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PRESIDENT



The 2017/2018 season has been extremely busy for Surf Life Saving Sydney. In my fourth year as President, I have been very fortunate to have the same board supporting me this season with the exception to Elissa Hancock – The Director of Administration who joined the team this year and has been a great asset to the executive team and the broader BOM. The main focus this season has been to ensure we provide relevant value to the 15 clubs in Sydney Branch delivering on our ongoing commitment to deliver leadership and guidance.

This year saw Surf Life Saving Sydney recognised as SLSNSW Branch of the Year this is an amazing accomplishment and is a true reflection of the amount of focus and effort put in by the whole team. I am truly grateful for the support provided to be by the team as this is an awesome result in securing this award which has never been won by Sydney Branch.

This year saw the induction of our first female Life Member into the distinguished list existing Life Members, congratulations to Joan Vaughan and Margaret Pearce. I would also like to congratulate Glen Clarke who was also awarded the honor of Sydney Branch Life Member. Ron Hegarty was also awarded the Presidents Medal, congratulations Ron.

The year in review, with our continued focus on innovation and sustainability for the future, enabling us to continue to deliver against the strategic priorities as outlined in our strategic plan while managing a heavily operational organisation.

The key areas of focus this past season have been on strategy and innovation while continuing to improve the operational

aspects of the organisation. Under the continued guidance of Peter Agnew we have been in a position to ensure we have a strategic focus while delivering against our core operational requirements. During this process we continued to engage with all the clubs ensuring we were focused in the appropriate areas. Peter also continued to ensure we were leading across the Drone Technology front which has now been embedded into our support operations team.

On a lifesaving and education front Simon Torsellini and his team continued to deliver some great results across the portfolio. Matthew Spooner Manager of Lifesaving has been a great asset to the team and has provided leadership and direction to the lifesaving coordinators across the branch. The ever-increasing requirement for the support operations led by Matthew Evans Support Operations Manager across the branch with some testing incidents occurring that required many hours of interactions from all the teams. This season saw the team and our clubs faced with some tragedies putting the clubs and services under significant pressure. I have also been encouraged by the amount of engagement and focus David Kowald the Education Manager has provided on the education and I would like to thank the team for their continued effort provided by the army of trainers, assessors and facilitators across the branch.

The financial health and compliance of the organisation has been led by Marissa Saunders Director of Finance and Compliance however unfortunately Marissa decided to resign mid-term due to increasing work commitments with her new role. During the season Marissa has instigated a number of initiatives from a finance and compliance perspective which ensured we remained compliant. Our book keeper Sharon Porter came and has fitted into the team very well and managed our accounts in a very professional manner. In terms of major initiatives undertaken from a branch perspective was paying out one of the investment properties reducing cash on hand and we are also midway through consolidation of the accounts with St George.

The Surf Sports team lead by Wayne Druery has also provided some great opportunities supported by the clubs. The main focus was to continually challenge the way we do things today. The team have continued to deliver on the objectives set by hosting a series of Nutri-Grain in Sydney Branch which was successfully run at North Cronulla for the second year.

This season also saw a successful Branch Championships and Junior Championships held at Maroubra with a full schedule being completed on both days. I would like to thank Danny Donohoe (Maroubra President) and his team for the management of the two days and for continuing to support the event.

Sydney Branch also took a team to the SLSNSW Inter Branch Championships and came away with second place. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Team Manager John De Cean and the competitors for achieving a great result.

The Member Services team have also been working on a strategy to engage more youth and females into key positions within the

organisation while ensuring we have a succession plan in place to support the future direction of the organisation. This year we launched a number of conferences dedicated to the youth within SLSS, this has been met with a high level of enthusiasm of which will continue into the future being led by Keith Grima, Keith resigned mid-term in order to step up his retirement activities. Charlie Pavlou has taken on this role and I'm sure will do well bringing a youthful perspective to the role and engaging the younger generation of our organisation.

The Junior Development team led by Doug Hawkins continued to manage juniors and deliver the development camps. These camps ensure the juniors of our organisation are provided with the necessary skills to be future leaders of the organisation. Doug and his team also continued to roll out the junior scenario training across the Branch.

The 2017/2018 Surf Life Saving AOE saw a revamp of the evening with a new look and feel and location was a great success and a tribute to the work the BOM and office staff put into the evening. I would like to personally thank Elissa Hancock – Director of Administration who managed all of the planning for the event and delivered a great result. The evening saw recognition of the best lifesavers and competitors in our Branch.

Maintaining the protection of our Lifesavers, beyond the flags, is a necessity of our organisation moving forward. The Surf Life Saving movement has taken a strong stance on Member Protection over the past season and Surf Life Saving Sydney has been an early adopter of positions by SLSA on the protection and safeguarding of Young People as well as being proactive in applying SLSA policy to our own.

Sydney Branch, over the past season has seen a large increase in members completing the Member Protection Information Officer training. The program, facilitated by Morgan Lander from 'Play by The Rules' was run over two weeknights in May, with over 30 members completing the course.

The training provides members with the knowledge, skill and protocol on practical scenarios where they would likely be required to use their MPIO status. The role is far less complicated than most members might believe. It requires members, when approached as an MPIO to simply provide information on; relevant policy, documentation or processes involved in resolving a grievance. The role is one of impartiality which only requires the MPIO to listen and takes no part in further investigation or proceedings.

The award itself is recognised by SLSNSW upon completion and provides clubs with Members who can help leverage their position as a compliant, safe and positive community hub.

The stellar engagement from clubs in providing participants for the MPIO course showcases the commitment in creating a safe environment for our members across the Branch. Further efforts from Education Manager David Kowald and the Education Team in updating our Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators Manual to be completely adherent to SLSA's MPP 6.05. This solidifies SLSS's position as a Branch that is leading the way in maintaining and proactively improving the protection of our Members.

SUPPORT OPERATIONS VEHICLES

Increased mobility, efficiency and most of all professionalism is what our new Support Operations vehicles will contribute when assisting frontline surf lifesavers and our partner external emergency service agencies.

If we rewind and reflect on Support Operations within Sydney Branch you will see that we were the pioneers in providing services to areas outside our traditional patrolled locations and times. Support Operations have provided Duty Officers, Jet Rescue Boats (now Offshore Rescue Boat), Rescue Water Craft and Drones amongst other initiatives.

Fast forward to June 2018 and again Surf Lifesaving Sydney is leading the way. To further enhance Support Operations the Duty Officer team has been fortunate enough to obtain two vehicles to be used to respond to incidents and support our patrol teams throughout our Branch.

Both vehicles are fully kitted out mobile response units, almost a surf club on wheels! Each vehicle has been sign written in the latest SLSNSW livery providing a highly visible and easily recognisable asset. Contained within each vehicle is:

- Rescue Tube
- Oxy Viva
- First Aid Kit
- Major Trauma Kit
- Public Address system
- Shark Alarm
- Incident Response Kit (including sea dye, torches and incident command kit)
- Radios
- Mobile Phone
- Sat Nav
- Warning beacons

With the capacity to carry a drone onboard and tow a jetski to almost any location this truly brings surf lifesaving to the people.

These vehicles have been able to be funded through the generous support of SLSNSW and through blackspot funding which means there is minimal financial burden on Branch. Throughout the second half of season 2017/18 duty officers were out scouring the coastline collecting data on rock fishers and their compliance to wearing lifejackets within the Randwick City Council area. This data was fed back to SLSNSW to be utilised in reporting to aide in the benefits of lifejackets whilst partaking in this sport. In return Surf Lifesaving Sydney secured a grant to offset the lease and operational costs of a vehicle.

So how will these vehicles assist our frontline patrols? Firstly, our Duty Officers will no longer need to be using their own personal vehicles to conduct patrolling activities, this means Duty Officers can now be positioned at anticipated hot spots and can quickly respond when an incident occurs; think Gordon's



Bay on Australia Day where a Duty Officer can be positioned in anticipation or Bondi on a 40-degree day where they could potentially assist the patrol with beach bursting at the seams. The other key advantage is now Duty Officers will have all the equipment available to affect an efficient response meaning if a Duty Officer is first on scene to an incident in a non-patrolled location they will have basic life support equipment on hand rather than waiting for a patrol or external agency, this has the potential to be life changing!

During after-hour callouts or incidents at non-patrolled locations such as La Perouse these vehicles are instilling a confidence in the public and emergency services that Surf Lifesaving is an authority in aquatic search and rescue. The change in attitude has already been seen when responding to an incident with a greater respect being afforded to our organisation when working in collaboration with external agencies and a positive reception.

So where to from here? It is anticipated that further vehicles can be obtained on a cost neutral basis to further enhance a Duty Officer network. Initially, a vehicle will be with the on-call Sydney Branch Rescue Coordinator and the second vehicle will be utilised by Duty Officers within the Eastern Suburbs of the Branch (South Head to Botany Bay) on a rostered basis. This decision has been driven by the number of callouts and incidents as well as the needs of clubs and identified blackspots. Bate Bay (Cronulla Beaches) and the Royal National Park have been identified as a high priority and as such the focus will be on providing a support vehicle to this area next.

So, if you see one of these vehicles at your beach over the summer please come and take a look so you are familiar with the equipment, have a chat with the Duty Officer to see how Support Operations can assist you in your patrolling requirements and provide you with alternate pathways within Lifesaving.

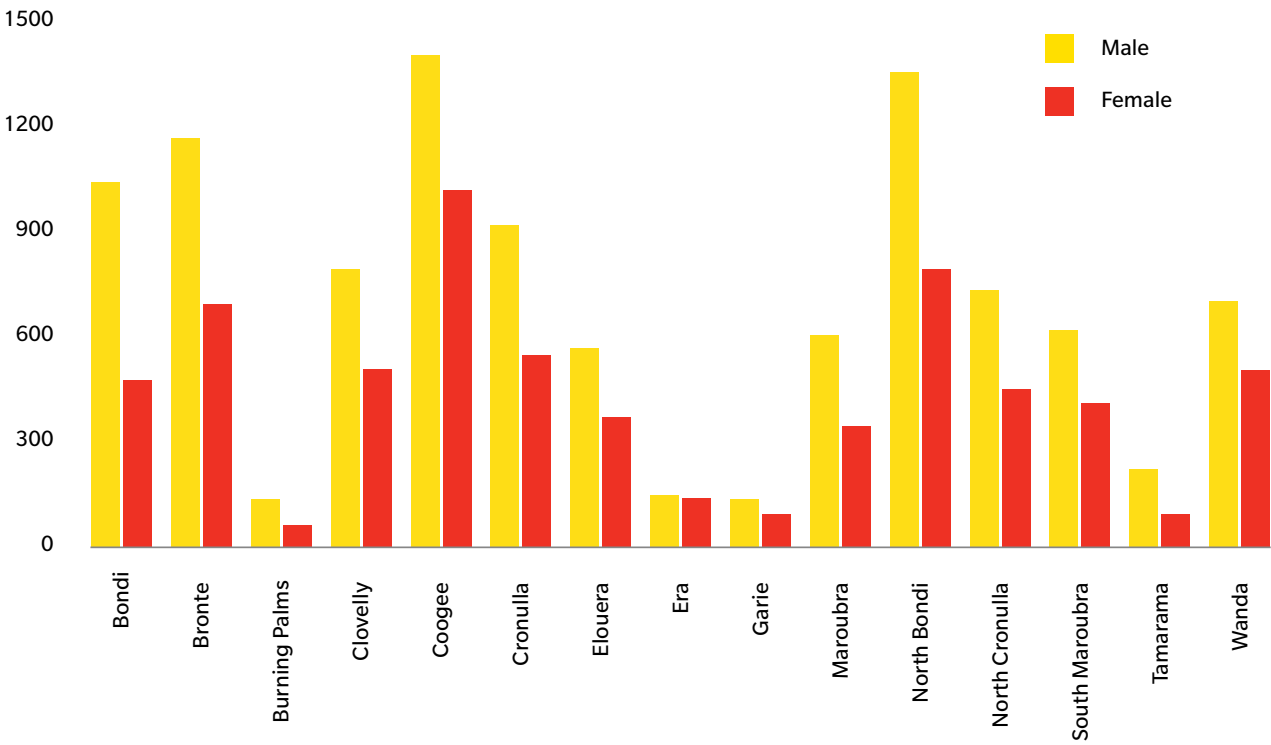
Most of all, take advantage and give us a shout if you require assistance or advice at your beach! Support Operations is there to assist you and is now a core component of our operations.

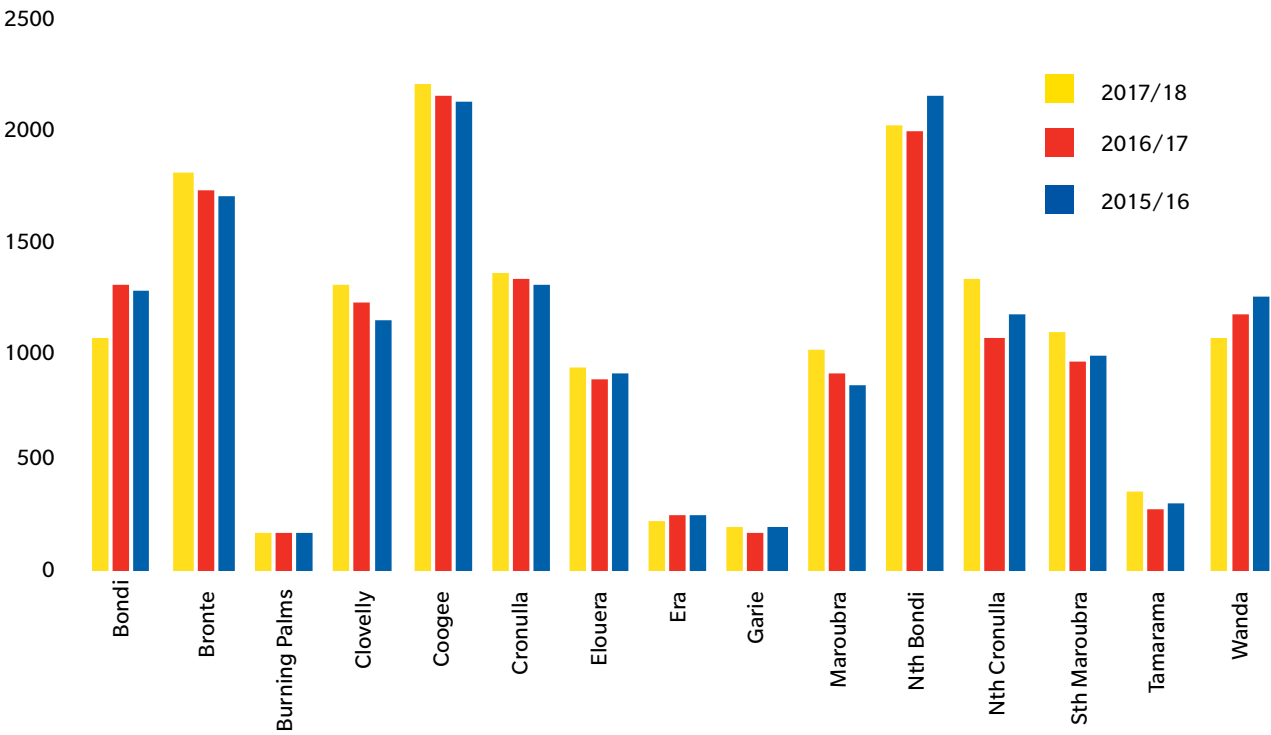

Over the past season Brent was asked to take on the role of Director of Education at Bondi SBLSC. He picked up with role with enthusiasm and commitment completely focused on setting goals for education at Bondi. Through Brent's hard work he was able to ensure that 20 probationary trainers were fully endorsed as Trainers in BM, ART, Spinal and IRB which assisted greatly with the education team at the Club. His team of trainers successfully trained core awards including 105 Bronze Cert II, 29 SRCs, 3 SMIRBDrivers, 19 IRB Crew, and 82 ART awards with many more members gaining higher awards. Patrol teams were provided with a skills matrix recommending that all patrolling members hold a First Aid award as well as ART.

Brent also activated a small team to do a formal review of the clubs' member loss rates. A complete data set of 10 years awards and patrols were put through data analysis to gain a better understanding of the lifecycle of a member. Some amazing results came from this data analysis which the club is putting into action.

Brent also led the re-enactment of the 80th Anniversary of Black Sunday, a key moment in Bondi and SLSC history. He gathered a large team of volunteers to plan the event and held numerous meetings over the months leading up to the day. The re-enactment was designed to achieve the following aims – to education club members and the broader public on the history of lifesaving and the events of Black Sunday 6th February 1938, to increase public awareness of the dangers of rips, promote beach safety and educate swimmers to always swim between the flags, to highlight the improvements in lifesaving techniques and resources in the last 80 years. The success of the re-enactment event received much publicity including a statement in Parliament by Ms Upton on 8th February.

Brent's commitment, passion and delivery is testament to the meaning of volunteer and a very worthy recipient of Sydney Branch Volunteer of the Year 2017-2018.

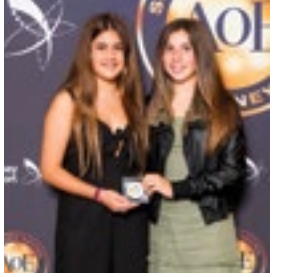

MEMBER SERVICES



The Member Services portfolio encompasses a variety of activities including member development, member recognition and member protection.

Surf Life Saving NSW (SLSNSW) shares responsibility for many of these activities. Surf Life Saving Sydney have been working to support SLSNSW activities and programmes, ensuring that SLSA Policies and Procedures are well understood and that clubs are compliant.

The 18–25 Enrichment Programme was very well supported by the Branch this season. The focus of this seasons’ event was on both retention issues related to 18–25 youth membership, and the development of a ‘talent pool’ to identify future leaders and provide succession pathways for those members. The 18-25 Enrichment Programme was held at North Wollongong this year and produced high-level engagement between participants and senior members of the Branch. The weekend was very successful and enjoyable. I would like to thank President George Shales, Manager of Lifesaving Matt Spooner

and Manager of Support Services Matt Evans for spending the weekend with our participants.

A great example of the member development process is the succession of Charlie Pavlou, who was appointed to take my place as Director of Member Services in April 2018. Charlie has been a participant in various development programmes during the last few seasons and facilitated this season’s Enrichment Programme.

Member Protection has generated a great deal of activity this season, with Member Protection workshops and Member Protection Information officer training. LIFESAVING AND EDUCATION



Once again, our season has come to an end, and I can proudly say that there were no lives lost between the red and yellow flags.

Sydney Branch Lifesavers continue to protect patrolled beaches from Sydney Heads to the Royal National Park as well as an extensive coastline with Support Skis and Offshore Rescue Boats operations.

Thank you to all clubs and lifesavers for a great job done this season.

In the 2017-18 season our statistics showed that the number people coming to our beaches had only slightly increased from the previous season, but surf conditions varied significantly each weekend keeping our lifesavers on their toes throughout the season, especially over the Christmas holiday period, January and February. This saw the number of preventative actions preformed in the branch increase from 32,000 to 39,000.

It was great to see that even though our Patrols were extremely busy on the beach this season, we still continued to maintain our high level of lifesaving standards. This was echoed by our lifesaving co-ordinator's throughout the season, with many clubs achieving 100% patrol efficiency results in the majority of inspections.

Our rescues were down by 254 across the Branch, but I can proudly say that there are 1,547 individuals out there who returned home to their families from a day out at beach because of the dedicated and highly skilled lifesavers in this Branch. When you consider that we had almost the same number of people on the beach and in the water as last season, varied and

challenging conditions resulting in 7000 more preventative actions being performed across the branch, and yet we were able to reduce the number of rescues across the branch by 254, amazing effort. Traditional rescue methods (Board and Tube) remained high, while IRB dropped again this season to only 12% of all rescues. First aids followed the same pattern, with the number of marine stings and cuts and abrasions dropping by 16% to 4,190.

Our drowning fatalities outside of patrolling areas and hours fell from 12 to 9 this season, with the number of resuscitations performed by our lifesavers rising to 7 (3 previous year).

Once again, the Support Operations were extremely busy through the season, with the number of call outs slightly dropping to 121. The RWC team preformed 106 rescues, while our duty officers did over 300 hours attending incidents throughout the branch. Many of the incidents the team attended to this season were extremely difficult and distressing, and I would like to thank Member Services for their support.

This season saw the Branch expand its Drone Operations, and in February 2018 began rostered patrols north and south for Drone Operators. Our initial EOI for operators we received over 35 Sydney Branch Members apply, with 16 gaining their wings, and the remainder starting their course prior to the 2018/19 Season.

Our Duty Officers completed a Rock Fishing survey for SLNSW and the NSW Government. The survey required the team to visit area's that had been identified as rock fishing blackspots between Randwick and La Perouse.

We also saw the first patrols for Support Ski 4, based out of North Bondi. Congratulations to all involved, including the members that patrolled. The Ski further strengthens our support operation capabilities in branch, allowing us to continue to provide support to clubs while an incident is in progress.

On the Education front, the overall award numbers increased from the previous season, and as like last season the number of members completing their proficiency in core awards increased. This is a great reflection on our clubs and education teams, that we have not only increased the number of members and awards on patrol, but we have retained our members from the previous season. With Many Clubs and Branches in the state and country struggling to retain members, it's great to see Sydney Branch in such a strong position.

The number of new Bronze Awards and SRC Awards increased while their respective proficiencies were strong across the Branch. In an area where many clubs have struggled in the past, off the back of our hard work the last 4 seasons we saw steady awards numbers again in IRBD, IRBC, BBM and First Aid. Congratulations Andrew McKellar and Jake McDonald, this season we saw our RWC awards jump by 42%. A fantastic effort by our 2 Trainers. As we lead into the start of season, we have already commenced training for another 10 riders, with another course starting in September 18.

Our Gear Inspection App was used by Sydney Northern Beaches this season, and they immediately saw the benefits we enjoyed

the previous season. Sydney Northern Breaches halved the gear inspection time across their branch, while Sydney Branch completed all Waverley, Randwick and Batebay clubs in a single day with the same inspectors. We will be making further changes in the off season to the process, and hopefully making a better experience for Assessors and Clubs.

There are a number of people who need to be recognised and thanked for their contribution to maintaining our lifesaving operations and standards. Firstly to Linda Perrin and Toni Murphy from Branch Office who organise and process lifesaving operations. Without them the Branch would be difficult to operate.

Special thanks to Matt Evans and his team of Rescue Coordinators, Duty Officers, SurfCom Operators, RWC operators, Drone Operators and Off Shore Rescue Boat members. The team has worked tirelessly throughout the season, often in the background, to provide support and guidance to our patrol teams, including responding to hundreds of incidents within the branch outside of normal patrol hours.

Congratulations to our Lifesaver of the Year – Jackson Towns, Volunteer of the Year - Brent Jackson, Sydney Branch Award of Excellence Winners, along with our Rescue of the Month Winners.

David Kowald and his educational team of Facilitators, Assessors and Training Officers for all their hard work in keeping lifesaving education at such a professional level. Also, the great work the area co-ordinators did in the areas throughout the season, Paul Hotton (Waverley), Bec Mister (Randwick), Steve Urghart (Batebay) and Peter Pearce OAM (RNP). Special thanks to Paul Hotton, who will be stepping down this year as Area Coordinator Waverley and Community Education. Paul has done a fantastic job over many years and will continue to assist the branch next season with Community Education.

To our lifesaving coordinators lead by Lifesaving Manager Matthew Spooner, Britany Banks (Waverley), Stu Fillman (Randwick), Graham Hill & Mike Batty (Batebay) and Mark Wood (Royal National Park), thank you for your efforts working with Clubs to ensure standards were being maintained and guided clubs through positive engagement to improve their lifesaving patrols. Big thank you to Graham Hill and Mike Batty, for their support and effort over the years, both Graham and Mike won't be standing next season.

2017/18 was another successful season for the Support Operations Team with the following members gaining awards for their outstanding contributions at the recent Sydney Branch Awards of Excellence:

Of the many incidents through the season one stands out being the collaborative response from Surf Lifesaving Sydney in responding to the Royal National Park bush fires. Our local knowledge and expertise were called upon by the Rural Fire Service, requesting that we have a Duty Officer placed at the Fire Command Centre at Heathcote to provide liaison between our three National Park Clubs, helicopter service, offshore rescue boat and RWC. With communications being poor with the other agencies our radio network, assets and personnel were called upon to provide critical updates and assist with evacuations throughout the park. The positive comments received were outstanding and a credit to our members.

The Duty Officer Team again worked tirelessly supporting our clubs throughout the season both during and outside of patrol hours and patrol locations. More than 125 13SURF calls were made to Sydney Branch requesting our assistance.

At the end of the season Sydney Branch was successful in gaining two vehicles which will be used by the Duty Officer Team to improve response times and capabilities. These vehicles will also raise the profile of Sydney Branch amongst the community and our emergency services peers. With our services increasingly being responded to non-traditional patrol locations these vehicles have been kitted out with Basic Life Support equipment further extending the range of our Lifesaving services.

Sydney Branch’s RWC Team was expanded to cover the coastline from South Head down to Port Hacking with RWCs now placed strategically at North Bondi, South Maroubra and Bate Bay. The training of new members continues through the off-season to further strengthen patrolling numbers with a focus on the upcoming season to further integrate RWCs into the after-hour callout system and to also identify further strategic areas to provide coverage.

New to Support Operations this year was our Unmanned Aerial Vehicle or ‘Drone’ Team. The members of this group have been drawn from our clubs and trained by the Little Ripper Team. At the back end of the season the drones became a part of regular patrols across our beaches providing enhanced water safety at events, general patrolling of swimming locations and keeping an eye out for marine creature activity. This team will continue to evolve and integrate into Support Operations to assist clubs where appropriate.

Surf Rescue 30 continued to build members through the season and through their local member secured funds to enhance the Rescue Base at Malabar. The Branch will continue to support this Group so that they can realise their full membership potential and be available to assist patrols at all times during patrol hours and have a capability to respond where requested to after-hour incidents.

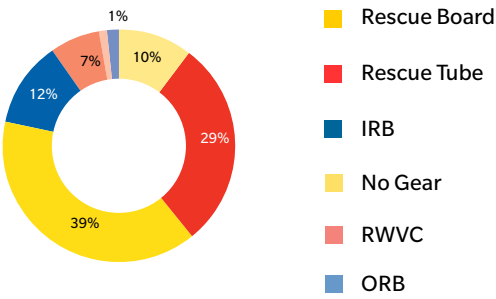

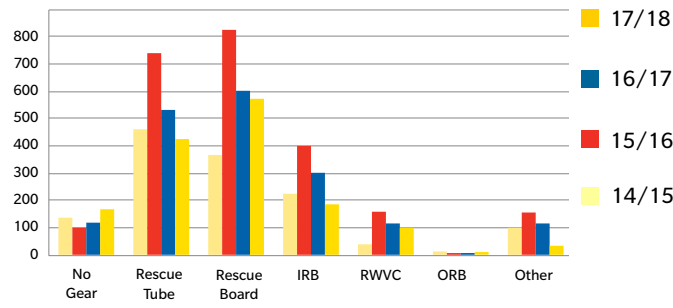

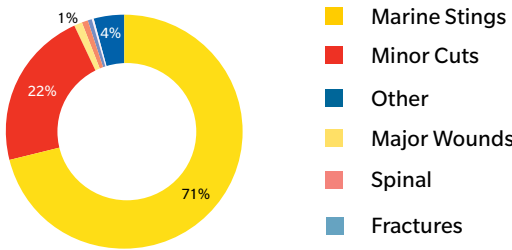
Total Rescues 1,503 Season 17/18



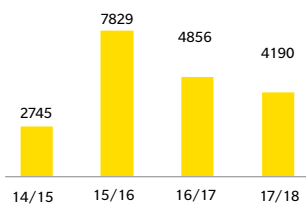
Total Rescues - 4 Year Comparison



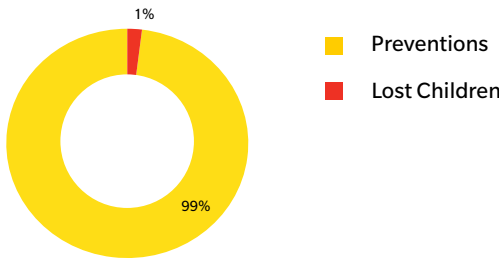
Total First Aid 4,190 Season 17/18



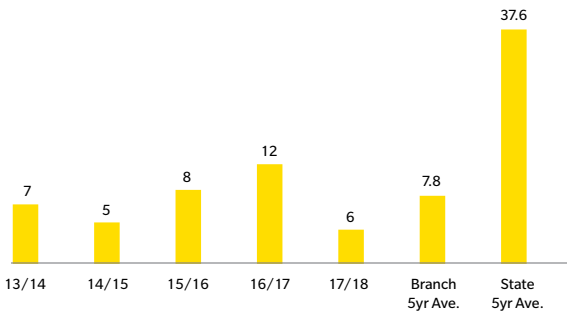
Total First Aid - 4 Year Comparison



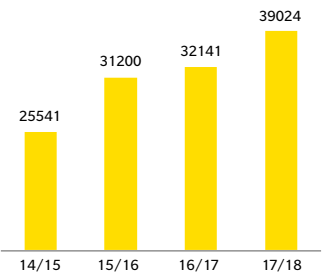
Total Preventions 17/18 39,024

Bondi Surf Bathers’ Life Saving Club are proud of another season with no lives lost on our watch at Bondi Beach.

Thank you to our lifesaving team led by Club Captain, James Rogers. Many members have to juggle their work, social, and family time to ensure we stay on top of our patrol obligations. Dedicating on average 50+ hours a season per active member is a huge commitment and one that the Club is extremely thankful for. The recognition of Meagher Patrol for Branch Rescue of the Year for a 4 person CPR was a gratifying symbol of the effort in lifesaving and skills development, and our determination to have “no lives lost”.

Our surf sports team have continued to build on the successes of previous years. David Auckett, Nick Nezval and a strong sub-committee worked tirelessly to plan for every event. This season we welcomed Robert Chapman into the newly created head coach position. The club retained its Australian Masters title, but it was also pleasing to see a win in the National Pool Rescue titles and some success for our new Champion lifesaver competitors.

Our Club’s deputy president Pep Font made considerable improvements in the area of member protection. We have now put in place an updated policy to help uphold our core values and create a safe, fair and inclusive environment for everyone associated with surf life saving. In addition, we have more than doubled the number of Member Protection Information Officers from whom our members can seek guidance. Pep was also instrumental in introducing an ecumenical Chaplain’s position whom members can contact at any time. Since thanks to Marty Nezval who has delivered an unobtrusive and diverse level of support which has previously not been available to our members.

Director Brent Jackson led the Education section and delivered seven Bronze medallion courses, resulting in 105 new lifesavers, six new Gold medallion members and a significant increase in higher awards. The section also graduated 20 new Bronze Trainers and six higher award trainers to rebalance the workload of a group that works tirelessly to enhance the skills of our lifesavers.

On behalf on the Nippers Committee I would like to thank everyone involved in our nippers program helping make this another successful season.

We had 794 nippers register which was an increase of 70 over last year. We had 80 boys and 76 girls join our U6 age group while 30 nippers graduated from U14’s with their SRC qualification and commenced lifesaving duties. I look forward to seeing them on patrol next season. Once again Col, Marty and Kirsty managed the U6’s and helped them gain confidence to enter the water and have lots of fun on the sand. There is a mix of laughter and tears with an opportunity to let go of their parent’s hand.

Nippers provides an opportunity for parents to be actively involved with their children. Our ‘yellow cap’ program is the first step in qualification and we encourage parents to do their Bronze Medallion course so they can help out as water safety, this sets a great example for children and increases everyone’s skills in awareness, safety and first aid. Knowing CPR is a skill everyone should have. Nippers is of course run by parents and we need to continue to see people step in and help as officials, age managers, committee members or even just on the BBQ. As our nippers graduate so do a group of experienced volunteer parents. There has been a great initiative this year to upskill parents on boards and there is now a great crew training once or twice a week and even doing a couple of master’s events, I encourage anyone with their bronze to join in, your children will be impressed.

To successfully run nippers we rely on our age managers and assistants to do a great job within the limited 1 hour time slot they have each Sunday, but nippers is not a learn to swim group so we encourage all nippers to undertake some swim sessions during the week. We try to make Sunday a fun experience and will always encourage kids to enter the water to increase confidence and develop their skills. Our emphasis on Sundays is on participation in a safe environment, we are focussed on water safety which means sometimes we cannot enter the surf due to unsafe conditions. We are of course fortunate to have the pool and Bogey Hole available.

Many nippers have participated in our training and competition program. Firstly, a big ‘thank you’ to our coaches. Jason Gavin did a fantastic job running the advanced board squad, while Scott Doble kept the development group moving forward. Jo Mermaid continued to run our beginner group on Tuesday afternoons at Bondi. On sand, Jordan to over this year and continued to develop our land-based athletes with a number joining his long-distance training group as well. This year we successfully ran a camp in the Christmas school holidays with the support of club champion Wally Eggleton. Of course, the early morning sessions and carnivals would not work without the dedicated support of parents driving their kids around.

Each year we run 2 rounds of club championships, this gives everyone the chance to see how they are progressing in the mix of events with points counted towards end of season awards. Our results in competitive carnivals across the season have been



strong and a credit to the coaches and determination of the competitors. Mitch Gavin was selected in the Sydney Branch team and along with the rest of the under 12’s led a strong group across the seasons carnivals. We had 90 competitors attend the State champs this year. There is such a competitive field across every event, just making finals is an achievement. Our U14’s lead the way with some strong relay performances in the water and on sand, Sophie Ferenczi won a silver medal in the 2km sand run and also won silver at the Aussie National titles in Perth. Unfortunately, we won’t have this group in nippers next year but we wish them the best in cadet’s competition.

This year we intended to run the Junior Ocean Swim at Bronte but cold water moved in and brought the temperature down to just 14 degrees the day before, so a decision was made to shorten the course and hold it at Bondi. The surf conditions were great and the water had warmed ‘up’ to 16 degrees. We gave away a brand-new JM paddle board and despite the cold water everyone had a great time. The swim is a great way to introduce the nippers to the longer format of ocean swimming with many of our U14 and former nippers all taking on the longer adult swim.

A feature of Nippers is the development of Junior Surf Life Savers and it was a great to initiate a new award this year. The Dave Finnimore award for Vigilance and Service awarded to Alexander Doble for his river rescue of a young boy in the school holidays. Proving once again that our nippers are trained and equipped with the skills and confidence to take action and rescue someone in trouble.

It has been a pleasure to manage Bronte Nippers in my second year as Director and I would like to thank the committee for volunteering their time and for their hard work. Thanks to Jessica Stewart, Amber Brown, Mark Braun and Jason Gavin. I would also like to thank Basil Scaffidi for his support as President of Bronte Surf Club.

Finally, a massive thank you to all of our nippers who make Sunday mornings at Bronte Beach the best place to be. The smiles and laughter make it all worthwhile and I am proud to see the nippers build friendships, confidence, display sportsmanship and develop into young life savers willing to serve our community.

2017-18 was another brilliant year for Clovelly Nippers and our community.

In 2017-18, Clovelly SLSC had 471 Nippers. This is over an extra 100 nippers being trained in surf safety and surf lifesaving since 2015-16. Our achievements this past season included:

Lifesaving Skills

- Lachlan Eliasson awarded Sydney Branch Junior U15’s Lifesaver of the Year for his enthusiasm and service, completing over 100 patrol hours in the 2nd half of the season.
- A focus on a variety of learning activities to nippers in every age group to have fun and learn lifesaving skills. Age Managers, instruct nippers in tube and board rescues and CPR, culminating in the end of season lifesaving demonstration.

Education

- 412 nippers completed their educational requirements, that is 88% completion!
- 43 Nippers gained their Basic Emergency Care and 40 their Resuscitation Certificate
- 37 U14 Nippers completed their SRC with an even balance between boys and girls adding strength and diversity to our patrols.

Training and Competition

- A record number of state competitors (27).
- Luca Beardmore won Silver in the 1km beach run. Luca’s silver was a great highlight of the year in a hotly contested field, with the whole Clovelly team cheering him on!
- Over 40% of our state team made it into quarter and semi finals
- Running two training sessions per week at Bondi and Clovelly

Participation and Community

- Initiated the inclusive nippers program with Giant Steps a school for children with autism. All who were involved in this found it the most rewarding experience.
- Increased the number of volunteers involved and created a new Volunteer Coordinator position to ensure all the key jobs got filled with enthusiasm
- Hosted Tamarama and Era and visiting South Maroubra and Bondi

ELOUERA SLSC

Club Operations

Our core activity is that of lifesaving and the protection of the community who choose to use Bate Bay beaches. To do that, consistent with our charitable purpose, we provide educational opportunities to members to become proficient in lifesaving awards. Our lifesaving activities have again been led by Cameron Simpson and it is with pleasure that again we can report ‘No Lives Lost’.

For the season ended April 2018 there 357 educational awards in the Under 6 to under 13 age groups and 169 awards to older age groups. Elouera also provided lifesaving to the community who use Elouera Beach with in excess of 9387 hours voluntary service provided, resulting in 374 preventative actions, 24 rescues and 47 first aid treatments.

At the start of the Nipper season a ‘Child Protection Team’ was established to work together within all areas of the Club. Its main objective is to create and provide the safest environment for our kids. The team approach is consistent with advice within SLSA that an effective ratio of trained member protection personnel is 1 per 100 members.

In October a large group gathered to welcome Elouera’s boat sponsor Tom Breen, who would christen his tenth family boat – the Charlotte Breen X, and in April Phillip Holt and Suzanne Stanton from Host Estate participated in a ceremony to launch an IRB generously donated by the Holt Group.

Elouera hosted several carnivals throughout the year, including a masters’ carnival in October, both the Bate Bay Interclub carnival and the Ohana carnival in December, and the Australian Surf Rowers League (ASRL) Australian Championships carnival in February. The ASRL event was held in huge seas and will go down as one of the great rowing carnivals.

Elouera picked up several awards at the Surf Life Saving Sydney Awards of Excellence, namely: President’s Award - Ron Hegarty; Club of the Year- Elouera SLSC; Surf Lifesaver of the Year - Jackson Towns; JDC Female Lifesaver of the Year - Sophie Burns; Area Patrol Efficiency (Cronulla/Sutherland) - Elouera SLSC; and Surf Sports Team of the Year - Wilko Open Women’s Boat Crew (Sarah Hill, Tara Lal, Emma Gillespie, Samantha Hewitt and sweep Grant Wilkinson)

Elouera was again well represented in SOG RWC operations, with its members contributing 213 hours or 19% of the total patrols performed by the Surf Life Saving Sydney Support Skis and having Andrew McKellar perform the role of branch RWC coordinator and lead trainer. Also, the following Elouera members contributed their time as Duty Officers in Sydney Branch: Matt Gentle, Darren Galea, and Jackson Towns.

Supporters

The Club extends its thanks to our Federal Member Mr Scott Morrison, Treasurer, and his State colleague Mr Mark Speakman SC, Attorney-General for their continued support of the Club.

The Sutherland Shire Council continues its support and assistance to Elouera and we extend our thanks in particular to General Manager Scott Phillips for continuing the council’s generous support of

the four Bate Bay clubs. Notably, the cooperation, support, and assistance provided by Brett Richardson, Manager of Public Safety and Lifeguards and his team of lifeguards is outstanding.

Our major sponsor, The Sutherland District Trade Union Club (“Tradies”) continued its valued support.

Commercial Operations

September marked the opening of Bianchini’s café. This was significant as it represented to completion of the current round of building works, and provides a third significant revenue stream from the Club’s commercial operations, complementing Summer Salt Restaurant, and the Washington Lounge.

Looking forward the commercial focus of the club centers on increasing revenue through the Washington Lounge, paying down debt, and on establishing a lease beyond the expiry date of the current lease in 2022.

The work of Brian Thompson in getting the club to the current situation must be acknowledged.

It is my pleasure to submit our Annual Report for the 2017-18 season.

Firstly, I would like to thank our Junior Development Committee, Age Managers, parents and fellow members who helped with everything that it takes to run Nippers. You make Nippers possible at Maroubra.

I would also like to thank the Board of Management for its ongoing support for our junior development program, which this year saw 29 Rookies graduate and become qualified patrolling members of our club. Particular thanks for such a job well done must go to their age managers, Tim Murray and Adam Hayward, and their trainers Yasmin and Tony Grivell.

In our younger ranks, 36 Nippers, mainly from our U12’s, attained the Basic Emergency Care (BEC) award and 42 Nippers, predominantly from our U11’s, attained the Resuscitation (CPR) award, under the guidance of Megan Still (Junior Education Coordinator) and her team of dedicated trainers and assessors. These awards carry on a proud tradition at Maroubra, previously championed by George Behayon (Deputy Chief Training Officer and Junior Development Life Saving Advisor, Sydney Branch) where our children are introduced to formal training at an early stage and given the opportunity to attain nationally recognised qualifications, which elevate them amongst their peers. At Maroubra, we expose Nippers from U6’s to basic emergency response strategy (DRSABCD) and CPR. We are leaders in Sydney Branch in offering such training in conjunction with full nationally accredited awards for Nippers. We have demonstrated the value of familiarising children so early to lifesaving techniques through training outcomes and retention.

In November our U11’s and U13’s enthusiastically represented Maroubra at their respective Sydney Branch Junior Development Camps, where they had an absolute ball, earning the admiration and praise of the organisers. Archie Hayward deserves special mention in this regard as the leader of our U11’s patrol team, which delivered an exceptional performance in the lifesaving challenges in very tough weather conditions. The performance of both camp cohorts in this area is a testament to the combined lifesaving and surf sports training approach adopted at Maroubra. These development camps are invaluable for the educational, motivational and leadership experiences that they offer junior lifesavers in training, and we are fortunate to have them. Our Life Savers can once again hold their heads high with NO LIVES LOST this season.

As one of the larger clubs in the Branch, a club the size of North Bondi, whilst successful in many areas, is not without its challenges. Like all clubs, it is with the hard work and dedication of all our members which ensures we reach our goals and can operate successfully across all areas.

Our core role is Lifesaving, and to that end Doron Milner, our Head of Lifesaving and Club Vice Captains, Eloise Starr and Pippa Batchelor along with the Patrol Captains and senior patrollers have once again worked to ensure Bondi Beach is safe.

Lifesaving is in very good shape, with over 580 volunteers completing over 18,000 hours. This season we expanded our patrol group numbers to give more leadership opportunities. As in past seasons, we also conducted some patrols at other clubs and also assisted other clubs with some gear donations. Rescues increased this season to 235 while Preventative Actions increased to well over 2000, showing our patrollers are saving lives by not only rescuing people BUT more importantly ensuring they don't get into trouble in the first place. We also performed over 380 various First Aid incidents - the biggest increase was 'lost children', where we reunited 191 'lost parents' with their children.

The most exciting news in Lifesaving this season was the launch of the Waverley District RWC. Thanks to Club Member and Sponsor Trevor Bell and his company Jet Dryer. It was a long process of refining the details for the operations in Waverley but it has been well worth the effort with the vital service already proving it's worth. I particularly wanted to thank Doron Milner and Marcel Kwantes for their efforts in getting the operation side if this working and also for arranging the new facility for it. We'd also like to thank all those that the Branch for their support in getting this across the line.

Disappointingly the first of our community events, the North Bondi Rough Water Swim, had to be cancelled due to the conditions being too "ROUGH". Fortunately the North Bondi Classic Ocean Swim was held in near perfect conditions and with the Bondi BareFoot run moved to September we saw greater participation. All events raise funds for us to maintain and improve our service to the community.

Over many seasons we have built a tremendously well run and professional Education Team. This season Michael Boland headed up Education. Michael has continued the success and while the results could not have been achieved without Michael's dedicated team, taking on the Head of Education role is a big step which he has both handled and excelled in. With more focus on further and higher awards, we achieved a total of 705 awards including 442 Surf Ed awards, 81 new Bronze Medallions and 42 SCR Awards.

A continuing area of priority is the youth of the Club, and no finer example is the fact numbers in this area continue to grow season upon season. We held a few meetings with the U23's and plan to get them more involved in the future running of the club. We look forward to our next generation of leaders coming through.

Our club has a great depth of experience in training, former CTOs Tom Bodger, Troy Longworth and Phil Capps continue to patrol Tamarama Beach. Thank you for your great service. If you like training please think about joining our training team to continue our proud tradition of delivering quality training to our members.

We need to retain more lifesavers. Each year we train about 40 new surf lifesavers and yet our active patrol numbers have been stable

for the last few years at around 110 members. About half of our new Bronze Medallion members do not stay for more than one season.

Establishing friendships is a key element to retaining members. Please welcome the new Bronze Medallion members to your patrol. We need to recruit more women to our club. Only 20% of our club is female and the average across surf lifesaving is 51%. We have strong female representation in the leadership of the club we just need more on the beach! Please encourage more women to join our club in the new season.

We are proud of Margie Simpson who again represented our club at the National Surf Life Saving Competition, and of Patrick Connors who qualified for his Gold Medallion. They are an inspiration for us to improve our skills. Please think about upgrading your skills next season. You could consider completing the ARTC, First Aid, IRB crew or one of the many other courses offered in the area.

It is a pleasure to work with the Management Committee of the Club. It is a talented and dedicated team. We would like to thank Guy Waddell for his many years of service as the head of Nippers. Guy will still be around catching waves with a rescue tube in a lurid rashie, he just won't have the whistle around his neck on a Sunday morning. Our Capital Campaign has made huge leaps in the past year. Our funds raised has gone from 1.1 million to 3.3 million. I want to thank our members and community for their strong support.

The Tamarama SLSC was a proud supporter of marriage equality. David Murphy, the Clubs Social Secretary, arranged to have the club, and our members' bodies, painted for the Walk for Equality. It was a huge success and attracted national and international media coverage. Tamarama became the poster image for the campaign. It was heartening to see our local community support marriage equality with 80% support in the area. While we painted the club back to its traditional, iconic yellow on a warm Spring Friday afternoon, many locals passing by asked us to keep the club painted in support of the campaign.

Our member, Bruce Bouchard, provided first aid to a swimmer that had dislocated their shoulder on the reef last year outside of patrol hours. Lance Brooks, who had recently moved into the area, watched on as Bruce helped the swimmer and thought Bruce must have been a doctor he handled the situation so professionally. Bruce modestly pointed out that he was just a local life saver. This inspired Lance to do his Bronze Medallion this season. Lance, in turn this year saved a drowning swimmer outside of patrol hours, when no one else was around and he was out on a rescue board. This is the sort of community that I want to live in.

Our participation through Tamarama SLSC is shaping what our Australia will be, we have the opportunity to define the future with our actions. I look forward to serving together with you next season.

Life Member Surf Life Saving Sydney, Surf Life Saving NSW,
Surf Life Saving Australia & North Cronulla SLSC legend
Harold John Brown, OAM

His contribution to Surf Lifesaving was incredible.

He was a Surf Lifesaver extraordinaire.

His personal leadership in the development and training of the Inflatable Rescue Boat was outstanding. The success today of this vital rescue equipment in Australia and indeed the world, is due to the efforts, direction and leadership of Harry Brown.

The design and development of Surf House at Bondi Beach as well as the previous Surf Lifesaving NSW Headquarters at the Sydney Academy of Sport and Recreation in Narrabeen was Harry's responsibility.

Harry Brown held the most responsible position of Honorary Secretary of the National Council of Surf Life Saving Australia and was in fact the last honorary officer to hold this position.

Wherever you look inside the North Cronulla SLSC clubhouse, you see Harry Brown's footprint. The 25 metre swimming pool (the first in any surf club) was designed by Harry along with two versions of the famous Harold Judd room, as well as the Club's Gymnasium, Nipper Room, Training Room and Administration centre. Harry was the pioneer of the new development at North Cronulla Beach which will be fulfilled in the years to come.

Harry was a leader in the club's Pool Survival Campaign where it reached out to the public and taught 600 parents the skill of Resuscitation at a time when there had been an increase in infant drowning in back yard swimming pools.

Harry Brown led the Club over many years as Patron, President, Treasurer, Chief Gear Steward and Boat Captain. In all these positions he displayed enormous energy and passion and by his leadership inspired so many members in his club.

Harry Brown was awarded Life Membership of the North Cronulla SLSC, Surf Life Saving Sydney, Surf Life Saving NSW and Surf Life Saving Australia.

He was voted into Surf Life Saving's Hall of Fame for displaying Excellence over a long period of time in the category of Surf Life Saving.

As well, Harry Brown was awarded with the Medal of the Order of Australia, OAM for his services to Surf Lifesaving.

He will be missed by many in his Club let alone the entire Surf Lifesaving family nationwide and around the world.

Life Member Surf Life Saving Sydney, Surf Life Saving NSW &
Era SLSC stalwart Cecil Frank Osborne.

Known to all as Frank, he was 87 years old.

Frank's journey in the surf lifesaving movement, in which he would devote so much of his life, began in 1958 when he obtained his Bronze Medallion at Era SLSC.

Although he joined one of Sydney's smallest and most isolated clubs, the young man rose quickly through the ranks to become a familiar face on the lifesaving scene and was highly regarded as a loyal clubman.

Over the years he served in many positions including but not limited to Club Captain, Vice Captain, Junior and Senior Vice President, Social Organiser, Chief Instructor, First Aid Officer as well as achieving 100% Patrol Attendance on a dozen occasions.

Frank held three Life Memberships in the movement during his lifetime. He achieved Club Life Membership in 1968, Branch Member in 1979, and was elevated to this exalted status at a State level in 1996.

While he contributed across all areas of the movement it was the areas of lifesaving, training, and education that remained a core passion and he took his talents to Branch level.

During his summers spent serving Sydney Branch he held many roles. Some of his achievements include a 7 year stint as Vice President, a member of multiple committees Chief among them Resuscitation (1955-2005), gear improvement and gear inspection.

He was also an Assessor and Examiner for over 4 decades, and played an important role in the establishment of the first SLS Helicopter Rescue Service in 1974 – 76 including the training of HRS members.

In 1977 he was selected and travelled to the USA as an Australian Representative at the World Lifesaving Conference.

His considerable contributions have not been forgotten by his Branch.

His was a life well lived.

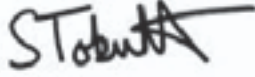

Notes to the Financial Statements
For the Year Ended 31 May 2018

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009* and *Associations Incorporation Regulation (NSW) 2010* and the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991*. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs. They do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(b) Property, plant and equipment

Property Plant and Equipment are carried at historical cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the entities commencing from the time the asset is held and ready for use.

Assets are depreciated over their lives utilising the following rates:

Fixed asset class	Depreciation rate
Plant and Equipment	7.5% - 40%
Leasehold improvements	2.5 % - 10%

(c) Investment property

Investment property is carried at fair value, determined annually by the Committee based on the assumption used in the independent valuation carried out during the year to 31 May 2014. Changes to fair value are recorded in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income as other income/expenses.

(d) Trade and other receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(e) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(f) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(g) Revenue and other income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(g) Revenue and other income

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt. Member subscription income is also recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is also generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

(h) Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(i) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are stated inclusive of GST.

(j) Financial assets

Investments in financial assets are recognised at cost and represent term deposits held with banks with original maturities of three months or more.

(k) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income.

(l) Intangible assets

Intangible assets are recognised at cost of acquisition. Intangible assets have a finite life and are carried at cost less any accumulated amortisation and any impairment losses. Intangible assets are amortised over their useful life of 10 years.

(m) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

2 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The directors make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Key estimates - fair value of investment properties

The committee has assessed there has been no significant increase or decrease in the fair value of investment property compared to the carrying value as at 31 May 2014 and therefore no revaluation or impairment has been recognised.
