PRESIDENT' REPORT

I am proud to present to the meeting the Annual Report for SLSS 2008-2009 Season.

For those members involved in the administration of Branch and Clubs, this time of year can be as busy (if not busier) than the active patrolling part of the Season. Annual Reports in surf life saving form part of the history of the Association. I would like to thank those responsible for the report's production including officers of the Branch to the Clubs for supply Branch with the Club Annual Reports. I appreciate that it is a busy time of year and thank you for assisting us in meeting our reporting timetable.

Our sponsors are very important to us and in addition to welcoming you I would like to thanks you for your ongoing support and commitment to our Branch. Our volunteer lifesavers work very hard to provide our service and it is fantastic that these efforts are recognised through the generosity of our sponsors.

Sydney Branch remains incredibly loyal to the fundamentals of the volunteer based history of surf life saving. Our results are equal to any other Branch in the country and in many areas we lead the way. Once again Sydney Branch has had a season that we can all be proud of.

The Director of Life Saving – Michael Hodsdon and Director of Surf Sports – Mike Vitnell are in their second year and were able to consolidate on the ground work done in the first year. John de Cean once again has been invaluable to me and the Branch. It was the end of an era for the BJD with Tim Murray handing over the guard to Doug Hawkins. Special thanks to Tim for a great job at the helm of BJD and good luck to Doug. Peter Carney looked after finance.

There are several highlights that I would like to mention from last season:

The focus on additional awards is substantial with many awards being for silver medallions or above. The efforts required in training, facilitation and assessment is substantial. Congratulations to all those involved in this process.

Mike Vitnell as Director of Surf Sports has taken a highly strategic approach to improving Surf Sports. Building on his first year, he has made great inroads on what should be regarded as a fantastic year. We have continued to run our traditional carnival calendar. Our carnivals have been well run and we have greatly benefitted form the increased number of carnival officials.

Once again, prior to the commencement of the season with a Forum for Presidents, Club Captains and Chief Instructors, Surf Sports and Administrators. It was well attended and the results achieved a strong start to the season.

Tim Murray has done a great job once again leading the Board of junior Development and the BJD events have been extremely well supported. Our Junior movement has continued from strength to strength with 5770 members in our nippers movement representing 40% of our total Sydney membership.

George Fatseas, our Director of Youth, has continued to provide motivation for this demographic of the Branch which remains a key area of focus for the Branch.

Despite a drop in sponsorship, a review of the financials will show that the Branch is in good financial shape and thanks to the Director of Finance Peter Carney and the Finance Committee for their hard work. We have once again been able to keep our fees to the lowest in the State - both capitation and carnival entry fees. Peter will address this separately but I am pleased to announce a profit for the

year of \$29,206. Also significant is the fact that the Branch has acquired another property with a view to shoring up future revenue streams for the ultimate benefit of the Clubs.



2008 SLSS PRESIDENTS MEDAL

S.L.S AUSTRALIA LIFE MEMBERSHIPS

Congratulations to Rex Sargeant & Stephen Strange on their Life Membership of Surf Life Saving Australia.

S.L.S AUSTRALIA HALL OF FAME

SLSA President, Ron Rankin AM welcomed two new inductees into what he called 'an exclusive group of Australian surf lifesavers who have achieved to the highest levels' Dennis Green (Maroubra, South Maroubra, Southport and Kurrawa) and Barry Stuart (Maroubra and South Maroubra) were Australian Double Ski Champions in 1959, 1962, 1963, 1964 and 1967 while Stuart won an individual title in 1958 and Green in 1965. Green also won double ski titles with Wally Brown (Maroubra) in 1954 and 1957 and with Dennis McGuire (Maroubra) in 1961. Green and Stuart were the first of many surf lifesavers who went on to make their mark in the Olympic sport of flatwater kayaking, with Green representing Australia at five games, winning a Bronze Medal in his debut in Melbourne in 1956, while Stuart paddled for his country at Melbourne, Rome, Tokyo and Mexico City.

- 1802 rescues were performed by Clubs and Groups
- 7,756 awards (Junior Activities and Senior) were facilitated and assessed for Clubs and associated Groups during the duration of the season
- More than 150 Lifesavers participated in Board of Lifesaving activities such as Surfcom, RWC's, Assessment and Proficiencies, Facilitation, Duty Officers and Peer Support Councillors

EDUCATION

The last 12 months has proven to test even the most patient member due to the new procedures invested in education for Surf Lifesaving. That said, I am very pleased to confirm that we at Sydney Branch have meet all the audit requirements to enable us to open our doors and fly that education flag for another 12 months.

We have had to implement a number of changes due to the Registered Training Organisation (RTO) requirements implemented by SLSNSW. Approximately 95% of Trainers and Assessors have successfully endorsed under the new procedures which will ensure that those Trainers and Assessors are current until 31 December 2011. A copy of the endorsed Assessors as at 15 May 2009 can be located at the end of the annual report.

On behalf of the BOL, I would like to thank the team at SLSS Branch Office, all Trainers, assistant Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators for the effort and time each member has put in throughout the season. Without you, we would not have been able to achieve the results which can been seen on the Branch Awards summary.

There has been a strong push for members to complete their Certificate IV in Training and Assessment which will continue next year. We have approximately 7 members who have successfully completed their Certificate IV in Training and Assessment. Congratulations to those members.

There will also be a new facilitated course introduced next season as the Certificate III in Public Safety, which follows on from the Bronze Medallion Award. Further details relating to this course will be distributed in the next 12 months. Later this year we will also see the introduction of the 33rd Edition of the Training Manual. Sydney Branch will be working closely with SLSNSW to roll out the new manual and resources for the manual.

As always members feedback is welcome and also any ideas on how to improve on any procedures and resources currently being implemented. Please forward your ideas and feedback to your Branch Education Manager via an Improvement Request Form which will then be forwarded to SLSNSW.

I would also like to recognise the efforts of Linda Perrin at Surf Lifesaving Sydney. Linda puts in an effort which is beyond what is expected in her role at SLSS and we all acknowledge and agree that without Linda's support, thoroughness, responsive attitude to her work and Linda's good nature and patience, we would not be where we are at today, that is 100% compliant with the RTO requirements for SLSNSW and generally organised and member satisfied.

On behalf of the BOL, I would also like to thank Steve Allan, Academy Support Officer for SLSNSW who has put in an enormous amount of effort with Sydney Branch to ensure that we meet the RTO requirements.

Once again, congratulations to the team at SLSS Branch Office, every Member, Trainer, Assessor and Facilitator who have contributed their time to education, for a job well done and I look forward to working with you next season.

Surf Lifesaving NSW also continued its support during the season by providing a significant amount of funding prior and during the season for major structural and relocation costs. With Surfcom Sydney now relocated in a state of art facility, it enabled Gary Pracy the Communications Manager to continue to build his team and ensure the level of service being provided to the clubs during the patrolling hours was at an extremely high level. I would personally like to take this opportunity to thank Gary Pracy for the level of commitment and tenacity he has provided during his first season as Communications Manager for Surf Lifesaving Sydney.

This year saw the Support Operations Group actively involved in a mock disaster which was held in Botany Bay. This mock disaster involved all emergency voluntary statuary services located in the local area including Offshore 2, Offshore 3, Lifesaver 1, Support Skis, Duty Officers and Rescue Coordinators. All groups were focussed on working and achieving the one goal to ensure all services could work together with the main objective being we all understood the capabilities and limits of each services should the need arise. I am pleased to advise all surf lifesaving services performed extremely well in difficult and testing conditions.

During the past season the requests for assistance from the Support Operations Services has increased with clubs within Sydney Branch as they become aware of they types of assistance available to them from the support team.

In closing, I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to the BOL management team, the office support provided by Linda and Yvette and the continued support from the respective officers, Ron Camilleri, Brent Armitage, Gary Pracy, Duty Officers and the peer support teams. It would also be remiss of me not to take this opportunity to express my gratitude to Scott Rofe from *Top Dollar Metal Recyclers* who provided a generous amount of funding to the support operations team which enabled the purchase of new equipment.

This year the RWC Group consisted of 3 jet skis, one based out of Maroubra which patrolled the Eastern Beaches, another based out of Cronulla which patrolled the Bate Bay Beaches and another out of Botany Bay.

The group performed a significant number of rescues and attended a number of call out operations. With over 100 rescues performed and 250 preventatives (excluding carnivals), the RWC group is an asset to the Support Operations within the Sydney Branch. Other highlights during the season included the training of 10 new operators. The training these operators under took was an intensive 10 week course where candidates were thrown into several demanding and difficult situations. They all performed very well under stressful conditions.

The skis have done over 700 hours this season. I would like to thank every driver who contributed to this outstanding figure.

I wish to make special mention to George Shales and Gary Pracy for their support over the last 2 years. George has guided me in the right direction and supported me where necessary, allowing me direct and manage the group. Gary, despite not having his RWC Drivers, would whenever asked be able to lend a helping hand moving skis to get serviced or doing some running repairs. Gary has also housed Support Ski 1 for the past season at no cost.

I would like to thank Maroubra SLSC and the Cronulla District Lifesaver Rescue for their continued support in housing Support Ski 3 and Support Ski 2 respectively.


I would like to thank Linda and Yvette in the office for all their help and support over this season. Their assistance is invaluable.

The Assistant Lifesaving District Supervisor, Graham Hill, and I undertook unannounced Patrol Inspections of each Bate Bay Club at least once each month during the Season and copies of reports relating to the Patrol Efficiency Competition were forwarded to SLSS after each. Generally standards throughout were high and any areas identified for improvement were attended to promptly by individual clubs.

Either the Assistant or I - and usually both - attended each monthly meeting of SLS Cronulla Sutherland District Council Inc. (District Council), presented a Report, responded to queries and followed up on any matters arising at the meetings. This interaction was an important lifesaving strategy and the courtesy and consideration of the members of the District Council at all times was appreciated.

At the invitation of the Club Captains of Cronulla and North Cronulla Clubs I attended their Lifesaving Meetings and outlined the roles and operations of the LDS and the Assistant LDS. Unfortunately several offers to make similar presentations to the other Bate Bay Clubs went unaccepted.

The duties of LDS were made easier by the cooperation and availability of Brad Whittaker, Manager Beach Operations, Sutherland Shire Council and the Lifeguards. Regular contact was maintained either by telephone, emails or face-to-face. This open relationship enabled prompt settlement of the few problems which arose. The assistance is appreciated. As well, the Manager Beach Operations, Sutherland Shire Council, and I have been working together to effect a more effective utilisation of lifesaving resources and also to improve signage on the Bate Bay Beaches. The reviews continue.

Observations made during patrol inspections within Bate Bay and reported to SLSS BoL as areas for improvement included: relative youth/ potential inexperience of patrol captains; need for attention by clubs to standards of communication, particularly public addresses announcements and when using Surfcom; availability and maintenance of oxygen equipment; standards of patrol documentation and placement of patrol areas.

Mention must be made of the comradeship and the cooperation displayed by Bate Bay Clubs which followed the sudden death of Barney Johansen, Club Captain of North Cronulla at the time. It was pleasing that in time of such grief and uncertainty the Clubs pulled together to support their North Cronulla colleagues. It also was reassuring to note the professional and appropriate interventions of Duty Officers, support mechanisms, and emergency services personnel at all levels of SLS.

The ongoing legacy of the discontent between Cronulla District Lifesaver Rescue (ORB2) and the District Council has resulted in a worrying lack of trust between the two bodies. The unresolved review of the operations of the former has exacerbated the situation although, on the occasions

when ORB2 was tasked to assist one or other of the Bate Bay Clubs for a specific purpose, the members have responded professionally and without demur. It is in the interests of all organisations and personnel involved that the review be concluded with expedition to enable informed decisions to be taken.

From observation during Patrol Inspections and at other times during the Season I am confident that all persons using the areas patrolled by the four Bate Bay Clubs and ORB2 may do so in the confidence that active members of the clubs are professionally trained and proficient and that each is committed to provision of the safest possible aquatic environment. The dedication and professionalism of all active members of Cronulla, North Cronulla, Elouera and Wanda Surf Life Saving Clubs is acknowledged and appreciated. The ready assistance of Patrol Captains was evident and noteworthy.

The experience and commitment of Graham Hill who performed his duties as Assistant most creditably and the professional 'guiding hands' of the Director of Lifesaving, Michael Hodsdon; his Deputy, David Jenkins and the Support Operations Manager, George Shales, greatly assisted me during the Season and is acknowledged.

I do not wish to single any assessor out for amazing service or commitment this year, purely due to the fact that I believe this year there was numerous assessors who went above and beyond what was expected of them, and that I am proud of every single assessor in the Randwick district. You have made your club's proud as well as represented the district in fine form.

What an exciting and busy season. We started with the Annual Gear Inspection in mid September with the new panel doing the complete Branch. When they reached the Royal National Park, all seemed suitably impressed at what they saw. Some of the panel members had never been to Burning Palms or Era before, so they were surprised to see how a few isolated clubs do it. I offer my sincere thanks to the Inspection Panel, the Clubs all went well with only minimal equipment requiring re-inspection.

Next there was the yearly proficiencies with the assistance of Margaret Pearce we were there for most. There was some confusion at a couple of them on what was required but I plan next season to arrange a meeting with the three Club Captains to fix the dates and explain what is required.

Beach patrols were there when required over the season and I extend my appreciation to the beach patrols at Garie, Era and Burning Palms. Garie was supported by Coogee and Maroubra and I would like to thank these clubs for their assistance. One Sunday at Garie with Coogee on patrol I counted 25 members on patrol. All three clubs can report "no lives lost" whilst patrols were on the beach.

There were seven patrol inspections carried out over the season. All were good with a few exceptions of patrol caps and not much rescue equipment on the beach in inclement weather. The standard overall was an improvement on last season and all were meeting with the patrol service agreement.

Garie in late December till the end of January had a Lifeguard service Monday to Friday with them also being at Wattamolla on Australia Day. The funding for this is provided by the National Parks and Wildlife Service.

My appreciation is also extended to Michael Bretherton and Margaret Pearce, District Education Supervision, for their assistance during the season. I would also like to thank the three Clubs and their members for their assistance in keeping our beaches safe.

ORB ADVISOR REPORT

The 2008/2009 season was seen as a successful for the 2 SLSS Offshore Rescue Boat Groups. Both groups had little down time during the season and maintained a high level of preparedness for a 24/7 ability to respond to emergency calls for assistance. Their Rescue statistics are well documented and give credence to the value the groups give to SLSS and SLSNSW

The ORB's form an important part and are integral to the branches ability to respond to all areas under control of Sydney Branch 24 hours a day 7 days a week. They form an important part of our Branches Support Operations.

In addition SLSS is a member of the Botany Bay/Port Hacking marine sub committee disaster plan. Our ORB's together with other SLSS Support Operation Groups are recognized as having unique skills that contribute in preparing for marine disasters in our region.

Both groups this year have had low results in gaining ORB awards. This is an issue that will be addressed in the 2009/2010 season. The 2 ORB groups will be undertaking combined meetings to ensure strength and growth of both groups. This season we have been updating Surfguard with

prerequisites not listed against our Skippers. This information was overlooked when Surfguard was introduced.

ORB2 have been under review by the Cronulla Sutherland District Council since February 2006. This review is expected to be completed in the near future. The group should then be able to concentrate on replacing it's 16 year old craft.

SLSA and SLSNSW are growing their reach in marine rescue, not just between the Patrol flags but to areas not covered by surf lifesavers. Support Operations and in particular ORB's extend the reach of "Vigilance & Service"

This has been done with joint training seasons with Bondi thus utilizing resources for the benefit of all. Input this year has been into the redesigning the IRB Log book which we hope will be easier to use.

One of next year's goal is to work with the all the District IRB supervisor to assist them to help their trainers and assessors to update and get used to the new systems that are being introduced as the RTO status of SLSA becomes more demanding. My thanks go to the other district IRB supervisors, Peter, Dennis, Sigi and Dave for their guidance and assistance through the past year.

Surf Sports and Surf Life Saving Sydney has had a tremendous season. More competitors attended more carnivals, where we had more officials and more events. We have increased our participation at many levels; much of this is through dedication, willingness and that good old Australian tradition of having a go. Thanks to everyone from BOSS in joining in and lifting to the call.

Sydney Branch Board of Surf Sports is constantly moving with the times. Many things are not as they were, however tradition has not been discarded but embraced and rejuvenated. We have managed to set some trends, however always ready to look and learn from activities in fellow branches. We have a number of challenges this coming year, as we will be competing for the same sponsorship patronage against other well rehearsed organizations and sporting groups. We have a huge advantage, we are active from U6 through to over 65 and we are Lifesavers.

This year will see a focus on retention, development, expansion of programs and again change – introducing new, based on sound consideration, extensive planning and consultation. I will be asking the team to continue leading the way in striving for a high standard and we will be encouraging new members to step forward in activities such as coaching, officiating, administrating and mentoring. We need to sustain our growth and encourage the new to invigorate improvement. Some fine examples of this process from last season and next season can be seen in our branch representative team, our development team and our Emerging athletes program. Many changes have been implemented, the branch team support infrastructure was modified and many new activities introduced. I see even more improvement and greater participation as new, professional and very capable members are encouraged to nominate or take up positions in the branch team and other various teams supported by some of the best mentors around.

Through constant tinkering, feedback and planning we have seen an increase activity in our juniors competition, lead by Tim, his committee and a new competition subcommittee. Last season saw a new carnival added to the junior calendar. Thanks to South Maroubra SLSC even with frigid conditions, it got off to a great start. We saw expansion in the Cronulla Crays IMB carnival. For the first time including U/15's & U/17's. These activities will continue and grow, only with our branch member's patronage. We see more specialized activities and carnivals on the planning boards for next season. We must patronize and support home grown activities like these in our branch first. Many thanks must go to Tim and his team on the BJD. I look forward to working with Doug as he takes over the Directorship next season. I also know that Tim will not be too far away.

Officials and Education

This year with Graham and Graham as the facilitators, we saw some new presenters come forward. Another outstanding result with 3 more level 1 courses filled to capacity. I hope that our new presenters will continue assisting the Grahams, again improving our depth and providing needed help. The past years efforts in Officials education teamed up with carnival mentoring has seen a real growth in active officials. Sydney branch can boast one of the healthiest levels of official's membership in the state perhaps in the country. BOSS this year increased its Level 2 ranks by 8 hard working active level 2 officials. Sydney branch has increased level 1 officials by 30% from 2008 to 2009. Last season our greatest growth in officials for many years. We hope to keep the growth and participation by officials through activities like, Mentoring, a real succession plan,

rest breaks in carnivals, more focused carnival programs, ensuring rotation of appointments to develop skill base.

Competition Forum:

This season saw the first forum where clubs competition directors/ managers participated in open discussion on many topics concerning Surf Sports. Subjects covered were: what do clubs do to foster and support their officials? How do different clubs recruit officials and coaches? We provided information and discussed: the Emerging athletes program, HP and Development squad and branch selection process.

For the very first time we provided DVD, documented information and discussion on Pool rescue competition and the future of this activity. The Hottest item on the agenda was the up and coming Carnival program, discussion on ideas and a brainstorming session on how to increase participation. Finally a quick around the clubs on Coaching, clinics where and when, how do various clubs / districts provide what kind of coaching and what is needed.

All of this shared information assisted in delivery improved activities and set a sound starting block for more forums of this kind more frequently. Many issues were resolved and a number of positive ideas were taken back to clubs or BOSS.

Competition

Sydney Branch did have a great year of competition. Competitor's patronage at the 4 main senior carnivals was improved. BOSS expanded the rounds concept in craft events and beach sprints. Next season will see this return with some fine tuning. We hope to see a greater return of branch competitors. We have more officials with more experience running the carnivals efficiently. Giving everyone more time to enjoy the day.

Branch members won medals in the following areas: Aussie Masters 41, Aussie Open 54, Sate Masters 91, State Open 105 and state Junior 114. This is just outstanding achievement. Congratulations to all. Sydney branch must consider how to keep this standard high in the years to come; many of our open competitors continue to migrate to compete for QLD clubs. We must again provide initiative, review, plan and foster more opportunities to retain top line competitors.

SLSS Interbranch team:

The Carnival was held at Catherine Hill Bay. Great location with Sydney branch posting its best result in many years. Team captains Chris Allum and Jamie McGee lead by example all the way. Our team officials were a mix of seasoned campaigners and new professionals together steered and support this great team effort. There are many outstanding achievements however, to see our own captain and his brother swim to the aid of Alexander after a very nasty ski collision was testament to the integrity of our team. We provided fresh food on the beach, cold drinks. Electrolyte along with fresh fruit chilled and prepared in the team tents. The team took more resources to support our team in their effort. - The future plan looking at 1-3 year concept
- Improve and implement methods for talent identification, creating pathways for growth of our competitors as a fundamental part of HP, Development and EAP

Sydney Branch Surf Sports Development Camp 2009:

SLSS Carnivals

We have on the planning boards a number of specialized Carnivals, aimed at encouraging participation and providing opportunity for solid competition. I hope that we can rely on all branch clubs and members to assist with these. The junior branch saw a new carnival added to the series and again I see planning for a Sydney Surf Series within our own branch. For the first time in many years we have our first IRB carnival hosted by Elouera as part of the state series. Again we have plans to expand this further. BOSS is already working on next season planning, collaboration with other branches, we have concepts for endurance and beach skins events. Scrutineering and Gear Maintenance

upon retention, and helping the kids to focus on their future in Lifesaving.




Shark Dive Award

championships. I would like to congratulate and thanks Mike Vitnell and the Board of Surf Sports for their hard work, and in particular the development camp which saw youth members improving their




Country city exchange program.

It is with pride and pleasure that I am again able to report that 'no lives were lost whilst our patrols were on duty'. Thus, in this our 102nd year, the Bondi Surf Bathers' Life Saving



Club has again achieved its principal objective in the provision of a safe surfing Environment for those who choose to bathe at world famous Bondi Beach. Our rescue and service delivery statistics for the 2008-09 Season again display our responsibilities in patrolling what is arguably Australia's busiest beach.

Congratulations also to our fine Instructional Team with our overall awards summary for the season seeing our Club placed second in Sydney Branch with a total of over 350 awards. Whilst our bronze medallion total of 76 was down slightly on last season, it is the overall statistics across the wide range of surf life saving educational components which are most gratifying. This simply means that our members are trained very much into the 'complete package' as competent surf life savers.

It was also pleasing this season to see a record 25 graduates from the 'Nipper' ranks achieve their Surf Rescue Certificates. It is now very much the job of the Club as a whole to embrace these new cadets and have them develop and remain as active surf life savers at Bondi.

As with other surf life saving clubs, retention of our newer members, young and not so young, remains a real challenge. Our bronze medallion attainments are most pleasing, and notwithstanding this season's good Nipper graduation, the reality is that we have generally fewer cadet and juniors than like clubs. More work is required in that regard. Congratulations to all those members who wore the famous navy blue and white quartered cap as competitors for Bondi during the past season.

Our Open Women's R&R Team won gold at the Australian Championships in Western Australia for a record fourth consecutive year. Congratulations also to our Under 15 R&R Team Girls who took out the silver medal in their first year of competition.

At the State Championships at Swansea Belmont, gold medal winners were the Open Women's R&R Team (again, four consecutive years), Under 17 Beach Flags (Matt Horton, who made the NSW Surf Sports Team), and the '140 years plus' surf boat crew (Chris Pike sweep). Greg Byrnes was also a winner in the 35-39 years surf ski at the NSW Endurance Championships. Long Service Member Ted Healy was awarded a trophy as the oldest rower at this season's Australian Championships. Ted, who is 71, is a member of our '240 years plus' boat crew, and had won gold at both the Australian and New South Wales Championships in 1956 as a member of our Junior Boat Crew.

One Club section increasing its competition commitment is the IRB Group which has been moulded into a competent lifesaving support facility. Whilst they are an essential part of our patrolling obligations, this team has been hard at training in preparation for their competition season

which takes place across the winter months.

The changing face of the management of a large modern day surf life saving club, and the demanding reporting commitments and information exchange with SLSA and subsidiaries, has placed an increasing workload on our office-bearers, who have responded well. The world financial problems have seen a substantial downturn in sponsorship income availability but we are hoping for brighter days ahead in that regard.

There has been ongoing interaction and meetings with fellow Presidents from North Bondi, Tamarama and Bronte clubs. Our commitments have included Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch Council, Waverley Council Community Safety Advisory Committee, and Waverley Council - Surf Life Saving Clubs liaison meetings which have complemented our good working relationship with Waverley Council Lifeguards.

Bondi's 'centenary clubhouse renovations' were completed during the season and we now have an excellent facility for our members. We extend our appreciation to the Mayor of Waverley Sally Betts, her fellow Councillors, and to the various Council Officers for their support and assistance over the past year.





It was a massive start to the season with over 700 kids registering in October, which meant that we had to close our new registrations within the first two weeks of our arrival on the beach, as what an arrival it was. However it wasn't just the kids that turned up in force, parents too were very keen to get involved with The Surf Club. Over 170 parents completed the 3 hour Age Assistants course so they could get involved with the week to week activities on Coogee. A fantastic effort and the best response to such an initiative in Australia.

From the very first day we all stepped up to the challenge of accommodating everyone on the beach. The under 14's got stuck into their SRC training, while the other senior groups went straight into the water to compete in their first iron man of the season. The juniors met with their own challenges of stepping up to longer swims and even longer board paddles, which they took on under the very capable control of their dedicate age managers Cameron (8's), Geoff (9's), Ben (10's), Craig M (11's), Craig S (12's) and Poido (13's).

As always the sheer size of the under 6's and 7's posed our biggest challenge, to which Karen in the 7's took the reins with passion, and by week three, a more than capable Nick was thrust into the under 6's.

None of these daily challenges on the beach would be achievable without our water safety team. Over 80 Bronze Medallion qualified "green shirts" turned up to the beach on day one of the season, with many more parents keen to put on the lime green honour blazer. 26 more "Bronzies" became qualified before Christmas 2008 and another 38 put themselves through the challenge in April this year. This has meant that over 130 qualified Coogee lifesavers are now looking after our kids. All in all - the idea that information on nipper activities could be found easily, has meant the site was a great success, and will be so, into the future.

Without a doubt the most popular Sunday of the year was the in augural 'Elouera Carnival'. We only had team events, mixed up the skill levels to have even nipper teams – and it was a hit! Kids that did not normally win a place or a ribbon got one. Big thanks for Peter Williams for creating the fantastic atmosphere on the microphone – and the committee and age managers who supported the concept. It is very pleasing to report our members successfully, efficiently and diligently patrolled Maroubra Beach with "No Life's Lost" and in doing so they have earned praise and recognition for their efforts.

Patrol numbers at Maroubra are the highest for many years, with over 300 active members in our patrols. This is a great achievement and one that could not have been achieved without the commitment and dedication of every single patrol member. Our Surf Lifesavers have shown a real exuberance and enthusiasm towards public safety. Your service to the club and the community is appreciated. The Patrol Teams carried out a total of 176 rescues and prevented another 4104 people getting into difficulties. The 2008/09 season was another successful one for the Maroubra Seal Pups, with membership numbers breaking the 550 mark again. It's great to see so many parents making the decision to teach their children about surf safety and awareness; this is a benefit that not only extends into family life but into the community as well.

Registration days were held in September at the Maroubra Seals Sports and Community Club, the annual proficiency swims had to be held at Heffron Pool due the reconstruction work on the pool at the Seals. Whilst this was a logistical challenge for our committee - all members completed their swims before the 31 December deadline.

This year the Committee approved a \$10 per member building levy that contributed over \$5500.00 to the Clubs building maintenance fund. I'm sure the new Nipper Committee will follow this process in the 2009-10 season and continue to put money back into the Senior club. However, the offer to the Senior club to raise additional money by manning the Nipper BBQ's after 11:00am each Sunday to service the lunch crowd at the beach never eventuated.

With very few grants available to Nippers this year our funds were limited, the only grant we received was from the Woolworth's Fresh Food Kids program (\$2500.00). We were however still able to provide all of our normal services as well as purchase 11 new foam nipper-boards, 2 new BBQs, and donate to the Building fund. We ended the season in a very positive and secure financial position – our Sunday BBQ's as always were a great source of income (but a lot of hard work). With over 56 active water safety members and an additional 12 Nipper parents passing their bronze medallion courses we continued to be able to provide our own water safety on Sundays and at our mid-week training sessions.

When the season commenced in October, we concentrated on the developmental aspects of Nippers in all age groups. We modified events to enable the distances to be suitable to the skill levels of the children. We want to continue developing their confidence and skills so that they become active members of our Club. From all accounts the outcomes achieved were very positive.

We are very proud of the older children in our club who in the past few seasons have sustained record numbers and passed their Surf Rescue Certificates allowing them to start voluntary beach patrols on their way to becoming qualified lifesavers. We congratulate all of you on your dedication to Surf lifesaving.

Training:

As always, our training timetable was extensive and well attended. Three water training sessions were offered each week, along with surf swimming, general fitness and March Past sessions. Nippers would like to extend a huge thank you to Brian Purdon who is the best in the business when it comes to March Past. We would love to see some more beach training opportunities – so if anyone out there has skills in this area, we'd love to hear from you.

Carnivals:

This year's State titles were held at Swansea-Belmont and a fun time was had by all Maroubra competitors over the three days. We had quite a number of children making finals - not an easy task at this level. Well done to all of our competitors for putting in such a great effort – the weather may have been ordinary, but your performances were not. Congratulations to Harrison Lewis - Under 10's who won a Gold Medal in Beach Flags and to Ella Basalo on her 2 medals - Silver in 12yr Swim and Bronze in 12yr Ironwoman. Our March Past team finished a very respectable 5th place in the State, led by a very proud and loyal coach in Brian Purdon.

Our Helpers:

When a club has a membership base of 550 children, this requires some serious hands on help. We are very fortunate to have highly trained water safety personnel, led by Lee Miller, Paul Scullion and



Thankyou to the team at Junior Sydney Branch ("BJD"), Tim Murray in the Chair, Margaret Sears (Secretary) and Yvette Rutherford at the Office. Tim is standing down as Branch Chair and his shoes will be very hard to fill. On behalf of North Cronulla I would like to extend to him a hearty congratulations for the commitment and time he put into the role over the past few years.

One of the published goals of the BJD at the start of the season was to encourage member clubs to a surf lifesaving focus rather than competition. The excellent new SLSA nipper training manuals certainly helped with that goal, but the BJD committee has to be congratulated for the way it introduced the new age guide modules with well-attended seminars in the Eastern Suburbs and the Shire. At North Cronulla our education officer, Don McGroder should also be congratulated. Armed with the new training manuals, Don was tireless in "spreading the word." Getting around the many squads as often as he did was an amazing feat. Well done, Don.

In a sensible decision this year the BJD formed a competition sub-committee headed up by competition director, Mike Roye with the aim of streamlining issues around surf sport participation, particularly in relation to the branch carnival. In the result, issues such as the event program, entry requirements etc were ironed out prior to branch meetings and saved the usual round of hot debate. It is an idea worth taking into future years.

Doug Hawkins, branch lifesaving advisor again took responsibility for running the two development camps at Deer Park in the National Park (one for the U11's and another for the U13's). Both camps went off brilliantly. Having announced his retirement after years in the role, Doug will be close to impossible to replace. His contribution throughout his period of tenure on the Junior Branch committee has been awesome. This scribe had opportunity of attending the U11 camp and can now speak from personal experience. 98 nippers from the Sydney Clubs arrived at 4pm Friday and 98 tired but delighted young lifesavers departed Sunday arvo with a bunch of lifetime memories, new friendships and lifesaving skills. Northies was represented by Chad, Cameron, Jye, Matthew, Hayley, Monique, Brianna, Caitlin and Adelaide. All 9 kids behaved brilliantly all weekend and were a credit to themselves and our club. The program, facilitated by tireless Branch Development Officer, Doug Hawkins was incredibly full on, each day commencing with a 7am pool activity and non-stop events thereafter, finishing late at night with trivia and a movie. Events included canoeing,

abseiling, archery, obstacle courses and rock climbing. The kids were given rescue training in IRB's and rides on jet skis. The rescue launch, "Offshore 2" was also available for cruises around Port Hacking. Chad and Brianna enjoyed being volunteer patients when "Offshore 2" conducted mock rescue demonstrations. A highlight was when "Lifesaver 1", the rescue helicopter flew into camp. The crew then delivered a talk to the kids as to the chopper's role and allowed a walk-through of the aircraft. On Sunday the children were taught how to conduct a rescue tube rescue and were given instruction in CPR, culminating with a rescue competition. Huge thanks to the Northies minders, Grace Cowan and Andrew Highfield.

Thanks from Northies should also go to the Board of Surf Sports, headed up by Branch Director Mike Vitnell. The task of scheduling carnivals, filling appointments and complying with SLSA surf sports policies is a difficult and often thankless one. This year particularly so with weather conditions forcing cancellation of the senior branch event and forcing the junior carnival to move from Elouera to Cronulla/North Cronulla. The logistics of moving a surf carnival as large as our junior branch carnival on 12 hours notice to another beach is beyond belief. I think it was an awesome effort. BOSS should also receive a pat on the back for the number of surf sports official courses run during the year. The result of that initiative was obvious: carnival after carnival saw large numbers of new faces in the form of probationary officials. Wish that trend would continue. Also filling a long

standing gap, this year a scrutineers' course was also conducted. Newly graduated from that course and with tape measure, scales and a swag of stickers in hand, our Tony Hughes has dived into the role with gusto.

Now in the off-season Northies nippers are powering along. Competition



We commenced the season with 414 nipper registrations however throughout the course of the season 20 of our U14 nippers gained their Surf Rescue Certificate and progressed to Cadets Membership so with this in mind we ended our season with a steady 394 nipper members. I take this opportunity to congratulate our U14 nippers that have now obtained their SRC and wish them well as they enter into the Senior part of the club.

Nippers kicked off in September with our Nipper registrations and proficiencies and I earnestly thank all those involved with this arduous activity both at the pool, beach and administratively. We organised, timed, encouraged and processed 194 Preliminary Proficiencies and 150 separate Competition Proficiencies. (Proficiencies include a timed pool swim, run swim run, non-timed pool swim, surf education) These proficiencies allowed our nippers to participate in our 20 weekly Sunday activities and to enter into competition.

We hit the beach in October enjoying a full complement of Group Leaders/Age Managers. This group of club volunteers continue to amaze me with their everlasting, never-tiring, dedication, patience and commitment that they show to our club and our nippers. I truly thank you for your efforts this year. Also thank you to our water safety and Sunday patrol members who ensure that our youngsters are enjoying their activities in safe conditions.

In line with Sydney Branches Board of Junior Activities goal of increasing lifesaving activities within our nippers I am pleased to report that 95% (376) of our nippers participated in the new Surf Education program rolled out state wide this year. We also had 80 children aged 10 to 13 gain their Resuscitation Award this year. Congratulations to everyone involved. Thank you to my clubs Management Committee for also funding the attendance of our nippers to attend the U11 and U13 Sydney Lifesaving Development Camps and the April 09 Surf Sports Camp. Our children thoroughly enjoyed these three camps and we extend our thanks to Surf Life Saving Sydney for organising such great activities.

Competitively our children participate in carnivals that took us to a number of locations - including Forster, Cronulla, Nth Cronulla, Wamberal, Elouera, Wanda, Red Head, Queenscliff, Manly, South Maroubra & Swansea-Belmont. It was great to see so many South Maroubra hats at the Randwick Shield (well done to the team on a great effort despite the extremely low water and air temperatures on the day - we took out first place) and to all of our competitors that entered into the Inaugural South Maroubra Junior Carnival (results further on). I personally congratulate all of our nippers that competed. 
I would also like to acknowledge the support and help of Surf Lifesaving Sydney, the management,

DIRECTOR OF FINANCE

The following Report is to be read in conjunction with the Financial Report for the year ended 31 May 2009. The Branch derived a profit of \$29,206 for the financial year to 31 May 2009 which was well down on the profit of \$177,669 derived in the previous financial year. The reduction in profit reflects the decrease in Sponsorship and Donation income that the Branch received during the year. Income from Sponsorships and Donations decreased from \$428,863 in 2008 to 332,806 in 2009.

Sponsorship and Donations income has dropped over the last two years from \$547,369 in 2007 to \$332,806 in 2009 a decrease of \$214,563 or 39.20%. Total Income for the year was \$598,608 which was down on the 2007/08 figure by \$39,564 mainly due to a reduction in Solicited Donations and Sponsorships of \$98,137. The surplus from rental operations reduced from \$26,238 to 685 as a consequence of the rent free period offered to the lessor of on the new property.

Although operational expenditure exceeded last year's amount by \$101,626 monies were spent in areas that should produce long term benefits for the Branch. Expenditure on Competition and Event Running increased by \$36,694 and involved expenditure on additional development camps and on the High Performance and Emerging Athletes programs. Finance and Property Expenses went from \$23,262 to \$106,945 and relates to costs associated with the purchase of the second property. Most other expenditure was well contained including employee benefits which decreased by \$10,647 over the twelve month period.

On the assets side the original building at Alexandria has been occupied all year and no major expenditure was incurred. The new property derived income from around August last year however the lessor went into administration earlier this year. As a consequence the lease bond was called which provided three months rent while efforts were made to secure a new tenant. The Branch's property advisors including Graham Ford immediately began to seek new tenants and after a period of only six weeks were able to secure a new lessee. Negotiations continued throughout April and May and the new tenant took possession of the site in late May. Rental income will commence around 8 August this year, thereby generating positive cash flows going forward. The original building was not valued this year and therefore reflects the most recent valuation which was undertaken a few years back.

Cash assets, although down on the same period last year, are still quite healthy at \$724,791. The major movement on the Balance sheet has been in Property, Plant and Equipment which has increased from \$904,760 to \$2,141,681 and reflects the acquisition of the second property in the third quarter of 2008. The increase in the asset is matched by the Financial Liability of \$1,000,000.

During the first half of the year the branch employed three staff members which reduced to two from December 2008 onwards. Given the lack of sponsors it is highly unlikely that any additional staff will be engaged in the foreseeable future.

The BJD bank accounts and financial reporting were also centralised to the Branch office during the year. The benefits are that monthly reporting is now up to date and all payments can be made from a central area. Although there was some initial resistance I believe that all concerns have been alleviated.

The Finance committee met four times during the year and most members of the committee attended each meeting. I would like to thank, Peter Pearce, Brian Ferguson and Karl Solomonson for their significant contribution during the season. Matters discussed included the annual budgets, reviewing expenditure and reviewing the performance of the Branch's properties and sponsorship. I would also like to convey my thanks to the Sutherland District Trade Union Club for allowing us to use their board room for our meetings.

With the lack of sponsorship to start the 2009 / 2010 season the onus will be on all office bearers to control expenditure. The finance committee will meet more regularly to review the Branch's financial position including divisional budgets and actual expenditure.

My thanks to our tremendous sponsors who have enabled the branch to operate efficiently throughout the season. To DHL and Sydney Airport we thank you. Without your significant sponsorship the branch would not be in a position to provide services to the clubs and the general public.

To the girls in the office, especially Yvette who keeps the accounts up to date, I thank you for your professionalism and the manner in which you undertake your respective jobs.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2009

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial report is a general purpose financial report and it has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Charilable Fundraising Act 1991 and Associations Incorporation Act NSW.

The financial report is for an entity known as Surf Life Saving Sydney Incorporated as an individual entity. The Association was incorporated in NSW under the Associations Incorporation Act 1984.

The financial report complies with all Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS) in their entirety.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Association in the preparation of the financial report. Unless otherwise stated, the accounting policies have been consistently applied.

Reporting Basis and Conventions

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of financial assets, financial liabilities and selected non-current assets for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

2 Accounting Policies

Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at fair value or cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, where applicable.

Property

Freehold land and buildings are valued by an independent valuer every three years, with annual appraisals being made by the committee. They are measured on fair value, being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged in an arm's length transaction between informed participants.

The property is held for investment purposes and therefore the committee has adopted not to apply depreciation. Any fall in the value of the property will be adjusted in the Association's reserves.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are carried at either cost or at independent or Association's valuation, loss any accumulated depreciation or amortisation applicable.

Depreciation

Plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight line basis at rates calculated to allocate the cost less the estimated residual value over the estimated useful life of each asset.

Depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Plant & Equipment	15%
Office Furniture & Equipment	33%
Rental Plant & Equipment	10%
Competition & Life Saving Equipment	20%
Leasehold Improvements	10%

The assets carrying values are reviewed for impairment when events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable. An asset's carrying account is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount,

Profit and loss on disposal are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These amounts are included in the Income Statement.

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NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2009

Trade And Other Receivables

Recognition

The Association has elected to apply the option available under AASB1 of adopting AASB132 and AASB 139. Amounts owing are recognised and carried at original invoice amount less any allowance for uncollectable amounts.

An allowence for doubtful debts is made when there is objective evidence that the Association will not be able to collect the debts. Bad debts are written off when identified.

Trade And Other Payables

Recognition

Amounts owing are carried at their invoiced cost and represent a liability for goods and services provided to the Association prior to the end of the financial year that are unpaid and arise when the Association becomes obliged to make future payments in respect of the purchase of these goods and services.

Income Tax

No Income Tax is payable by the Association as Section 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 exempts Charitable Institutions from Income Tax.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and short-term deposits in the balance sheet comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less.

Revenue

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Association and the revenue can be reliably measured. The following specification criteria must also be mot before revenue is recognised:

Sale of Goods

Revenue is recognised when control has passed to the buyer.

Capitation Fees

Revenue is recognised when a member is entitled to the benefits of belonging to the Association

Sponsorship & Grants

Unconditional sponsorship & grants are recorded as income when received. Grants received for specific projects are recognised as revenue upon receipt regardless of whether the expanditure has been incurred as long as there is no contractual right to return the monies received to the grantor.

Rendering of Services

Revenue from the providing of a service is recognised when the member or customer receives the service.

Rents and Interest

Control of the right to receive the payment.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and service tax, except:

- (i) where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. It is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of an asset or as part of an item of the expense.
- (ii) receivables and payables are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the cash flow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2009

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

In preparing this financial report, the committee was required to make estimates and assumptions. These estimates and assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. Actual results may differ from these estimates. The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis.

Comparative Figures

Where required by accounting standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

14 Financial Instruments

Financial Risk Management

The Association's financial instruments consist primarily of deposits with banks, local money market instruments, accounts receivable and payable and loans from banks.

The Association does not have any derivative instruments at 31 May 2009.

(a)Treasury Risk Management

The committee meet on a regular basis and consider interest rate exposure and to evaluate cash flow to meet current and future obligations.

(b)Financial Risks

The main risks the Association is exposed to through its financial instruments are interest rate risk and liquidity risk.

Interest rate risk is managed by a fixed term interest rate (expiring September 2011) on \$800,000 of the dobt and by the monitoring of short & long term interest rate fluctuations on the remainder.

The Association manages liquidity risk by monitoring cash flows on a regular basis and lensuring adequate funds are held in the bank at all times to meet present and future obligations. Repayment of borrowings is secured by a medium term rental agreements which are sufficient to meet the financial institutions debt.

15 Related Party Transactions

During the financial year the Association paid \$6,321 to Tech Mates Pty Ltd (trading as, Purruna) for IT services. Tech Mates Pty Ltd is an entity controlled by Mr Robert Yeldon the preceding President of the Association.

16 Association Details

The principal place of business of the Association is: Surf Life Saving Sydney Incorporated 1414 Anzac Parade Little Bay NSW 2230

17 Segment Information

The Association operates predominantly in one business and geographical segment, being the provision of Surf Life Saving administration services to the member clubs from North Bondi to Burning Palms.

18 Information And Declarations To Be Furnished Under The Charitable Fundraising Act 1991

The Gross Revenue from Non Member Fundraising, Solicited Donations and Sponsorship did not reach the minimum Gross Revenue total of \$100,000 whereby additional reporting is required under the Charitable Fundraising Act of 1991. Should this amount be exceeded in future years the Association will be required to report on the Gross amount received and the manner in which those funds were applied in meeting the objectives of the Association and Surf Life Saving.




