated Surf Life Saving Clubs.

On the other hand we have the massive dilemma of huge public liability payments promoting widespread alarm and concern not only throughout our Association but right around the nation.

In the long term the cost of such cases will be borne initially by the local councils but in the long term by the nation as a whole – both **financially and socially**. The ramifications of the Bondi beach pay out have been recognised by local Council around Australia. Our State Government is working with our State body and legal bodies to find a solution to the impasse. We await their deliberations with great interest.

Surf Rescues this season by Clubs totalled 1883

You will see by our statistics that preventative actions and first aid cases are up dramatically from last season.

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Our **Board of Lifesaving** has continued to work hard to maintain Sydney's high standard of lifesaving and examination. Congratulations to their Director, Stephen Leahy for his enthusiastic direction and leadership. Our Education Manager, Kerryn Briody has worked hard to ensure our examiners and their candidates are of the best quality as they present for examinations.

Our **Board of Competition** led by their urbane and methodical Director, Colin Fitzgerald has completed a busy and tiring season with a warm glow. They tried new ideas this season with real success.

Total membership of Branch Clubs increased again this season, as is the trend in the new Millennium.

Annual proficiency tests conducted within Clubs proved to be a success.

Examinations held in the Branch this season reached a grand total of 130.



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The introduction of "Complete Patrol Logger/StateWatch computer data by Surf Life Saving New South Wales has been welcomed. This system brings Surf Life Saving New South Wales into line with the rest of Australia.

Both our "Trained experts in CPL," Margaret and Jennifer are able to guide Clubs when problems arise with the system. As the program progresses it will allow Clubs to do transfers and Carnival entries. Surf Life saving has been waiting for this administration break though for decades. It has now arrived!

Our Clubs held successful Open Surf Carnivals during the season - Cronulla, North Cronulla, Wanda and Coogee. Elouera hosted the Branch Championships in their usual efficient manner. 

Geoff Charles Forshaw

Joined Cronulla SLSC in January 1961 and gained the Bronze Medallion that season. Six years of Patrol Captaincy and a Gold Medallist in an Australian, Two Interstate and three Branch Surf Boat Championships indicates an impressive overview of his success in Lifesaving and competition before beginning and administration career.

Geoff joined the Club Management Committee in 1966 eventually rising to Presidency in 1981 to begin a four-year term. Club Life Membership was awarded in 1978.

In 1985 Geoff was elected Branch Deputy President and the following year served as President till 1991. At various stages in this period he was director of the Helicopter Rescue Service and a Member of the National Helicopter Operations Board.

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Geoff also served six years as a Branch Vice-President.

To recognise his dedication to Surf Life Saving he received a World Life Saving Citation of Merit in 1993.

Neil Stephen Miller

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Neil gained the Bronze Medallion with Bondi SBLSC in October 1949 however his activities onshore were very limited by reason of his enlistment in RAN and service in the Korean War after which he joined the RAAF.

In 1956 his employment demands regularly changed his place of residence which resulted in him joining a series of surf Clubs, including Newcastle, Nowra-Culburra, Coffs Harbour, Cronulla and finally North Cronulla in 1975. Through all these transfers however he retained veteran membership of Bondi.

Neil's dedication service with the Board of Control Totals 32 years as an official in both fields of Examination and Competition, mainly in the R & R discipline. Neil was a recipient of the SLSA 50 year Long Service Award in 1999.

Ronald Mark Camilleri

Ron joined North Cronulla SLSC in 1975 gaining the Bronze Medallion in January 1976.

While initially interested in competing in surf boat racing his desire for operating IRB's was paramount and by 1983 he had qualified as an IRB Driver, Instructor, Examiner and JRB driver as well as serving five years as Club IRB Captain.

Ron continued to gain the additional qualifications of JRB Instructor and the Examiner Certificates and similar awards in the Offshore Rescue Boat where he served 4 years as Branch Supervisor.

He has been Branch Duty Officer since 1991 Ron Camilleri's dedication to his important and essential facet of Lifesaving is indeed outstanding and at the time of his Life membership Award he had completed a miraculous 23 years of 100% patrol attendance, logging on a number of occasions in excess of 150 patrol hours annually.

Remembrance

Immediate past Branch Patron **John Kendall "Rooster" Vaughan OAM** passed away on 24 June 2002 after a series of illnesses, aged 76.



John, who commenced his lifesaving with Coffs Harbour SLSC in 1939-40 season then subsequently active membership with Coogee and Burning Palms also, joined Cronulla SLSC in 1956 as an associate.

Throughout a lengthy career as an SLSA Official he held many positions on NSW State Centre as Deputy President for nine years a co-delegate to National Council for four years.

His Sydney Branch Activities included No.1 District Supervisor (1951-54), Board Secretary (1959-68), Branch Secretary (1977-1980) Branch Treasurer (1967-72) and Carnival and Competition Supervisor (1985-88). He accepted the invitation to be Branch Patron in 1998 and occupied that for three years.

John was for many years President (7), Secretary (18), Treasurer (12), and Captain (4) of Burning Palms SLSC and had the distinction of holding Life Membership of Surf Life Saving Australia (1971), Surf Life Saving New South Wales (1968), Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch (1963) and Burning Palms (1961).

He was awarded a World Life Saving Citation of Merit in 1980 and bestowed with the Medal of Order of Australia in 1989 for his service to Surf Life Saving. To his wife Joan (OAM) and children Alan and Arlene the Branch conveys its deepest sympathy.

One of the last remaining Sydney Branch "Officer Links" with the former Manly-Warringah Branch came to a conclusion with the recent death of **Hector North McDonald OAM** who passed away on 30 April, aged 75.

Hector was a distinguished member of Collaroy SLSC and gained his Bronze Medallion there in season 1946-47. When M-W Branch, consisting of Sydney Northern Metropolitan Surf Clubs, came into being on 1 May 1960 Hector was serving in the capacity of Sydney branch Superintendent and on the changeover assumed a similar role with the newly formed authority and held the office until 1968.

He was then elected NSW Superintendent and served a five-year team directing the State's Lifesaving. Hector played a major part in the transition from the Holger-Neilson method of resuscitation to what was then known as expired air technique or mouth to mouth, mouth to nose resuscitation.

He co-represented New Zealand at the inaugural World Lifesaving Meeting in 1971 and also corepresented the Republic of China at the WLS Conference in USA in 1972.

Some of Hector McDonalds's personal honours included Life Memberships of SLSA, SLSNSW and SNB Branch; WLS Citation of Merit and the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM), an honour bestowed on him in 1991 for his services to Surf Life Saving.

The Branch is saddened to record the sudden death of **Dr. Ian John Mackie AM FRACP** the former SLSA Medical Officer and Medical Adviser to a number of the Branch Surf Clubs. He passed away on 14 April, aged 69.

A local Cronulla Medico and Cardiologist, he was also renowned for his voluntary work in the field of resuscitation techniques.



At various times he held such official positions as medical and education advisor to SLSA and RLSS and Medical Chairman of International Lifesaving Federation.

In 2001, in the presence of Queen Elizabeth II an Prince Phillip, he was awarded the prestigious King Edward VII Cup of the RLSS for readily making his extensive knowledge of all aspects of aquatic medicine available to lifesaver from every corner of the world and for his outstanding contribution to many areas of drowning

prevention.

Ian was a Life Member of World Lifesaving and Surf Life Saving Australia and in 1989 was honoured with the appointment of Member in the Order of Australia.

Director of Lifesaving

I have great pleasure, once again, to present the Annual Report for Surf Life Saving Sydney's Board of Lifesaving. The presumption that it was going to be an easy year, compared with the Olympic season 12 months prior was way off the mark.

First and foremost, my personal gratitude to the active surf lifesavers that kept our beach visitors safe. Drownings will always occur, yet the vast majority of these are preventable. There is no doubt that our efforts have kept the number of deaths to a minimum. This year we rescued 1883 people; a further 30480 were the subject of preventative actions. We provided first aid to 4202 beachgoers. Our Duty Officers responded to more than 200 calls for support from the emergency services.

Some of the highlights for this season include:

- The closure of Prince Henry Hospital saw the closure of the Branch office and meant the relocation of Sydney Surf – our communications centre – to the Westpac LifeSaver helicopter Base across the oval.
- > For the first time ever Surf Life Saving Sydney were successful in commencing a professional lifeguard service at Garie Beach throughout the Christmas holidays.
- Our Duty Officers, the Offshore Rescue boats and a number of clubs supported the rescue and relief efforts of the Christmas fires. Commencing on Christmas Day, lifesavers worked 24-hour periods for nearly a week to ensure the safety of residents around Port Hacking and the Royal National Park. The names of the members involved were submitted to the State rescue Board who recognised them in the Honour Board.
- > The Board completed a review of our Duty Officers system.

- Duty Officers continue to play an important role in supporting patrols during the season as well as working closely with the statutory services. More than 200 calls for support were attended to.
- Regular media releases outlining busy weekends, major incidents and special events kept Sydney lifesavers in the news sections of the major dailies and on radio and television.
- Our patrols have been well supported by our support services – the radio communication centre, the Offshore Rescue Boats and the Duty Officers.

- The Branch President, the CEO and myself have commenced planning for the introduction of patrol and rescue services on Botany Bay. This will be an innovative plan that will use various patrol methods to promote an overall service to the beaches around the Bay.
- Education and training is an important part of the Board's role. The Branch is providing more education programs that ever before. Silver Medallion programs, defibrillation instruction, IRB courses and courses for new Training Officers and Assessors have keep the Education Panel busy.
- It is important to recognise the work of our Examiners. It is a rewarding, but often thankless, role that this group undertakes. More examiners are required to meet the ever-increasing demands that are being placed before them.
- Our Branch winners of the Lifesaver and Volunteer of the Year went onto to win the State awards and did extremely well in the national finals. Tony Waller of Coogee was named the Lifesaver of the Year, while his Club Captain, Rob Yeldon was named Volunteer of the Year. Both men are outstanding examples to their peers and are most worthy of these great awards.
- The Management Committee of the Board is an amazing group of dedicated volunteers a group for whom I have the highest respect and are great to work with. Your efforts are well recognised and sincerely appreciated.

I have a funny feeling that "quality" and "standards" will be the guiding words for the Board over the next 12 months – it sounds like another big season!

With the season now well behind us and another one ready to unfold I look back on a season of big exams and a large number of our more senior members gaining specialist awards. The Branch ran the Silver medallion Life Support and Parol Captains Courses with good attendances for all courses, 65 Patrol Captain Awards and 60 Life Support Awards. The Train the Trainer Courses were also well attended with 78 members attending only resulting in 45 new Training Officers over several disciplines.

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Our Examiners In-services held at Elouera and Bronte, to update members on changes to the education system, and ensure the highest standard of examining is maintained. They were attended by 44 examiners and from the reports from attendees the format provided good discussions and debate on such topics as Resuscitation and Scenario skill levels. All Examiners were provided with a new uniform sponsored by Energy Australia, which we are grateful for their continuing support in the area of education.

All the Clubs in the Branch adopted the introduction of the CPL (Complete Patrol Logger) system at State Centre. The Branch has produced the season's Awards through this system and from all reports, once the Club Members are entered on the database the Award area of the program is user friendly and very efficient. Once again the Branch Office Team of Ian, Jennifer & Margaret's assistance with Award administration to the District Supervisors & myself during the season was unparrelled.

I would like to thank all examiners who gave up many hours of their time to assist with exams. On calculation, the group of regular examiners who attended exams this season have spent more time on the beach than most members of patrols, in excess of **50 hours**, with the District Supervisors Michael Bretherton (RNP), Tony Coffey (Cron/Suth), John Restuccia (Randwick) & Paul Booth (Waverley) upwards of **150 hours** spent at exams in their districts, without their dedication and commitment we would not have the numbers of Awards and in turn the Patrolling Lifesavers on our Beaches. The small team of Specialist Examiners in the areas of ARC, Defib, IRB, RWV & Offshore has produced an astounding 218 of Awards this season.

Examiners and Training Officers our work is not yet done, The Education Team is looking forward to implementation the IRB changes, the Airways Module (Oropharyngeal) to the ARC, Bridging Courses for all Training Officers & Examiners, along with the influx of new members awards in Season 2002-2003.



Clovelly SLSC

Clovelly SLSC takes pride in reporting yet again that there were "no lives lost" during the patrolling season. Along with the other Randwick District Clubs, Clovelly SLSC faced increased number of beach goers during the past season. In particular at Clovelly, the newly opened cafe and the extensive promenade and pool renovations proved very attractive to additional beach goers. Add to these influences, the publicity storm over "Bluey" the Groper and there were many swimmers and snorkellers both inside and outside the Bay.

Clovelly SLSC Lifesaving statistics reflected these factors. Clovelly patrols completed 23 rescues. These included operations utilising no gear, the rescue tube, rescue boards and the IRB. There were 301 first aid cases and the patrols carried out 11 preventative actions over the season. Of the rescues completed, the majority involved the IRB in situations at Thommos (Gordons) Bay and around the Bombie. Exhausted and inexperienced scuba divers were the major patients. Two of these operations occurred during April and involved assistance from the Coogee IRB as well as involvement from the Westpac Helicopter and the Randwick Lifeguard Jet Ski. These were great examples of the quick integrated response possible from local surf lifesaving groups acting co-operatively and using modern communication and rescue technology.

Season 2001-2002 saw the return of the famous red, white and blue Clovelly cap to regular surf carnival competition. A highlight for the Clovelly March Past team coached by Bob Bransdon was their 4th placing at the Branch Championships at Elouera The team performed well at the State titles at Swansea Belmont and their experiences at the National at Kurrawa will stand them in good stead for the coming season. Clovelly SLSC fielded a Nippers March Past team coached by Sara Thompson at a number of carnivals. Two Clovelly boat crews are in training for next season and our competitive presence will continue its reawakening.

In March, the role of Clovelly SLSC members in the local community was again recognised during the official opening of the new promenade, playground and cafe/amenities building. Mayor Dominic Sullivan recognised two Clovelly SLSC life members as rededicated the "Tom Caddy Steps" and announced the dedication of the 25-metre pool as the "Geoff James Pool".

In April, Clovelly SLSC worked in conjunction with local resident Susie Williams to present the "Swim for a wish" swimathon in supporter of the Starlight Foundation. This event raised more than \$5,000 for this worthy cause.

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Memorial Club for their support this year. The Randwick Labor Club continued its support of all 4 Randwick District Surf Clubs, with Clovelly able to launch our fully equipped IRB funded by the Labor Club on March 17. This was a gala day with Labor Club President Ken Murray being accompanied by Premier Bob Carr in christening the boat. The presence of Mayor Dominic Sullivan and Member for Coogee, Ernie page at this event was another example of the continuing support for Surf Life Saving provided by these two local politicians. Thank you also to the Lend Lease Corporation for including Clovelly SLSC in their Community Services Grants operation. Coogee Surf Life Saving Club's 95th season is one that within the Club we are extremely proud of. We feel that we have made good improvements in all areas in our Club including Lifesaving, Competition and Administration over the season.

Lifesaving

In terms of Rescues, we saved the lives of 56 members of the public during patrolling hours with again there being "No lives lost" whilst our Club was on patrol. The loss to the community if we had not saved these members of the public is immeasurable and the community should be justifiably thankful that our Club and indeed all other Clubs were on patrol in our unique voluntary capacity during the season.

We also performed 384 preventative actions and 11 searches and returned 31 lost children to their carers. In terms of first aid, our members attended to 384 marine stings, 58 cuts, 13 fractures and 7 spinal injuries.

In instruction our achievements amounted to an increase in awards and therefore life saving standards. Our patrolling strength also increased. In relation to new awards, our Club processed 72 Bronze Medallions, 24 SRC, 11 ARC and 22 First Aid. In addition to these awards there were 16 Silver medallion and other awards. Our club also experienced another year of net gain of active members that further improved our patrolling strength.

Rob Yeldon our Club Captain, Gary Bowles Vice Captain, Heather Morris Chief Instructor and the rest of our Lifesaving committee provided leadership and effort to which our Club and the community is grateful.

Members of our Club also Officiated in Examinations and other Branch activities and the Club wishes to thank these people for their time and effort.

Competition

Our club had a relatively good year with an average of 85 members participating in Club carnivals and other events. We picked up 2 Gold medals in the R&R at the Australian titles and a silver medal in R&R that we are very proud of. We also congratulate our other members of the State and Australian Titles Touring Team that participated and enjoyed themselves which we feel is what it is all about.

This year showed an excellent resurgence in the boat area whilst maintaining our numbers throughout the season which reflected in a very positive way on Competition Director Greg Middleton, Matt Leary his assistant and the rest of the Competition Committee.

Other Events / Clubs

In December we held the 2nd Annual Splash n Dash which is growing in popularity and was conducted in an extremely professional way by Heather Morris. We also held the annual Carnival in February in trying surf conditions which surprised a few people. The Coogee Bay Hotel were the major sponsor for both these events and to them we say thanks.

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The Coogee Minnows JSLSC also had a good year with over 450 youngsters participating. The Minnows Committee under the guidance of Tom Carroll did a superb job in organising and ensuring the safety of the children whilst still maintaining a focus on surf safety and progression to Surf Club active membership.

In other areas of the Club, we had a very busy year. Financially, the Club produced a modest profit on operations with Sponsors again playing a major part. Our administration in terms of Honorary Secretary, Jim Turney, Assistant, Rebecca Hamilton, Assistant Treasurer, Terry Parkinson amongst others worked tirelessly to ensure the smooth operation of the Club.

We were also fortunate to be among the recipients of a new I.R.B. and gear from NSW Sport & Recreation through SLSNSW.

Due to the adverse conditions mentioned previously, the club's internal competition events were not all run this year. Our proudest moments were achieved by our nippers, Garie Guppies, who fielded a team of twenty at the Branch Carnival and took out 10% of the major medals and nearly 50% were in the top ten finishers. A small contingent competed in the State Championships as well and some Guppies made it to the quarter finals.

With a new clubhouse and a renewed club morale, we should be able to field teams among the active ranks before long and at least keep up with our nippers.

Thirty members obtained their Bronze Medallions during the past season, together with nine Advanced Resuscitation Certificates. Six members also gained their Silver Medallion Award and three IRB Driver Certificates were obtained. During the season, nine members achieved 100% patrol attendance plus another six members who achieved the coveted "100 Club Award" for 100 patrol hours or more. Our thanks go to all these members.

During the season our Club entered into an arrangement with the Eastern Suburbs Evening College to conduct a series of seminars and the Bronze Medallion training as part of their summer syllabus. A series of seminars titled "The Science of the Surf" were conducted by Club member Dr Robert Brander to educate the community about how waves form and break, how to tell the difference between a safe and unsafe wave, how to identify rip currents, how sandbars are formed and change, how beaches behave and why some beaches are safer than others. The seminars were well attended, averaging over one hundred persons each seminar and they received widespread media attention, featuring in The Daily Telegraph, The Australian, Brisbane's Sunday Mail, The Wentworth Courier and The New Zealand Herald. The seminars also featured in the ABC-TV science program "Catalyst". The seminars also received a Special Award at the NSW Surf Lifesaving Awards of Excellence. The Bronze Medallion training attracted twenty-one persons to the Saturday morning training sessions, of which

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twelve completed their training by the end of the season. The Club is conscious of the need to expand our recruitment base and sees this as an ideal source to attract new members.

Our Junior Activity Group was again active on Sunday mornings, with a big increase in numbers. A special thanks to all the parents involved in making this part of Tamarama so enjoyable.

During this season, work commenced on the restoration of the external facade of the Clubhouse. Our thanks go to Waverley Council for their assistance with this project.

The Club sincerely appreciates the continued financial support and assistance from Waverley Council, McGrath Estate Agents, Bondi-Junction Waverley RSL Sub-Branch Club Ltd, Eastern Suburbs Leagues Club Limited and Sculpture by the Sea. Without the support of our sponsors, Tamarama would not be able to offer facilities to our members and the community. Our thanks to them all.

Our Club President, Dick Sheldon, is stepping down from the chair at the end of this season and it was fitting that at the Sydney Branch Awards for Excellence, Tamarama collected a third placing in The Champion Club of the Year award, was winner of the Waverley District Patrol Efficiency competition and was Overall Winner of the Branch Patrol Efficiency award. A fitting end to Dick's reign.

In conclusion, I would like to express the clubs thanks to Sydney Branch – Peter, Ian, Jenny and Margaret, for their continued support and assistance over the past season and wish all clubs a successful season in 2002/2003.
