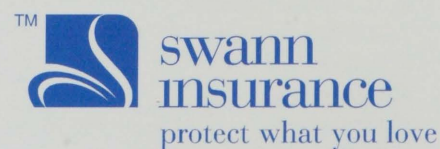

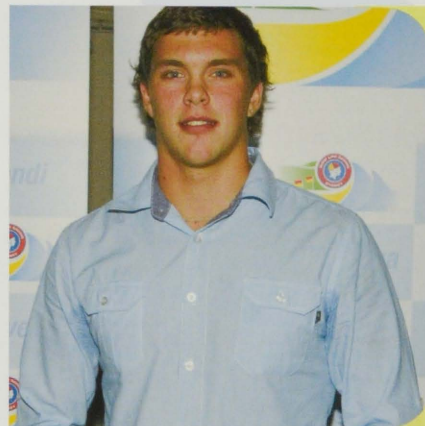

## Board of Lifesaving

After a demoralizing season, I attended the Election meeting and thought that we had turned the corner and would be back on track for another season. On returning from leave I discovered we did not have a Director or Deputy Director. Our Branch President John De Cean (who is not a Board member) stepped into the breach and took over for what was a challenging season. John on behalf of all Board members, I record our appreciation of a magnificent job under trying circumstances. Our membership also stepped up to the mark and dealt with the myriad of challenges head on and came out of the season with many achievements to their credit. I believe John has got the Board over its hurdle and the path is clear and well directed for the coming season.

Our first task was the Annual Gear Inspection and this was very successful and was again run over a full weekend. Clubs were very supportive in the first instance, however, a small minority refused to put up gear for reinspection. A special thanks to Cronulla, Garie and Clovelly who supplied meals, that were very much appreciated. The standard overall was high, which assisted a reduced number of volunteers who carried out the inspection. To those who have not been involved, think about it, as it is a fun, but serious weekend, where the interaction with the Club members who do the hard work to get the gear upto scratch is a great learning experience. The stickers used are still a problem and John is taking the matter up with SLSNSW and hopefully this perennial problem will be fixed once and for all, and we will have stickers that stick for more than five minutes.

The Branch agreed with our recommendation that gear is no longer to be kept on the premises where it is no longer fit for use. This is an OH&S issue, as well as a potential; insurance and negligence issue. We have further recommended due to the potential; that from next season where Clubs do not

abide by the reinspection criteria, they be suspended from competition until such time as the gear is reinspected or removed from the Club. We believe this will result in the problem being resolved as no Club would risk such an issue eventuating.

John alternated the meetings between Lifesaving and Education, which I felt was disruptive and resulted in a lack of cohesion, especially with business arising. However, we did see more Club representatives at meetings, which made the meetings more lively. There is talk of breaking up the Board into separate Lifesaving & Education entities, which I believe would be a retrograde step, as the two roles are very much a part of a matrix, which intertwine and interact with each other, that enhances and strengthens both areas.

John McNamee put his hand up and took on the role of Deputy Director of Lifesaving and has settled in well. A blast from the past was Wal Dobrow returning as our IRB Advisor. Wal is a very knowledgeable innovative individual who is an asset on Committee. Marissa although moving to Kiama continued to deal with all things educational. It is a shame the tyranny

of distance comes into play with her position. George in his role, dealt with a number of important issues and problems with distinction, which resulted in his receiving quite a bit of kudos for both himself and his team from various rescue groups.

Mike Batty who has been a stalwart for such a long time on Committee, has not nominated for the coming season. His fine mind and depth of knowledge will be missed. Gary Daly in recognition of his outstanding contribution to SLSS was elected to Life Membership, to which we congratulate him.

The "Ian Mackey Memorial Lecture" has been postponed, until early in the new season. National President and Branch stalwart Graham Ford has agreed to deliver the lecture, which I have no doubt will result in a big enthusiastic crowd attending.

It was interesting to note that SLSNSW has reduced the minimum number of BM holders on patrol from five to three. A survey is being conducted by SLSNSW, to ascertain members views on the compulsory wearing of Patrol Caps. We as a Board looked at the issue twice during the season & strongly endorsed the wearing of caps on a number of issues including public recognition, ease of identifying patrol members in the water, OH&S & the authority the cap generates in emergency situations. Such stance was endorsed by Club Officers at the meetings.

There has always been controversy over the setting of buoys for awards & proficiency's, with the distance always being too far out. During the season the Board purchased four range finders, one for each District so they may be used to correctly measure distances. Candidates as in the past can still challenge the distance before the event, however, we are confident this will eliminate most complaints. There use is not however compulsory.

The Patrol Competition, continues to gain momentum and we congratulate all those who assisted in making it so successful.



The Office continues to provide a fantastic level of very professional service. We tend to take Linda and Yvette for granted, which we should not. From all of us a big thank you, as we would be hard pressed without your expertise and enthusiasm.

SurfCom provided an excellent service under the direction of Robyn Bowley.

They continue to have a very small group who put in a huge number of hours. They certainly could do with additional assistance.

We continue to offer & provide assistance with respect to all facets of Lifesaving & Education.

I believe we are back on tract in most areas & I am confident that with good governance we will continue to provide a standard & service by our members that is second to none.

**SUPPORT OPERATIONS MANAGER**

The past season was full of highlights of which included a number of Major Search and Rescues were undertaken within the branch and included engagement from various levels of the branch, a number of clubs, Offshore Boat, Rescue Water Craft, Patrol Members (Maroubra & South Maroubra) and Duty Officers involved in single incidents. I am pleased to say the services provided by SLSS were done so at the highest level of professionalism and this was recognised and commented on by the Eastern Beachers Commander of Police.

Outside of the operational requirements the support operations group we also involved in a number of training operations involving external in internal agencies including Airport Disaster Training, IRB

Night Operations Training and attendance at the Emergency Management Volunteer Summit in Canberra.

Once again the level of commitment and support provided by the Support Operations Group continues to astound me and I would like to sincerely thank you for the ongoing support and commitment provided to me during the past season.

**SurfCom**

The 2010 – 2011 season was a very busy one for SurfCom Sydney.

A key change that was implemented during this season was the introduction of the new on-line SurfCom Management System. This system has been implemented throughout SLSSA and enables incidents to be more effectively monitored and recorded. The system can be accessed from any location, which has been particularly useful for recording out-of-patrol hours rescue activities. Aside from some early teething problems, the new system has functioned effectively throughout the season and has improved the efficiency of SurfCom Sydney's operations.

Other developments throughout the season included a contact group being established to facilitate communications between Club Radio Officers, and the promulgation of several circulars to reinforce radio protocols.

This season had its fair share of busy moments - particularly around the Christmas and New Year period, and on Australia Day where SurfCom was operational from 6:00am until 8:00pm. On several other occasions SurfCom remained open after the designated finish time for patrols when the need arose.

All SurfCom operators pitched in to the best of their availability over the season. A particular thank you must go to those that have contributed a high number of hours - including Joe White (208 hours), Bernard Weir (169 hours), Tony Beger (53.30 hours), Liza Hodgson (50.30 hours) and David Kowald (38.30 hours).

This season four new operators also commenced "solo" SurfCom duties -



congratulations to Bernard Weir, James Caterson, Shaun Hudson and Tosh Lane.

During the off-season, a series of visits and training exercises will be conducted – including visits to the NSW Police Communications Centre at Surry Hills and the NSW Ambulance Communications Centre.

Preparation is already underway for next season. A major priority will be SurfCom operator recruitment - in order to more evenly spread the workload among a wider pool of operators.

A SurfCom webpage to be hosted on the SLSS site is currently being developed which will provide an overview of SurfCom and the duties of Surfcom operators.

It is also intended that several SurfCom information sessions will be held – both to recruit more SurfCom operators and to better inform SLSS members about Surfcom's operations.

I would like to thank everyone who has contributed to and assisted SurfCom over the past season – including the SurfCom operators, the Westpac Rescue Helicopter Service and members of the SLSS Support Operations Group.

I look forward to a bigger and better season in 2011-2012.

This year SLSNSW have started to introduce IRB's into its afterhours call out system and ORB 3 had the opportunity to take part in two night training operations which involved IRB's and the Westpac Helicopter, these nights are very valuable in fine tuning the crews skills.

## Administration

The ORB 3 executive has been working alongside and in partnership with its major sponsors; Randwick City Council, The Randwick District committee and its members have been involved in all levels of life saving in Sydney. The group's executive has the group in a strong position looking to grow the group as it moves forward.

## Infrastructure

ORB 3 is in a good position currently and at the time of writing the group has a new 6.5 metre Kevlacat boat near completion and hopefully being delivered in July. The group also has plans lodged to renovate its current base to make it more suitable for its memberships and operational needs.

### **Lifesaving Supervisor – Cronulla/Sutherland District**

The Annual Gear Inspection conducted on 11 and 12 September again utilised the same inspection team for all Surf Life Saving Sydney– affiliated clubs, arrangements which worked so well the previous two seasons. As a result the Gear Inspection Panel achieved consistency of inspections across districts and general comparisons and exchanges of observations while the Team was travelling to and from the various clubs. Use of a bus for transport again contributed to an efficient process.

With some minor exceptions standard of gear inspected was generally good. Clubs now are clearly displaying equipment corresponding to the information from SurfGuard which assisted, particularly where a club had plenty of equipment. One criticism within Cronulla - Sutherland (although not unique to that District) was delays by all clubs in making arrangements for timely re-inspections of equipment. Recommendations have been made for addressing the problem in coming seasons.

At least once each month my Deputy, Graham Hill and I undertook a formal inspection of the patrols from each Bate Bay Club and followed up the inspections with informal observations of the patrols at other times. All inspections were unannounced, although Graham and I

wore Branch uniform on all occasions.

Again this season Graham and I spoke to beach-users who were not obviously associated with a surf club and with Council Lifeguards on the contributions made by the four Bate Bay surf lifesaving clubs. In the main, feedback was positive and any perceived, or actual, problems were promptly addressed with the respective club(s).

Patrols inspected generally scored well. Deficiencies identified, mainly centering on lack of patrol uniforms or inconsistencies between patrol logs and attendees at the time were promptly rectified. Patrol captains, IRB drivers and all active members were cooperative and courteous at all times. However, it was evident from comments made that members were becoming tired as the season came to a conclusion.

Wanda experienced ongoing problems with providing reliable IRB resources during the season which the Club is endeavouring to address. The usual high-standard of cooperation by other clubs in addressing the deficiency was pleasing.

Relations with the Sutherland Shire Council Manager Beach Operations and his staff continued to be most cordial and professional and their ready assistance and advice was appreciated.

Each of the meetings of the Cronulla-Sutherland District Council Inc. was attended by Graham and myself and formal reports were presented. Whenever corrective actions were required of clubs (requested either by the Council or us) it occurred promptly.

I reported in my report last season that development of a Bate Bay Beach Management Plan, garnering input from clubs and the Council, was nearing completion. Unfortunately that prediction was optimistic and the document has still not been finalised, although considerable progress has been made.

Again this Season "no lives were lost during rostered patrol hours". Notwithstanding the occurrence of several major incidents which required assistance and hospitalisation of beach users and/ or members all active members performed

creditably which is testament to the skills, professionalism, cooperation and ongoing education of all involved in ensuring a safe aquatic environment in Bate Bay whether as trainers/ assessors, support operations or patrolling members.

Of particular note were the decisions of the four Bate Bay Clubs to voluntarily extend the patrol hours in response to uncharacteristically large numbers on the beaches after normal patrol hours and the general beach conditions and temperature. The decisions were very responsibly taken and ensured that surf safety was paramount.

The accessibility of the critical incident team and the assistance of the Support Operations Group under George Shales when major incidents were encountered were appreciated and formally acknowledged in a letter which was forwarded to the Branch.

The lack of resolution of the Cronulla District Lifesaver Rescue (CDLR, previously the Offshore Rescue Boat 2) impasse is regrettable on several fronts. While the matter is unresolved, the service of many loyal and competent long-service members is lost; Clubs and the Council are not able to introduce contemporary and efficient equipment and procedures, and relations between the various levels of surf lifesaving remain strained.

It is particularly destabilising when it is recognised that the matter may not have escalated to the existing situation if the District's carefully - developed Terms of Reference for the review of the operations of the CDLR - which significantly were agreed by representatives of the Bate Bay Clubs and CDLR - were adhered to and the review progressed in a timely and impartial manner.

There are two other matters of importance to which I refer for consideration of future officers and active members. The first relates to the valuable assistance provided by the radio operators at SurfCom who all recorded excessive hours in monitoring and responding to radio transmissions. Clubs need to support this service and relieve the load on the operators.

The second matter concerns the situation which prevailed for much of the season when our Branch President also assumed the role of Director of Lifesaving. The circumstances which caused the vacancy in the latter position were unavoidable. However, even though Lifesaving Supervisors in the various districts assisted as best they were able, the Branch should never again allow the situation to develop. We all owe John De Cean a great deal of appreciation for his efforts and in that connection I place my personal appreciation on record.

Graham Hill and I readily acknowledge with gratitude the assistance and courtesy extended to us in our respective roles by:

- Administration and active members of Cronulla, North Cronulla, Elouera and Wanda Surf Life Saving clubs.
- General and Beach Management and lifeguards of Sutherland Shire Council.
- Officers and staff of Surf Life Saving Sydney
- Sponsors and supporters of the Branch operations.

Assessments at this venue were always well prepared in advance of the event with all required human resources, equipment and paperwork present and completed. The BBQ after the assessment was also a nice touch.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank the Clubs for providing access to their facilities, their Chief Training Officers for their support and assistance this season, the Branch Assessors for contributing their time and effort and Scott Marshall for his support and assistance this season.

Special mention for support to their IRB Sections including Nigel Harvey Club Captain from Bronte and Bill Shires President and Rex Hutton Club Captain from Tamarama.

My thanks goes to Peter Pearce who responds within a few minutes to my request for his District's IRB status (Mr Efficiency); Bob Lees, my predecessor who without his assistance I would not have been able to enjoy my job and achieve our collective goals. He has been a tremendous supporter and great sounding board for all IRB matters. Dennis Parker retired this year as District IRB Awards Coordinator after 10 years and his efforts were very much appreciated. Joel Eaton took over the role from Dennis and has completed a number of IRB Trainer and Assessor tasks. Randwick District has been ably operated by Siegmar Dobry (Sigy) and I had the pleasure of watching him assess a driver's course in large surf at Maroubra in April 2011. I was particularly impressed with the driving skills of Jay Shelley who demonstrated a perfect corking technique in getting through a breaking 8 foot wave. He was ably trained by Gary Cheer and assisted by Arthur Cotsios from Maroubra.

Also in the background, Ken Hudson (South Maroubra) provides National Scrutineering for all IRB equipment and Peter Burst (Bondi) and his water safety team provides a significant assistance in training and laying of buoys for Surf Sports carnivals.

Some of the initiatives introduced this year were

1. A comprehensive contact list for all our IRB captains including the IRB resources that each club has (IRB motors, boats and in particular spare parts), whether clubs were training for competition, the number of trainers, assessors, amongst other things. The intent of this document is to further engender cooperation and contact between our Sydney Branch IRB community.

2. Introduction of a Sydney Branch IRB Award for "Significantly improved the IRB cell within his/her Club or within the Branch". Congratulations to Paul Jefferson and Rob Illidge from Coogee.
3. Approval to place IRB training resources on our Sydney Branch website (approval being given but I am yet to provide the format to our web master, but already sent to our IRB Captains).
4. A training and assessment plan which gave a direction to IRB training assessment for the year.
5. Creation of Room Arranger program for all IRB clubs (excepting Clovelly who were in the course of construction and Bronte whose measurements required further investigation).
6. Waterproof spray jackets for all of our Sydney Branch Water Safety IRB drivers (Peter Burst, Dennis Parker, Joel Eaton, Kane Hughes and Daniel Wood) thanks to 1 Stop Property Reports for their donation (one of my companies). Dennis said that for the last 10 years he had been given promises of a waterproof spray jacket and was surprised that this had in fact come to fruition.
7. Guidance provided regarding a No-Surf exam day, where Assessors had the opportunity to assess all non water parts of an IRB exam, and leave the surf part of the exam until larger surf was available.

I would also particularly thank all of our IRB Crew and Drivers who have consistently supported Surf Sports water safety at Branch, State and Australian Titles.

I represented Sydney Branch in a number of IRB initiatives this year including the National IRB Boat and Motor Review held at Elouera in February 2011 (I note that I was the only person who had also participated in Harry Brown's inaugural Boat and Motor Review some 30 odd years ago – gee that was hard to type.); review of propellers for Surf Life Saving Australia prior to their purchase of some

500 four blade propellers; review of IRBC and IRBD training packages; assessment of an 8 handle IRB (now 12 handles); assessment of full loop cowling straps; introduction and assessment of hook knives, amongst other things.

The future holds further benefits to our IRB community including the requirement for all IRB members to demonstrate the "lock in position" at the next IRB proficiency (following the National IRB Review and the recommendations contained in the IRB Agenda). One of these recommendations includes removal of the crewman's right foot strap.

I have thoroughly enjoyed the available time that I have had to put in to our IRB community and having been recently re-elected I look forward to further assisting in 2011-2012.

# Sydney Lifeguard - Working Together Program



## Background

During school holidays many young lifesavers are on the beach enjoying themselves while the beach is very busy, and the local council lifeguards have hundreds, even thousands of people on the sand and in the water, under their responsibility.

Also many younger SLS members do not get to use their lifesaving skills they have accumulated over the years on patrol, and may only do the minimum number of hours over the patrolling season.

At the SLS Sydney U14-17 Development Camp in 2010 discussion was held about providing these young lifesavers more options of experience and development, while also giving them extra levels of responsibility.

Some of the attendees at the Camp had mentioned their attendance at the Lifeguard Info and work experience programs at Bondi Beach and Bate Bay, and this proposal is an extension of those programs, this time initiated by SLS Sydney, and if successful could become a model for other Branches and Councils in working together.

## Practicalities

Those young lifesavers who volunteered for this program were strong representatives of their clubs and SLS, and taking that into account the following requirements were met.

- Agree to the Brief of Roles and Responsibilities and SLSA Code of Conduct
- Must have Bronze Medallion and have obtained at least 30 hrs of patrol
- Must be endorsed by their club by Chief Training officer and Director of Lifesaving of the club - if U18 parent signatures
- Attend a training session with Council Lifeguards - Commit to a schedule of shifts being 4 hrs each
- Present themselves to the Lifeguards for their shift in full SLSA uniform with Hat, Shirt and Shorts

## Implementation

SLS Sydney (Doug Hawkins) met with Brad Whittaker (Head Lifeguard and Beach Manager at Sutherland Shire Council) and discussed this proposal at length based on the information contained in the discussion document. From that meeting SS Council gave their support to the concept. On Monday January 10th 2011 seven lifesavers commenced the program for the first shift - with Twenty Six lifesavers participating over the next two weeks in their shifts - with over 360 hours of patrolling delivered.

These young lifesavers came from the following clubs: North Cronulla, Cronulla, Wanda, Elouera and Coogee. The local contact for the participants was Lee Howell from NC who ably assisted and supported this project and was influential in its success.

## On the Beach each day the young lifesavers worked with the Lifeguards - patrolling, preventions and rescues:

The lifesavers were each given a set of responsibilities to attend to from the lifeguards at each shift. The lifesavers were also given a set of guidelines as to how to respond to scenarios on the beach treating the lifeguards as they would their patrol base and patrol captain.

In all cases of responding to issues on the beach the lifesavers were always in radio contact with the lifeguards and acted on their direction at all times - especially during rescues on the 2nd week

## Outcomes delivered to our branch younger lifesavers:

- Extra experience working on the beach for our young lifesavers and options to work at beaches other than their own.
- Exchange of approaches between lifesavers and lifeguards
- Increasing the relationship between the local council lifeguards and SLS
- Delivering opportunities for young lifesavers to become lifeguards via the ALS
- Delivering extra resources to our beaches during busy times in school holidays
- Higher presence of the SLS red and yellow on our beaches

**This program is now active,** and will be rolled out in Sept-Oct 2011 in the Sutherland Shire and also Randwick Council area who have taken this project on board this will be across seven beaches and an estimated forty young lifesavers.

This program is now being prepared to deliver to both SLS NSW and SLSA for implementation in other clubs and branches around Australia.



## Board of Surf Sports

This season was cram packed full, all types of events some new and not so new. The season seems to swagger along cruising through the different phases. Again I saw more members patronize more events in our branch than ever before.

I must say straight away a great deal of credit and thanks must go to the current Board of Surf Sports. Advisors: Mike Hawkins- Ben Dillon- Ian Goode-Joe Fowler- Graham Bruce – Graham Evans – Stephen Strawbridge, Branch Coaches Doug Iredale: Paul Moses/Joe Fowler, our youth mentors Jake Little/Emma Groves/ Carly Rogers/ Chris Allum/ Mark Simpson. Our Branch Team management and chaperones: Jackie/Shaz/ and finally a very hard working pillar of strength, BOSS secretary Jodee Calo. I would like acknowledge that without Jodee's wonderful support and experience many things would not have been possible, let alone become an event or an activity. Thank you Jodee.

Surf Life Saving Sydney BOSS managed this season: 4 branch carnivals, the Age Championships, 2 Youth carnivals: Sth Maroubra and Cronulla IMB. 4 Junior District carnivals, 1 Senior District carnival, the East Coast Surf Challenge at Nth Cronulla, 5 Emerging Athlete Program activities, 5 Coaching clinics: 2 x ski & 1x IRB/R&R/ Beach.

We also successfully conducted our annual Surf Sports Development Camp, our Jamberoo Surf Sports Day. NB2BRA: Downwind Ski challenge from Maroubra to Nth Bondi, 3 x Branch Team Selection Trials, 6 Boat carnivals or events. We plan to continue to deliver these activities next season and expand where it's needed.

On the horizon, under consideration or in discussion is: another Beach Coaching clinic, A mentoring clinic and workshop, an officials clinic, more events that engage our members and the community, district coaching clinics, another Youth carnival, perhaps the return of small version of the metropolitans and shortly we will be looking at running Junior level Officials courses.



My thanks to our ever hard working gear steward Bursty, who was assisted by Frank aka Captain Chaos. All the gear this season was in great shape, ready to be used and mostly there on time. Bursty and Co. carried out many hours of maintenance. Bursty and BOSS will continue to monitor and fine tune the Branch Carnival water safety roster.

This year saw a number of clubs negligent or no show with IRB and crews. The carnival referee and I, this coming season will enforce the no water safety nor compete rule set by Branch council. The carnival ref will deal with the team managers on the day, the Director of Surf Sports will be in contact directly with the President of the offending club, on the day. I am sure that all members do not want to see their competitors sitting out events due to lack of planning and preparation. Through Peter's IRB clinic many of the clubs have increased IRB crews and drivers, who have a better idea of how to set-up competition water course.

Bursty's support and experience was the rock with which we built the Nth Bondi

to Maroubra Downwind ski challenge. A Huge Thanks must go to Bursty, without your support and hours of hard work many activities would not have come to fruition.

It is with great pleasure I have to report that the Branch Team came home with the 2010-2011 State Interbranch Championship trophy again. Our team set a new standard. Not only did we win back to back, this time we increased our lead winning by a margin of 40 points. It is pleasing and rewarding to say that we received greater points this year from our teams elements than accumulated individual results. In fact in teams we achieved a mammoth 88% of available points, our beach area scored first and second place in 50% of the age groups, our beachies won 82% of available points, and this was even after one U/13 male competitor being drafted in on the Friday before completion started. This boy won his sprints and placed in the flags!!

I can spend the whole report picking outstanding examples of team work and exemplary sportsmanship. It is without a doubt the best group of athlete's I

have had the privilege to be involved with. All clubs and parents should be proud of how well their Son or Daughter represented themselves, their Clubs, the Branch and the organization. We have identified areas where we can still gain improvement and I hope to see this implemented over the next 6 months to give us our greatest chance of setting the bench mark higher again, for all other branches. All credit for this result should go to our wonderful and inspirational team of competitors from all over our branch in all ages, Hayden our Team Captain and Tara our Ladies Captain, the team of youth coaches and youth mentors, Team Manager Mike, John, Wayne and crew, Doug our team coach assisted by Chris Allum. In fact the whole team was a dream bomb including, our very own team cougar's. Thanks must also go to the support and help we receive directly from management and coming directly from our Branch President. Graham assisted 26 probationary officials, Assessed 3 new level 2 Officials. Times call for review and some aspects of our education model need to be finetuned. We do need to experiment with a level 1 split 2 evening course, we have the new junior level officials to prepare and roll out once SLISA and State have released the course and award.

We need to review our active officials and inactive officials to ensure appropriate ratios are in place to support our very busy calendar. We must continue to deploy our best senior officials and coaches within the branch to mentor aspiring and probationary officials and coaches. We must recognize that mentoring is a valuable asset, we as a branch have utilized over the years. To this effect my hope is that during the preseason August / September clinic months we will hold a mentors workshop and clinic.

We have a stable calendar with 3 year planning well under way. Many events are annualized and locked in, leaving room for club events, district / community events and special events to be slotted in without clashing. All clubs who intend to be involved, run or host an event which involves our members in any way, must advisor BOSS and provide special event applications, along with the appropriate documentation. Without endorsement there would be serious doubt to insurance and SLISA support. We need to lodge as many of these special events, new carnivals, community events, marathons, ocean swims, Ocean paddle challenges, run marathons into the calendar so that we maximize exposure to our members and clubs.

Development Projects are well underway. Surf Sports development camp saw a 30% increase in participation. Surf Sports Jamberoo day was a complete sell out. The HP and Development squads have been selected and are in need of the next phase, a representative activity. The Emerging Athletes Program continues to grow and deliver. Last season 110 participants to this season 183. Next season EAP activities will see a lot of the same but also will see some new concepts, just to keep the members on their toes and to encourage a fun learning, challenging environment. We have been working with development as our theme for some years now and we must expand this further into recruitment at novice levels and at the same time provide appropriate activities at the High performance level.

The future is bright, our status as a branch is on the rise, more education activities for officials, expansion of new events with many engaging the community. Our members can be involved in surf related activities all year round. Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch is leading the bunch at many levels. The future is Bright.

My thanks go to the board of management, the branch clubs and Presidents, my fellow members and to the best bunch of competitors ever.

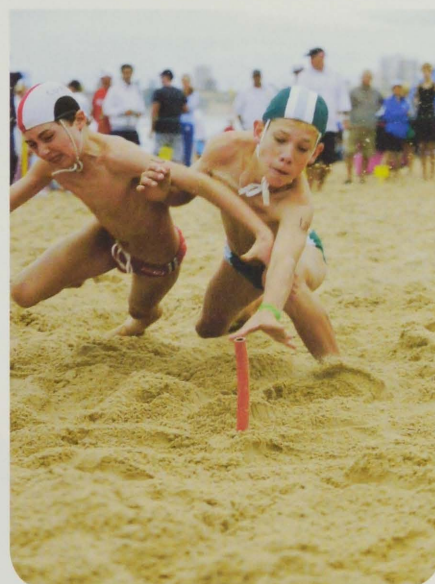

We have adopted, from the example of a number of other surf clubs, new initiatives for next season and beyond, that will ensure we see more parents involved, and actively participating, in our Nipper program.

## SLSS CLUB REPORTS

## Bronte SLSC



We are proud to report that in the 2010/11 season no lives were lost whilst patrols were on duty at Bronte Beach.

Our tradition of volunteer surf lifesaving at Bronte spans 108 years, which is an amazing record of commitment and tradition. Our core business is "between the flags", to ensure that the public are safe at Bronte Beach.

We undertook our lifesaving activities professionally to the highest standard expected of surf life savers across the country. Our professional delivery of surf lifesaving services at Bronte saw 254 rescues, 362 first aids and 1821 preventative actions, under the capable management of Nigel Harvey, with the able assistance of Roger Pyke. The best indicator of the strength of our patrols is that 117 patrol members received a 100% patrol award. We were able to increase our IRB driver ranks by four and crewmen by a dozen which although may be viewed as small steps, we are confident that we can build our capacity to be self sufficient in this key service delivery area. Thanks go to Dave Stone, Cameron Miles and Paul Johnson who assisted in developing the IRB section. We have IRB courses scheduled for this winter to ensure continuous improvement to meeting our patrol service agreement commitment.

An important part of meeting our patrol commitments is the training of new and current members which is a core area of our operation. Education manager Pat Keating and his team of trainers and assessors delivered 68 new Bronze and 25 Surf Rescue awards as well as a number of higher awards. Pat and his teams role is very demanding and an extremely important component of the Club to maintain our professionalism on the beach. We will continue to focus our attention on training next season particularly in the area of higher awards such as ARTC, First Aid and Spinal

which we hope to deliver to our patrolling members.

We had another very busy season with our Nippers and Junior Activities program. Youth Manager Basil Scaffidi and his team of helpers were outstanding, delivering our surf awareness and surf skills program to over 700 nippers. Sunday mornings at Bronte appeared to be a case of organized chaos with so many nippers on the beach but somehow we safely managed the program by dividing the large number into smaller groups and running different start times. The nippers season in competition produced amazing results with Bronte securing 7th place at the State Championships at Kingscliff. Congratulations go to Basil and his hard working team of nipper mums and dads.

Lizanne Wilmot our Canadian import received the Patrol person of the Year award in recognition of her outstanding patrol commitment which included over 100 hours of patrols. Other major award winners were Jason King as the Frank Norton Club person of the Year, Patrol Captain of the year Paul Johnson and Patrol of the year Patrol 1. The President's award went to Jeff Lydon, Cartwright insurance award to Bluey Graham, Competitor of the year Chris Kilmurray, Team of the year the Open Men's Taplin Team, Coach of the year Col McDermid and Master Competitors of the year Tom Woodriff and Coleen O'Neil.

"Beyond the Flags" we had a very busy season, with a number of social events co-ordinate by Basil Scaffidi and Coleen O Neil and we thank them for their efforts

Our social team headed by Auntie Pat and Jim Stewart were kept busy with the club functions including Anzac Day and Veteran's Day. Our Sunday sips which is legendary on the coast has seen a huge increase in numbers especially from our Nipper mums, dads and kids. The popularity of our Sunday Joggers has also grown, and we thank the efforts of Judy & Martin Green and their team who organized this.

After 10 years our Chief Operating Officer Ross Miles retired and we wish Ross and his wife Roslyn well for the future, Ross

## Clovelly SLSC

The club is proud to say "No lives lost" this season. This year the club has undertaken one of the most ambitious building projects in the clubs history. The boatshed is a facility which will serve many generations of the Clovelly community – surfclub members, nippers and swimmers. To finance it by the existing club membership of a small club like ours would not have been possible. Both the State Government and the council have proved to be great supporters of surf lifesaving in general and Clovelly surf club in particular.

The State Govt of NSW has provided \$360k in grants for this project. A special thanks to Paul Pearce our local member who was pivotal in helping us get this money. Thanks Paul. I would also like to thank SLS NSW who assisted in the first tranche of this grant money. The Randwick City Council has also provided us with enormous assistance. This includes \$80k interest free loan, \$165k total grant. They have also recently rebuilt the club roof to remove asbestos and undertaken other structural work under the supervision of club member Craig Mullins. This takes the total spent on the club by the council to \$350k.

They also provide a substantial annual grant and undertook the landscaping works above and around the building out of their recurrent operating budget. They are great supporters of the surf clubs in the district and I would like to pay tribute to the mayor and councilors for that support.

The club is not able to raise loans in a normal commercial way due to its legal status and assets being difficult to monetize so we have had to borrow from members. 11 club members lent \$10k each without any security out of support for the club. As I rang many of them with a long sales spiel I was normally cut short as they wanted just to know how much and how to make the payment. Others who had not been approached and had heard about the need for funds approached me at the beach or in cafes with offers of money. This is a great to be a part of

the Clovelly Surfclub. The 11 members were Bob Callaghan, Ken Ryan, Garry Stubbs, Mark Percy, Tania Rouse, Dave Cunningham, John Stewart, Ian Eccles, Deb Taylor, Seb Pearce and myself. We have also been inundated with support by people buying a brick at \$100 each. I cannot name all these people due to time constraints but they are acknowledged on the plaque we are about to unveil. To lift a park, build a boatshed and put the park back was always an ambitious project. It would not have been possible without the help of so many people.

From our clubs point of few there are a few people I need to mention. These people all worked in a voluntary capacity and this project took up a huge amount of their time. Firstly I would like to thank Mark Percy. Mark has been chair of the building committee. In this role he has worked on the strategy of developing the club buildings, filled in all the funding applications and organized all the supporting documentation – a huge task in itself and then overseen the project liaising with all stakeholders. This has all been carried out with Marks trademark attention to detail and accuracy and this is a big part of the reason why the project has gone so well. I would also like to acknowledge the huge workload of Paul Smith. He has spent a lot of time on the ground here meeting suppliers, letting people in and checking issues. The other building committee members were Paul Zaja and Ken Ryan who also did a great job. Paul Zaja, who has ended up running a bank to keep up with all the

loans and donations as well as accurately maintaining the books has done a great job as club Treasurer.

I would also like to thank the Randwick City Council for the way they worked with us in planning approving and making this project happen. I would like to thank the many councilors over the last three years who have supported this plan and also the council staff. In particular Ray Brownlee the General Manager whose door has always been open, he doesn't like being given credit for things but when you deal with him things tend to happen very quickly and also Hayley Sedgeman who has been the project liaison and the many other council staff who have helped us. We have been constantly amazed and delighted by the speed with which things are done, the willingness to look for other ways to help us out and their patience as we kept going back with more requests

We also thank our professional advisers and contractors for a job well done. Our Builder J + CG Constructions did a great job – we would specifically like to thank project manager Theo Pengliss, the unflappable foreman Stefan Rakwski, Mark Guerreiro, and Clovelly Surfclubs own Aiden Fitzgerald. I would like to thank Simon Figures at Glass Outlook for donating the plaque recognizing all involved. Congratulations to Club Captain Seb Pearce on an excellent job as Captain this year. Seb has only joined the club in recent years and has been prepared to step up and assist the club in this role. Seb has shown great skill in balancing the many demands of all stakeholders.

As a small club we are struggling with the increasing demands from district and branch (particularly in the growth of meetings) and it is making it increasingly difficult for us to get members to take on roles. Season 2010/11 saw a record number of 396 registered Clovelly Nippers. More importantly 372 obtained a SLSA award for surf lifesaving skills which range from the Surf Play Award for under 6 Nippers through to the Surf Rescue Certificate for our under 14's. As an important part of the Australian surf lifesaving movement, Clovelly Nippers are proud of the 16 under 14 Nippers who obtained the Surf Rescue Certificate and now fulfil the important obligation of providing voluntary surf lifesaving patrols – congratulations. It is again my pleasure to announce, in our 105th season of patrolling, "No Lives Lost" on Coogee Beach during the 2010-11 surf season! And what a season we've had.



## Lifesaving

Our lifesaving operations were again overseen by our Club Captain Catie Anderson, and Club Vice Captain Mark Doepel. The number of our active patrolling members continues to grow with approximately 450 lifesavers on our patrol roster, with 374 gaining 100% patrol attendance this season!

Again this season our Club has not only patrolled the beach, but also the rock platforms and bays to the north and south, as well as mounting patrols at Wylies bathes. We have also provided Lifesavers to assist with patrol duties at Garie and Burning Palms.

At Branch level, the Club has also provided lifesavers to operational support units such as the Off-shore Rescue Boat, Helicopter Lifesaver One, and Surf Comm Sydney.

The most inspiring thing for me this season, as President, was watching "Team Coogee" effect the rescue and treatment of some 150 swimmers

suffering from hypothermia as they attempted to swim around Wedding Cake Island, at the Island Challenge, in some un-seasonally cold water. This rescue, which won the Branch Rescue of the month for November, reinforced to me the skills and dedication of the Australian Surf Lifesaver and the reason for which we are held in such high regard within our communities.

## Education

Our Education Team, lead by Chief Instructor Rob Gibellini has again had another huge season, putting through approximately 436 awards, including 120 new bronzies and 60 SRC's. The Club continued to run our "Lightening Bronze" course in the school holidays, as well as conducting two more "Migration to Surf" Courses for newly arrived migrants.

The Club conducted a joint Bronze course with South Maroubra, sharing resources and Instructors, to ease the burden on the two Club's Instructors. A number of our lifesavers also gained their Assessor

credentials so as to be able to assist the Branch Education Team with its huge workload.

## Events

Coogee again ran the "Express Glass Island Challenge" the first open water swim of the season, which has now become entrenched as one of the Club's major fundraisers. We followed this up with the "Coogee Bay Hotel Open Surf Carnival" which this year included the Branch Patrol Competition. Coogee looks forward to running this event again this coming season.

## Youth Development

Coogee has been working hard over the last two years in developing a program for the retention of our youth members, in particular the transition from Junior to Senior Club. The Club now has a plan in place that oversees the development of our six year old Minnows all the way through to eighteen year old lifesavers. The first stage, for the Senior Club, was to create an identity within the Club for our youth members. ## Competition

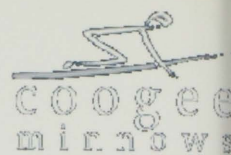

## Elouera SLSC

Elouera Surf Life Saving Club continued to provide Shire residents and visitors with a high level of aquatic safety and has done so in close association with the other three Bate Bay clubs – Wanda, North Cronulla and Cronulla – during Season 2010~2011.

Each of the clubs displayed willing cooperation in patrolling and education generally and in specific events such as the Branch Age and Open Surf Lifesaving Championships; the Bate Bay Interclub Carnival and in the various joint representations to Sutherland Shire Council. The clubs also participated in the second year of a combined life guard / surf club "working together" program. This program involves younger members from each of the clubs undertaking training and work activities with council life guards.

Surf clubs provide a wide variety of activities for members including, the most important or core purpose, the provision of voluntary surf patrols for the community. As proof of this, club members performed exceptionally in a number major rescues during the season, a true reflection of the training provided by our club instructors. According to statistics in Surfguard, patrolling members made 102 rescues, conducted over 1,245 preventative actions and provided first aid to 301 people. Although the number of rescues is down in comparison to 2009/10 it was accompanied by a corresponding increase in preventative actions.

Membership of the Club has steadily increased during 2010~2011 and currently comprises 678 JAC members and 455 members in the Senior section of the Club ~ a total membership of 1,133.

Our young nipper members are provided with a vast array of activities and skills training each Sunday morning and many of the older groups combine beach activities with additional education in surf knowledge and resuscitation techniques. For those who choose, additional surf and craft training is also provided on weekdays when large groups of kids can be seen battling surf conditions or on the beach under the watchful eye of our trainers and water safety personnel.

The new Elouera Surf Academy (ESA) program provides a structured training program for nippers and caters for all abilities. As testament to the success of the ESA program, at the New South Wales State Age Championships the club finished a credible 8th overall. This season's achievements are a credit to the nipper committee led by Steve Urquhart together with Darrin Lane and all the trainers, managers and water safety personnel.

After conducting a planning session in May last year we identified a number of areas where the club needed to improve. Our life saving side appears to be strong as does our training however our junior ranks have been diminishing. Consequently, a renewed effort is being placed on the development of our juniors (14 – 19 year olds) which will hopefully see improvements in member retention and competitive results in future years. The club, through Paul Kasparian and Scott Moore, provided our youth with a number of activities during the season through which our newest and youngest members could participate. We intend building on this vital area and will devote more resources to it over the next twelve months.

Our young adult section has maintained its numbers over the past season. We have provided leadership opportunities for these members to display their skills by promoting some members to the ranks of patrol captains and vice captains. Others have continued to compete quite successfully for the club and are held in high esteem by our younger members. The club has also sent members to leadership courses conducted by Surf Life Saving Sydney.

Our club is also fortunate in that we have a significant number of members in the 50+ age group who are quite active around the club. From patrols to competition and coaching these members provide an active service that other community based organisations are generally unable to provide.

In terms of additional community involvement the club has also been involved in:

- (i) The 29th Tradies Surf Awareness Clinic. This year the Clinic catered for in excess of 300 children aged from 7 to 12 years of age. The Clinic, conducted over 5 successive half-days between 10th. and 14th. January 2011, involved over 90 volunteer members who willingly gave up leisure and holiday times to ensure a professional Clinic which was safely conducted in challenging surf conditions. The involvement and support of the Sutherland District Trade Union Club ("Tradies"); the local lifeguards and thirteen generous companies and organisations which donated products ensured the success and continuation of this important community event. Planning for the 30th Clinic is already underway.
- (ii) The third Cook Classic event was held in November last year and involved all four Bate Bay clubs combining with many charities throughout the Shire to raise much needed funds and at the same time provide a community event and display for residents of the Shire;

The season has not been without challenges. The building and issues associated with it have continued to take up a significant amount of my time and that of others.

A number of major issues were resolved including:

- (i) Obtaining the Certificate of Occupancy;
- (ii) Completion of the Driveway on the northern side of the club; and
- (iii) Obtaining our Liquor Licence;
- (iv) The renovation of the board & ski shed should be completed by the time this report is read.

## Garie SLSC

Once again, Garie SLSC can say 'no lives lost on Garie Beach in patrol hours'. A proud record that has been maintained since the formation of the club in 1938. Of course this record has only come about because of the dedication and perseverance of a close-knit band of members ably supported these last couple of seasons by the assistance of other clubs from the Sydney Branch. Garie SLSC could not have fielded full coverage of the patrol season without the wonderful help from Coogee SLSC and Maroubra SLSC who have been strong supporters of our club during this long shortage of patrolling members. Elouera SLSC also assisted with a large group visiting for a weekend sojourn to participate in the innovative idea of visiting lifesavers. Our club is extremely grateful to these clubs for their wonderful patrol support.

The past season of 2010/2011 has seen some changes in the management format and new ideas for recruitment and retention have been addressed. Our chief instructor and trainers have worked hard to provide the necessary training and organizing that is entailed in getting new squads ready for their examinations and qualifications. Because of this latest drive to increase our patrol strength, Garie SLSC is able to say that a total of 75 lifesaving awards were gained in the season. Along with 121 Surf Ed awards for the nippers, our total came to 196 awards. This is a rewarding achievement for a small club that has been struggling with low membership for several years. The aim of the club is to retain this enthusiasm over the "off" season in order to be ready for the new season of 2011/2012.

On the lifesaving/rescue scene, it was a fairly quiet season. The season saw many wet weekends with the breaking of the major drought and so many natural disasters occurring locally and overseas. Beach visits by the bathing public were down, but there appeared to be an increase in National Park picnickers, bush-walkers and fishermen. Yet we still

managed to do 59 rescues, 126 First Aid treatments, 513 preventative actions and 5 searches for lost children.

Behind the scene, our committee have been making many plans for improving our clubhouse utilization. We were recently successful in obtaining a grant to purchase important equipment to greatly improve our training programs. With the latest teaching aids, we will be looking to expand our training system with in-house seminars. This assistance, from the NSW Emergency Management Grant, has been most gratefully received. There have been offers from qualified people who have shown willingness to assist in the teaching of new recruits and with their help also, we should soon be able to increase our patrol strengths.

Our competitive side though has fallen behind due to the low numbers of participants available on the majority of weekends. With the input from the visiting clubs however, the younger members are showing some keenness to pit their talents against the competitors from the other clubs. Our competition strengths lay with the junior activities section. They again showed they had the spirit and determination and competed valiantly

at the State Championships and local Sydney carnivals.

The 2010 'Garie Dash', was again held at Bundeena in November 2010 and again our thanks go to those who have been at the forefront of this boat carnival since the beginning. This event could not be the success it is without the support from the Sydney Branch officials who have always guided and steered our members with their carnival knowledge and expertise. The process of administering different operational areas of the club is a delicate balancing act to accommodate varying needs. With the need to satisfy members' expectations the BOM has been diligent ensuring the clubs stability, sustainability, growth and development. Her results in Surf Life Saving are already highly commendable for her early age and we can watch her grow as a competitor as she can watch the kids grow and inspire us as a club. Nippers have also implemented better communication lines with the parents. Through our weekly 'Nipper News' programme, SMS & email facilities we were able to pass important details to parents. Competition has not always been fully addressed with Maroubra of late, we however have the ability to become highly competitive with many of our children having untapped and presently un-nurtured ability. It is the intention of the committee to facilitate a more structured process for children who wish to train and compete at surf carnivals as individuals and team events. We will continue to develop, support and expand opportunities for those children in the coming season.





Life Saving training was taught more specifically this season to the under 11, 12 & 13 age groups, with excellent results achieved with more than 70 nippers receiving the Surf Smart 2, Surf Smart 1 and Basic Resuscitation skills awards. In all we had over 300 children obtain awards in Surf Safe 1 & 2 and Surf Aware 1 & 2. Our creed of teaching children Surf Life Saving skills will be refined and continually committed to achieve even more positive results.

It is the dedication, motivation and encouragement that Age Managers and Age Managers Assistants provide each and every Sunday morning that our club can reach such lofty achievements. Age Managers are the back bone of our organisation and at Maroubra we are fortunate enough to have some extremely capable members who fill this role with distinction. My hat goes off to you all with admiration and thanks for your support.

Nipper retention to our senior club was also very strong with many U14's becoming new cadet members and achieving the SRC (Surf Rescue Certificate) thus becoming eligible to help patrol our beach. Their assistance with Nippers' Water Safety was extremely helpful on Sunday mornings and adds to their own continued training and surf awareness.

I might also add here that over 46 Surf Life Saving awards were presented to Nipper parents. Bronze Medallion, Advance Resus, Age Managers Course, IRB crew / drivers and spinal care were among some awards obtained. The parents of Nippers also make up 6 Patrol Squads for patrol rosters at Maroubra Beach. It's this involvement from families that makes our nippers and surf club such a strong and fantastic club to be apart of. More parents should take an opportunity to become involved, it is rewarding and fun to be part of your children's learning process in such a great environment.

We look forward to expanding our ideas and progressing with new formats in the coming season to make Maroubra Nippers even stronger.

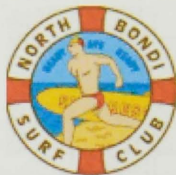

## North Bondi SLSC



This past season has seen a consolidation of the work done over previous years. In particular our building project is now at the point of fruition after 4 years of a lot of hard work and some frustration. To knock down and rebuild a Surf Clubhouse is a daunting task, and is considered our biggest challenge in the last 90 years of existence.

The benefits will be the most advanced lifesaving facility in Australia that will cater for not only our present requirements but the needs of a changing community for decades ahead. It will be an iconic building on the world's most famous beach.

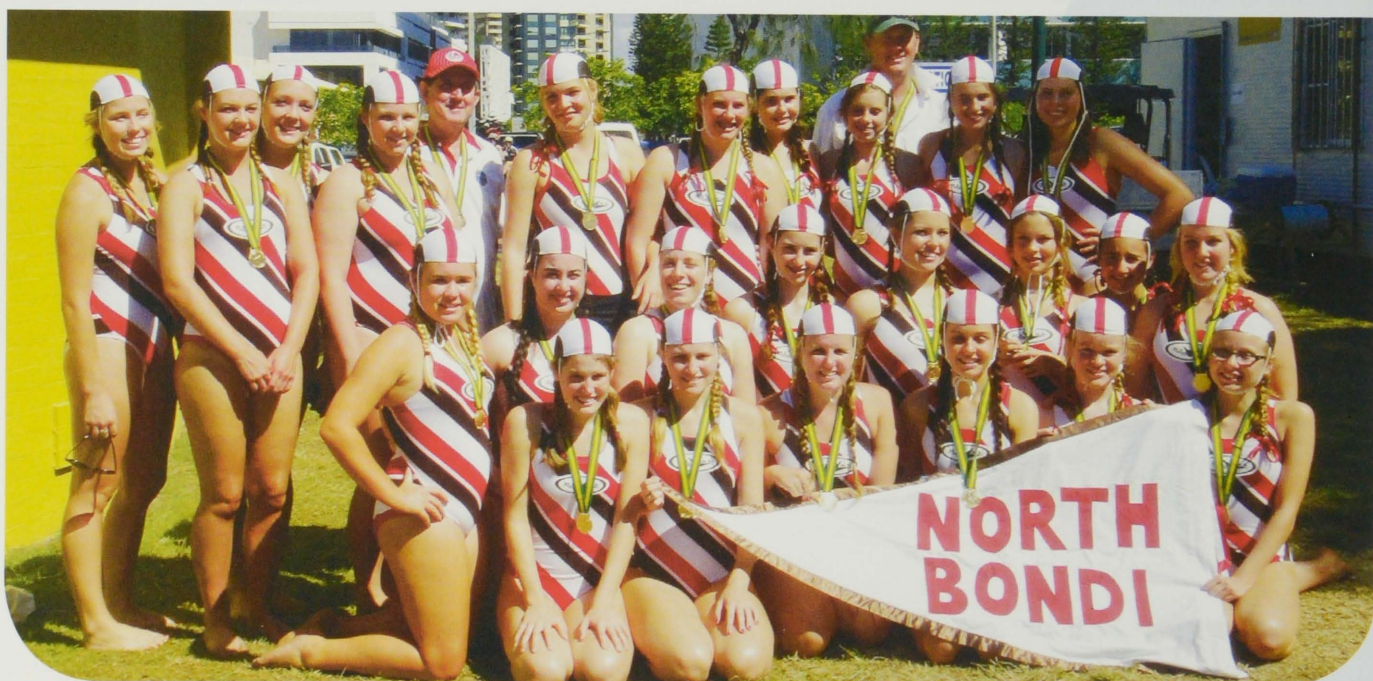
It will also be a fantastic asset to expand the Club's already impressive community charter and provide financial stability to ensure our future is strong.

Lifesaving is what the surf life saving movement was founded on 105 years ago. As one of the original Club's we continue to excel in our core activity. We have over 500 active members voluntarily giving up their time to safeguard the surfing public. Our patrol captains and their teams are thanked for a job well

done. Rescues are down which is a tribute to the preventative measures the patrols undertake. Serious cases of first aid especially with incidents on the rock face and Ben Buckler headland are handled professionally and 53 lost children reunited with their grateful parents. These actions often go unseen but are part of

what we do. North Bondi's lifesaver of the year was Gerry Stephenson. He clocked up an amazing 428 hours of patrols over a variety of services. This included IRB duties, Surfcom assistance, ORB3 rosters and the Branch support ski service. He is a very experienced patroller who will also receive his 25 year patrol service award this season, what an amazing achievement. The Club also patrolled at Hawkes Nest and hosted many country exchange patrollers in January.

The education team at North Bondi continues to provide massive support to our lifesaving operations. Unfortunately our Education Director stood down mid-season due to work pressures. This initially caused some grief but the team rallied around and got everything back on track to finish off a very busy season. With proficiency testing, upgrades of qualifications in addition to the training of new candidates to join the Club it is a mammoth undertaking. The number of bronze medallion and surf rescue candidates remains strong and this is the lifeblood of any surf club. Advanced award numbers were also high which up skills our members and provides greater benefit to the community. The challenge of paperwork overkill is something that





seriously needs to be addressed in this voluntary organisation. The amount of administration required is what drives people away at worst or at the very least doesn't encourage people to get involved.

Our junior activities member numbers continue to increase. This year the decision was made to split the Sunday morning activities into 2 sessions catering for non-water based age groups first and then the remaining children. This worked very well due to the dedication of the Age Mangers and helpers. It allowed greater participation in a wider range of events on the same beach foot print. A renewed focus on sports participation also saw greater numbers and success at carnivals. Jim Walker and his hard working team are thanked for their great contribution to our future lifesavers. A continued focus on the 13 and 14 year old members was undertaken this season. Scott Thomson organised surf sports training at other Clubs and a trip to Jamberoo that was well received by this age segment. It is crucial to the survival of Surf Clubs that we integrate our older Nippers into the Club. North Bondi will continue to focus on this objective.

Competition saw Club members compete at all Sydney Branch, State & Australian Titles. Unfortunately the ludicrous decision of State titles venue precluded many of our competitors especially our younger members from competing. This is a real shame as it is a key part of surf club competition. The logistical nightmare coupled with financial burden placed on the Club was unacceptable. Schooling and employment leave were also major factors in a dramatically reduced team. The Australian Titles saw some great results with our masters competitors success earlier in the week. All our open competitors put in great efforts in the Kurrawa surf with Tilly Strain gaining silver in the under 17 board riding. The march past area shone with the Club fielding 3 teams and winning the under 23 division and the under 17 division. Gold in 2 of the 3 divisions on offer is an outstanding result for the Club. Our under 17 team made it 5 gold in a row which I believe no other march past team has ever achieved. Our

future success in this area of competition looks assured.

North Bondi organises many community events that allow the public to engage in fitness activities in a safe and professionally run atmosphere. These include Rival Roughwater swim in January, Haviana's Australia Day Challenge, Cold Power North Bondi Classic swim in February, Bondi Barefoot soft sand run in May and City to Surf in August. These are all huge undertakings to organise and ensure the required personnel are on hand. The Australia Day event saw the world record broken and was a credit to all our volunteers who ensured the safety of the event participants and a massive crowd at the beach. Our event organisers, doctors and patrollers all give up their time freely to ensure success and much needed funds to support our lifesaving endeavours. The Club also hosted the Wheelie Warriors Day with disabled children at the beach, World Youth Education Trust event allowing young children from Tanzania to experience lifesaving and organised surf skills training for 100 Rose Bay Secondary College students.

On a sad note the Club farewelled Australia's longest serving lifesaver. John Stroud was a proud member of this Club for 82 years. As history has it John's younger brother Frank now takes the mantle as our most senior member with 78 years service to North Bondi. What a family!!

My thanks are conveyed to the Branch for their continued support and especially the office staff for assistance. I would also like to mention the Club's executive who has a huge task of running one of the largest Clubs in Australia. This coupled with the extra burden of the rebuilding project has seen the workload significantly increase. Finally I thank all our members for their contribution in ensuring North Bondi is the great Club it is.

## North Cronulla SLSC



This has been the most successful season this Club has seen for many years. In summary however, our most important achievement is very simply stated... No Lives Lost.



It's worth taking the time to consider the effort that goes in to making that statement. For starters, our members volunteered over 12,900 hours on patrol, they performed 273 rescues (including a very moving one on Australia Day) and 5384 preventative actions. In addition to this they performed 243 first aid treatments, 4 of which were of a serious nature. It is a fair indication of the treacherous nature of our beach when you consider that our preventative actions more than doubled on last year, but our rescues still increased by almost the same proportion. Nothing is more indicative of the hazards our members face each time they step onto the beach than these comparisons.

These sorts of numbers are not self generating. The work by Darren Thorne in his role as Lifesaving Director has been key in this achievement. Darren has just completed his third year in the role and at the same time managed to achieve his 16th year of 100% patrol attendance, an absolutely fantastic effort and a fair indication of the gap that will be left by his

standing down from the role. Darren's work in what is one of the most difficult roles in the Club has been a major factor in the results shown by the numbers, and in the continuing high standard of our patrols.

Our 7th place in the State Championship, our top ten placing at the Australian Championship and our Junior Sections 2nd place at the State Age Championship are all common knowledge, but what is perhaps not so well known is the many examples of great sportsmanship shown by our members. Our Junior section gave another two awards to members for examples of great sportsmanship, which come on top of the awards handed out by the Senior section last season. Once again, these awards were granted following on from letters of congratulation from other Clubs.

Sitting in behind the numbers and results are a vast array of jobs, functions, tasks performed by other volunteers in the Club. The Board members devote huge amounts of time to the Club, and the various committees Finance, Lifesaving,

Competition, Education, Ladies, Social etc. are critical to the smooth implementation of Board decisions and to the development of strategy for the future. These structures and people all go towards either making the task of our front line troops easier or enriching the Club life that keeps people coming back.

The life of a clubbie is continually being made more difficult and the people who put their hand up and volunteer on committees, boards or in coaching roles all deserve our thanks.

Pretty inspiring stuff all that.

In this report it would be remiss not to extend votes of thanks to our administrators. Sydney branch has 15 clubs and thousands of nippers. Setting up the communication lines and organising our branch activities doesn't happen by fluke: it is a monumental task. Without the contribution of people such as Doug Hawkins, our Branch President, our own Jackie Parker, secretary/treasurer and the staff at branch office, our branch could not continue to function as well as it does. ## Finance Report 2011

The 2010/2011 season was a much healthier season in relation to the finances for Surf Life Saving Sydney with the signing of a new corporate sponsor, Streets Ice Cream, for a three year period commencing in October 2010 and concluding in 2013 to the value of \$450K. The injection of funds has enabled us to focus on a number of key infrastructure requirements in the office.

The upgrade of key operational systems such as the new phone system and the new office photocopier have been key enablers for the office staff to take them from some older and less reliable equipment to more robust and functional systems. This has all been achieved with less ongoing operational costs.

The upgrade of the office server equipment ensured key daily activities were able to be achieved. The staff now have the ability to work uninterrupted, without having to worry about the infrastructure failing, as had been the case in the past. This was achieved with the assistance and patience of the staff in the office and saw the introduction of a hosted backup system and key Microsoft operating system. These upgrades have been implemented at a lower expense than usual with the utilisation of the Microsoft partnering arrangement with volunteer organisations. The cost reductions for these purchases have resulted in savings of 20% of the actual ongoing costs of licensing.

The two properties owned by Surf Life Saving Sydney continued to operate as expected, however one of the properties was vacant during February - July 2011 (2/53 Burrows Road). This placed some pressure on the financials at the latter end of the financial year. We have since signed up a new tenant for a three year period.

The state of the financials have been left in a healthy position with a profit of \$57,158 and enabled Surf Life Saving Sydney to reduce its liabilities by paying out one of the loans at the value of \$200,000. SLSS has also been able to distribute payments of \$3,000 to each of the Surf clubs as part of the DHL funding totaling \$45,000.

I would like to thank the Board of Directors for their support and also the Finance Committee (Peter Pearce, Trevor Elliot, Karl Solomonson and John De Cean) for their support and direction throughout the season. Thank you also to the office team, Linda and Yvette, for their ongoing support. Yvette's assistance with the financial aspect was immeasurable and greatly appreciated.







**NOTE 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies**

Surf Life Saving Sydney Incorporated is not a reporting entity because in the executive committees' opinion, there is unlikely to exist users who are unable to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs and these financial reports are therefore a "Special Purpose Financial Report" that has been prepared solely to meet the financial reporting requirements under the Association's constitution, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the Associations Incorporations Act NSW.

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, and the following applicable accounting standards.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of this report, as described below, are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Association's constitution.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

**(a) Income Tax**

No income tax is payable by Surf Life Saving Sydney Inc. as Section 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 exempts Charitable Institutions from Income Tax.

**(b) Revenue**

- Sale of goods: Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised when control of the goods has passed to the buyer, the amount of revenue can be measured reliably and it is probable that it will be received by the Association
- Rendering of services: When the outcome of the transaction involving the rendering of services can be estimated reliably, revenue associated with the transaction is recognised by reference to the percentage of the services performed
- Interest revenue: Interest revenue is recognised as revenue when received
- Members subscriptions: Member subscriptions are recognised as revenue when received

**(c) Goods and services tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, unless the GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority. In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

(d) **Plant and Equipment**

Property, plant and equipment are stated at historical cost less depreciation. Individual items costing less than \$300 are expensed immediately through the income statement rather than capitalised to the balance sheet. The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are charged over their life from the time the assets are purchased.

**Property**

Freehold land & property is measured at fair value by an independent valuer in regular intervals.

The property is taken to be held for investment purposes and therefore the committee has adopted not to apply depreciation. Any adjustments in the value of the property will be made to the asset revaluation reserve. The current value of the property is \$2,092,631 with the last valuation being conducted on 18 July 2006.

Loans from the Building Society are secured by a registered first mortgage over the property.

Assets excluding leasehold buildings are depreciated over their lives utilising the following rates:




