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
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SECTION O1 INTRODUCTION

I am pleased and honoured to present this year's President's Report as the organisation's first female Branch President. The report highlights the remarkable strategic and operational activities undertaken by our dedicated volunteers and staff within Surf Life Saving Sydney.

I'd firstly like to thank my fellow Directors, our Club Presidents and Members, as well as our Stakeholders for their incredible support and encouragement in my first year. Our organisations successes are built on a team effort approach and the unwavering and selfless support we provide each other.

This year has been one of significant progress and accomplishment. One of our core focusses was to reengage with our Youth who are the future of our organisation. With this in mind we successfully re-engineered and expanded our Youth programs and initiatives by integrating them with the juniors to create the new Youth & Junior Development portfolio under David Love, which now engages and provides a voice to a broader segment of our membership. This naturally increased awareness about beach safety amongst our young members and their critical role in the future of surf life saving. These initiatives not only increased members engagement, but also inspired new members to join, strengthening our volunteer base.

A key strategic goal has been the development of comprehensive training programs, that are relevant to our needs and environment ensuring our volunteers are equipped with the latest skills and



knowledge. We have delivered advanced training modules in areas such as beach management, emergency response, youth leadership, and surf sports development skills. These programs have been instrumental in enhancing the competence and confidence of our frontline volunteers, ensuring they are well-prepared to handle the diverse challenges they face on our beaches and coastline.

Sadly, we farewelled our dear friend Geoffrey Forshaw OAM, Life Member, Patron and former President of Surf Life Saving Sydney. Geoff played an instrumental role in shaping the identity and success of Surf Life Saving Sydney. Geoff's commitment to excellence, passion for our organisation, and generosity as a President, Life Member and Patron has left an enduring legacy that will be felt for generations to come.

My warmest congratulations to our members who received Australian Honours. Peter Agnew AM ESM (President Surf Life Saving NSW) and Peter Kirkwood AM were both awarded the Member of the Order of Australia (AM). Warren Riley OAM and Rita Taylor OAM were honoured with the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) and Andrew McKellar ESM was awarded the Emergency Services Medal (ESM). These achievements are a testament to their outstanding commitment and hard work.

We celebrated Peter Carney on his elevation to Life Membership and Ron Hammond as the recipient of the President's Medal. Their remarkable contributions to Sydney Branch have been truly



invaluable, and their recognition is a testament to their extraordinary dedication and impact. Congratulations to both for these well-deserved honours.

On the operational front, our volunteers and staff have demonstrated exceptional dedication and resilience. The past year has seen a significant increase in patrolling hours whilst the number of rescues and preventative actions performed reduced, underscoring our commitment to public safety. Our teams have operated with exemplary professionalism, often in challenging conditions, and their efforts have undoubtedly saved lives.

The behind-the-scenes work of our branch office staff has been equally commendable. Their support has been crucial in coordinating our activities, managing logistics, and ensuring smooth operations. The introduction of new technologies and streamlined processes has improved our efficiency, enabling us to better serve and support our clubs and the community.

Our volunteers are the backbone of our organisation, and their commitment is truly inspiring. They have generously given countless hours, not just in patrolling our beaches but also in training, development, and community engagement activities. Their passion for surf life saving and their dedication to our mission of saving lives and keeping our communities safe are evident in all they do.

We are positioned along one of Australia's busiest coastlines both

on the water and on the beach. We operate in a high profile and dynamic environment that offers tremendous opportunities for our clubs and members within the surf life saving movement, fostering both personal and organisational development. Our operational activities are consistently demanding, extending throughout patrolling hours, beyond these times, and even into the off-season. The unwavering dedication and commitment of our members ensures that we can effectively meet the needs of our community and safeguard our coastline.

Nevertheless, we continue to face significant challenges, particularly with black spots along our coastline, especially around National Parks and away from our patrolled beaches. These black spot locations remain a serious concern, as lives are tragically lost in these dangerous zones. Addressing these risks is a priority for our organisation. We express our heartfelt gratitude to Surf Life Saving New South Wales and the NSW Government for their ongoing focus and investment in Rock Fisherman Education Programs and the Enhanced Funding Grant. Their support is crucial in enhancing safety measures and saving lives along our coastline.

Despite facing another challenging season, our Garie SLSC members displayed remarkable dedication. With the closure of Garie Road preventing access to their beach and clubhouse, the members chose to patrol at nearby Wattamolla Beach, a notorious black spot for drownings. Thanks to their efforts, no lives were lost at Wattamolla Beach this season. It is unlikely Garie Road will be

repaired until the 2025-26 season, however the Garie Members are committed to preparing for when it is opened, and we are committed to supporting the club in any way we can to ensure they are ready for flags up on Garie Beach. In an unexpected event, a light plane made a safe emergency landing on Garie Beach. This incident highlights the unpredictable nature of our coastline and underscores the importance of having prepared members ready and able to respond from anywhere to emergencies. Thank you to Era SLSC and Westpac Life Saver Rescue Helicopter for your quick response to this incident.

Sydney Branch clubs once again demonstrated their dominance at both the NSW and Australian titles, with the Sydney Branch Team winning the NSW Interbranch Championship for a consecutive year. This achievement highlights their consistent excellence and dedication. The Sydney Branch Boat Series also had a successful season, offering a fantastic opportunity for our boat crews. The enthusiasm and skill of the participants were evident, reflected in the competitive spirit and camaraderie displayed throughout the series

This year, we successfully integrated Live Heats into our carnivals and processes, introducing an official check-in system that significantly improved event efficiency and organisation. This innovation enhanced the overall experience for competitors and officials alike. Despite challenging surf conditions at North Bondi, we hosted another successful Branch Championships across all sections. While the difficult conditions impacted our junior events, the resilience and determination of our athletes ensured a memorable and rewarding competition.

For the first time, our Junior Awards of Excellence was a separate event held at Hoyts Entertainment Qtr Moore Park. The event was a full house, with juniors and parents enjoying the theatre layout, complete with popcorn, soft drinks, and choc top ice creams, followed by a screening of the latest release movie. The success of the Junior Awards of Excellence event highlighted the value of recognising and celebrating our young members in a fun and engaging environment. It was a memorable experience for all attendees and reinforced the importance of listening to and remaining relevant to our membership.

I extend my heartfelt gratitude to Marissa Saunders, our outgoing Director of Administration for her incredible organisational business skills in helping us successfully streamline our operations during her tenure. Her efforts were instrumental in transitioning our systems and processes to a cloud-based solution, which has significantly increased transparency and flexibility for our staff and volunteers. This change not only enhances our current operations but also sets the stage for a more efficient future.

Moving to the cloud has allowed us to achieve significant cost savings by reducing the need for hardware updates and multiple software solutions. This modernisation has improved our operational efficiency and cut down on unnecessary expenses. Additionally, the introduction of BoardPro has ensured transparency, accountability, and reliability in our meetings and decision-making processes. This tool has greatly enhanced the effectiveness of the Branch Council, Board of Management, and each portfolio committee, reinforcing our commitment to good governance. We are deeply grateful for Marissa's contributions and the positive impact she continues to make on our organisation.

Thank you to Scott Muir, our outgoing Director of Lifesaving and Support Operations whose exceptional hard work and dedication has made a lasting impact on our organisation. Over his time in the role, Scott demonstrated an unwavering commitment to excellence and safety. His leadership and tireless efforts ensured that our Lifesaving & Support Operations teams were always well-prepared and equipped to meet the challenges of their crucial work. 
Peter is still working hard in education and surf sports to build our future leaders and support our members to get the most of our organisation.







DIRECTOR LIFESAVING AND SUPPORT OPERATIONS

With the advent of an El Nino season Sydney Branch endured a hot summer. We continued to see increased patronage on our beaches, particularly in non-patrolled areas between Little Bay and Yarra Bay.

Our branch has no shortage of wonderful volunteers. Members who put in so many hours of thankless work. Members who inspire others to be better. Lives saved because members of SLSS care. I am continually amazed by the accounts of bravery shown by our members. To our almost 5,300 patrolling members who performed 1,165 rescues, 3,106 First Aids, an amazing 42,512 preventative action in ensuring the safety of 1,759,273 beach patrons, well done on another successful season of no lives lost between the flags.

Our core business is saving lives and to that end, I would like to highlight several key focus areas:

LIFESAVING:

- Unfortunately Garie Rd remained closed, making it unsuitable for any vehicle (although a surprising number of emergency vehicles converged on Garie beach when a light aircraft made an unplanned landing.). Working closely with Garie SLSC and SLSNSW we continued with Garie SLSC patrolling at Wattamolla. The repairs to the road were due for completion in October this year. However, recent rains have once again washed away the road and reparations are not expected until 2025. Another unfortunately challenging year ahead for Garie
- This year SLSNSW presented all Southern NSW Branches (Sydney Branch included) with new Lifesaving Service

Agreements (LSAs) for the 2023-24 and 2024-25 seasons. The process proved challenging for all concerned. However, there were some important lessons and I am happy that it led to a delivery revamp from SLSNSW. SLSS presented this new procedure to all Club Captains and I am optimistic the process will be a lot smoother next year.

- Gear Inspection (GI) our GI team inspected more than 500 items this year over two weekends. The two-weekend format was accepted well by our clubs ensuring no club had to wait around all day. We also sent our GI team down to the Royal National Park (RNP) for the first time in some years. The walk in and out and then in and out again proved challenging for one of our team members. SLSS newly formed Gear Inspection Review Panel were able to provide IRB Captains with more precise tolerances for IRB Motors. Thank you to the panel comprising Peter Burst, Dave Paget, Rob Illidge and Jason King, and headed up by our Lifesaving Manager, Michael Bonnici.
- Call Out Teams we created a new committee to look at training, service levels, equipment and effectiveness to increase the capabilities of our Call Out Teams. We also raised this at a State level, and I expect to see more to come of this in the following year.
- We ran an effective ALBERT (Australian Lifeboat Emergency Rescue Training) course this year and received positive feedback from all involved. I believe another is planned for the upcoming season.

SUPPORT OPERATIONS:

- Rescue Water Craft (RWC) Sydney's RWC Team
 once again lead the way across NSW. The hours and
 kilometres spent at sea are quite phenomenal compared
 to the 10 other NSW Branches. Because of this our
 operators are some of the most skilled in the country
 regularly being called upon to perform in conditions
 where others are unable to go. Thank you to all the
 team, we are all so proud of you.
 - · 20,777km travelled at sea
 - · 3,706 hours on Patrol
 - · 405 rescues
- We maintained our Duty Officer numbers despite some retirements bringing on several new recruits whom all passed their trial periods and are now full time Duty Officers. Senior Management of the Duty Officer cohort have worked hard to improve the reputation of our Duty Officers, and I would say that most Patrol Captains now know when they see a Red Shirt on their beach, it is to support them and not carry out a Patrol Audit! One last time: Dark Blue Shirt (Lifesaving Coordinator) = Patrol Audit; Red Shirt (Duty Officer) = assistance with a member injury or Major Incident. More of our Team have carried out Flood and Fire training and spent Patrols in Maritime Area Command (MAC). Our Duty Officers carried out over 3,635 hours of patrols being a 15% increase on last year.
- Our beloved Surf Rescue 30 (SR30) was saved! Many hours of work performed by members at Randwick District, Branch and State in collaboration with Randwick City Council to devise a strategy that would revoke the previous decision to shelve SR30. To the Team Leaders at the Boat Shed who never gave up, thank you.
 - · The boat contributed 1,117.50 hours of patrolling.
 - · Performed 34 rescues.
- Our Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) section strove hard to maintain pilot numbers in a challenging environment.
 They continue to support both clubs and lifesaving services in surveillance for marine life and in rescues.
- SLSS Support Operations ran a Waverley District Search and Rescue Exercise (SAREX) prior to the commencement of the season. Staged as a multiincident event over a large area (at The Gap, Bondi and off Waverley Cemetery), it involved Duty Officers, RWC Operators, Lifesaver 21 and Waverley Council Lifeguards
- The key strategy piece around saving SR30 was turning the base at Malabar into a Support Operations Hub. To that end, we were able to fit out and install a 12 meter (40 foot) container at Malabar next to the SR30 shed. Thank you to SLSNSW for funding and Randwick City Council for installation. Fully insulated with power and air conditioning, the container can house two RWCs and a Side by Side Vehicle (SSV). We formed a relationship with the Malabar Boat Owners Association and were able to use their boat ramp (as long as we assist with cleaning the ramp - a big thank you to John Restuccia and his son, Nathan, for volunteering to do this). As with any new enterprise there are always teething problems, and many lessons were learnt. It has brought our RWC Operators and Duty Officers a lot closer as the DOs are able to assist with launching and retrieving. I look forward to seeing the vision come together of all DOs, RWC Operators, SR30 Crews and UAV Pilots beginning and ending their shifts together as ONE team at the Malabar Support Operations Hub







As anyone involved in club administration will attest, it takes the contribution of many to be successful. It is no different at Branch in each one of our departments. Lifesaving and Support Operations is very lucky to have many such people.

In his third year as Manager Lifesaving, Michael Bonnici has worked tirelessly with clubs to help them deliver a first-class Lifesaving Service. Through his efforts and commitment, we have now seen the role realising its full potential. He is a fantastic right-hand man and I wish him nothing but the best in his future Lifesaving Career.

Unfortunately, we once again lost the services of our Lifesaving Coordinator – Waverley early in the season, although we recruited Amy Hanna in the second half of the season. Plus Will Davison jumped into the Lifesaving Coordinator – Randwick role. Both Amy and Will are learning on the job and display a propensity to do well in these roles. The redoubtable Rob Short (Cronulla Sutherland District) and Mark Wood (Royal National Park District) both returned this year. With a wealth of experience and knowledge, these two gents are incredibly valuable to our team. We are all better because of their advice

Michael Byrne (Elouera) continued in his role as Duty Officer Coordinator. Under his mentorship we have seen the Duty Officer cohort expand both in number and in the field of operations.

There is a reason Surf Lifesaving Sydney has the most cutting edge RWC service in the country. That reason is Andrew McKeller. Through Andrew, our RWC operators drive the safest, most capable craft. GPS fitted and with dual battery systems, our operators can be safe in the knowledge that someone onshore always know their location, and there is minimal risk of their craft breaking down.

Andrew and his team led the way and the rest of NSW followed. SLSS lead the way in NSW with more hours and kms spent patrolling our coastline than the other branches. Andrew was also instrumental in the setup of the new container at the Malabar Support Operations Base. We spent many hours planning, designing and then implementing. Without Andrew's efforts we could not have got this off the ground.

Boat Captain, Doug Lucas assuming the role of Offshore Rescue Boat Coordinator has provided feedback in what has been an extraordinarily difficult time for the boat service. I would like to commend the entire SR30 group for the long hours and dedicated service they put in to uphold their motto of "Safer Beaches, Safer Coastlines, Safer Lives". Brad Taylor and Doug Lucas have racked up cricket scores with the number of hours they have dedicated to SR30 this year. Without their efforts, the boat service may well have folded. Thank you and we are very proud of you all.

Our UAV Team was very well led by Michael Lette this year. The UAV has quickly been recognised as a vital part of Search and Rescue

operations. Furthermore, our UAV team continues to work hard supporting clubs, Duty Officers, and Lifeguard services. We are very lucky to have Michael as our UAV Coordinator. Well done and thank you to Michael and the team.

Kane Hughes, our Emergency Management Coordinator, continues to evolve this emerging role. As SLSNSW steps further into the Emergency Management space, it is imperative that SLSS can maintain relevance at the head of the pack. Kane and the role he fulfills facilitates this. Kane has also been proactive in preparing briefs to enhance SLSS EM capabilities, such as the Vehicular Operations Briefing paper that has been presented to the SLSNSW Board. Thank you for your service and advice this year Kane. Your support has been invaluable.

Jackson completed his fourth and final year as Support Operations Manager. In what is increasingly becoming a demanding administrative role, Jackson performed with aplomb. It has been a pleasure working with him in this role

One of the biggest thanks must go to our Branch Office Lifesaving Manager, Linda Perrin, without whom, my position would be untenable. Linda has been my biggest ally, has provided a mountain of support and advice and kept things light-hearted when the situation was challenging. On a broader scale, it is safe to say the Lifesaving and Support Operations Committee could not operate at one tenth the level without Linda. I cannot communicate enough my thanks to Linda this year.

Surf Lifesaving Sydney has so many wonderful volunteers. Members who put in so many hours of thankless work. Members who inspire others to be better. Lives saved because members of SLSS care. I am continually amazed by the accounts of bravery shown by our members and I cannot thank you enough.





SUPPORT OPERATIONS REPORT

SUPPORT OPERATIONS

This has been yet another action-packed season with new state of the art facilities and vessels being implemented, countless hours of additional patrolling and fantastic training initiatives packed into an already busy season.

Waverley Local Government Area (LGA) was home to the annual 'Search and Rescue Exercise' (SAREX) regime this season. Local club calllout teams, the Westpac Lifesaver Rescue Helicopter (Lifesaver 21) and Support Operations resources attended to a multi-patient search and rescue operation, enhancing skillsets and networking amongst each other. The 'rescue ready' status of our dedicated teams was tested during the exercise, with a "noduff" rescue occurring close to the rocks at the northern end of Bondi Beach near the end of the exercise. A very thankful female was conveyed to the beach by one of our jetski operators, with a fortunate and successful ending to a day of training. Thanks to all involved.

For the second year in a row, the Support Operations Group, Wanda SLSC and the Sutherland Shire Lifeguards were the recipient of the SLS Sydney Rescue of the Year at the recent awards of excellence held at the Art Gallery of NSW! On 31 March 2024, over the notoriously busy Easter long weekend, a serious incident began to unfold 1km north of Wanda SLSC. Three males were swept off a bank and into a large and dangerous rip current, attracting the attention of members of the public on the beach. The Support Ski responded and located the patients in a critical condition and began assisting them alongside Wanda SLSC members and Sutherland Shire Lifeguards. Utilising their specialist skills and training, the patients were provided urgent first aid and transported to hospital in a critical condition, later making a full recovery. However, without the quick and coordinated response from all involved, the outcome would have most certainly been a drowning. A huge team effort well done!

RESCUE WATER CRAFTS

The Rescue Water Crafts (RWC) have once again had a mammoth season, reflected in the thousands of patrols hours and myriad rescues and preventative actions performed by the operators.

The team patrolled non-stop (above and beyond their Lifesaving Service Agreement) between Christmas and New Years performing hundreds of preventative and rescue measures. Undeniably, the skills learnt during the upskilling sessions of current operators run during the early part of the season provided valuable familiarity with patrolling locations and rescue techniques, complimenting the great work conducted by our operators during the busy holiday period.

The RWC Women's Development Clinic was held again this season with the women working alongside Surf Rescue 30 and Lifesaver 21 honing their skills in rock-related access and rescues, team collaboration and general RWC skills and experience. Participants

even included ladies from other branches, further increasing their networks, skillsets and experiences. This is becoming an annual event and is a fantastic recent initiative by our current female RWC operators, promoting greater inclusion and camaraderie. Go Girls!

Finally, a new facility was implemented at Malabar this season housing our two Eastern Beaches RWC's. With funding provided by Randwick City Council, the facility boasts the ability to ensure 24/7 access, greater cohesion and inter-service collaboration being housed next to Surf Rescue 30 and easy flat-water access to Malabar Beach for a smoother and less reliant launch to ensure prompt emergency response. Thank you to our operators for their patience and assistance in implementing the new facility.

Increasing from last season, SLS Sydney RWC undertook 2,265 patrol hours on the water, consumed 15,082 litres of fuel and travelled 26,237km in season 2023-24! Our RWCs performed 264 rescues for the season

SURF RESCUE 30

Surf Rescue 30 (SR30) acquired a state of the art new vessel this season, with exceptional support from their sponsors and partners Randwick City Council, Clubs NSW, Maroubra Seals, Coogee Bay Hotel, Bendigo Bank and Sea School International.

The boat had yet another busy season, liaising with external agencies strengthening their skillsets and relationships on the water through commercial training and familiarisations. With a relatively small but extremely dedicated group of members, the vessel was on the water conducting vital coastal patrols supporting the Eastern Suburbs clubs and support operations.

Training and education is ramping up, with new criteria and a more flexible and suitable arrangement proposed to increase member accessibility to patrols on SR30 and to ensure the ongoing strong membership base. The SR30 team has built a modern and innovative service this season, set to reap the rewards in the coming seasons. Fantastic work and thankyou to all our SR30 members this season!

SR30 performed 23 rescues and the operators performed 1,117 patrol hours.

UNMANNED AERIAL VEHICLES

The Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) team is continuing support local club events and compliment the Department of Primary Industries UAV patrols throughout the season. With our small but dedicated group of pilots continuing to upskill and maintain their wings, the group is destined for bigger and greater UAVs in the coming years, with technology advancements quickly engulfing the service. Thank you to all those pilots that assisted in a volunteer capacity this season supporting emergency callouts and club events throughout the season. A valuable eye in the sky for surf lifesaving!



DUTY OFFICERS

The Duty Officer (DO) team welcomed new members to the ranks and benefited from additional funding seeing an increase in equipment and technology available to the operational leadership team. The 30+ strong team, on call 24/7, 365 days a year, were regularly called out to respond to critical incidents alongside our partner emergency services. A whopping 3,635 hours were performed by our duty officers this season!

Whilst having a strong presence on the beach, the DO team also undertook deployments to the Port Stephens area to assist during January with an influx of drowning emergencies in the area. RWC operators were deployed alongside the Duty Officers with some of our members conducting a number of rescues, saving lives beyond the borders of Sydney Branch!

The season has been a raging success for the Support Operations Group, with all our dedicated members, many still assisting their local clubs on patrol as well, performing exceptionally well and saving the lives of many outside the flags! I am immensely proud of the team's achievements this season and have no doubt the service will continue to grow and expand!

The success of the group wouldn't be possible without the wonderful coordinators at the helm and a huge thanks to Michael Lette (UAV), Doug Lucas (Surf Rescue 30), Michael Byrne (DO) and Andrew McKellar (RWC). It has been a pleasure to work alongside such a professional leadership team.



SLSS RESCUE OF THE YFAR - SLSS SUPPORT On Sunday the 31st March 2024, it was a sunny hot day, 28 degrees with good attendance at all Bate Bay beaches over the Easter long weekend. The swell was between 1 to 1.5 meters with a very slight wind. There were many banks and rips all the way along the Bate Bay beaches resulting in dangerous conditions for swimmers when they ventured outside the safety of the flagged areas.

A member of the public, Mr Anthony Ching was running about 1km north of the patrolled beach at Wanda when he noticed 3 people approximately 100 meters from shore standing on a sand bank. He continued to watch the males and observed them to be swept off the back of the bank into deep water. Mr Ching looked to try and obtain a surf board to take to the rescue but was not able to locate anyone.

The 3 males in the deep water were now calling for help as they tried to remain afloat in the deep water. It appeared that none of the 3 were swimmers. Mr Ching then proceeded to swim out to the 3 males. By the time Mr Ching had arrived, 1 of the males had made it back to the sand bank and this male was able to make his way back to shore. A young male with a bogie board made his way over and gave his board to Mr Ching. Mr Ching then secured the larger of the 2 males who was going below the surface and taking in water. This male was in the worst condition, secured onto the bogie board and moved to the bank and then to shore. He then went back for the 3rd male, also rescuing him with the bogie board returning him to shore.

Both males had swallowed water and began to cough up water whilst laying on the sand. Mr Ching then ran 1km to Wanda to raise the alarm of this incident. He returned to the scene with Sutherland Shire Lifequards Cameron Pyett and Will Bannister in a side-by-side vehicle (SSV).

rescue saw the SSV traveling north at speed and then observed males lying on the sand. He landed the RWC next to the patients on the sand. He could see that 2 adult males were in a serious condition and required urgent medical assistance. He then contacted Surf Com providing and initial report and requesting urgent medical assistance. Chris moved both patients that were lying on their backs, into the recovery position. When the Lifeguards arrived, oxygen was provided to the patient needing critical care. Basic life support was provided to the 2 most serious of the 3 patients.

With only 1 oxygen kit, a request was made to Surf Com for Wanda to bring additional equipment to the scene. Wanda Patrol Captain, Elisha Single dispatched Wanda lifesavers, Mark Dunham and Mikaela Sutherland in the Wanda SSV with additional oxygen kits and bottles to the scene.

Basic life support was provided to the 2 most serious patients. Sydney Duty Officer Molly Parker, New South Wales Police and Fire Brigade then attended the scene. New South Wales Ambulance later attended the scene and 2 males were transported to St George hospital in a serious condition.

There is no doubt that the quick response of Mr Ching and his initial actions rescuing the patients from the water, then supported by the Sutherland Shire Lifeguards Pyett and Bannister including volunteer lifesavers, Chambers, Dunham & Sutherland provided the critical care that saved these 2 gentleman's lives. This is an outstanding demonstration of collaboration between lifesaving services in Bate Bay and New South Wales Emergency Services working together during a rescue.

Congratulations to all involved in this rescue.

DIRECTOR EDUCATION

Sydney Branch's Trainers, Assessors, and Facilitators (TAFs) welcome and upskill new members to the Lifesaving movement and support existing members to improve and broaden their patrol skills. Branch is very fortunate to have a dedicated team of TAFs who commit to the ongoing development of their own education skills in order to deliver Vocational Education Training (VET) accredited training to club members. It is not for everyone, does take time and commitment, and I thank you all.

The branch education team seeks to support club-based training initiatives, primarily through the coordination of assessments. It is comprised of myself (Director of Education), the Education Manager - Phil Carter, and the four area Education Coordinators -Ron Krite, Nicole Cooney, Brett Furniss, and Paul Cooper. These Education Coordinators work long and hard throughout the season ensuring the success of the club-based training programs for our fifteen clubs. I thank them also.

Branch education also supports clubs meet their lifesaving obligations in two ways:

Directly, through the provision of higher-level award courses for club members, namely the Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue (SMAR), Silver Medallion Patrol Captain (SMPC), RWC Operators (RWC), Provide First Aid (PFA) and Gold Medallion (Gold) assessments; and

Indirectly, through working with SLSNSW to identify and support members wishing to become TAF's through participation in Training Officers and Assessors courses, plus those selected to complete the Certificate IV in Training and Education.

This season 57 and 137 members completed their, higher-level award courses, SMAR and SMPC awards respectively. Put simply branch can not keep up with member-demand for these courses and a focus on the coming 2024-25 season will be boosting facilitator numbers. A change in pre-requisites prevented many potential RWC candidates being eligible this season. A reassessment of prerequisites will allow numbers to return from a low of 4 candidates this year to somewhere in the high teens for the coming season. Branch relied on SLSNSW to run PFA courses this year, with some 600 members coming through. As with other facilitated courses, in the coming season branch will look to increase its internal capacity.

The delivery of TAF courses by SLSNSW was impacted by the release of the new Certificate IV standard TAE40122. Although it is not yet mandatory to upgrade, the new release impacted on the content of the training officers and assessors courses, requiring resources to be diverted away from training delivery. Opportunities for new training officers are now back to normal with 32 coming through this season, and more expected next. There were no assessor courses run in 2023-24, although SLSNSW are now well placed to resume this much-needed course. And pleasingly, the



requirements have eased compared to the previous Certificate IV standard TAE40116.

It was pleasing to see the number of clubs recognising the significant contributions to branch education. This was shown with large numbers of nominations for the Branch Education Awards of Excellence, once again showing the ongoing dedication and commitment of our TAFs. Congratulations to all the nominees, and a special thanks to everyone for their work throughout this season.

I extend my sincere congratulations to the following award winners:

- Trainer of the Year: Remi Defina Sperando (South Maroubra)
- Assessor of the Year: Frederic Testard (Maroubra)
- Facilitator of the Year: Marissa Saunders (Bondi)

These winners will represent the Branch at the upcoming SLSNSW Awards of Excellence. On behalf of the Education Committee, I wish them the very best of luck.

In the Community Categories – South Maroubra's Beach Safety Awareness Program won Community Education Program of the Year, and Elouera's Surf Awareness Clinic won the Safe365 Innovation of the Year Although his contribution is much broader than education, we were very pleased to see Education Manager Phil Carter being recognised as Branch Member of the Year – a fitting acknowledgement.

And speaking of acknowledgements, the support of Linda Perrin, branch office Manager of Lifesaving and Education is simply brilliant. Linda has the discipline and processes to ensure the smooth running of Education's activities and communications, and at the back-end handles the volume of paperwork in a timely and highly organised manner that is truly commendable.

This is the second season of Education operating as a separate portfolio to Lifesaving and Support Operation. In some respects Education is still finding its way within the Branch and I think as time passes greater opportunities to improve skills on the beach will be realised. Branch works closely with SLSNSW as it is the Registered Training Organisation under which Branch operates, primarily through the NSW Education Sterring Committee. SLSNSW is conscious of the demands placed on TAF's and is active in reassessing pain points, compliance tasks and taking advantage of new technologies.

Thank you to everyone involved in Education for your contributions.

The committee includes 18 mostly operational positions, with 14 of those being taken up by youth members, and 12 of those members being under the age

Our youth members are an extremely talented group, and we expect there are many more like them to come. They are super keen to gain leadership and administrative experience at the branch level. We expect that this will continue to grow, so our clubs, and our organisation as a whole, will be in great hands in years to come.

Back in early December, we held our first operational Branch Youth Camp at Burning Palms SLSC. A dozen youth members and some on the new committee, from clubs in the built environment districts of Waverley, Randwick, and Bate Bay, were given a unique experience by our host, the wonderful Sandra Marshall of Burning Palms SLSC, along with the wonderful Youth of the Royal National Park surf clubs. Our Pool Lifesaving Competition Clinics, of which we conducted five this season, were a resounding success again, with numerous Youth and Junior attendees from a multitude of Sydney Branch clubs winning a plethora of medals at the recent State Championships. With these clinics, we aim to tap into Pool Lifesaving competition an underappreciated Surf Sports events

such as Champion Lifesaver, R&R (Rescue and Resuscitation), etc. not only for their high relatability to Surf Lifesaving patrol operations, but also for their high Youth retention value. There's nothing quite like the camaraderie of Surf Sports competition, particularly in team events, to retain our Youth as active patrolling members of our organisation. For evidence of this, one needs to look no further than what is going on in Surf Boats and Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) racing, where Youth involvement is skyrocketing!

Watch this space for more Camps and Clinics next season.

To cap off this season, for the first time, we conducted the Junior awards of Excellence ceremony as a separate event in its own right at the Hoyts Event Cinema at The Entertainment Quarter, Moore Park, and the full house of attendees, children and parents alike, loved it! The theatre layout, accompanied with the ever popular refreshments trio of popcorn, soft drinks, and choc top ice creams, followed by a screening of the recently released movie "IF", was a huge hit with the crowd.

Huge thanks to our Branch Staff and Directors, as well as our Youth Comperes and Guest Presenters for putting on such a great event.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am very proud on behalf of the club to say "no lives lost" for Bondi this year.

Our patrols had 380 rescues during patrol hours, which takes our total rescue count to 28,205 since 1924. Our patrols were strong with most patrols with over 30 lifesavers and many patrols having multiple Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) drivers and crew. Patrol leadership from Captains was at a level that I believe is our best with; skills development, concern for member safety, modifying numbers based on risk and weather, and keeping morale high. We were also proud to see Thomas Hough recognised as Branch Lifesaver of the Year and Jack Castles as Junior Lifesaver of the year.

The Education team delivered 120 Bronze Medallion (BM) new holders. Since its foundation, the club has trained 4,188 BM holders. In addition, the section ran a large number of Advanced Resuscitation Training (ART) and First Aid update programs delivering a higher skill level in the post Covid world. Thanks to the IRB training team we gained 10 new drivers and 36 crew awards.

The club achieved its seventh consecutive Masters win at the Australian Titles and the Stan Mac, against North Bondi, stayed at Bondi after a close race where the lead changed many times.

The club relied on activations, grants, sponsorship and fundraising to support operations. We thank the Federal government, Waverley Council, SLSA, SLSNSW and Sydney Branch for a number of grants received to support our operations, and especially the State Government for the \$1m grant towards the rebuilding program.

It was with great sadness that in September, our first female life member Louise Santos passed away. Louise quietly played a pivotal within our club for decades. I look forward to her legacy living on through a new patrol and a major club award.

The club continues its work with the broader Bondi community.

This year 350 vulnerable people within our community were able to have Christmas lunch at the club. We continued the Dippers and Silver Salties programs. We also supported the ADHD Association, Take 3 for the Sea, Ocean Lovers Festival, Coastrek (Beyond Blue), and many other community activities. We also continued the Bondi Podcast, which captures great member stories, and builds awareness of the club and its mission.

Over this year, I have been supported by passionate, capable and competent Directors who act with the "One Club" mindset and aim to improve the club for the benefit of all members. Really when you think of all the items above, it should come as no surprise that these capable Directors, and the sixty plus manager roles that support them delivered a result that Branch recognised us with the "Club of the Year".

With fifteen full strength and highly skilled patrols, a robust education system, strong Nipper and Dipper programs, healthy finances, and an improving competition section, I believe Bondi is ready to ensure "no lives lost" next season.

A massive thanks to all involved in making Bondi Nippers happen each week, each month and each season - this includes the nippers, the Committee, the Coaches and the competition focused crew, our past nippers that are back helping out, past nipper parents, new parents that turn up and help out each week, our BBQ and merchandise volunteers and everyone with a smile each week!

A thank you and well-deserved recognition to the engine room of any Nippers program - These people put themselves properly out there week after week after week. Our super awesome Age Managers and our super awesome Water Safety team. You make it possible each week to physically be on the beach and in the water. Your dedication is exceptional, and your positive focus on making this as good as it can be for our Nippers each week is greatly appreciated. Your roles are not easy ones, and you have the courage to turn up each week - thank you, the positive impact you create is powerful.

Looking forward to seeing you all next season on the beach and in the water. I know we will grow in strength and engagement again next year and the skills of our nippers will increase again as our groups of coaches take up to the next level across our entire program.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

We as a club never take for granted reporting 'no lives lost'. Tragically, this season, while we didn't lose any lives during patrol hours, on Sunday 10 March 2024, a swimmer was caught in the infamous Bronte Express at dusk. Despite an extensive water search, initially by club members, and then by NSW Police and SLS support helicopters, he remains missing.

On Sunday 13 April, the shocking attacks at Bondi Junction occurred. We lost member Jade Young and not only the Club but the whole community felt the impact. We were also affected by the passing of Dawn Singleton through her step-brother Jack, a nipper Age Manager, and Ash Good, a regular on our beach and in the Bronte ocean pool. Life in our community has forever changed.

As to our season, thank you to all our volunteers. We also appreciate the continuous support of the Waverley Council lifeguards. The wonderful collaboration has never been more important after a summer of many after hour rescues. I would like to acknowledge the efforts of local surfers in playing an important role in these rescues.

This year we had 84 rescues and 11,682 preventive actions. Lifesaving remains the core of our Club and we continue upskilling our lifesavers and education capabilities. It is the highest of our priorities and the Club is proud of our strong lifesaving base. We are also proud of the continued importance we place in growing women in leadership roles in our Club and promoting an inclusive culture.

After many years of hard work, we achieved our Development Application approval and I want to thank everyone for their support. We are currently working to finalise the detailed design, appoint a main contractor and commence construction of temporary accommodation. This will house both the Surf Club and the Waverley Council Lifeguards and Park Staff for the duration of the new build.

We have commenced the important task of raising funds for the new building. Thank you to Niamh Lysaght for overseeing this critical objective.

Thank you to the many people who have contributed to our successful season. Firstly, to the Board of Management, Paul Wenck, Aaron O'Sullivan, David Jones, Anthony Burrows, Betsy Rumble, Sophie Paulin and Dave Finnimore.

To our very special admin team who have all worked tirelessly, led by our incredible General Manager, Kimberly Johns. Thank you to Jessica Stewart, Tim Jeffries, Lydia Boyle, Vanessa Power Simanda Sarno, Tilly Teahuahu-Tana and Lina Graffet. I would like to thank Parvez Ahmed as departing Manager of the kiosk, Judy Koslowski, and Owen Muddie and to all our bar and kiosk staff.

Our Education Team under the expert guidance of Betsy Rumble have excelled this year with 50 Surf Rescue Certificates, 60 new Bronze Medallions, 74 new Advanced Resuscitation Techniques holders, 7 Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) Crew, 30 Silver Medallion and 8 new Gold Medallion holders and 6 regualifying Gold Medallion holders. We also acknowledge Jenny Austin as our Training Officer of the Year.

It was another great Nippers year led by Anthony Burrows and Jessica Stewart and their hardworking committee. Nippers I believe is the foundation of our Club and for many of our members, Nippers is the reason to be part of the Club. This season we had an incredible 816 nippers through the program.

Thank you to the great efforts of our IRB team, wonderfully led by Jochen Valdeck and we congratulate Sam Hunt as this year's IRB Team Member of the Year.

We have an incredible group of sponsors, led by Macquarie Bank as our major partner of the Bondi to Bronte Ocean Swim. Sunday joggers' popularity is as great as ever and we thank Morgan & Libby Green, Geoff Doble, Ally Woodford and Judy & Martin Green for their organisation. Thank you to Jimmy Stewart for his help in managing the Club gymnasium.

Our social calendar was highlighted by a number of great celebrations including the annual Summer Party. Sunday Sips crowds reached new heights and a big thank you to Kimberly and her team

My favourite day, ANZAC Day Memorial Service, drew a big crowd. A big thank you to Pat & Jimmy Stewart and their team of helpers for providing such a great spread of food.

Special acknowledgement to Lina Graffet for her hard work in compiling this year's Annual Report.

A huge thank you to my wife Cathy and our three daughters Hannah, Sarah and Sophie who support my great love of this wonderful Club.

NIPPERS REPORT

With over 825 enrolments before the season started, we knew we were in for a big one, and the 2023-24 season did not disappoint! It was great to enjoy plenty of safe water conditions and warm water on Sundays and see nippers and parents alike improving their confidence in the surf.

This season we chose to focus on a number of key objectives which included, as always, the safety of our kids and volunteers in the water, fostering a culture of surf craft care, spreading the load amongst our hardworking volunteer network and exploring our surroundings, including our neighbouring beaches, where conditions allowed. It was inspiring to see the age managers take on these

focus areas to help develop well rounded junior lifesavers in training for our community.

This season the Under 13s and Under 14s enjoyed a special collaboration with the NSW Water Police. Over half a dozen lucky Under 13 and Under 14 youth and three adult supervisors participated in the event on a Sunday in mid-February. The party boarded a 20 metre police boat at Rose Bay with paddle boards and then toured Sydney Harbour before transiting out Sydney Heads and around to Bronte. During the transit the youth had a chance to discuss with the police their role on the water and how Surf Life Saving and the Water Police can work more closely together.

Running on rotation through the Waverley clubs each year, management of the Waverley Shield carnival is a mammoth logistical challenge. This year the challenge fell to Bronte. Under the leadership of Neil Hayward and with a detailed handover from our friends at North Bondi who ran the carnival last year, Bronte put on a great show at North Bondi for over 1,000 competitors.

We were saddened to see the loss of a life during an evening incident in the Bronte Rip late in the season. I would like to thank those nippers and parents who assisted with the search on the night and during the days that followed. We are excited to be working towards a new chapter at Bronte following the approval of the Development Approval (DA) for our new clubhouse. I look forward to working with the Nipper community to maintain our culture and momentum during this period of transition.

It is always a privilege to record that during the season just concluded, whilst our patrols were on duty, 'No Lives Were Lost' adding to our exceptional 84 years of continuous service to the visitors of the Royal National Park and maintaining this wonderful legacy.

The Club would like to extend our appreciation to Dave Love for introducing his youth leadership team to the Palms and for keeping us in mind with regards to events and activities. It was great to be able to host the Branch!

The season had many challenging occasions and perhaps none more so that the one patrol challenge rescue and two which occurred outside patrol hours. The during patrol rescue was awarded Branch December rescue of the Month, another whilst challenging for the rescuer has only received a write up in our annual report but the other which was performed in +5m surf missed recognition by Branch for March Rescue of the Month but the nomination is still being considered by the Royal Humane Society of NSW for the clear act of bravery that was involved in the rescue. The two outside of patrol hours could very well have added to the growing and alarming national water-based death tally for the year and the Club is indebted to both Bruce and Riley Vaughan for the fine display of surf rescue skills!

We would like to acknowledge the support provided through Branch, SLSNSW and the Royal National Park in provision of an upgrade to our onsite helipad, just a little further north than the current one and also for the soon to be realised space provision at the Heathcote State Emergency Service for our out of hours rescue gear which will permit Palms members to support the wider community when things go awry!

As most clubs have noticed the yellow whirly bird has little involvement with general lifesaving duties these days due to the State Government contracts with Toll. That being said, we are appreciative of the work SLSNSW has engaged on Era and our behalf to enable them to undertake a heli-lift operation of patients like the one referred to above. Timely movement is appreciated considering the return of access to Garie is still a way off. This

provision on one occasion would have freed unknown members of NSW Police, NSW Fire + Rescue and NSW Ambulance who effected a manual evacuation for a non-ambulatory patient and as well their 13+ vehicles!

We also appreciated the encouraging support our local state member, Ms Maryanne Stuart, has offered since her election last year. As with all opportunities, these are yet to be realised but our membership base is hopeful! We also played host to our federal member Ms Alison Byrnes who challenged her husband to join her on the trek in. The morning spent with the federal member, and our state member Paul Scully, were appreciated by our Club's executive

I would also like to record the Club's appreciation for the financial support that the Parks have again provided this season, it is most gratifying that they understand that in doing what we do to support their access provisions for the wider Australian and visitor communities does cost dollars!

It would be remiss of me to not highlight our appreciation of the continuing support provided through our Branch's leadership specifically and SLSNSW more broadly. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Summer season 2023-24, my first as President, passed quickly. Once again, our lifesaving efforts have ensured no lives lost. Thanks to our many volunteers and special thanks to the committee and all our officers and leaders across the club. The committee had a few new faces and ably navigated the steep learning curve that taking on these roles entailed; not least of which training a new president.

Club Captain, Kim Davey, once again successfully led our lifesaving team. We had 13 patrols, with 278 active members patrolling. Over 200,000 people visited our beach. The team performed 39 rescues, 529 preventative actions, and over 500 first aids. On behalf of all who enjoy our beach, a heartfelt thanks to all our volunteers. Special thanks to Tom Hetherington for his leadership of the Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) team, and to Lara Garrido-Herrero, as Vice Club Captain.

Our education team was led by Cheree D'Ornay. Our trainers have worked hard upskilling, maintaining and training our patrolling members. We had a successful year gaining 222 awards, which is a fantastic achievement for our small and agile team. The quality of our candidates has been noted by assessors, which is due to the excellent trainers we have at Clovelly. A highlight of the awards, and sign of the strong future for the club, was that 40 nippers gained their Surf Rescue Certificate. This is testament to both the nipper parents and the trainers who helped them through.

Our Surf Sports team was led by Kimmy Rashleigh this season. The club continues to invest and build its competitive spirit. Highlights of our inter club competition include the club marathon, the inaugural Syd D'Ornay NYD swim, the Cloey classic, the Tom Caddy relay, the Dave Murray shield, and the return of twilight carnivals.

In Masters Sydney Branch Championships, Clovelly finished fifth with a team of 18 competitors. Highlights included gold medals by Jo Emery in the Board and Ski Race and Wendy Pepper in the Flags. Two teams in the women's under 135yrs surf placed second and forth.

The state titles saw a team of ten masters head to Queenscliff with Clovelly finishing twentieth. Jo Emery took gold in the board race with Philomena Pettit close behind with silver, and Wendy Pepper almost making it a sweep just missing the podium in fourth place.

The taplin relays proved a strong team event for Clovelly with the 150yrs team combining for second place, while the 130yrs team finished in fourth place. Our Club Captain, Kim Davey, showed her strength on the sand placing third in sprints. The women's 230yrs and over sprint relay placed second.

This year at Aussies, Clovelly put forward its biggest master's team in years, with fourteen competitors. Clovelly placed 28th out of 68 teams. Highlights included a Gold Medal from Jo Emery and Wendy Pepper in the Double Ski, and a trio of silvers from Kim Davey in Flags, Jo Emery in Ski and the 230yrs min women's Beach Relay of Jo Emery, Wendy Pepper, Caroline Smith, and Philomena Pettit. It was exciting to have our first Men's relays compete in sand and surf for the first time in many years.

Matt Scott led our Nippers again this season. Thanks to Matt , his committee and age managers for leading this vital part of our club. The retention, and SRC completion numbers, are a testament to the team and the culture.

We celebrated the end of season with a Presentation event upstairs at the club on our last day of patrol. Congratulations to our award winners:

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Coogee SLSC embraced the 2023-24 surf life saving season whole heartedly and used each day as an opportunity to create comradery, foster growth, and contribute to the local community's spirit and safety. We proudly acknowledge at the outset that it is relieving to report no lives were lost on Coogee Beach during this season's patrolling. This achievement can't be underestimated with the familiarity we share regarding the dangers associated with the surf and rate of drownings at coastal and water locations across New South Wales.

This season has been nothing short of amazing and is certainly worthy of reflection. The achievements of our members have taken centre stage (and rightfully so). We hope to showcase our highlights summarily below.

Our members patrolled over 24,000 hours at Coogee Beach and devoted time to patrol at other SLS Sydney beaches and further afield at Corrimal SLSC and Narooma SLSC. During our volunteer patrols, we conducted 12 rescues in Coogee and performed over 140 first aid responses. Led by our Club Captain Alex Scott, together with the Lifesaving Committee and Patrol Captains, our 17 patrols diligently watched the water and managed record beach attendance crowds during the peak of summer.

The education team, led by Rebecca Mister, continued to redefine the boundary of possibilities by delivering an impressive number of awards during the season. We saw 83 Minnows 'Silver Caps' obtain their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) under the leadership of Doug Hawkins, Shannon Campbell, Aidan Byrnes, Alex Scott and Katrin Baldow, and thunder bronze medallion programs (converting SRC awards to bronze medallion) led by Andrew Gardiner, Cate Kyling, Athenia Pascoe and Adam Treharne. Our broader bronze medallion education team welcomed new members to our Club in the Spring Bronze (led by Michael Barnes and Athenia Pascoe), Summer Bronze (led by Marc Schmandin and Ben Heenan) and Dads and

Mums Army XXVI (led by Katrin Baldow and Doug Hawkins). In addition to this, our higher awards team was busy delivering First Aid, Advance Resuscitation Training, Inflatable Rescue Boats, Patrol Captain and Gold Medallion courses. We extend our thanks to the entire education team and to all Members (new and existing) who embarked on these awards.

The Coogee Minnows program returned to the beach between October 2023 and April 2024 to train our next generation of surf life savers to an exceptional standard. The success of the Minnows program is best seen through enrolment numbers, exceeding 800, retention rates and the competition results. Congratulations to the Minnows Committee (led by James Campbell), all age managers, assistants and water safety volunteers.

We hosted the annual '50 Year Members Celebration' in April 2024 and had the pleasure of inducting Anthony Gately, Tim Green and Robert Russell-Smith as 50-year Members while enjoying the company of our longest serving Members. We also commemorated Anzac Day by hosting our traditional ceremony (organised by Tony Waller, David Park and Doug Hawkins). Our loyal winter swimming group, Coogee Penguins, also commenced ready to enjoy the offseason cooler waters of Coogee Beach. We continued to honour tradition in the competition area, hosting the Presidents Cup, Rose Shield and Anonymous Donors biathlon.

The Competition theme continued throughout the season with three rounds of Club Championships, Branch Championships, State Championships and ultimately, at the Australian Championships. We celebrate our Open Club Champions (Emily Miers and Finian Stronach), Masters Club Champions (Nicola Logan and Blair Chapman), Junior Club Champions (Ava Szabo and Daniel Kavanagh) and Cadet Club Champions (Caitlyn Lee and Angus Folsom). The Sunshine Coast (QLD) was inundated in April by our strong 140 participant competition contingent, participating across beach, water, surf boat, RnR, lifesaving and board riding. We extend our congratulations to all competitors, coaches, officials and water



safety for facilitating our competition team, including our youth team. Success across competition is difficult to come by and is the result of a cohesive Competition Committee and Minnows Committee

Our season closure was marked by the 'Annual Dinner' in May during which we reflected on our Australian Championship success and highest awards. Lee Hume, outgoing Competition Director, was awarded the prestigious Honour Blazer following his commitment to the growth of competition in our Club throughout the season. Thanks to the sponsorship of Australian Mutual Bank, we were privileged to award an educational scholarship to Thomas Walker following his contribution to our Club over 12 seasons. The perpetual Singer-Yeo Memorial Award for Rookie of the Year was awarded to Giorgia Aiello.

We continued to deliver our regular community events and sought new opportunities to expand our impact. We continued our Project Libertas initiative, welcoming previous graduates back to patrols throughout the season and embarking on a program review to redefine (and break) boundaries limiting inclusivity in surf life saving. This trend extended to our 'Beach Ocean Safe' (BOS) program, inviting international students from UNSW to upskill on beach safety strategies and lifesaving methods. Dippers returned for its eighth season (in collaboration with Autism Swim) to assist people with Autism to safely learn about the water and how to enjoy it safely. Coogee Run Club was welcomed into our Club to participate in a one-day safety session and we delivered programs to Wylies and the McIver Baths groups of a similar nature. Thank you to our Community Team, including Allison Roberts, Helen Murphy, Doug Hawkins, Madhav Raman and Oliver Jackson for assisting in delivering these important programs.

For the first time since 2018, we hosted two Coogee Island Challenges in November 2023 and April 2024. Over both events, 3,300 local swimmers participated, 2,200 of which successfully circumnavigated Wedding Cake Island. The events provide critical

fundraising to assist in our Club's operations over the season however are a great source of comradery and social engagement for all members of our local community and broader swimming network.

In addition to the above community programs, we haven't been complacent in our strides toward diversity in the Club, focussing on our Pink Patrol, Rainbow Beaches Patrol and breaking boundaries limiting our Membership by embarking on the innovative 'Coogee Award Holders' program.

On behalf of the Executive Committee of Coogee SLSC, comprising myself, Sharon Deans, Matt Larkin, Alex Scott and Emily Miers, we extend our thanks to each member of the Management Committee, cautiously leading our Club and embarking on transparent decision making and accountability. It is inspiring to see so many Members work tirelessly behind the scenes to ensure the long term success of our Club and we extend our deepest appreciation. We thank all the other committees of the Club, who also delivered this season including (but not limited to) the Competition Committee, Ocean Events Committee and Bluey's Youth Group. Our Club's operations hinge significantly on the commitment of our full time and part-time staff, our sponsors, life members and governors, all of whom have played a role in our achievements.

As this report shows, momentum and growth has allowed all areas of the Club to have an immensely successful season. Such success can only be achieved thanks to the contributions of all Members and support of SLS Sydney.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I'd firstly like to start off by recognising the incredible work carried out by Elouera's Board of Management, each director has gone above and beyond in their roles, and I would not be able to carry out my duties without each of these valued team members. After receiving SLS Sydney's Club of the Year award last season, Elouera continued to strive to be the best club that it can be, and I'm extremely proud to be able to lead this amazing surf club, I look forward to seeing the club continue to grow in the future, and make it a place that members are proud to be connected with.

Director of Lifesaving Andrew McKellar once again returned for another season, leading our 12 patrol captains and their patrolling members. Elouera had large numbers enjoying the beach, and at the same time some challenging weather and surf conditions, however all lifesavers acted swiftly and professionally to ensure once again "No Lives were Lost". For the 2023-24 season 11,225 patrolling hours were conducted, with 9 rescues, as well as conducting 868 preventative actions. This was a significant increase in patrolling hours, and at the same time a substantial reduction in the number of rescues undertaken, showing that Elouera's patrolling members are being proactive in the aquatic environment.

With Stephen Urquhart returning to lead Elouera's education team, it saw an improvement in the award tally from the 2023-24 season. The entire education team again ensured that we had a 100% success rate with our Bronze Medallion candidates, and existing members were proficient and upskilled in advanced awards. Elouera also ran its third mental health first aid course; this was extremely popular and received excellent feedback from all participants. I know first-hand how time consuming this role is and Stephen has again done an incredible job. This year the club gained a total of 437 awards. Of this total, 174 were gained by senior members while 263 were gained by our Juniors.

A huge thank you must also go to Elouera's Director of Surf Sports Dean Morris and Deputy Director of Surf Sports Issac Byrne. Elouera had some very positive results in surf sports and continues to grow into a very competitive Club. Overall Elouera finished seventieth at the 2024 Australian Surf Life Saving Championships which is a truly amazing accomplishment considering Elouera's size. There were many incredible individual and team results which all competitors should be extremely proud of. Elouera's competitors not only strive to be the best in their chosen sport, but also take pride and are extremely dedicated lifesavers who use their skills and athleticism to also serve the community.

This year Elouera celebrated a significant milestone, being the

fortieth 'Tradies' Elouera Surf Awareness Clinic. This program has trained tens of thousands of children in beach safety, which in turn has saved countless lives. It is with pleasure that we submit the Garie Report on behalf of the Board and Members of Garie Surf Life Saving Club,

At the start of the season, there was a strong sense of optimism we were looking at this being our last season at Wattamolla. Lousie Skjeime took the captaincy which was quite commendable considering that she was to be organising another season at a beach with no facilities and patchy communications at best. This was made more difficult with the organic attrition affecting the rostering of patrols, it was difficult to balance patrolling member preferences of who they patrolled with against what worked operationally regrettably contributing to a notable decline in morale and engagement.

Amongst the setbacks we did enjoy success, and I'm sure every club, no matter the size or challenges they face, would agree that if we had to choose just one success, it would be an easy choice: no lives lost! In the face of various obstacles and difficulties, our top priority has always been the safety of those who recreate at our beaches. Achievements, accolades, and victories are important, but nothing compares to the value of human life. This is the second year that no lives have been lost at Wattamolla. This is thanks to the patrol coverage at Wattamolla that has been shared by the

Australian Life Guard Service, and Volunteer Surf Life Savers who have patrolled at Wattamolla over the summer period,

It's also worthy to mention that there have been no lives lost at Garie either, just a Light Aircraft that had to make an emergency landing. It is noted that he 61 year old pilot and his two passengers escaped unharmed.

With no access to the clubhouse and the boatshed, two families have graciously allowed us to store equipment at their houses. Thank you, Owen & Louise Skjeime, and Tony & Michelle Graeme.

Allowing us to store equipment at your houses has not only made the gear accessible should we need it but for equipment that is not in use storing the equipment away from the salty beach environment has also allowed us to effectively increase the serviceable life of the gear. The All Terrain Vehicle (ATV) and majority of the Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) motors have been effectively mothballed for the past two seasons hopefully meaning we should, once brought back into service, allow a further couple of years of usage. This is the same for the excess boards and tubes the club has accumulated over the years.

Thanks to the National Parks and Wildlife Service for their incredible



support during this past seasons. Their generosity in allowing us to use their canteen as on-beach storage for essential equipment such as boards, beach patrol surrounds, tents, and rescue tubes has been invaluable.

We must also acknowledge the invaluable assistance and support that Maryanne Stuart MP and Jenny Ware MP have provided to the club over the past season. whether it be coordinating meetings with government departments or recommending our club for various grant applications. Because of their dedicated support and advocacy, Garie Surf Life Saving Club is well represented across both levels of government. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I can proudly report another year of "no lives lost" between the flags at Tamarama Beach.

Despite its small size, Tamarama Beach is a demanding beach. 77 rescues were carried out this year, some in extremely challenging conditions. This year our volunteers completed over 900 preventative actions. Our wonderful patrol captains deserve a special mention: thank you to Zoe Scott-King, Cameron Berry, Harriett Gillies and David Ogle, Lance Brooks, Chris Barrett, David Head and Michelle Cowans, Jody Fitchet, Bill Shires, Chris Glover, Derek Bagatourian, Tim Murray, Sandra Fox and Jesse Price for leading with professionalism our talented volunteers. A heartfelt thank you goes to our members for showing up with enthusiasm every weekend to keep the beach safe.

AN ENGAGED, SUPPORTED AND GROWING MEMBERSHIP

Over the past three years, Tamarama SLSC membership numbers have grown to record numbers despite the renovation delays that have left our members without a clubhouse for three seasons. Our active membership numbers have bucked state trends and instead of shrinking have been growing by approximately 15% annually. We believe this is due to the incredible sense of belonging, diversity, tolerance and safety that the club developed over the past ten years. Our education teams have done an incredible work this year with large bronze groups.

This year Tamarama SLSC has seen growth in members seeking and achieving further roles within the club, particularly in the Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) area. The Management Committee felt the need to sustain the IRB team in their endeavors to grow the team through the purchase of a new IRB hull designated for training. Thanks to the work of three consecutive IRB captains we have now a healthy cohort of IRB drivers and crew that can support our operations.

A NEW HOME

A key achievement this year has been the completion of the clubhouse after fifteen years of hard work and commitment. The project achieved Development Consent in 2013 and, after over five years of fundraising, construction commenced in 2019 to then be delayed by the pandemic, a builder insolvency and serious extensive defects uncovered by the new builder. The project is now finally complete. With our capital partner Waverley Council, we have overcome what has been an undoubtedly hard process through the extensive experience in development, construction and remediation of our building committee members. Thank you to Building Committee chair Mike Turner, current members Richard Hamilton, Ronan MacSweeney and past members Michael Alvisse and Christian Wilde for the indefatigable work to realise the new clubhouse. The support from our members was also critical: I have not received a single complaint during the building process, only words of support and encouragement.

SUSTAINABILITY IN FOCUS

We believe Tamarama SLSC ought to be leading the way in sustainability education through good example. A new Sustainability Committee has been formed this year chaired by two professional sustainability experts. The terms of reference included a survey to gauge priorities for our membership and "low hanging fruits" for immediate implementation such as the selection of 100%

sustainable power supply and the successful grant application for solar power implementation. The sustainable operations of the new club house will also be a focus area next year.

A DIVERSE, INCLUSIVE CLUB

Tamarama SLSC leadership in inclusivity and diversity are well known in the community as is our support for minorities such as LGBTQIA+ (Rainbow Beaches), migrants and refugees (Migrant Beach Day Programme) and indigenous communities (Holly Days Programme).

This year we have once again awarded our Kirsty Boden scholarship to an incredibly engaged participant who, low and behold, carried out a rescue on his first day of patrol.

Tamarama SLSC has had continuously the highest participation in the Lifesavers with Pride (LWP) initiatives and we keep supporting participation in Rainbow Beaches as we believe a diverse membership is key to wellbeing, participation and retention.

This year we have hosted six Inclusive Swims for Women and Gender Diverse people with well over 100 attendees, many newbies to the world of ocean swimming and we keep recruiting new club members as a result. Our wonderful Erin Riley and Ce Benedict took part in the LWP panel for Transgender Awareness Week in November at Bronte SLSC while Michelle Cowans ran a Migrant Beach Safety Day in January, with people from Vietnam, China, Laos, Cambodia and Russia taking part in the Adult Migration Education Program.

NEW STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS

NIPPERS REPORT

Once again, Tamarama Nippers survived the season without a clubhouse, the third in a row. The club is however expecting final completion of the new clubhouse in July 2024 and the Nippers look forward to enjoying the 2024-25 season with warm showers, and gold-plated facilities.

Clubhouse aside, the club has seen strong membership levels (for Tamarama) with 129 Nippers registered for the 2023-24



season (up from 111 in 2022-23). Equally, we have experienced record levels of Junior Members (13-17 years) retaining their post Nipper relationship with the club which provides patrol depth, and welcome Age Manager assistance (after attaining their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) and Bronze Medallion qualifications). This level of youth engagement has not been seen at the club since the early 1990's and is testament to the hard work and superb training offered by long term member and former Junior Activities Director - Guy Waddell.

Good weather, an enlarged beach and favourable surf conditions led to persistently agreeable Sunday mornings with plenty of sun and above average amounts of water time.

Friday afternoon swim training sessions for Nippers at North Bondi, led by Club stalwart Annabelle Paterson and her merry group of recent SRC and Bronze graduate helpers, markedly improved the confidence and surf skills of those attending ensuring we were able to extend the challenge offered during the normal Sunday mornings at Tamarama.

We continued our participation in most surf carnivals with a small, loyal group of strong competitors who achieved outstanding results.

The award winning "Holly Days" indigenous nipper program run by Jo Miller and focussed on providing a Nipper experience for the La Perouse aboriginal community continued and highlights some twenty years of collaboration between the club, and the La Perouse Community.



DIRECTOR FINANCE REPORT



In my first year as Director of Finance at Surf Life Saving Sydney, I am pleased to present the financial statements for review. I'd like to start off by thanking my predecessor, Athenia Pascoe (Coogee), as well as the members of the Finance and Compliance Committee, Phil Carter (Maroubra), Paul Farrugia (Clovelly), Uri Teitler (South Maroubra) and Kristy McIntyre (Bondi). One of the things I love about being involved at Branch is the engagement from passionate, talented and engaged people from across all our clubs.

I've been keen in this position to bring in some structural changes which will benefit the Branch in future years as these come to fruition. This includes changing the structure of our accounting system, bringing in new finance systems to support our team, implementing a finance and purchasing policy for the branch, changing banks to ensure both better returns and a line of sponsorship, and working with a new supporting staff structure that embeds efficient processes and practices. As SR30 transitions into the Branch in the 2024-25 season, these changes will be in place to ensure a seamless transition to our new systems.

Our revenues this year were impacted by the departure of our major sponsor, as well as our Education sponsor. Whilst we were aware

of this going into the season, it still impacted what we were able to achieve throughout the year. Similarly the Enhanced Funding Grant from SLSNSW was restructured this season which resulted in State funding more expenses directly reducing the grant allocation to cover our own expenses. As a result, whilst our revenue position decreased this year for Sponsorships and Government Grants, the impact was not as harsh as our Lifesaving expenses also decreased to match.

Our other revenues increased which offset the net revenue shifting to an increase in income. Capitation fees remained constant, with an increase the result of a greater membership base. Our Competition fees increased as a result of splitting the Branch Carnivals over two weekends.

Our expenses increased in totality this year. Whilst we started the year with three staff, Brianna Riley (Maroubra) left us to return to studies during the year, and Mason Kemeny (Bondi) joined us from SLSNSW in a more senior capacity. We also increased our existing staff, Catherine Woodside (Wanda) and Linda Perrin (South Maroubra) from four days to five a week. As a result, our employee expenses increased to match this increase in delivery.



Our competition and event running costs were down in 2023-24, due to education and membership services delivery reduced due to the departure of our Education sponsor. Our development camps were also reduced, plus our Life Members event, usually held in alternate years, was not held this year.

Our Other Operating Costs have decreased this year as well. As identified earlier, under the new Enhanced Funding Agreement with SLSNSW, many of our costs are covered directly by State, resulting in these costs no longer being recognised by Branch.

Regarding our Other Income and Expenses, our restructured finances brought in increased interest, and we retired several of our assets which we had not undertaken in the prior year. Unfortunately one of our investment properties suffered because a tenant went into administration. This meant that our revenue was down, and our costs were increased to manage the transition to a new tenant. Finally, the revaluation of our investment properties resulted in a downward shift for our balance sheet which was reflected as a loss in the Profit and Loss.


Many thanks to the team in the office, Linda, Catherine, Briana and Mason and to our outgoing bookkeeper Sharon Porter, who have all

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 31 May 2024

1 Summary of Material Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements are for Surf Life Saving Sydney Inc. ("the Incorporation") as a not-for-profit individual entity domiciled in Australia.

Surf Life Saving Sydney Inc. is not a reporting entity because the Board of Directors is of the opinion that there are unlikely to exist users who are able to command the preparation of financial reports tailored to satisfy all of their information needs. Therefore this report is a Special Purpose Financial Report that has been prepared solely to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Board, the requirements of the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and Australian Charities and Not-for-profit Commission Act 2012.

The special purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies described below and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors, AASB 1048 Interpretation of Standards, AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures and AASB 124 Related Party Disclosures.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Significant account policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

(b) Revenue and other income

The core principle of AASB 15 is that revenue is recognised on a basis that reflects the transfer of promised goods or services to customers at an amount that reflects the consideration the Incorporation expects to receive in exchange for those goods or services.

- 1. Identify the contract with the customer
- 2. Identify the performance obligations
- 3. Determine the transaction price
- 4. Allocate the transaction price to the performance obligations
- 5. Recognise revenue as and when control of the performance obligations is transferred

Generally the timing of the payment for sale of goods and rendering of services corresponds closely to the timing of satisfaction of the performance obligations, however where there is a difference, it will result in the recognition of a receivable, contract asset or contract liability.

None of the revenue streams of the Incorporation have any significant financing terms as there is less than 12 months between receipt of funds and satisfaction of performance obligations.

(b) Revenue and other income

The revenue recognition policies for the principal revenue streams of the Incorporation are:

Donations

Donations collected, including cash and goods for resale, are recognised as revenue when the Incorporation gains control of the asset.

Grant Revenue

Where grant income arises from an agreement which is enforceable and contains sufficiently specific performance obligations then the revenue is recognised when control of each performance obligations is satisfied.

Each performance obligation is considered to ensure that the revenue recognition reflects the transfer of control and within grant agreements there may be some performance obligations where control transfers at a point in time and others which have continuous transfer of control over the life of the contract.

Where control is transferred over time, generally the input methods being either costs or time incurred are deemed to be the most appropriate methods to reflect the transfer of benefit.

Membership subscription income

Membership subscription income is recognised over the period in which the services are rendered and corresponds to the satisfaction of performance obligations and transfer of control to the customer.

Amounts received in advance are recognised as deferred income and credited to profit and loss on a straight line basis over the expected subscription period.

Rental income

Rental income is recognized on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

(c) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(d) Property, plant and equipment

Property Plant and Equipment are carried at historical cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciation amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the entities commencing from the time the asset is held and ready for use.

(d) Property, plant and equipment

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

Fixed Asset Class Depreciation rate

Plant and Equipment 7.5% - 40% Leasehold improvements 2.5% - 10%

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

(e) Investment property

Investment property is held to generate long term rental yields and/or for capital appreciation. All tenant leases are on on an arm's length basis. Investment property is carried at fair value determined by current market values every three years. Changes to the fair value are recorded separately as an income or expense items directly in the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

(f) Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised initially on the date that the Incorporation becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial instruments are measured at fair value plus transaction costs (except for instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss where transaction costs are expensed as incurred).

Financial Assets

All recognised financial assets are subsequently measured in their entirety at either amortised cost or fair value, depending on the classification of the financial assets.

Classification

On initial recognition, the Incorporation classifies its financial assets into the following categories, those measured at:

amortised cost

Financial assets are not reclassified subsequent to their initial recognition unless the Incorporation changes its business model for managing financial assets.

Amortised cost

The Incorporation's financial assets measured at amortised cost comprise trade and other receivables and cash and cash equivalents in the statement of financial position.

Subsequent to initial recognition, these assets are carried at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method less provision for impairment. Interest income, foreign exchange gains or losses and impairment are recognised in profit or loss. Gain or loss on derecognition is recognised in profit or loss.

(f) Financial instruments

Impairment of financial assets

Impairment of financial assets is recognised on an expected credit loss (ECL) basis for the following assets:

financial assets measured at amortised cost

When determining whether the credit risk of a financial assets has increased significantly since initial recognition and when estimating ECL, the Incorporation considers reasonable and supportable information that is relevant and available without undue cost or effort. This includes both quantitative and qualitative information and analysis based on the Incorporation's historical experience and informed credit assessment and including forward looking information.

The Incorporation uses the presumption that an asset which is more than 30 days past due has seen a significant increase in credit risk.

The Incorporation uses the presumption that a financial asset is in default when:

- the other party is unlikely to pay its credit obligations to the Incorporation in full, without recourse to the Incorporation to actions such as realising security (if any is held); or
- the financial assets is more than 90 days past due.

Credit losses are measured as the present value of the difference between the cash flows due to the Incorporation in accordance with the contract and the cash flows expected to be received. This is applied using a probability weighted approach.

Trade receivables

Impairment of trade receivables have been determined using the simplified approach in AASB 9 which uses an estimation of lifetime expected credit losses. The Incorporation has determined the probability of non-payment of the receivable and multiplied this by the amount of the expected loss arising from default.

The amount of the impairment is recorded in a separate allowance account with the loss being recognised in finance expense. Once the receivable is determined to be uncollectable then the gross carrying amount is written off against the associated allowance.

Where the Incorporation renegotiates the terms of trade receivables due from certain customers, the new expected cash flows are discounted at the original effective interest rate and any resulting difference to the carrying value is recognised in profit or loss.

Other financial assets measured at amortised cost

Impairment of other financial assets measured at amortised cost are determined using the expected credit loss model in AASB 9. On initial recognition of the asset, an estimate of the expected credit losses for the next 12 months is recognised. Where the asset has experienced significant increase in credit risk then the lifetime losses are estimated and recognised.

(g) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period the Incorporation determines whether there is evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss.

(h) Intangible assets

Intangible assets are recognised at cost of acquisition. Intangible assets have a finite life and are carried at cost less any accumulated amortisation and any impairment losses. Intangible assets are amortised over their useful life of 3 years

(i) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

(j) Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Incorporation during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(k) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Incorporation's liability for employee benefits, those benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Employee benefits expected to be settled more than one year after the end of the reporting period have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may satisfy vesting requirements. Cashflows are discounted using market yields on national government bonds with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cashflows. Changes in the measurement of the liability are recognised in profit or loss.

(I) Adoption of new and revised accounting standards

The Incorporation has adopted all of the new and revised Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB). There are no new and revised Accounting Standards and Interpretations effective for the current year that are relevant to the Incorporation.
