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PRESIDENT



The 2016/2017 season has been extremely busy for Surf Life Saving Sydney. In my third year as President, I have been very fortunate to have the same board supporting me this season. The main focus this season has been to ensure we were relevant to the 15 clubs in the branch. This meant we were continually striving to deliver value and provide leadership and guidance to all clubs.

The year in review, with our continued focus on innovation and suitability for the future, enabling us to continue to deliver against the strategic priorities as outlined in our strategic plan.

The key areas of focus this past season have been on strategy and innovation while continuing to improve the operational aspects of the organisation. Under the guidance of Peter Agnew we have been in a position to ensure we have a strategic focus while delivering against our core operational requirements. During this process we continued to engage with all the clubs ensuring we were focused in the appropriate areas. Peter also continued to ensure we are leading across the Drone Technology front. This enabled us to utilise the technology in an unfortunate drowning incident which occurred in February this year on Maroubra beach. Having the ability to put the technology to use in a major incident while unfortunate allowed us to fully appreciate the value of using technology and continue to ensure the organisation at all levels remains engaged.

On a lifesaving and education front Simon Torsellini and his team continued to deliver some great results across the portfolio. The ever-increasing requirement for the support operations teams across the branch with some testing incidents occurring that required many hours of interactions from all the teams. The

incidents we have been involved in this season have highlighted the ongoing requirement for the services and in fact has necessitated the appointment of additional rescue coordinators and an increase of other support services.

I have been very encouraged by the number of clubs who have taken up the SLSNSW quality clubs program. We currently have 11 of the 15 clubs who have obtained the quality club status as recognised by SLSNSW 9 Bronze level, 1 Silver level and 1 Gold level. This program is designed to ensure that all clubs have the appropriate plans in place to remain sustainable for the future.

The financial health and compliance of the organisation has been led by John De Cean. The decision was made to engage an external book keeper to manage the accounts which has enabled us to have a clear separation from operational activities accounts. While we undertook this process we were exposed for a short period of time while the new book keeper Sharon Porter came on board. I would like to say thank you to the club presidents and board members for their patience during this period.

The Surf Sports team lead by Wayne Druery has also provided some great opportunities supported by the clubs. The main focus was to continually challenge the way we do things today. The team have continued to deliver on the objectives set by hoisting a second series of Nutri-Grain in Sydney Branch which was successfully run at North Cronulla.

This season also saw a successful Branch Championships and Junior Championships held at Maroubra with a full schedule being completed on both days, which is the first time in many years. I would like to thank David Simpson (Maroubra President) for the management of the two days and for continuing to support the event. The team at Maroubra ensure the event is run without any issues and continues to deliver.

Sydney Branch also took a team to the SLSNSW inter branch championships held at The Lakes on the central coast in the Entrance and came away with the winners trophy. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the team Manager John De Cean and the competitors for achieving a great result. I would also like to take this opportunity to recognise Jackie Parker who has been involved as the team chaperone for the past 12 years. Jackie has been instrumental in ensuring the behind the scenes logistics runs like clockwork. It is with a heavy heart that I advise that Jackie has advised due to personal commitments that she will be unavailable for future interbranch championship events. Jackie, I know personally that this is a tough decision you have made and I sincerely wish you all the best in the future, you will be sadly missed.

The Member Services team have also been working on a strategy to engage more youth and females into key positions within the organisation while ensuring we have a succession plan in place to support the future direction of the organisation. This year we

launched a number of conferences dedicated to the youth within SLSS, this has been met with a high level of enthusiasm of which will continue into the future

The Junior Development team lead by Doug Hawkins continued to manage juniors and deliver the development camps. These camps ensure the juniors of our organisation are provided with the necessary skills to be future leaders of the organisation. Doug and his team also continued to roll out the junior scenario training across the Branch.

The 2016/2017 Surf Life Saving AOE was a great success and a tribute to the work the BOM and office staff put into the evening. The evening saw recognition of the best lifesavers and competitors in our Branch. UNMANNED AERIAL VEHICLES

The call goes out for a missing swimmer on a busy summers day on one of Sydney's popular swimming beaches as lifesavers are alerted that someone was seen moments earlier disappearing under the water. Assistance is launched from the beach and speedily races to the last known location where a search pattern is quickly commenced, time is of the essence. A lifesaver sees an exhausted hand clutching the air to stay afloat and aims their $rescue\ equipment\ towards\ the\ struggling\ victim\ -\ they\ let\ go$ of a rescue tube that lands in front of the grief-stricken victim and they clutch onto it for life. The lifesaver on this occasion is sitting in front of a large screen in the clubhouse and the rescue equipment is an inflatable tube dropped from an Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV), or better known as a Drone. The patient is soon attended to by the Inflatable Rescue Boat and is quickly transport to shore.

Surf Life Saving Sydney has been a lifesaving pioneer since the inception of the movement on our beaches in the early 1900's and continues to be today. Whether it be with the development of the Oxy-Viva Resuscitator, helicopter surf rescue, Inflatable Rescue Boats or Drone Technology Surf Life Sydney enjoys being part of what makes the organisation special – a continual effort to ensure we get better and smarter in the provision of life on our beaches.

Over the past three years Surf Life Saving Sydney has played an integral part of the organisations drive to find ways to experiment with, and trial this aerial technology. We have had some fantastic outcomes with our member trials in locating submerged objects and scenario based searches says Deputy President, Peter Agnew who has co-ordinated the project team. "It is quite exciting to see the number of developments in camera technology, search automation and shark spotting algorithms that one day in the not too distant future will take for granted as part of our standard patrol equipment.

Surf Life Saving Sydney conducted the first done think tank within the organisation with CASA, Central Coast Branch, SLSNSW and SLSA three years ago and may stakeholders have since seen the potential for the use of Drones.

On 28 February 2016, Westpac formally announced their sponsorship of the trial of autonomous, Little Ripper Lifesaver for search and rescue. The sponsorship complemented Westpac's existing 42-year sponsorship of the Westpac Life Saver Rescue Helicopter Services (WLRHS) and further strengthened their commitment to supporting local communities and making Australia safer.

Kane Hughes and Andrew Ugarte are the Branches first qualified drone operators and will move into further trials and operations linked to Little Ripper and Surf Lifesaving in the coming season. Meanwhile the organisation is fast developing its standard operating procedures, specification and award requirements for the equipment.

While drones won't replace the iconic Australian Lifesaver any time soon, it is envisioned that they have the potential to be a close companion in our search and rescue tool kit. Potential uses for the drone are:

- Missing swimmer searches
- Shark searching
- Investigation of submerged object offshore
- · Flotation aid deployment to distressed swimmer
- Hover over missing object as a reference point
- Transport of defib or first aid equipment or radio to distant or
- · Training and development footage
- Event safety observation
- Night operations (Flur or heat seeking cameras etc)





2016-2017 MALE/FEMALE MEMBERSHIP COMPARISON





Surf Life Saving Sydney has continued to develop and prosper across our ranks due to the strength and commitment of our members, clubs and sub-committees. Without these dedicated members within the organisation we would be unable to deliver the high standard and breadth of services across the branch. The Member Services portfolio is indebted to these members who make our work achievable in guiding the organisation to develop future leaders, sustainable practices and strong member based policies and programs.

This year the Member Services Committee and Youth Advisory Group embarked on providing positive change and value added services in a challenging environment. These two groups worked hard with members across the branch to help deliver a range of programs from a club, branch and state level.

A key highlight of the year was the development and deployment of the 18+ Youth Enrichment Program. This entry level leadership development course run by Surf Life Saving Sydney provided an opportunity for our future leaders to network, develop skills and widen perspective of Surf Life Saving. LIFESAVING AND EDUCATION



Once again, our season has come to an end, and I can proudly say that there were 'no lives lost' between the red and yellow flags.

Sydney Branch Lifesavers continue to protect patrolled beaches from Sydney Heads to National Parks as well as an extensive coastline with Support Skis and Offshore Rescue Boats operations.

Thank you to all clubs and lifesavers for a great job done this season.

In the 2016-17 season our statistics showed that the number people coming to our beaches had only slightly increased from the previous season, but surf Conditions varied significantly each weekend keeping our lifesavers on their toes throughout the season, especially over the Christmas holiday period, January and February. This saw the number of preventative actions preformed in the branch increase from 31,000 to 32,000.

It was great to see that even though our Patrols were extremely busy on the beach this season, we still continued to maintain our high level of lifesaving standards. This was echoed by our lifesaving supervisors throughout the season, with many clubs achieving 100% patrol efficiency results in the majority of inspections.

Our rescues were down by 588 across the Branch, but I can proudly say that there are 1,801 individuals out there who returned home to their families from a day out at beach because of the dedicated and highly skilled lifesavers in this Branch. When you consider that we had almost the same number of people on the beach and in the water as last season, varied and challenging conditions resulting in a

1000 more preventative actions being performed across the branch, and yet we were able to reduce the number of rescues across the branch by 588, amazing effort. Traditional rescue methods (Board and Tube) remained high, while IRB dropped again this season. First aids followed the same pattern, with the number marine stings and cuts and abrasions dropping by 50 % to 4.856.

Sadly our drowning fatalities outside of patrolling areas and hours rose from 8 to 12 this season, including the number resuscitations performed by our lifesavers (3).

Once again, the Support Operation were extremely busy through the season, with the number of call outs slightly dropping to 112. The RWC team preformed 126 rescues, while our duty officers did over 250 hours attending incidents throughout the branch. Many of the incidents the team attended to this season were extremely difficult and distressing, and I would like to thank member services for their support.

This season saw the Branch and State use Drone technology for the first time in a SAR operation at Maroubra. Working alongside our Rescue Coordinators, Duty Officers, Rescue 30, RWC, call out teams from Maroubra, South Maroubra and Coogee, allowed us to continue the search for a number of days in difficult conditions.

On the Education front, the overall award numbers increased from the previous season, and as like last season the number of members completing their proficiency in core awards increased. This is a great reflection on our clubs and education teams, that we have not only increased the number of members and awards on patrol, but we have retained our members from the previous season. With Many Clubs and branches in the state, and country struggling to retain members, it is great to see Sydney Branch in such a strong position.

The number of new bronze awards increased by 14% and SRC 6%, while their respective proficiencies were both up 6% across the branch. In an area where many clubs have struggled in the past, off the back of our hard work the last 3 seasons we saw steady awards numbers again in the branch, as with proficiencies increasing by 21% for IRBD, and 13% for IRBC. A fantastic effort by our IRB Trainers and Assessors.

The Sydney Branch Lifesaving, Education and Support Operations teams have again worked extremely hard this season maintaining the highest level of communication and engagement with the clubs. This season we introduced 2 new applications in the branch, an internal Gear Inspection App, and a Rock Fishing Safety App.

The Gear Inspection App was designed to assist the Branch Gear Inspection Team to review all Lifesaving equipment in

the branch. In the past this had been a very paper heavy task, which slowed down the process on the day. The new app allowed the team to provide instant feedback to clubs regarding any of the piece of equipment being tested, with clubs being able to access a detailed report on any outstanding items.

The second App we released was centred around Rock Fishing Safety. The allows individuals rock fishing the ability log their start time and return time. If they fail to check out or make an emergency call their emergency contact will be sent a text message containing their last known position, which can be relayed to emergency services. The App was launched at the Water safety community education and engagement day Coogee Beach 25th February 2017, organised by the NSW Department of Primary Industries (Fisheries NSW). The App was very well received amongst the Rock Fishing community, along with Randwick Council, NSW Police and other emergency service organisations. The App is designed to work only between South Head in Sydney harbour to Burning Palms in the Royal National Park, but we plan on expanding its reach in 2018.

There are a number of people who need to be recognised and thanked for their contribution to maintaining our lifesaving operations and standards, firstly to Linda Perrin and Victoria Raymond from Branch Office who organise and process lifesaving operations, without them the Branch would be difficult to operate. At the time of writing this report Victoria has left SLSS, to pursue other interests and challenges, from everyone in the Lifesaving and Education team, we wish you all the best.

Special thanks to Joel Wiseman and his team of Rescue Coordinators, Duty Officers, SurfCom operators, RWC operators and Off Shore Rescue Boat members. The team has worked tirelessly throughout the season, often in the background, to provide support and guidance to our patrol teams, including responding to hundreds of incidents within the branch outside of normal patrol hours.

Congratulations to our Lifesaver of the Year - Jedd Goggin, Volunteer of the Year - Wayne Druery, Sydney Branch Award of Excellence winners, along with our Rescue of the Month Winners.

Marissa Saunders and her educational team of facilitators, assessors and training officers for all their hard work in keeping lifesaving education at such a professional level. Also the great work the Operational Area Education Coordinators did in the areas throughout the season, Paul Hotton (Waverley), Beck Mister (Randwick), Steve Urquhart (Cronulla/Sutherland) and Peter Pearce (RNP).

To our Operational Area Coordinators Lifesaving led by the

Deputy Director of Lifesaving Matt Evans, Peter Quartly (Waverley), Matthew Spooner (Randwick), Graham Hill (Cronulla/Sutherland) and Mark Wood (RNP) and their assistants, thank you for your efforts working with Clubs to ensure standards were being maintained and guided clubs through positive engagement to improve their lifesaving patrols. Mid way through the season Michael Byrne who was the elected Lifesaving Operational Area Coordinator for Cronulla/Sutherland stood down from the position and we were fortunate to have this position filled by Graham Hill.

I look forward to working with the Clubs and Support Operations Services in 2017-2018 and wish everyone all the best during the off season.

SUPPORT OPERATIONS

The 2016 / 2017 season was an extremely busy season for all of the Support Operations Groups with many different scenarios to deal with and who once again did an outstanding job.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank each and every one of our support operations members for your ongoing commitment, dedication and professionalism for the way in which you conduct your duties. This was my first season as Support Operations Manager and with it came with many challenges, but I am proud of what has been delivered by the Support Operations team this season.

Unfortunately, the drowning toll for the year was 12, which is the highest in many years and significantly up on the previous year (8).

Sydney's Duty Officer & Rescue Coordinator team continued to deliver a first class service to our patrolling teams and I was excited to induct three new Duty Officers to the team, being Matthew Gentle (Elouera SLSC), Jackson Towns (Elouera SLSC) and Ryan Rosenbaum (Maroubra SLSC). Our Duty Officers and Rescue Coordinators continued to provide an invaluable service in the 24-hour surf emergency response callout system and worked closely alongside our volunteer surf lifesavers, council lifeguard services, Westpac Lifesaver Rescue Helicopter Service and other statutory emergency service authorities. This team allows the branch to provide a 24/7 response capability and are often called upon at all hours of the day/night. Our Duty Officers also acted as Safety & Emergency Management Officers (SEMC's) at SLSS carnivals to ensure minimum safety requirements were met.

I was excited to extend our Sydney RWC capabilities this season, having three RWCs service the branch and support our clubs. This season saw our RWC patrolling hours increase to 1053 hours significantly up on the previous year (by 335 hours), this is a testament to the dedicated operators who not only conduct normal beach patrols but go above and beyond to provide support to our clubs and roster themselves on for additional RWC patrols. I would like to congratulate the efforts of Jackson Towns who commenced the first half of the season as the RWC Coordinator and Andrew McKellar for continuing on in the roll for the second half of the season.

Surf Rescue 30 had another successful season attending a number of difficult rescues and maintaining a 24/7 response capability within the Branch. This season Surf Rescue 30 was tasked to 24 emergency responses and the skills displayed in patient access and treatment is a testament to the ongoing training and professionalism of the team. The group have also commenced redevelopment of the current base, which is an exiting time for the group and we look forward to seeing the base refurbished over the coming years, I would like to congratulate Matthew Harper who acted as the Group Captain and was a vital part to the groups improvement and success during the season.

The utilisation of our peer support services this season continued to increase due to the number of complex and difficult situations our members responded too. SLSNSW have changed the level of support offered to members and I must say it is a vast improvement on previous seasons. This service is available 24/7 to our members and it is imperative that we ensure our members are assisted through difficult processes as quickly and professionally as possible.

This season saw the introduction of Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV's) or Drones utilised in our Search & Rescue capabilities, this is the first time they have been utilised for a Surf Life Saving search operation within Australia and goes to show the innovation of Sydney Branch. Having access to these resources gave our lifesavers extra eyes in the sky delivering live vision back to the beach. Three of our members, Kane Hughes, Andrew Ugarte and Joel Wiseman were all trained in operating drones for Surf Life Saving Operations and we hope to see them utilised more in the future at once SLSNSW have finalised the Standard Operating Procedures in relation to the use of UAV's.


Total Rescues 1,801 Season 16/17




Total Rescues - 4 Year Comparison




Total First Aid 4,856 Season 16/17




Total First Aid - 4 Year Comparison




Total Preventions 16/17 32,141

Once again we commenced our season with Sydney Airport as our Major Sponsor assisting us to deliver the best Nipper program in the country - thanks once again to Sydney Airport for their continued support.

It's always great to start a Season with an awesome team, and once again we had Marcelo Garay - Deputy, Donna Hargreaves - Secretary, Michael Day - Surf Sports and George Benhayon - Lifesaving and Education - a great JAC Committee with some solid experience.

Our Age Manager Courses were once again very well attended across our two sessions. Thanks to the clubs for encouraging so many people to attend, this season over 160 people gained their Age Managers Award. These sessions are a great opportunity to share the role of Nippers within the surf clubs and what we can achieve when we work together.

Director of Surf Sports Report

Another season with no lives lost on our watch at Bondi Beach. Thank you to our lifesaving team led by James Rogers and his Captain of Lifesaving Charles Cotton. The two of them worked hard with their sub-committee through the season to ensure our patrols had the equipment required and could request assistance where required. As the role becomes more onerous with compliance and numbers, we look to add more people to the team to ensure we can stay on top of our obligations on Australia's busiest beach.

In last year's report I mentioned we were going to start purchasing more new equipment as much was outdated. Our Director of Finance Jon Fyfe has managed the club's finances closely to ensure we can replace equipment and ensure we can put some money aside as security in future years. At the time of this report the specific figure wasn't confirmed however we will be posting a healthy net surplus of approx. \$180k. Our surf sports team this year exceeded expectations. David Auckett, Nick Nezval and a strong sub-committee worked tirelessly to plan for every event this year. In a year where the two major carnivals were affected by weather, we were able to still post some fantastic performances. Our female boat crew won a state gold medal, we won an R&R gold and our masters team won the point score at National titles for the first time. The strong results come from a team culture within surf sports that ensures everyone is supporting each other, I have no doubt there will be continued success next season.

Our Club's deputy president Pep Font involves himself in a number of areas of the club including bringing home one of our Australian championship gold medals and also still a patrol captain on the beach. In the last season Pep started what will be an annual survey of our members, this will allow the opportunity for our wider membership to have a voice. Last season also saw the introduction of community talks, they consisted of a range of topics from nutrition, open water swimming, digital tech and

Lia Trebilcock and her deputy Kristy McIntyre led the Education section over the last season. The education section is our newer members' first taste of the club and it's great to see trainers continuing to hold a strong standard for our new lifesavers. We had just over 70 new candidates achieve their bronze medallion this season with 3 members achieving their gold medallion. Our Director of Nippers Scott Ryan and his team look after our voungest members. The section over the last year performed strongly and ensured our numbers continue to stay high. We continue to work on bridging the transition between nippers and patrols, in the next season we will look at trialling a few different methods to ensure we retain more of our nippers.

Our sponsorship/marketing team led by Fiona Tschaut exceeded previous targets to heavily contribute to our healthy surplus. In the last year we started working with large brands and working out how we can actively promote them, this has produced some great interactions such as our Seafolly and IBM activation. Siobhan as deputy worked hard on the digital side and ensuring our social and web presence grows from strength to strength. Thank you to Leo in his role as director of administration section



for another year and he was assisted this season by Garret O'Conner As the club grows in size this role becomes more complex as we look to grow our revenue streams. Within Leo's portfolio is our paid administrators - Vivienne Veckranges, Louise Santos and Helen Jenkinson; thank you to the hours you put into the club and each of you contributed to the results achieved in the last season there is no doubt that we wouldn't be where we are without each of your efforts the last season.

Our last season was successful in a number of ways however it was also one of the hardest years emotionally for many at our club. Fifteen of our members passed away in the last season including our patron and three active members. Our patron Les Hawkins passed away in late 2016, patrolling (long service member) Lee Bowman passed in early January, IRB Driver David Spierin in early January and Michael Glazer in mid April. Thank you to all members for supporting each other and being there for the loved ones of our members that passed away.

The club has a number of other sub-committees comprised of members putting in countless hours every week, some of these are in the spotlight whereas others work hard behind the scenes. Some of these run events such as the Legends Lunch, the Bluewater swim and Bondi-Watsons Bay paddle; other groups have organised the website, looked at a rules revision and countless other projects. Thank you to all of you. Looking forward to the season ahead and seeing to each section thrive. We will be looking for more people to assist with small roles in different sub-committees to make the job easier. We have a rich history at Bondi and we look to add to it with success in the years to come.

Our rescues this year were just over 250, we had nearly 3,000 preventative actions and 300 first aids. This summer's challenge was typified by Christmas Day where 66 rescues were performed. A phenomenal statistic. The difficulty with the statistics is we believe we don't capture all of our rescues and other actions and they are very likely an underestimation.

On behalf of the Board of Management, we salute our incredible volunteers who are a credit to the Club year after year. I would also like to thank the great work of the Waverley Lifeguards and we are very proud of the close working relationship we have with them. Testament to the great work of our volunteer lifesavers is longtime lifeguard legend Rod Kerr (Kerrbox) writing a letter of endorsement to the Club which included the following "I've been wanting to drop the Bronte Surf Club a short note to thank all your patrollers and water safety personnel for the wonderful support they have given us over the years, especially this past season when numerous rescues required the assistance of the Club's lifesavers... this year in particular, the Bronte Surf Club volunteer surf lifesavers have done a tremendous job and helped us patrol what has been at times very challenging conditions..."

Our administration staff continues to work diligently and with the support of wonderful sponsors and members, we have established a strong base for our future.



We expected some 'down time' over the course of the winter off season, but any such plans were the quickly brushed aside with the impact of the severe storms which hit the east coast of Sydney in early June 2016. The Coogee club house suffered significant damage and an enormous effort was required to clear away the debris and make good the structural damage. We would like to acknowledge all of the support we received from Surf Life Saving Sydney and all clubs across the branch in relation to the matter. The offers of support were generous and very much welcomed. We must also acknowledge the incredible efforts made by the Randwick City Council in helping us get back on our feet and in rebuilding the club. We were also proud to continue to provide patrolling assistance for another season to Garie Surf Club. It was also heartening to see many of our members assist in District and Branch roles – and also SurfCom. We would like to thank the Randwick Municipal life guards for all their support over the course of the season and also acknowledge the incredible work done by the off shore services in the ORB and jet-ski and support operations area. We are proud to maintain our 110 year record of "no lives lost" between the flags at Coogee.

Our education area excelled across the whole of the season, putting through a huge number of awards, both in the bronze and special awards area. We also continued to train a noticeable number of squads for the demanding gold medallion award. We also delivered a number of innovative community projects, especially the Coogee Dippers programme which provided surf awareness training to young autistic children and gave on going assistance to the Randwick Diggers Club and its annual community day.

The club once again ran two major ocean swims this season, the Coogee island Challenge; the first in November 2016 and the second in April 2017. These events have become a key fixture on the Sydney ocean swims calendar and were very well attended on both occasions. Perfect conditions on both days saw record numbers sign up on the morning and on both occasions we were able to have the main swim go round the back of Wedding Cake Island.

Our annual carnival is held on the first Saturday of every
February and is one of the longest – if not the longest, running
surf carnivals in Australia. This season's carnival was extremely
memorable as it saw the return of surf boast to Coogee after a
short period away. There was good attendance at the Carnival,
a wonderful march past with the Scots College Bag Pipes and
Drums and much camaraderie in the air. A great day – and thanks
to all of the officials who helped out.



Our showing in the competition areas of the club was strong and we performed well at Sydney carnivals and at the State competition. The national titles showed a strong performance by our ever growing masters area and we achieved gold medals in the flags and the girls R&R. Any hopes of further medals however were thwarted with the arrival of the tail end of Cyclone Debbie and there was disappointment when the water areas were called off. Fingers crossed for Perth!

We remain incredibly proud of our nippers area: the Coogee Minnows continues to go from strength to strength and the sheer professionalism of our Minnows Executive never ceases to amaze us. Coogee Minnows is one of the largest nipper squads in Australia and makes us very proud – and confident in the future of the Club. Our Club lifesaving activities were of a high standard this past season. We had approximately two hundred and seventy active patrol members who saw a fifty percent increase in rescues and preventions and doubling of first aids.

Club Vice Captain, Darryl Easton organised our patrols with good numbers regularly in attendance. Cronulla were recognised formally when at the SLSS Awards of Excellence where we were awarded the Patrol Efficiency Award for our area.

The beach remained in good condition for most of the season making it a very pleasant and safe place to be. However, toward the end of the season, sand erosion and rock exposure presented several challenges for patrols and our daily activities.

We had a good season in lifesaving education, with very good numbers in basic awards meaning new and trained lifesavers on our beach. We also had high IRB award numbers, achieving the most IRB awards in the Branch. Our last IRB squad of the season included the other area Clubs with both candidates and trainers and this was a great co-operative success.

Our Junior Activity Group, the Cronulla Crays ran a very good program this season. We saw a continued growth in Crays numbers meaning a full beach of activities each week. The very successful Learn to Swim and Assessment Program, sponsored by Tradies, was run again for our younger groups. The Black Caps nipper group for young members with special needs continues to operate very successfully thanks to the good work of Cameron and Lauren Pyett plus Sherie and Emma Lisser.

The Club Coaching and Competition section continues the re-establishment and development process's of the last couple of seasons. Our results at Aussies were good in a cyclone interrupted carnival and it was unfortunate that our Cadet to Open water competitors including boaties were largely unable to compete. Our core activity is that of lifesaving and the protection of the community who choose to use this magnificent beach and it is with pleasure that again we can report "No Lives Lost".

On the administrative front a number of concurrent tasks were undertaken throughout the season in order to assist the club maximise the revenue opportunities available to it from commercial operators. These include: seeking expressions of interest for the operator of the café to be constructed as part of building works currently underway; obtaining council approval for the works; obtaining member approval and a guarantee from the Sutherland Shire Council (council) to borrow the funds necessary for the works; negotiating the loan; designing the scope and appointing a builder; and negotiating with existing restaurant to extend their lease to 2022...

Earlier in the season we had finished construction works that increased storage space available for craft; these works were funded by the club and through grants secured with the assistance of our local federal and state members. The Club extends its thanks to our Federal Member Mr Scott Morrison, Treasurer, and his State colleague Mr Mark Speakman, Attorney-General for their continued support of the Club and in particular their assistance with funding for our construction projects. The Sutherland Shire Council continues its generous support to the four Bate Bay clubs and the close relationship between the clubs and the lifeguards deserves special mention.

Elouera members contributed 305 hours or 33% of the total 914 hours performed by the branch Support Skis, and 247 hours or 31% of the total 798 hours performed by the branch Surfcom operators. Jackson Towns and Andrew McKellar shared the role of branch RWC co ordinator for the season and trained new drivers during the winter.

Our team searched tirelessly for the entire day in testing surf conditions, without complaint and in a very professional manner, providing 3 IRBs, an ATV and close to 30 members.

Education was led by Paul O'Donohue and his team helped our members achieve 50 Surf Rescue Certificates, 45 Bronze Medallions, & numerous other awards. They trained a total of 231 Awards placing us fifth in the overall Branch standings.

Our core role is of course Lifesaving. We are in very good shape when it comes to life saving. Those that manage Surf Lifesaving Clubs know that the season is a full 12 months with no real off season so whilst patrols have concluded, IRB competition is underway along with planning for Presentation nights, AGM's followed by debriefing of the past year and planning for next season.

Reviewing Lifesaving/Education over the 2016/17 at South Maroubra I am able to report our members were directly involved in rescuing 128 swimmers, 6182 preventative actions completed, 860 first aid cases were attended to by Club Members so a very busy year.

Regrettably whilst I am pleased to report No Lives Lost during patrol hours sadly the same cannot be said 'after hours' when a 14-year-old boy and his cousin from Western Sydney entered the notorious south end rip @ Maroubra beach around 8pm late December where he was immediately pulled out to sea and soon after drowned, his young cousin was rescued by a passer-by. It is appropriate I mention the efforts of South Maroubra members on the night throwing their hands up to help with the search and also the following days with the search for the victim and later the development of an after hours rescue device being managed by our DOL Damien Woods.

It is also appropriate I separately mention the effort of Hamish Manks who whilst on holidays was called upon to resuscitate a boy who had drowned at a beach. Thanks to his extensive efforts the victim was successfully brought back to life and whilst the long-term prognosis is unknown, the victim was given a fighting chance of survival by Hamish!

Within the Ed Services space our club continues to improve on the quality, quantity and variety of courses being offered with the increasing number of valued trainers. In total 151 awards were completed within the senior club and an additional 403 Surf Ed awards. Congratulations to all of the trainers and special mention to Nicole Cooney who recently received recognition of Sydney Branch Trainer of the Year at Branch Awards of Excellence. We wish Nicole all the best as she now goes forward to NSW State Awards of Excellence in August 2017.

Well done to our lifesaving and Nipper members!

Competition wise throughout the 2016/17 season our members did the club proud in and out of the water with IRB competition underway at the time of writing. I am really proud to report a number of our members entered into and completed the Coolangatta Gold which is a first in recent years. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009 and Associations Incorporation Regulation (NSW) 2010 and the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991. The committee has determined that the not-for-profit entity is not a reporting entity as there is unlikely to exist users who are unable to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs.

(b) Property Plant & Equipment

Property Plant and Equipment are carried at historical cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. Individual items costing less than \$300 are expensed immediately through the income statement rather than capitalised on the balance sheet

The depreciable amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the entities commencing from the time the asset is held and ready for use

Assets excluding leasehold buildings are depreciated over their lives utilising the following rates:

- Buildings 2.5% - 10%

- Plant & Equipment 7.5% - 40%

Building Improvements are amortised over the estimated useful lives.

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(e) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

- Donations are recognised at the fair value of the donations received or receivable. Donations in the form of services are measure by referring to either the fair value of the services received of the fair value of the asset or the asset enhancement resulting from the services.
- Sale of Goods: Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised when control of the goods has passed to the buyer, the amount of revenue can be measured reliably and it is probable that it will be received by the
- Rendering of services: When the outcome of the transaction involving the rendering of services can be estimated reliably, revenue associated with the transaction is recognised by reference to the percentage of the services performed.
- Interest Revenue: Interest revenue is recognised as revenue when received.
- Member Subscriptions: Member subscriptions are recognised as revenue when received.

All Revenue is stated net of the amount of Goods and Services Tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

(g) Employee benefits

A liability is recognised for benefits accruing to employees in respect of wages and salaries, annual leave, long service leave and termination benefits when it is probable that settlement will be required and they are capable of being measured reliably.

Report on the Financial Report

An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Members of the Executive Committee, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Receipts from cash donations and other cash fundraising activities are a significant source of revenue for the Sydney Surf Life Saving Incorporated. The Sydney Surf Life Saving Incorporated has determined that it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of donations and other fundraising activity revenue prior to entry in its financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us about revenue from these sources was limited, our audit procedures for donations and other fundraising activity revenue had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. We therefore are unable to express an opinion on whether cash donations and other cash fundraising activity revenue obtained by the Sydney Surf life Saving Incorporated are complete.

Qualified opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph:

- (a) the financial report of Sydney Surf Life Saving Incorporated is in accordance with the and the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991, the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009 and Associations Incorporation Regulation (NSW) 2010, including:
- (i) giving a true and fair view of the entities' financial position as at 31 May 2017 and of its performance for the year then ended; and
- (ii) complying with Australian Accounting Standards as described in Note 1,
- (b) the financial report gives a true and fair value of the financial results of fundraising appeals conducted during the financial year; and
- (e) at the date of this report, there are reasonable grounds to believe that Sydney Surf Life Saving Incorporated will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.

Emphasis of matter

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report which describes which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report is prepared to meet the requirements of the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991, Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009 and Associations Incorporation Regulation (NSW) 2010.* As a result, the special purpose financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

jacket legislation in the Randwick LGA. Thanks to the Director of Lifesaving, Simon Torsellini, for his work in getting this App across the line.

The drone initiative has been making steady progress in its development and Sydney Branch members are taking a lead role. Thanks to our Deputy President, Peter Agnew, for his efforts in ensuring that our Branch is well represented in the project.

Innovation in Surf Sports is also the subject of focus led by Wayne Druery and we will see several innovations trialled in the coming season.

The Gear Inspection App and the Member Recognition App were developed by Simon Torsellini this season and were both very successful. These Apps will be further developed during the season, reducing paperwork, providing useful data and delivering efficiency.

The office staff are a key component in our ability to deliver on our Strategic Plan.
