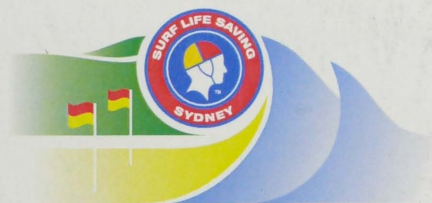

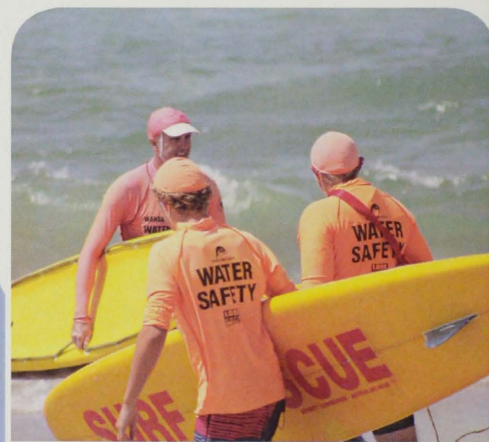

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President's Report

It is my pleasure to present to you the Annual report of Surf Life Saving Sydney and in doing so I urge you all to take the time to read the report, which reflects another successful season in all areas. I must take this opportunity to extend my thanks to all patrolling members this season, whether at club level or as part of our Support Operations Group for your fantastic coverage during the season. It is with pride that I can say "NO LIVES LOST" during patrolling hours.

This season many of our Clubs & Services were still on patrol after the nominated hours and on behalf of all levels of the Association THANK YOU for ensuring that we put the public first and providing 'VIGILANCE & SERVICE to the people of the community that use our many wonderful beaches each weekend.

This season we welcomed Glen Clarke to the role of Director of Lifesaving after not being able to fill the position for most of previous season. The 2011-2012 season has been a learning time for Glen but I am sure that he will be working hard to ensure that we are again providing the best Life Saving services within the State.

The Gear Inspection Panel should be congratulated for giving up a weekend to travel to the 15 clubs in the Branch on one weekend inspecting all our Lifesaving equipment to ensure that it is safe and ready for the start of the patrolling season. I must congratulate the clubs on the standard of the gear that is put up each season and we have improved from many years ago.

The Lifesaving Premiership was again hosted by Coogee SLSC, who made all their facilities available for the competition. This event is growing in numbers in particular the Champion Lifesaver Competition. I would put the challenge out to all clubs to enter a team into the Patrol Competition next season as after all this is our core business that we do and it would be great to have 15 teams in the event. I would like to congratulate Michael Bretherton who has been in charge of this event for many years and has worked hard to rebuild this event for the Branch.

Again our Support Operation Group under the control of George Shales should be congratulated for the fantastic services they provide to the community and our members. A big thank you to the crews of Surf Rescue 30, RWC, SurfCom operators, Duty Officers and our Peer Support team that have been called on several occasions to offer assistance to our members involved in major or minor rescue.

This season also saw a change in the position of Education Manager when Marissa Jank resigned from the position to move for work to Maitland. I know you will all join me in thanking Marissa for the fantastic job she has done over the years in this role. We welcomed Leona Stojak to the role part way through the season and Leona has been working very hard in this position to ensure that our standard of education remains as the number one in the State. We all need to work together to improve our numbers in the awards department next season.

Surf Sports has again been kept very busy under the control of Michael Vitnell as the Director of Surf Sports and his BOSS committee. This season we saw the return of the Cronulla Open Carnival which was a great success, with a new concept of a teams carnival and the feed back was positive. We also again held the North Cronulla, Intercities at Wanda, Coogee Open carnival and the Elouera Boat Series which were all well attended.

The Age, Masters and Open Championships were held at Wanda this season and it was a fantastic weekend. Congratulations to all clubs that hosted

carnivals this season in the Branch, I know that the competitors do appreciate all the work that goes into running carnivals.

This season we also saw the introduction of the Elouera Ohana Carnival which was also a great success and now gives our juniors 3 carnivals to attend with the very successful IMB Carnival at Cronulla and the South Maroubra Carnival.

It is also pleasing to see many opportunities for parents and interested people becoming Carnival Officials. The introduction of the Junior Officials courses as well as 2 successful Level 1 courses held during the season.

I must congratulate our Inter Branch Team who travelled to Redhead beach in December to compete against the other Branch teams. Being the winners for the past 2 seasons we finished in 2nd place this season by 7 points behind Sydney Northern Beaches Team. I must congratulate the Team Captains' Dane Farrell and Tara Coleman and all the Team members on a great performance during the weekend and it good to see all members of the team supporting each other during the weekend. A big thank you to all the parents that assist and supported the Sydney Branch Team.

The Junior Activities section continues to grow in numbers with most clubs having an increase in membership. 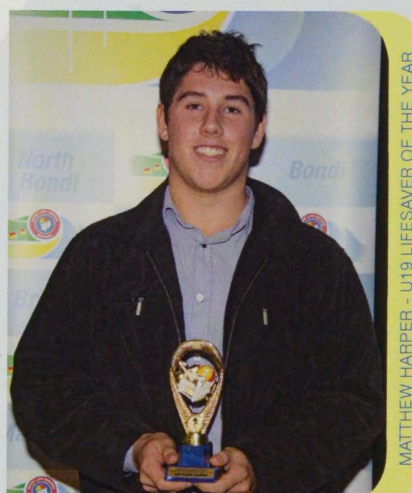

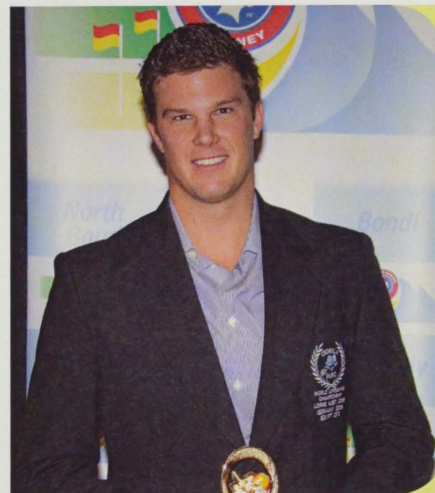

Director of Lifesaving Report

This season has been a challenge and satisfying in the least. Firstly thank you to all Clubs and their members for the work on the beaches; I'm pleased to announce that no lives were lost during patrol hours on the beach. Secondly thank you to the Board of Management as well as Branch office staff Linda and Victoria whom without their assistance and guidance would have made the role so much more difficult to understand and perform.

As I walked the beaches to see how patrols performed I was pleased to see strong numbers of committed lifesavers in the red and yellow uniforms.

North Bondi to Burning Palms managed to commit to all expectations of lifesaving requirements although some areas were a concern to operations. IRB's need to be on the beach at all times while patrols are operating and this is an area of concern for the Board of Lifesaving and Clubs. Thanks to all Clubs who worked in the spirit of cooperation and teamwork to assist some Clubs lacking patrolling members on the beach. To Clubs that assisted in 'out of hours' operations and 'extended patrol hours' to look after the public, job well done. There were many incidents on the beaches after patrols had finished as the public took advantage of good weather and daylight savings.

The pre-season activities of SLSNSW Conference for Branch Directors, Education Managers and Member Services, Club Captains & Education Conference as well as Gear Inspection warmed the season up for all lifesavers. The Club Captains & Education Conference was successful with presentations delivered by the Director of Lifesaving NSW, NSW Education Managers as well as Marissa Jank and myself.

The Gear Inspection Panel convened prior to season commencement to ensure all equipment had been inspected and operational for rescue whilst safe for lifesaver to use. assessments whilst assessors delivered first class professional assessments of candidates presented for awards. Assessor numbers need to increase to share the load amongst each Area assessors and to be developed for the future. The Support Operations group excelled in their area assisting with patrol hours, out of hours operations, call outs and patrol member assistance. My thanks and appreciation for your time and efforts.

The "Life Saving Competition" held at Coogee this year saw increased participation of lifesaving members displaying their skills. Competition was tough and conditions perfect for this event. Branch Competition officials and members of the Board of Lifesaving participated in the assessments of participants for this event. My thanks to Michael Bretherton for organising an information seminar on the competition for all clubs as well as taking responsibility for the successful operation on the event.

At the end of a long, eventful season, certain things stick in your mind. For me it was the calm, reassuring voice of a patroller at Garie who, at the end of a tiring day and in appalling weather conditions, was having to cope with a suspected serious spinal injury patient on the beach who was in a high state of distress.

As he went through the correct procedures of calling for an ambulance and explaining that even though heavy rain was falling he was reluctant to move the patient due to the nature of the injury, his voice and those of the SurfCom operator and the Duty Officers remained cool and professional as they waited for the paramedics to arrive at that remote location.

It was yet another graphic demonstration of how all the training and practical experience our surf lifesavers strive for each year comes into play in critical incidents such as this.

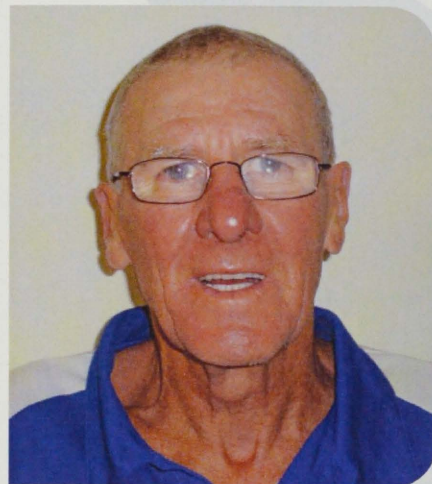
Another encouraging aspect for me was the helpful manner most Sydney Branch clubs demonstrated as we sorted out the ongoing problems with patrol tents along our beaches. We still have to persevere with the Streets tent for another season and it was evident patrol captains were making the correct decisions in dismantling the tents in strong wind conditions.

I've spoken to most of the Area supervisors throughout the season and they all report that most clubs are working hard to fulfill their patrol agreements.

But once again there are still some major problems in getting more IRB drivers trained up and many clubs are not enforcing the use of Channel 2 for local communications rule strictly enough. Also in my random inspections I've noticed that many patrol members (including Patrol Captains) are still not wearing correct uniform on the beach including the obligatory cap.

We will be asking clubs to address these issues as a priority for next season.

Although the season ended on a tragic note at Kurrawa with the death of teenage board competitor Matthew Barclay, it's heartening to know that our Branch President John DeCean acted quickly in forming a special safety committee within SLSS to address procedures within our own competition calendar.



Also I'd like to congratulate our Communications Officer Robin Bowley for the tremendous results he has achieved in recruiting more SurfCom operators and arranging a special award for them.

Finally I'd like to thank my fellow Board of Lifesaving members, Director of Lifesaving Glen Clarke for his forthright leadership, George Shales for his unstinting dedication to the cause, hard-working Peter Quartly for his untiring admin work, Linda Perrin and the ever-helpful team at Branch office, and all the Chief Training officers, Assessors, Supervisors, Duty Officers, Club Captains, IRB and education officers and special congratulations and thanks to all the active surf lifesavers who keep our beaches safe. And don't forget, Gear Inspection time is not far away!

George Shales continues to be a man with many hats and with his dry sense of humour keeps meetings lively, however, it belies the fact that he puts in extremely long hours and produces excellent results.

Michael Bretherton ran a very successful "Lifesaving Competition", with the competition building from past years. He introduced training for same that was open to all Clubs'. It was disappointing that

Bretho has announced his retirement from officialdom, which includes the position of SLSNSW Director of Education that he did so well in. Hopefully like so many before him he will get bored and we will see him again active in the future.

Wal Dobrow has put up plans for the addition of extra handles on IRB's which will allow more to carry them at a lesser weight per Lifesaver, which will get over some OHS issues. Wal has also introduced some innovative training guidelines, which allow for a better utilisation of resources and the man hours of trainees.

Mike Batty came back and shared with Michael Hodsdon the position of Club's Patrol Advisor and in the light of this role has written a paper on retention and candidates who only want the award. This will be reviewed over the winter as it has been an issue for some time.

Peter Agnew, with Leona and others is looking into the feasibility of introducing at Branch level of a Community Education scheme. This if successful will increase our exposure to the wider community and add to our overall capabilities.

Assessors were provided with new shirts and name badges were provided for those who needed them.

SLSNSW was looking for feedback with respect to reintroducing the crewman component to the BM course. We have indicated that we do not support on a number of levels, including the scope of the existing award, the time such component will add to training and the negative impact on potential members who have no interest in the craft. We have conversely asked SLSNSW to look at making the Spinal Management Award a Club Award and we have been given the go ahead to trial.

Paperwork is one uniform complaint across the full spectrum of Lifesaving activities. Our minutes this year have been streamlined and our now running to a page or two and not the dozen plus of previous years. One area where paper work is still necessary and vitally important; is the reporting of accidents that occur during any SLS activity. We continue to let ourselves down on occasions and this can have dire consequences.

The Quad bikes are no longer a part of authorised equipment and you will note that all Club's with vehicles have moved on to the bigger more stable sit-in ATV's.

The Office continues to provide a fantastic level of very professional service. We tend to take Linda and Victoria for granted, which we should not. From all of us a big thank you, as we would be hard pressed without your expertise and enthusiasm, which on occasion must be hard to maintain.

We continue to offer and provide positive and effective assistance with respect to all facets of Lifesaving and Education within Sydney Branch.

This has been a great season and I thank Glen and his extended team for providing such a worthwhile service to our fellow Clubbies...

Our ongoing success in furthering the professional development of our Members is from the dissemination of knowledge and skill from Peter Agnew, Advanced Awards Coordinator and his team of Facilitators who have dedicated their time and knowledge to ensure that all Members can continue to grow within surf lifesaving and apply their improved skills on the beach and in their everyday life. Support Operations Manager

The 2011/2012 season saw a number of changes occur across various areas within the support operations group. The main focus of the group overall was to maintain existing services and increase the level of availability and awareness with both internal stakeholders and external agencies. This was partly achieved by the creation of a support operations web page hosted on the Surf Life Saving Sydney website ensuring all services are represented in one area with clear lines of communications established to ensure the overall awareness of the group is heightened and ease of access for members and interested parties.

The Randwick Offshore Rescue boat took delivery of their new craft at the commencement of the patrolling season. This required the group to undergo a comprehensive retraining effort as the new craft was significantly different to the previous one. The new craft now brings the level of service and equipment provided by the group into the equivalent status of professional organisations.

The RWC group took delivery of two new jet skis at a value of \$35,000 which increased the availability of the crafts within the Randwick and Sutherland areas. The previous skis were plagued with mechanical problems which made it difficult to maintain the interest from the current operators and seek additional operators.

Since the new skis arrived at the commencement of the season the number of patrolling hours has increased by 100%. This has eased the search for new operators which have seen an increase of over 100%. This trend is expected to continue as numbers continue to grow over the off season.

SurfCom has continued to be an area of concern with the manning of the most crucial aspect of the group continually being understaffed. However, this season saw a concentrated effort with a new

recruitment strategy undertaken that has resulted in a number of enthusiastic operators joining the team. Thus taking the burden off some of the more experienced members of the team.

I must say if it were not for Joe White we would have no team. Joe has been integral to the success of the SurfCom Sydney environment and I would like to offer my sincere thanks to Joe for his continued support and also congratulate him on being named SLSS Branch Member of the Year.

To the Duty Officers who provide countless hours of assistance during and out-of-hours, I would like to once again thank you for efforts in assisting with major events, whether it is providing support to the Patrol Captains or providing counseling services behind the scenes. The tireless effort put in at often early hours of the morning, or late at night while most people are sound asleep, often goes unrewarded and unnoticed and I sincerely offer my humble appreciation to the level of commitment and service you provide.

In closing, I would like to thank all of the members of the team who actually make this group one of the most valuable and respected services within Surf Life Saving Sydney. I would also like to thank the SLSS Board of Management for their continued support throughout this season. I also wish all members of the team a successful 2012/2013 season.

2011/12 saw the Randwick District Offshore Rescue Boat (ORB3) operate as the sole ORB for the Branch. ORB3 performed with outstanding success throughout the season and this is a reflection of the dedication and hard work of its members. Unfortunately due to ongoing issues, Offshore 2 was again unable to take to the water and provide its services to the Cronulla-Sutherland region.

New Rescue Vessel for ORB3

Prior to the commencement of the season, the ORB3 Group took ownership of a new rescue vessel. This vessel was months in the planning and involved extensive consultation with the manufacturer, Kevla Cat; as to how best customise the vessel for surf rescue purposes. Upon delivery, the Group embarked on an intensive training program to ensure the service was immediately ready should it be called upon. The training proved to be invaluable when ORB3 was first on-scene to a

recreational vessel washed onto rocks at Little Bay with persons unaccounted for. Fortunately, for the persons in distress, ORB3 was actively training in the area and was able to account for all onboard, which included 2 adults and 1 child.

Rescue and After-Hour Taskings

ORB3 was very active on the preventative action and rescue front during the season. The Group was called upon, often in testing conditions, to assist clubs during patrol hours and also by emergency services via the 13SURF call-out system.

With commendations from emergency services on the professionalism shown by crews it is a testament to the in-depth training and on-going development ORB3 undertakes.

Some major incidents attended by ORB3 throughout the season were:

- Rescue of persons when their boat ran aground off Little Bay during an adverse change in weather conditions;
- After hours search for a fisherman washed off rocks at Dover Heights;
- Search for a snorkeller separated from

their group off South Maroubra during fading light and into the night;

- Numerous searches for rock fishermen swept off coastline between South Head and Botany Bay;
- Major first aid treatment to a person fallen from a cliff suffering head injuries and lowered level of consciousness near Congwong Beach, Botany Bay.

This will enable quicker response times by allowing the four-wheel drive and trailer to be maintained in the towing position when stored. Other enhancements will provide better crew accommodation, gear storage and training facilities.

Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB)

I choose to start my Report with particular thanks to Bendigo Bank for the donation of two IRBs and motors this year (Bronte and Tamarama) and for their ongoing relationship with local Surf Life Saving Clubs. Without sponsors our life saving commitment would be much harder to achieve.

The 2011 season started with the late introduction of the IRB Awareness Unit to make all Bronze members familiar with four components dealing with IRBs and already contained within the 'Bronze Manual'. These components were lifting and transporting the IRB, safety around the IRB environment, launching and retrieving the IRB and transfer of patients from the IRB to the patrol on the beach). In addition to the above, an IRB

Workshop was also rolled out to existing qualified IRB personnel with a focus on safe driving and minimising injuries, key recommendations from the National IRB Agenda including the change to equipment (removal of the illegal ProPel guard and the right foot strap, introduction of four blade propellers, amongst other things), introduction of the new crew lock-in position when negotiating the break (vide the IRB Review), and consistency in training and assessing by following the IRB Delivery and Assessment Guide. It is very likely that the IRB Awareness Unit and IRB Workshop will be used again for next season.

I had arranged a number of meetings amongst IRB personnel to discuss the changes from the National IRB Agenda, centralised IRB Training (CT) and Assessing, culture of safety, minimising injuries, introduction of the new Work Health and Safety legislation, NSW Maritime regulations regarding speed and safe distances (now RMS), introduction of suitable Risk Assessment processes, amongst other topics. I believe that our safety record has improved significantly with more careful driving and improved coordinated training activities. Some of these activities were the Scariest at Garie weekend training session organised by Coogee and included a number of IRB skills improvement sessions and an introduction to tow snorkeling. Our focus is saving lives and in February 2012 a single IRB team rescued 45 people in around 2 hours in one of the busiest days recorded by SLS NSW.

Although this shows a reduction of around 10% in IRB Awards in comparison to last season, it does compare favorably with the

22% drop in the overall Total number of all Awards in Sydney Branch from the previous season 2,379 (2012) 3,054 (2011). The time required to properly train an IRB Driver is significantly greater than the time required for a Bronze Medallion candidate.

Special recognition is due to our Water Safety IRB Operators who attended both the Australian Titles and the NSW State Titles and spent long hours each day, all to ensure that other lifesaving members can compete. These IRB Operators included (Coogee) Paul Lardi, Siegmar 'Sigi' Dobry, Amy Teale, Rob Illidge, Stu Fillman, and no doubt other members of our IRB community including Peter Burst, Daniel Wood and their team. Water Safety and the cooperation between neighbouring Clubs for community swim events are also important in assisting major fund raising activities for our Clubs. I note the significant improvement in IRB operations at Bronte and the efforts of Tamarama and Clovelly in increasing the number of their qualified personnel.

IRB Competition results were different this year, with South Maroubra coming First in the State and Second overall in Australia (after trying hard for about 25 years). Coming close on their heels are North Cronulla lead by Joel Eaton and Kane Hughes, and the Coogee IRB Team who were recognised at the State Titles for their effort in their first year of competition, lead by Paul Lardi. Sydney Branch IRB Clubs are again back at the highest level of IRB competition.

The number of patrol inspections this season was increased from one to two per month for most months. For far too long my involvement in grassroots lifesaving has been limited to my own limited patrolling and the Annual Gear Inspection.

On taking up this role, after such a long break, was an eye opener and an uplifting experience. Getting back and speaking to Patrol Captains and their teams; it is quite clear that much of the information I see and take for granted does not necessarily filter through to the average member on the beach.

As with all seasons, we started with the Gear Inspection and it has been evident for some time, the quality of gear has been improving and this is reflected in the minor nature of the minimal reinspections required.

One area of concern is still the sharing of IRB services between Bronte and Tamarama, where on at least one occasion there was no IRB on the beach and the other Club was not made aware of the situation. The Patrol Inspection's, under Glen Clarke was enlarged to two formal inspections per month, through to the end of January, which resulted in 44 inspections. What they did show was that we continue to have a core of "Lifesavers" who take their volunteering seriously and have a professional approach to same.

I believe I have a good relationship with Club's and their Captains and thank them for making my job that much easier.

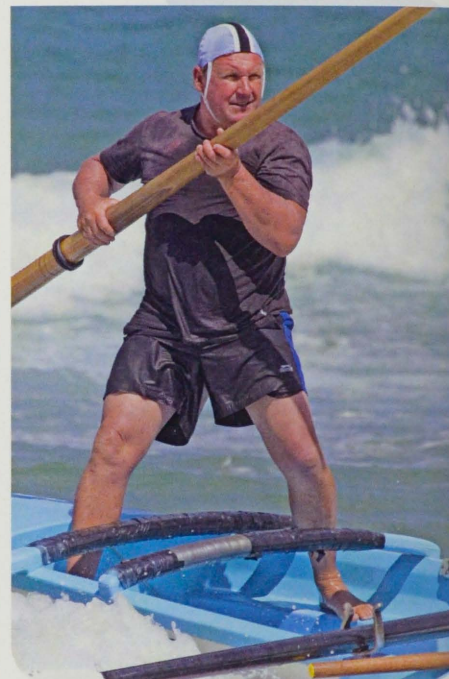

- To increase the number of Nippers participating in competition carnivals.



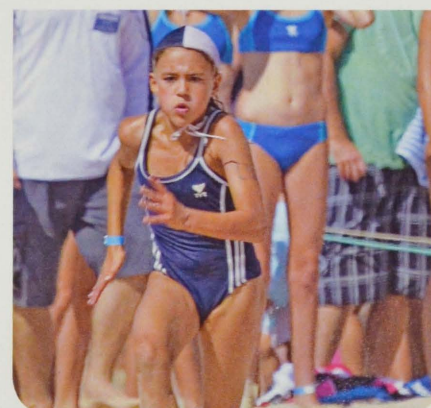
The Nipper achievements for the season are summed up as follows:

Bronte SLSC



As the sun sets on another summer on our famous beach, we are proud to report that for the 2011 – 2012 Season, no lives were lost while patrols were on duty at Bronte Beach.

My first year as President has been a rewarding process. We have a truly fantastic surf club made up of hard working volunteers and we should be very proud of the service that we undertake in patrolling one of the most difficult beaches in New South Wales.

Our ultimate aim and core business is "between the flags" and we have continued to ensure the public are safe at our beach.

This year saw a total of 331 rescues, 129 first aids and 3000 preventative actions. These numbers were significantly up from last year. Thank you to Nigel Harvey and his team for a great job done on the beach. This year 46 patrol members received a 100% patrol rewards which is a tremendous achievement. We increased our IRB driver team by 6 and crewman by 7. Andrew Ferguson and his team have done a great job in building this important area of the club.

We have had a successful year in our education and have 85 new bronze medallion holders, together with 33 SRC awards (our under 14 nippers) and 38 other awards. Sam Wilson has done a great job in his role as Director of Education and we are in the best position that we have been in a long time with the quality of trainers and assessors that we have to educate new and current members.

I wish to thank our entire Board of Management. Roley Tyrell our Finance Manager who somehow manages to find time to oversee the finances while producing the best sausage sandwiches on any beach in Australia. Bronte Nippers

It was a season of two halves this year at Bronte SLSC for our nippers programme. However, the surf conditions at the beginning of 2012 were challenging and meant we spent a few Sundays out of the water.



We had over 700 registrations at Bronte nippers this season with over half of these in the Under 6s, Under 7s and Under 8s. Our largest SRC group for some year, 31 girls and boys, passed their SRC and we congratulate and look forward to seeing them patrol our beaches next year. We continue to encourage any cadets who want to assist with nippers to come down early on a Sunday morning next season. The nippers were ably led by our club captains Frances Ryan and Morgan Penry and I thank them and all the under 14s for their leadership shown throughout the season.

Whilst Bronte Beach continued to offer up varying, and at times difficult conditions, we had another fun year on the beach. The continued improvement in the skills of our nippers in the water continues to amaze me. It has taken many years and countless hours in the pool but the Bronte surf swimmers are amazing. This was evident in the Bronte Junior Ocean Swim held on 4 December 2011 which continues to grow in popularity. In tough conditions, our younger Nippers amazed us with their courage and skill.



We sent representatives from our under 11s and under 13s nippers to the Development camps run by the Sydney branch. As usual they came back with glowing reports of the experience and they all participated with great enthusiasm for all types of activities including a helicopter ride!

We staged two twilight nippers and these nights continue to be successful although it becomes more and more difficult to find time in the calendar!

We have continued to encourage and develop our surf board riding crew early on a Sunday morning and this continued to grow in popularity, particularly with the girls. We hope to continue to grow this initiative in 2012/2013.

The competitive side of the Bronte nippers programme continued to flourish. A core group of Bronte nippers spent their summer travelling up and down the coast finding carnivals to compete in. The rest of the team were satisfied with a trip to North Bondi for the annual Waverley Shield. We managed to retain the Waverley Shield after a close encounter with North Bondi. At the Branch Championships, Bronte excelled with the under 11 group in particular absolutely dominating the water events.

We took 104 nippers to state and managed 6th overall in the point score. The best result ever by Bronte at the State Championships. Highlights included 65 of the 104 making a final and the five surf teams winning medals showing unbelievable ocean swimming talent at Bronte, the tough conditions suited the Bronte swimmers and it showed in our results. It was the first time for many years that Bronte had been successful and placed in a board rescue event. The fourth placing by both the All Age Beach relay and the All Age Board Relay at the State championships was a great result for both teams. The All Age Board Relay final was held in challenging conditions and it was a gutsy performance in particular by all the under 9 and 10 paddlers in the event. The staging of the state championships at Kingscliff has placed a financial and logistical burden on many so we are pleased the event will move closer to home next year.

As the number of nippers at Bronte continue to grow so does the demand on our resources both financial, equipment and the number of people required to help run nippers. This is a problem for all clubs as surf life saving continues to grow in popularity. This year we tried to stage some fund raising events, including a raffle and the swimathon. The support has not been overwhelming and at some stage the club will need to consider raising the nipper registration fees in order to ensure we have sufficient resources moving forward.

In addition the increase in numbers means we need more and more parents to help. There are plenty of ways to get involved. We are lucky that we have so many parents who help with nippers but we are always happy to see a new face. I strongly recommend you think about how you can help next season and you may be surprised at how rewarding it is!

There are too many people to thank individually for the great year we have had. So I say thanks to all of you, enjoy the off season and good luck in 2012/2013!

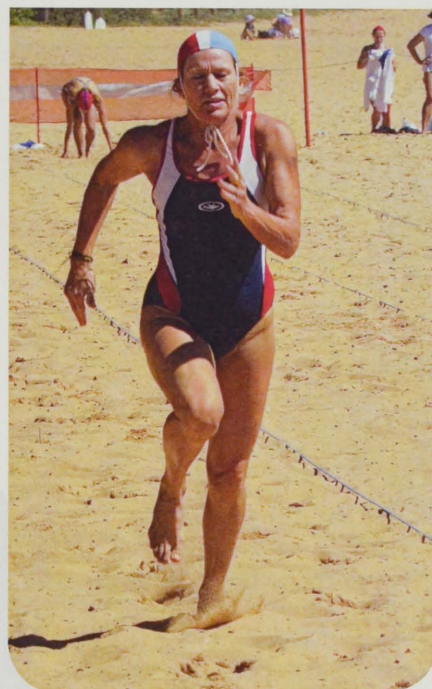

SLSA awards recognises learning of a variety of surf lifesaving skills for Nippers of all ages. These awards range from the Surf Play Award for under 6 Nippers through to the Surf Rescue Certificate for our under 14's. I congratulate all Nippers who achieved an SLSA award this season.

Clovelly Nippers are particularly proud of those under 14 Nippers who obtained the Surf Rescue Certificate (CPR endorsed). This group are now in the process of integrating into the senior Surf Lifesaving movement having received the red and yellow quartered cap and commenced providing voluntary surf lifesaving patrols - congratulations. Special recognition though goes to those who joined Clovelly Nippers as under 6. The other constant in that group was their age manager Gerry McGillion to which the Nippers owe a great debt. As well mentoring these young ladies and men for 9 years Gerry invariably is one of the first there on a Sunday morning to set up. Thanks also to John Anderson (assistant age manager) and Craig and Jess Wheatley for providing the SRC specific training sessions.

Nippers that aims to develop lifesaving skills also through Surf Sports ie that great Australian institution of the surf carnival.

This season saw Nippers competing in the regular Sunday morning handicap, point score and championship events, twilight nippers, board and beach training sessions and District, Branch and State Carnivals. Highlights for the season were:

- The annual Australia Day Challenge held against Tamarama at Clovelly which saw us wrest the shield back from Tamarama
- The Randwick Shield at Coogee. This competition between the 4 Randwick Council surf clubs (Clovelly, Coogee, Maroubra and South Maroubra) is a fun and enjoyable introduction to inter club competition; and
- small groups heading to face the challenging conditions of the Branch and State Championships
- The inaugural which saw different events being contested including waterpolo and what somebody thought resembled a mosh pit but was actually under 6 v under 7 in beach soccer

Coogee SLSC

In our 106th season I can again report "No Lives Lost" during the 2011/12 Surf Season.

Lifesaving

The Season commenced with our new Club Captain Dave Winkle taking the reins from Catie Anderson.

The Club congratulates Catie for her tenure of the position, and notes her awarding of the Club's Honour Blazer for 2010/11.

Dave's Lifesaving committee were hard at work from pre season to end of season with some amazing achievements.

With a patrol roster with in excess of 450 members again this season the Club has patrolled Coogee beach and the surrounding rock platforms. We also provided patrols at Wylies Baths and assisted Garie and Burning Palms. At the Branch's request, IRB patrol assistance was given to Clovelly from October to December until they had adequate drivers on roster.

Members of our Club were also instrumental in giving their time and expertise to the Branch's "Support Operations Group" where we provided lifesavers to the Off Shore Rescue Boat, the Rescue Water Craft, 'Surf Com Sydney', and the Lifesaver Rescue Helicopter Service.

Our records indicate some 53 rescues from the surf this season, with many involving the management of spinal injuries due to the nasty "Coogee Edge". I was very proud on a number of occasions to watch as our patrol members



went about the treatment of these life threatening injuries, and must make mention of the close working relationship we have with the Council's lifeguards. At the end of the day, paid or volunteer, it's always about the Patient!

Education

Our Education Team was ably led by our new Chief Instructor Craig Howie this season. And what a busy season it was!

The Team ran 6 Bronze Medallion Courses this season with 135 new Bronzies coming on board to patrol at Coogee. Additionally we had 48 new Surf Rescue Certificates, mostly Minnows coming up to join the senior club.

A total of 401 awards for the Senior Club and 778 for the Minnows saw a total of 1183 awards gained through the hard work of our Education Team. This tally was the highest in the Branch.

Our Instructors also found time to continue to roll out the "Migration to Surf" program which raises both awareness and confidence to newly arrived immigrants with little knowledge of the surf.

Youth Development

Our Coogee Blueys (our 13-18 year old members) have had another great season, with some 48 new cadets coming on board to bolster our youth membership.

The Blueys have been overseen by our Youth Development Officer, Doug Hawkins. Doug's main role for the season has been to oversee the President's Youth Committee, which is a representative group of our youth members who have a direct reporting line to the President so that they can voice their collective opinion about youth issues within the Club. The Committee also took on a number of fundraising events during the season, with the New Year's Eve Family Banquet a huge success both financially and socially for our youth members.

Events

This season saw the club run three major events.

The Club's Open Surf Carnival, which again incorporated the Branch's Lifesaving and Patrol Competition, was held on the first Saturday of February, as it has always been. The carnival had good weather and the feed back from Competitor and Officials was that it was a great day, and a well run event. Congratulations to Ben Barry our Carnival organiser.

The Club also conducted two open water swims around Wedding Cake Island.

The first swim the "Express Glass Island Challenge" was held in November, the start to the ocean swimming season and was our largest swim to date. It has now become one of our major fundraising activities.

Competition

The on going work of our tireless Competition Director Warwick Everingham and his Competition Committee is starting to bear fruit.

This year at the Australian Titles the Club won 2 gold medals in the Open Carnival and a gold medal in the Masters.

The Club finished in the top twenty five clubs at Aussies and thirteenth at the State Titles.

The competitor rebuilding program, concentrating on our cadet and junior members, and a push to have teams competing in all areas of competition seems to be the right formula for the Club.

Again, more water safety was inspired to join the ranks of the lime green army. This resulted in over 30 parents testing their mental and physical worth over 2 "Dad's Army" Bronze courses. With a greater focus on the safety of our children on the beach I am proud that Coogee Minnows, under the skilful guidance of our water safety coordinator, Peter Sakley, always meets and exceeds the minimum water safety ratios with fully qualified lifesavers.

Day one on the beach was a perfect start to the season. All the planning and years of experience meant that everyone could slip into their roles perfectly. The hardest shoes to fill for the first few weeks are always those of the under 6's age manager. Fortunately this year we were ready from the get go with Paul Haes and Ben Ashton sharing the role to step in and take care of 170 kids in just one age group. Not only were they ready and willing to take on the challenge of that many kids they also had their recruiters' hats on and within a few weeks had over 25 trained age assistants. A huge thank you to both of them who have rewritten the handbook on controlling and entertaining that many kids for over an hour.

All age managers deserve an applause for their efforts in the season. Its a tough gig that is not just about coordinating large groups of kids but also one that involves the management of hundreds of parents expectations. A big thanks to Craig with our fantastic SRC's in the under 14's. As usual a special thank you to our SRC trainers Geoff "Daylight" who were on with the beach or in the class room from day one and didn't stop till they successfully turned another 54 Coogee Nippers into Lifesavers.

Of course the education and lifesaving training doesn't stop with the under 14's. We are very proud of the fact that Coogee Minnows begins some form of lifesaver training from the youngest of our age groups. Whether its 5 year olds knowing all about the patrol tent, 8 year olds learning hand signals and how to put someone into a recovery position or 11 year olds knowing how to rescue someone with a tube, the process of becoming a Coogee lifesaver becomes a lifestyle.

Of course all this education and lifesaver training doesn't mean we forget about competition. Randwick Shield was a great success thanks to the commitment of all our volunteers and the Coogee kids who relished in the home ground advantage.

Well done to all our competition teams.

SLSS CLUB REPORTS

Elouera SLSC



Elouera Surf Life Saving Club once again continued to provide Shire residents and visitors with a high level of aquatic safety and has done so in close association with the other three Bate Bay clubs – Wanda, North Cronulla and Cronulla – during Season 2011~2012. I am also proud to report once again that “No Lives Were Lost” during the season.

Elouera worked closely with each of the other three Bate Bay clubs in patrolling and education generally and in specific events such as the Branch Age and Open Surf Lifesaving Championships; the Bate Bay Interclub Carnival and in the various joint representations to Sutherland Shire Council. The clubs also participated in the third year of a combined life guard / surf club “working together” program. This program involves younger members from each of the clubs undertaking training and work activities with council life guards.

The club's patrols worked exceptionally well and according to statistics in Surfguard, patrolling members made 135 rescues, conducted over 1,175 preventative actions and provided first aid to 98 people. The number of rescues undertaken was up by 33 on those conducted in the previous season. Unfortunately one member of the public died after suffering a heart attack after walking out of the surf. Although patrol members and local beach inspectors attempted to resuscitate the victim, she did not respond to all our efforts. Condolences are extended to her family.

Membership of the Club has steadily increased during 2011~2012 and currently comprises 623 JAC members and 491 members in the Senior section of the Club ~ a total membership of 1,114.

Our nipper section had another outstanding season. Numbers increased to around 625 up from around 550 the previous season. Our younger members are provided with a vast array of activities and skills training each Sunday morning and many of the older groups combine beach activities with additional education in surf knowledge and resuscitation techniques. The new Elouera Surf Academy (ESA) program again provided a structured training program for nippers and catered for all abilities. As testament to the success

of the ESA program, at the New South Wales State Age Championships the club finished a credible 4th overall – up from 8th in the 2010/11 season. This season's achievements are a credit to the nipper committee led by Steve Urquhart together with Darrin Lane and all the trainers, managers and water safety personnel.

Our life saving side appears to be strong as does our training however our junior ranks were diminishing and consequently we continued our junior development program. A significant effort is being placed on the development of our juniors (14 – 19 year olds) which is starting to bear fruit for the club. We will continue to build on this vital area and will devote more resources to it over the next twelve months.

In terms of additional community involvement the club has also been involved in:

- (i) The 30th Tradies Surf Awareness Clinic. This year the Clinic catered for in excess of 260 children aged from 7 to 12 years of age. The Clinic, conducted over 5 successive half-days between 9th. and 13th. January 2012, involved over 90 volunteer members who willingly gave up leisure and holiday times to ensure a professional Clinic which was safely conducted in challenging

surf conditions. The involvement and support of the Sutherland District Trade Union Club (“Tradies”); the local lifeguards and thirteen generous companies and organisations which donated products ensured the success and continuation of this important community event.

- (ii) The fourth Cook Classic event was held in November last year and involved all four Bate Bay clubs combining with many charities throughout the Shire to raise much needed funds and at the same time provide a community event and display for residents of the Shire;

Our instructional team had another great year under the guidance of Glenn Cairncross who undertook this position for his second season. The standard of training has been high and congratulations must be extended to Glenn and the entire team of instructors and assessors. Numbers wise, Elouera members gained 206 awards in the senior club. A further 552 nipper awards were gained taking the grand total to 758 awards for the season, up slightly on the 739 awards gained in the 2010/11 season.

Elouera members also distinguished themselves in competition at all levels, with Elouera continuing to rebuild its name at both Junior and Senior levels. Congratulations are extended to

our nippers who finished 4th in the state and to our members who won or gained places at the recent Australian Championships.

The season has not been without challenges. The building and issues associated with it have continued to take up a significant amount of my time and that of others. Thankfully only two projects now remain outstanding and are expected to be completed in the coming twelve months.

This year's Surf Life Saving Sydney Awards of Excellence night was held in late May. Elouera nominated a number of members for awards and congratulations are extended to those members who attained awards and or gained high commendations.

Elouera could not continue to operate to its current high standard without the generous support of sponsors. The contribution made by our major sponsor, Sutherland District Trade Union Club ("Tradies") has been significant. They provide funds for the purchase of general life saving and competition equipment and support the annual surf awareness clinic and have been a major sponsor for over 26 years.

A large and quite unexpected roll up with nippers from other clubs saw a day of great competition in a fun atmosphere. There were plenty of prizes, for all kids. The carnival was wrapped up by a senior Taplin event that saw some of the best swimmers and paddlers in surf lifesaving race against each other. Many thanks to our carnival sponsor Ohana, and the many officials and work party that contributed to the success of the day.

Again we push the surf lifesaving theme throughout the season. Every kid from U9s up spent some time using the tubes, learning communication signals and learning CPR. Garie SLSC

The season of 2011-2012 was an interesting one with an extremely wet summer keeping the beach almost deserted on many occasions but with growing crowds visiting Garie Beach when the good weather came out. This combination was at times a challenge for our members however the Club Spirit again excelled and we are pleased to report that no lives were lost whilst our area was patrolled.

Garie's patrols went back to full day patrolling after five years operating with half day rosters. Because of the distances often traveled by members, half day patrols were not very successful. Overall the interaction of active members may have been missed, however the camaraderie of a number of patrols strengthened to become a well catered family day at the club instead of just another patrol day.

On the beach, the inconsistent weather did not hamper the efforts of our patrol members who managed to still carry out 38 rescues and 1320 preventative actions, (an increase of 200%). As well, 58 First Aid activities were performed. Garie Beach received 3471 volunteer man hours of patrol support with 2500 of those being from Garie members. Again, we cannot thank enough the other Sydney Clubs that supported us during the season particularly our regulars, Maroubra SLSC and Coogee SLSC. These two clubs were joined by newcomers, North Bondi SLSC and North Cronulla SLSC Juniors who are now looking to make these visits a welcome addition to our patrol strengths.

The Chief Instructor and his team did an excellent job putting through 52 lifesaving awards and the nippers gained a remarkable 185 Surf Ed awards making a total of 237 awards which resulted in Garie taking out the most awards in the RNP District at the recent Branch Awards of Excellence evening. An outstanding effort by this team of instructors despite the weather conditions for the majority of the season. This influx of newly qualified patrol members certainly boosted our shrinking numbers in recent years.

A special mention must be made of an outstanding incident involving our Patrol No. 4 made up of predominantly newly

qualified members. On April 1st a surfer was injured when dumped by the shore break at the northern end of Garie Beach. The patrol had ended for the day and was packing up when the alarm was raised. The patrol immediately swung into action and raced to the isolated area as a severe storm was approaching and darkness was descending rapidly. The patient was in a serious condition in severe pain, shock, tingling and loss of feeling in his lower half.

These younger members carried out full spinal procedures and stabilized and monitored the patient until ambulance paramedics arrived. We were later to be advised that without their excellent treatment, the patient would never have walked again. A full report will be documented further on in our own Annual Report, but for now, we must congratulate these young patrol members. They have made our club very proud of their achievement.

As we all know, competitive events are a way of keeping our patrolling lifesavers fit and strong. To this end beach and water races are held whenever possible. Because of the inclement weather all season and a shortage of members, not all of our programmed events took place. However, those that were held were contested enthusiastically.

Our nippers were the keenest competitors, showing some of the senior members how it's done. A full run down of their achievements will follow later in the reports. Mention must be made though, that these nippers are the lifeblood of our club. Many of our newest patrolling seniors have come through from the parents of the juniors and make the social BBQ's and socializing the glue that is holding our membership together.

Our major competitive event is the annual 'Garie Dash' which was held once again in November at Bundeena. Our thanks go to those Branch officials who have supported this boat carnival since the very beginning. The new venue for the prize giving and refreshments again proved popular with competitors who enjoy the tug-o-war as much as competing on the water. SLSS CLUB REPORTS

North Bondi SLSC



After a long and tortuous journey over the past 5 years I can report the demolition and rebuilding of our Clubhouse has started. Over 80% of the \$6.2 million project cost has been raised by the Club itself with Government at all levels very shy to get involved. We have received no Federal Government money which is very disappointing given the scope, size and importance of this community infrastructure project.

We do thank Waverley Council for their \$750,000 contribution and the State Government for \$350,000 Surf Club Facility Grant. Our State MP Gabrielle Upton was instrumental in securing a further \$100,000 under the electorate based Community Building Partnership. Mayor John Wakefield and Councillors are thanked for the donation of the temporary buildings and most of the storage containers which has saved us considerable money.

Our generous benefactors and supporters are sincerely thanked for their vote of confidence in the project. This coupled with a member building levy, member tile donation project and Club savings squirreled away over many years has enabled this building to become a reality. It is no understatement that this brand new facility will allow us to grow our community charter over many decades ahead. The amenity & financial security this building brings will underpin our expansion plans with lifesaving, youth development and surf sports activities. Whilst we will spend a tough 12 months in the demountables watching the birth it will be well worth the disruption.

One of the key strategies of the Executive over the past few years has been youth development. This ranges from increasing general Nipper numbers and involvement in surf sports through to Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) qualification and ultimately on to obtaining the Bronze Medallion and higher awards. This has been deliberate effort to tie in with our rebuilding timeline to ensure we capitalise on our youth to propel the Club forward. It is very pleasing to note we have 1029 registered Nippers engaging in healthy weekly activities and gaining basic surf sense skills. Of the 85 bronze medallion awards obtained last season 47 were candidates under 18 years of age. This coupled with the 40 SRC candidates demonstrates a strong increase in youth numbers.

Lifesaving saw a large increase in rescues over the previous seasons which were capably handled by our 549 voluntary patrollers. North Bondi performed outreach patrols at Garie, Coalcliff and Hawks Nest SLSC's during the season. The up skilling of our members was a priority during this past season and I can report very pleasing results in this area. Our lifesaving and education teams are very strong and provide the catalyst for the well-respected community service we perform. The administration and finance functions of the Club are in safe hands and provide the necessary support to our operations. These areas will be critical to our functioning during the rebuilding stage.

North Bondi embarked on a more structured approach to our surf sports training and participation during the past season. This has resulted in a general increase in numbers involved and greater results being achieved. It was very pleasing to see the results of our youth in the major championships. This coupled with our open and masters competitors will again see the Club back on the scoreboard.

The past season has been very successful and a stepping stone to the future achievements of North Bondi. We look forward to completing our rebuilding to provide the physical amenity to allow us to thrive for a long time to come.

With another year just about done it's interesting to reflect on what has been a stellar year in the history of North Cronulla, tempered by another tragedy at Kurrawa.

On the home beach, the year was a very stop start affair with the beach closed on many occasions due to a combination of unfavourable swell conditions and a series of major, wide rips which kept appearing and travelling up and down the beach. With the abysmal Sydney summer weather this year, when the beach was open the weather kept crowd numbers down and ensured a fairly cold, wet and/or windy day for our patrol.

Despite this the Club logged another high of just under 14,000 hours on the beach. The overall statistics however showed the tale of the season. Crowds were down by almost 40%, preventative actions down by 66%, rescues down by 70% and just about every other measure down by more than 50%. Regardless, our patrols kept on performing and, in spite of much confusion over SOP's at the Branch end, our patrol captain's by and large maintained the high standard set over the past few years.

North Cronulla has the highest profile beach of the Bate Bay Clubs with board riders competitions, events, fairs and carnivals an almost weekly event. As a result we are the most heavily scrutinised Club in the District. This in turn impacts greatly on the structure and management of our patrols, with much call for our assistance off the beach. This is reflected by the community involvement of the Club, and the work we do with various community and Council groups. This has been a regular feature of the Club for many years and continues throughout the year, not just in the surf season.

North Cronulla, along with the other clubs in Bate Bay showed vision, leadership, innovation and courage in developing

the Bate Bay Beach Management Plan in consultation with our local Council. The District structure is a major benefit to each of the Clubs in Bate Bay, giving us the ability to develop properly targeted plans and deal with Council in a united and consistent fashion. This is recognised by all parties as being a major strength of the Surf Life Saving organisation in the area. The developing Bate Bay Beach Management plan is one example of this, together with the ability for all services in the District, including the Council, to properly identify the necessary resources and improve efficiency and effectiveness of the services we deliver to the public.

The tragic loss of a young lifesaver at Kurrawa impacted on us all in many ways and probably more than most of us care to admit. It reinforced the need to respect the ocean and to be conscious of the need for vigilance when around it. It was a timely reminder that it is the people at the "pointy end", the people out there doing the business week in and week out who are the lifeblood of the Clubs and therefore the organisation. These people do have skills, they are courageous and they understand the ocean and particularly their local environment. Their knowledge is worthy of recognition. We need to recognise once again that all knowledge is not vested in the few within the bureaucracy. Our volunteers are the organisation; they deserve respect, to be looked after and to be listened to.

The outcome of the review of the Branch is eagerly anticipated and will be intensely scrutinised by our members, who have been quite vocal in their expectations of the organisation at a number of levels. They have been quick to express their disappointment at the performance of the

State centre, with a number of matters unresolved after years of inactivity seen as an indication of the general lack of practical support for Clubs and their members. In particular the lack of support for a member who became involved in unwanted litigation as a result of performing his duties is poorly perceived by our members, and should be of concern to every member of Surf Life Saving in the country.

In the competition arena the Club had its most successful year in many decades. Our 6th place at Aussies was the product of strength in many areas across the spectrum, led by our cadet members. We equalled our best ever gold medal tally, won the under 15 point score, the R&R Champion Club and were the most successful march past club. The areas of success are a fair indication that we are starting to better utilise the wide range of interest and abilities that exist in our members and have broad Club involvement.

Our success in being named Sydney Branch Champions for the second time in 3 years, is a further indication of the growing strength and depth of our Club.

With our retention rates and junior growth, the future for our Club looks extremely bright, although like many Clubs we are seeing some fallout from the tragedy at Kurrawa.

Within North Cronulla, we intend to continue to expand our community focus and look forward to another successful season next year.

North Cronulla Nippers



Another brilliant season for our Surf Club.

Again our nipper membership grew: exceeding 650 youngsters.

We began with registration and swim proficiencies in September/October. As to those proficiencies our club continued to lobby SLSSA, through the Sydney Board of Junior Development to re-introduce the timed pool swims as a compulsory requirement before children are sent to sea. In our view it is about child safety and our internal proficiency requirements will remain: therefore in addition the SLSSA required proficiencies, our under 9-10 nippers need to complete a 400 metre pool swim inside 6 minutes; under 11-14's the same distance inside 5 minutes.

This year saw a new committee led by Peter Moyle (Director), Donna Hargreaves (Secretary) and Kevin McNamara (Deputy Director). Last season's training template with some modifications was re-introduced; placing board and surf swimming as the priorities. Our club owes a debt to the senior members who put in many hours guiding the many nippers who regularly dragged themselves along to training, particular thanks go to Stuart Cameron and Tracey Shriek for leading the week day training sessions in those disciplines.

The year started with Chad Moses and Meghan Fowler elected as nipper captains. We then saw our largest ever group of SRC graduates presented with red and yellow patrol uniforms. A few weeks later the under 14's flew north for their Gold Coast trip away: a terrific way to commence their final nipper year and richly deserved after a year of fundraising:

- Competitively our club again showed brilliant form, demonstrating the value of the in-house training programs. For the 3rd year in a row North Cronulla

nippers cracked a podium finish at the State Championships, finishing behind only Manly and Avoca. Our parents and team managers deserve equal congratulations: Kingscliff is a serious hike up the coast and our club managed to field an enormous team. At risk of singling out one performance from the many, Hailey Lane's swim to win the under 13 race was sensational. A full field of the best the state could offer, testing conditions and young Hailey swam herself into the drop zone, cracked a wave and is now state champ. Fabulous stuff!

Our Nippers were also represented in numbers at the IMB Carnival at Cronulla, the South Maroubra junior carnival, the Bate Bay 4-Way, our own Junior Australia Day Iron Person Classic, the Branch championships at Wanda/Elouera and a host of other events.

The work our club has put into our junior surf skills is bearing rich rewards in seniors: 5th at State, 6th at Aussies (with our cadets winning the Australian Championships under-15 point score). All that said this is a Branch Delegate's report. North Cronulla has had excellent representation at junior branch this season. This season our hard-working secretary, Donna Hargreaves took on the additional and busy role of Junior Branch secretary. Unless you are party to what goes on behind the scenes you could not know just how much work needs to be done. Donna was this year presented with our Committee Person of the Year award: it was richly deserved.

Sydney Branch has 15 clubs and thousands of nippers. Setting up the communication lines and organising our branch activities doesn't happen by fluke: it is a monumental task. The contribution of people such as Doug Hawkins, our Junior Branch Director, Bruce Bevan, Deputy Director and Donna often goes unnoticed, but is monumental. Our branch is not just about surf sports (mind you, 5 of the top 10 positions at State means we aren't too bad at them). The brilliantly conceived and organised development camps are fantastic opportunities. Our



under 11 and under 13 nippers who attended Deer Park, came back enthused and full of stories. Reports were that our parent minders were a terrific support at camp. Well done to them.

This year Telstra singled out our Branch for a grant of significant funds to be spent towards fostering Sydney nippers. Each club has committed to using its share of the grant for that very purpose. At North Cronulla you will notice next season some sensational renovations to our nipper barbecue area.

We have known pretty much forever, just how important the nippers movement is to our children. It is not simply a pathway to the senior surf lifesaving movement. And yes, it clearly makes for happy, healthy and active children, but nor is it just about those goals. What we are additionally doing for our kids is providing them leadership skills, teamwork skills and instilling self-confidence. These provide a framework on which they can build for a lifetime. Organisations jumping on board to support us in the generous way in which Telstra has done, are mightily appreciated. They can be guaranteed their funds won't be wasted.

On the local surf sports front, Mike Vitnell again took on the reins as Director. Junior competition director was Wayne Druery. Both those gentlemen put in enormous hours to ensure our events are organised as professionally conducted. Both deserve the warmest of congratulations. This branch at both senior and junior levels has an extremely capable and highly regarded group of competition officials. The proof of that is not just how efficiently our local carnivals are run: I suggest you cast an eye occasionally over the key officials

at State and Australian championships. You will see a disproportionately high representation from our ranks.

Our Club also thanks the staff at our branch office. I personally should apologise for so frequently interrupting Victoria Raymond in her duties: she is a terrific addition at the office.

Once again the off-season sees Northies nippers powering. Sunday morning board training has already commenced and again numbers are excellent. There can be no doubt the contributions by the coaches, water safety and squad leaders during the winter months have laid the foundation to the steady annual improvement of our nippers in surf sports. Our U13 parents/nippers are in full swing raising funds for their trip (again to the Gold Coast).

Work commitments sadly have Peter Moyle standing aside as Director. His work in that role was excellent this year. Incoming Nipper Director is Michelle Sheldon; we wish her and her incoming committee all the best for what will hopefully be another bumper season.

As reported in past Branch Annual Reports, a great deal of our time, effort and fundraising has gone into repairing our club over many years, fighting the scourge that most surf clubs face being positioned in the some of the most open and exposed environments confronting salt air and driving wind and rain and the inevitable consequence being concrete cancer and general decay.

Well I am now in a position to report that the days of the 'one step forward, two steps back' routine in terms of building repairs for the club are over, well at least for the near future. I guess the best way I can describe our transition has been really the ugly duckling of clubs transforming into the beautiful white swan and that pretty much epitomises what we have been through over the past exhaustive season. Who would have thought so much could have been done in a 12 month period whilst keeping the doors open and all club activities running, certainly not me.

As most clubs who have been through major renovations would understand, when you effectively lose the entire club to the building process including surrounding grounds, conducting our core business of lifesaving and all that comes with it is really bloody hard and inevitably takes a toll on the membership, supporters and most importantly those trying to lead the club.

About 12 months to the day we were at a point where all relevant consents were finally in place, some but not all funding secured, great builders and other professionals including an impressive bunch of people from Randwick City Council willing and able to help us to move forward; our project was ready to roll on or so we thought. The reality of construction soon hit us with many twists and turns throughout the journey including but not limited to losing access into the club and various store rooms, demolition during which time no-one was permitted in the club and then returning after hours to find debris, leaks and dust throughout the club, securing the club from the elements and those seeking to take advantage of our vulnerability were all an ongoing and constant challenges.

We had hoped global warming or little rain might have been a reality, how wrong predications were with record rain and generally poor weather conditions which resulted in flooding throughout the lower levels. I remember on a number of days getting soaked trying to spread waterproof sheets over what was once the upstairs lounge and stairway which

for several months became open and unprotected space. The local hardware store became our close friends with tarps, mops, buckets and brooms being the order of the day.

At one stage during the building process we had absolutely no where in the club to conduct any business with education relocated to our great supporter, the Maroubra Seals Club, core club business and clothing sales were run out of a donated site shed. Dennis our ex-caretaker was forced effectively to set up a camp site within his room to protect him from the constant flooding and deteriorating living conditions. Then throw in maintaining a consistent service delivery for lifesaving and moving lifesaving and nipper gear up and down to the beach plus running our other commitments including our fantastic Junior Carnival, our fun Community 'Octoberfest' event, well it was madness with a capital M.

To complicate what was already to be a tough building assignment, an opportunity arose after the commencement of the major building renovation that was simply too good not to have a crack at. This opportunity was an idea from Phil Dutton who encouraged the club to apply for assistance from the Tooheys New Crew; a fantastic group of tradesmen funded by Tooheys who carry our favours for community assets and organisations. In our case we were hoping to be successful in a makeover of our bottom lounge (not able to be funded in our planned major renovation). Not holding out to much hope we were amazed to find that our application was in fact successful and much to both our delight and horror went about planning for this major community event which required widespread community advertising, support from the public and membership alike, and most importantly an ability to work around an existing work site. So more stress for an already overwhelmed Board of Management!

Well I'm pleased to report The Tooheys New Crew boys led by Paul 'The Chief' Harrigan over a three day period with a band of dedicated club members got stuck into what was to be a wonderful

little renovation that has now transformed the tied old 'Kelly Lounge' into a really nice and open club room complimenting the major transformation and creating a boutique function room.

So what was the overall outcome you ask?

Well Tooheys New Crew renovation was the first renovation to be completed with some additional improvements after the boys finished up. As far as the major renovation is concerned which involved totally rebuilding the upstairs room, new foyers on three levels, disabled access and general external ground improvements the club managed to get through the many challenges and in May 2012 we received our interim occupation certificate allowing us to use the room for a range of priorities. We were hoping to introduce the room to our Sydney Branch friends hosting the 2011/12 Sydney Branch Awards of Excellence. Regrettably the event grew too large to accommodate within our new facility however we do hope to one day soon to have all our friends come on down to join with us to celebrate this wonderful achievement! Perhaps come along to the **December 2012 Junior Carnival**, you'll be most welcome.

For those that remember the old club house I'm sure you'll be amazed at the transformation and have included a couple of photos for your perusal. Lifesaving

Whilst building was by far my priority, I was fortunate to have a small band of dedicated lifesavers committed to stabilising our lifesaving services whilst ensuring lifesaving interests were not overlooked or neglected. It goes

without saying given the magnitude of our building projects there would be some disruption and conflict between building works and lifesaving operations however I'm sure I speak on behalf of everyone in saying everything went as well as could be expected. Our challenge in the approaching season is to build our lifesaving personnel on the back of our renovated facility and to do that we need to get the message out that South Maroubra SLSC is **"Open for Business"**. We invite any lifesaver past or present from any club who is looking for a new challenge to come on down and be part of our exciting future.

On the beach, members did a wonderful job responding to record numbers of rescues with 273 rescues and 3039 preventative actions along with 57 first aid cases, a really busy year for our lifesavers.

Unfortunately rock fishermen continue to place themselves at risk with several drowning both at south and north Maroubra well away from patrolled beaches and outside patrolling hours. This is certainly a problem that needs to be reviewed by agencies and government.

I congratulate members on achieving **6th place for Club of the Year** given the disruption we experienced and the fact only a few points separated first to sixth, a really terrific achievement. Of particular note is the fantastic work done by the

very much admired Joe White who took out 2 wonderful Branch awards and contributed 264 radio room hours. Dennis Clarke and Chris Maloney contributed some massive hours and did a fine job in assisting in a range of areas on the beach. Our IRB drivers continue to demonstrate superior surf rescue skills and certainly are benefiting from the many many hours of training they commit to IRB racing brining those skills to our beach to the benefit of those in trouble.

Congratulations to members who picked up major awards at Sydney Branch Awards of excellence Night including, Joe White Branch Member of the Year & Surfcom Operator of the Year, Ray Robinson High Commendation Assessor of the Year, Montana Walters High Commendation Female Athlete of the Year (13-14 yrs), Louis Fong BJD Age Manager of the Year.

Competition

I very much wish to acknowledge our fantastic IRB Competition Team who throughout the summer months are our best patrolling members and by winter months are our best performing competitors. I guess this makes this ever growing group of members some of the very best in our club. As mentioned earlier it is staggering to see this group continuing to grow at the rate they do. I guess this is testament to the mateship,

competitive spirit and leadership that is all contained within this competition section. I make special mention of Australian medallists Damien Woods, Brad Ellison, David Dubois, Chris Maloney, Jack Perrin, Nick Mellick, Cathy Hall, Alex Bishenden and the entire team who work all together in the spirit of sportsmanship. To Ken Hudson and Bruce Creecy, stalwarts and mentors of the team a special congratulations. To be **NSW State Champs and 2nd at the IRB Aussies** against very strong NSW and Queensland competition is an outstanding result. To our summer competitors led by our growing boat section well done and thank you for coping and training around the building works. To our up and coming lifesavers in Nippers (and parents, coaches, supporters) who continue to be super competitive, well done on your state performance placed 11th out of 120 odd clubs and best in the Randwick District.

Conclusion

Well, that's about all folks from down town South Maroubra SLSC. Thank you to John De Cean and entire Branch staff. Shirt' brigade. As our nipper group, exploded 2 years ago to the size of a school, we need all the volunteer helpers we can get. I assure you that your child/rens experience at nippers will increase the more you become involved - the benefits are well documented.

To the clubs major sponsors – Maroubra Seals Club, The Juniors, Randwick City Council, Botany City Council & the NSW Government – we thank you for your support. To the local businesses that support our nipper program – namely Bonds, All Phones, True Blue Collectables, Oportos, , Look Design and Demon Surf Boards and Mango Racing I thank you. 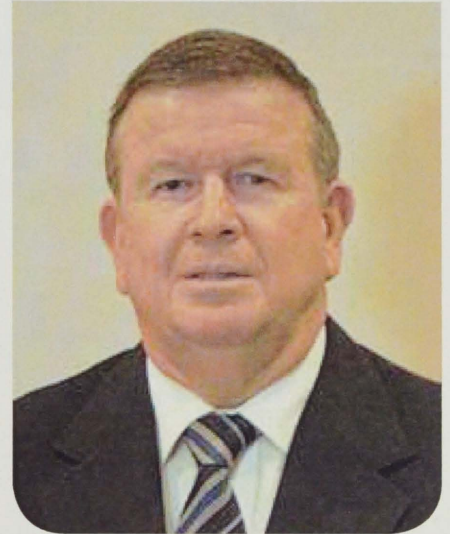

Finance Report 2012

The following Report is to be read in conjunction with the Financial Report for the year ended 31 May 2012.

The Branch achieved a profit of \$1,378 for the financial year to 31 May 2012 which was below the profit of \$57,158 derived in the previous financial year. The result is after making a proposed distribution of \$3,000 to each Sydney Branch club. The reduction in profit reflects the decrease in Grant income of \$55,543 during the year. Income from Competition and Event Fees was also down by \$99,488.



Total Income for the year was \$540,107 which was down on the 2010/11 figure by \$139,498 mainly due to a reduction in life saving grants and competition and event fees. The surplus from rental operations improved markedly to a surplus of \$12,505.

In line with the reduction in overall income, expenses were also reduced by \$83,719. Expenditure was curtailed across most categories throughout the year to ensure that a distribution could be made to clubs at the end of the financial year. The few expense categories where expenses increased significantly were:

- (i) **Consultants**
One off fee for the branch review
- (ii) **Depreciation**
For the two new jet skis
- (iii) **Uniforms and Apparel**
Uniforms for branch officials, assessors and Duty officers.

The Balance Sheet remains healthy. Cash assets have increased to \$676,717 an increase of \$97,372. Both buildings at Alexandria have been occupied all year and no major expenditure was incurred on either building. The tenant in the new property is in the process of exercising the option for a further term. None of the buildings were re-valued during the year. During the year two new jet skis were purchased and are shown in Plant and equipment. One of the skis will be sold in the coming season.

In terms of liabilities no further reductions were made on the bank loans. The terms of the loans were renewed in August last year.

During the year the Branch employed two staff. The Finance Committee met once during the year to review and assess to 2012 budget. I would like to thank, Peter Pearce, Trevor Elliott, Karl Solomonson and Greg Holland for their contribution during the season.

My thanks to our tremendous sponsors who have enabled the Branch to operate efficiently throughout the season. To Streets, DHL, Westpac and Sydney Airport we thank you. Without your significant sponsorship the Branch would not be in a position to provide services to the clubs and the general public.

To Victoria and Linda in the office, I thank you for your professionalism and the manner in which you undertake your respective jobs. Thanks also to Yvette who left us in July last year to work at SLISA.







NOTE 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Surf Life Saving Sydney Incorporated is not a reporting entity because in the executive committees' opinion, there is unlikely to exist users who are unable to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs and these financial reports are therefore a "Special Purpose Financial Report" that has been prepared solely to meet the financial reporting requirements under the Association's constitution, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the Associations Incorporations Act NSW.

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, and the following applicable accounting standards.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of this report, as described below, are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Association's constitution.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Income Tax

No income tax is payable by Surf Life Saving Sydney Inc. as Section 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 exempts Charitable Institutions from Income Tax.

(b) Revenue

- Sale of goods: Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised when control of the goods has passed to the buyer, the amount of revenue can be measured reliably and it is probable that it will be received by the Association
- Rendering of services: When the outcome of the transaction involving the rendering of services can be estimated reliably, revenue associated with the transaction is recognised by reference to the percentage of the services performed
- Interest revenue: Interest revenue is recognised as revenue when received
- Members subscriptions: Member subscriptions are recognised as revenue when received

(c) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, unless the GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority. In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

(d) **Plant and Equipment**

Property, plant and equipment are stated at historical cost less depreciation. Individual items costing less than \$300 are expensed immediately through the income statement rather than capitalised to the balance sheet. The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are charged over their life from the time the assets are purchased.

Property

Freehold land & property is measured at fair value by an independent valuer in regular intervals.

The property is taken to be held for investment purposes and therefore the committee has adopted not to apply depreciation. Any adjustments in the value of the property will be made to the asset revaluation reserve. The current value of the property is \$2,092,631 with the last valuation being conducted on 18 July 2006.

Loans from the Building Society are secured by a registered first mortgage over the property.
